A PROCLAMATION

RELATING TO TRADING WITH PERSONS OF ENEMY NATIONALITY RESIDENT OR CARRYING ON BUSINESS IN CHINA, SIAM, PERSIA, OR MOROCCO.

GEORGE R.I.

WHEREAS it is expedient that transactions between British subjects and persons of enemy nationality resident or carrying on business in China, Siam, Persia, or Morocco should be restricted in manner provided by this Proclamation:

Now, THEREFORE, We have thought fit, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, to issue this Our Royal Proclamation declaring, and it is hereby declared, as follows:—

1. The Proclamations for the time being in force relating to Trading with the Enemy shall, as from the twenty-sixth day of July, nineteen hundred and fifteen, apply to any person or body of persons of enemy nationality resident or carrying on business in China, Siam, Persia, or Morocco in the same manner as they apply to persons or bodies of persons resident or carrying on business in an enemy country.

Provided that where an enemy has a branch locally situated in China, Siam, Persia, or Morocco, nothing in Article 6 of the Trading with the Enemy Proclamation No. 2 shall be construed so as to prevent transaction by or

with that branch being treated as transaction by or with an enemy.

2. Nothing in this Proclamation shall be taken to prohibit anything which may be specially permitted by Our licence or by a licence given on Our behalf by a Secretary of State or the Board of Trade or the Lords Commissioners of Our Treasury.

3. This Proclamation shall be called the Trading with the Enemy (China, Siam, Persia, and Morocco) Proclamation, 1915.

A PROCLAMATION

RELATING TO THE EXPORTATION OF ALL ARTICLES TO THE NETHERLANDS DURING THE PRESENT WAR.

GEORGE R.I.

WHEREAS by section 1 of the Exportation of Arms Act, 1900, it is enacted that We may, by Proclamation, prohibit the

exportation of all or any of the following articles, namely: Arms, ammunition, military and naval stores and any article which We shall judge capable of being converted into or made useful in increasing the quantity of arms, ammunition or military or naval stores to any country or place therein named whenever We shall judge such prohibition to be expedient in order to prevent such arms, ammunition or military or naval stores being used against Our forces or against any forces engaged or which may be engaged in military or naval operations in co-operation with Our forces:

AND WHEREAS by section 1 of the Customs (Exportation Restriction) Act, 1914, it is enacted that the above-recited section 1 of the Exportation of Arms Act, 1900, shall have effect whilst a state of war in which His Majesty is engaged exists as if, in addition to the articles therein mentioned, there were included all other articles of every description:

AND WHEREAS by section 1 of the Customs (Exportation Restriction) Act, 1915, it is enacted that the power of His Majesty under section 1 of the Exportation of Arms Act, 1900, as amended by the Customs (Exportation Restriction) Act, 1914, by Proclamation to prohibit the exportation of articles to any country or place named in the Proclamation, shall, during the continuance of the present war, include the power to prohibit the exportation of any article to any such country or place unless consigned to such person or persons as may be authorised by or under the Proclamation to receive such article:

Now, THEREFORE, We have thought fit, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, in virtue and in exercise of the powers aforesaid, to declare, and it is hereby declared, that the exportation of the articles mentioned in the second column of the Schedule hereto is prohibited to the country named in the first column of the said Schedule unless those articles are consigned to the persons referred to in the third column of the said Schedule.

WHEREAS by Section 8 of "The Weights and Measures Act, 1878," it is provided that the Board of Trade shall, from time to time, cause such new Denominations of

Standards, being either equivalent to or multiples or aliquot parts of the Imperial Weights and Measures ascertained by the said Act as appear to them to be required, in addition to those mentioned in the Second Schedule to the said Act, to be made and duly verified, and that those new Denominations of Standards, when approved by His Majesty in Council, shall be Board of Trade Standards in like manner as if they were mentioned in the said Schedule:

And whereas by "The Weights and Measures (Metric System) Act, 1897," it is provided that the Board of Trade Standards which may be made under Section 8 of the Weights and Measures Act, 1878, shall include Metric Standards derived from the *irridio-platinum* linear standard Metre deposited with the Board of Trade, and numbered 16:

And whereas it has been made to appear to the Board of Trade that a new Denomination of Standard Measure of Length of $1\frac{1}{4}$ or 1.25 Metres derived from the Standard Metre aforesaid is required, and they have caused the same to be made and duly verified:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the power vested in Him by the said Acts, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to approve of the Measure of Length of $1\frac{1}{4}$ or 1.25 Metres as a new Denomination of Standard, and doth direct that the same shall be a Board of Trade Standard in like manner as if it were mentioned in the Second Schedule to "The Weights and Measures Act, 1878."

