

not elsewhere, and shall be there detained and kept separate from all other swine for 28 days, unless they are slaughtered on such premises before the expiration of that period, or are moved under and in accordance with the conditions of a licence of an Inspector of the Local Authority of the county of Cambridge, or of the District in which the place of destination is situate, to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse in the same Scheduled Area.

3.—(1.) A copy of every licence granted by an Inspector under this Order shall be sent by the Inspector to the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination specified in the licence is situate.

(2.) After completion of the movement the licence shall forthwith be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest police-station in the same District by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing such movement.

4. Swine moved to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse under a licence granted under this Order shall be there detained until they are slaughtered.

5.—(1) Every person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Movement Licence, if any, authorising the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2) Every person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

6.—(1) If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2) If a pig is not isolated as required by this Order, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the occupier of the place where the pig is detained shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(3) If a person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

7. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-sixth day of June, nineteen hundred and fifteen.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 22ND JUNE 1915.)

SLAUGHTER OF ANIMALS ORDER OF 1915.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Slaughter of Animals Act, 1914, and for the purpose of maintaining a sufficient breeding stock, do hereby order as follows:

Restriction of Slaughter of Animals In-calf or In-pig.

1. An animal which is visibly or obviously in-calf or in-pig shall not be slaughtered, or be caused or permitted by its owner to be slaughtered.

Restriction of Slaughter of Calves.

2. A calf under the age of twelve weeks shall not be slaughtered, or be caused or permitted by the owner thereof to be slaughtered; but this provision shall not apply to a male calf of any of the following dairy breeds, that is to say, Channel Island, Ayrshire and Kerry breeds.