WHEREAS by Section 16 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, as amended by the Pluralities Act, 1850, it is, amongst other things, enacted, "That whenever it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, with respect to his own Diocese, and whenever it shall be represented to him by the Bishop of any Diocese, or by the Bishops of any two Dioceses, that two or more Benefices, or that one or more Benefice or Benefices, and one or more Spiritual Sinecure Rectory or Rectories, Vicarage or Vicarages, in his or their Diocese or Dioceses, being either in the same Parish or contiguous to each other, and of which the aggregate Population shall not exceed 1,500 Persons, may, with advantage to the interests of Religion, be united into one Benefice, the said Archbishop of the Province shall inquire into the circumstances of the case; and if on such Inquiry it shall appear to him that such Union may be usefully made, and will not be of inconvenient extent, and that the Patron or Patrons of the said Benefices, Sinecure Rectory or Rectories, Vicarage or Vicarages respectively, is or are consenting thereto, such consent being signified in writing under the hands of such Patron or Patrons, the said Archbishop shall, 6 weeks before certifying such Inquiry and Consent to His Majesty as hereinafter directed, cause, with respect to his own Diocese, a Statement in writing of the facts, and in other cases a Copy in Writing of the aforesaid Representation to be affixed

on or near the principal outer door of the Church, or in some Public and conspicuous place in each of such Benefices, Sinecure Rectories, or Vicarages, with Notice to any Person or Persons interested that he, she, or they may, within such 6 weeks, show cause in writing under his, her, or their hand or hands, to the said Archbishop, against such Union; and if no sufficient cause be shown within such time, the said Archbishop shall certify the Inquiry and Consent aforesaid to His Majesty in Council, and thereupon it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to make and issue an Order or Orders for uniting such Benefices, Sinecure Rectory or Rectories, Vicarage or Vicarages, into one Benefice, with Cure of Souls, for ecclesiastical purposes only."

And whereas the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, hath, pursuant to the provisions of the said Acts, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Certificate in Writing, bearing date the 19th day of March, 1915, in the words following:—

"We, Randall Thomas, Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury, Primate of All England and Metropolitan, do hereby certify to Your Majesty in Council:—

"That the Right Reverend Frederic, Lord Bishop of Salisbury, as Bishop of the Diocese within which are situate the Vicarage of Bishop's or West Lavington and the Rectory of Cheverell Parva or Little Cheverell, both in the County of Wilts, having represented unto us that the said Benefices are contiguous to each other, and of which the aggregate population does not exceed 1,500 persons, might, with advantage to the interests of religion, be united into one Benefice, we inquired into the circumstances of the case:

"That on such Inquiry it appeared to us that such Union might be usefully made, and would not be of inconvenient extent, and that the said Lord Bishop of Salisbury in right of his Bishopric being the Patron or person entitled to present to the Benefice of Bishop's or West Lavington, (if the same were now vacant), and also to the Benefice of Cheverell Parva or Little Cheverell, (the same being now vacant), has consented to the proposed Union:

"That 6 weeks and upwards before certifying such Inquiry and Consent to Your Majesty in Council we caused a Copy in Writing of the aforesaid Representation of the said Lord Bishop to be affixed to the principal outer door of the Parish Church of each of the said Benefices, with notice to any person or persons interested that he, she, or they, might, within such 6 weeks show cause in writing under his, her, or their hand, or hands, to us, the said Archbishop, against such Union, and no such cause has been shown:

"The Representation of the said Lord Bishop of Salisbury, our Inquiry into the circumstances of the case, the Statement of Circumstances in reply thereto, the Consent in Writing of the said Lord Bishop as Patron of both the said Benefices, and the copies of the Representation and Notices before mentioned, are hereunto annexed:

"And we do hereby certify the Inquiry and Consent aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council, to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may, in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do, make and issue an Order for

uniting the said Benefices into one Benefice with Cure of Souls for ecclesiastical purposes only.

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the Vicarage of Bishop's or West Lavington, situate in the County of Wilts, and the Diocese of Salisbury, and the Rectory of Cheverell Parva or Little Cheverell, situate in the same County and Diocese, shall be united into one Benefice with Cure of Souls for ecclesiastical purposes only.

Whereas the Governing Body of Corpus Christi College, in the University of Oxford, did, under the provisions of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, on the 12th day of June, 1915, at a General Meeting of the said Governing Body of the College, specially summoned for the purpose, by the votes of not less than two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting, make by Statute the following alterations in Clause 13 (b) of the Statutes of the College:

And whereas the said Governing Body of the College did, on the 18th day of June, 1915, affix the Common Seal of the College to the said alterations of the Statutes of the College:

Now, therefore, the said Governing Body of Corpus Christi College, in the University of Oxford, doth hereby submit to His Majesty The King in Council, for His approval, the said alterations of the Statutes of the College.

In the Statutes made for Corpus Christi College, in the University of Oxford, by the University of Oxford Commissioners, and approved by Her late Majesty Queen Victoria in Council on the 3rd day of May, 1882:—

In Clause 13 (b) after the words "hereinafter specified" add the words "free of income tax."

In the same Clause (13 (b)) add the following words:—"Emoluments paid to an Official Fellow out of the General Revenues of the College, in addition to the Emoluments of his Fellowship, shall up to £150 per annum be free of income tax up to 2s. 6d. in the pound."

His Majesty The KING has been graciously pleased to approve of the grant of the Victoria

Cross to the undermentioned Officers, Non-commissioned Officers and Men:—

Lieutenant John George Smyth, 15th Ludhiana Sikhs, Indian Army.

For most conspicuous bravery near Richebourg L'Avoue on 18th May, 1915.

With a bombing party of 10 men, who voluntarily undertook this duty, he conveyed a supply of 96 bombs to within 20 yards of the enemy's position over exceptionally dangerous ground, after the attempts of two other parties had failed.

Lieutenant Smyth succeeded in taking the bombs to the desired position with the aid of two of his men (the other eight having been killed or wounded), and to effect his purpose he had to swim a stream, being exposed the whole time to howitzer, shrapnel, machine gun and rifle fire.

Jemadar Mir Dast, I.O.M., 55th Coke's Rifles (Frontier Force), attached 57th Wilde's Rifles (Frontier Force).

For most conspicuous bravery and great ability at Ypres on 26th April, 1915, when he led his platoon with great gallantry during the attack, and afterwards collected various parties of the regiment (when no British Officers were left) and kept them under his command until the retirement was ordered.

Jemadar Mir Dast subsequently on this day displayed remarkable courage in helping to carry eight British and Indian Officers into safety, whilst exposed to very heavy fire.

No. 7709 Lance-Corporal William Angus, 8th (Lanark) Battalion, The Highland Light Infantry (Territorial Force).

For most conspicuous bravery and devotion to duty at Givenchy on the 12th June, 1915, in voluntarily leaving his trench under very heavy bomb and rifle fire, and rescuing a wounded Officer who was lying within a few yards of the enemy's position.

Lance-Corporal Angus had no chance whatever in escaping the enemy's fire when undertaking this very gallant action, and in effecting the rescue he sustained about 40 wounds from bombs, some of them being very serious.

No. 3902 Company Serjeant-Major Frederick Barter, Special Reserve, attached 1st Battalion, The Royal Welsh Fusiliers.

For most conspicuous bravery and marked ability at Festubert on 16th May, 1915.

When in the first line of German trenches, Company Serjeant-Major Barter called for Volunteers to enable him to extend our line, and with the eight men who responded he attacked the German position with bombs, capturing 3 German Officers and 102 men, and 500 yards of their trenches. He subsequently found and cut eleven of the enemy's mine leads, situated about 20 yards apart.

No. 1780 Lance-Corporal David Finlay, 2nd Battalion, The Black Watch (Royal Highlanders).

For most conspicuous bravery and devotion to duty on 9th May, 1915, near Rue du Bois, when he led a bombing party of twelve men with the greatest gallantry in the attack until ten of them had fallen.

Lance-Corporal Finlay then ordered the two survivors to crawl back, and he himself went to the assistance of a wounded man and carried him over a distance of 100 yards of fire-swept ground into cover, quite regardless of his own personal safety.

No. 1272 Private John Lynn, 2nd Battalion, The Lancashire Fusiliers.

For most conspicuous bravery near Ypres on 2nd May, 1915.

When the Germans were advancing behind their wave of asphyxiating gas, Private Lynn, although almost overcome by the deadly fumes, handled his machine gun with very great effect against the enemy, and when he could not see them he moved his gun higher up on the parapet, which enabled him to bring even more effective fire to bear, and eventually checked any further advance.

The great courage displayed by this soldier had a fine effect on his comrades in the very trying circumstances.

He died the following day from the effects of gas poisoning.

No. 2832 Corporal John Ripley, 1st Battalion, The Black Watch (Royal Highlanders).

For most conspicuous bravery at Rue du Bois on 9th May, 1915.

When leading his section on the right of the right platoon in the assault, he was the first man of the battalion to ascend the enemy's parapet, and from there he directed those following him to the gaps in the German wire entanglements. He then led his section through a breach in the parapet to a second line of trench, which had previously been decided upon as the final objective in this part of our line.

In that position Corporal Ripley, with seven or eight men, established himself, blocking both flanks and arranging a fire position, which he continued to defend until all his men had fallen and he himself had been badly wounded in the head.

No. 7942 Acting Corporal Charles Sharpe, 2nd Battalion, The Lincolnshire Regiment.

For most conspicuous bravery near Rouges Bancs on 9th May, 1915.

When in charge of a blocking party sent forward to take a portion of the German trench he was the first to reach the enemy's position, and, using bombs with great determination and effect, he himself cleared them out of a trench 50 yards long.

By this time all his party had fallen, and he was then joined by four other men, with whom he attacked the enemy again with bombs and captured a further trench 250 yards long.

No. 10082 Corporal James Upton, 1st Battalion, The Sherwood Foresters (Nottinghamshire and Derbyshire Regiment).

For most conspicuous bravery near Rouges Bancs on 9th May, 1915.

During the whole of this day Corporal Upton displayed the greatest courage in rescuing the wounded whilst exposed to very heavy rifle and artillery fire, going close to the enemy's parapet regardless of his own personal safety. One wounded man was

killed by a shell whilst this Non-commissioned Officer was carrying him.

When Corporal Upton was not actually carrying in the wounded he was engaged in bandaging and dressing the serious cases in front of our parapet, exposed to the enemy's fire.

No. 7602 Private Edward Warner, 1st Battalion, The Bedfordshire Regiment.

For most conspicuous bravery near "Hill 60" on 1st May, 1915.

After Trench 46 had been vacated by our troops, consequent on a gas attack, Private Warner entered it single-handed in order to prevent the enemy taking possession.

Reinforcements were sent to Private Warner, but could not reach him owing to the gas. He then came back and brought up more men, by which time he was completely exhausted, but the trench was held until the enemy's attack ceased.

This very gallant soldier died shortly afterwards from the effects of gas poisoning.

His Majesty the KING has been graciously pleased to approve of the appointment of the undermentioned Officers to be Companions of the Distinguished Service Order, in recognition of their gallantry and devotion to duty in the Field:—

Major Douglas Rykert McCuaig, 13th Canadian Battalion.

For conspicuous gallantry and ability between 22nd and 24th April, 1915, near Ypres. On one occasion when some men of a battalion on his immediate left had vacated their trench he rallied them and got them back under heavy fire. When, after about an hour, during which this trench was enfiladed by both artillery and rifle fire, he found it impossible to hold it any longer, he withdrew in good order, and successfully took up another position by daylight and under very heavy fire.

Major Gordon Brooks Wright, 3rd Field Company, Canadian Engineers,

For conspicuous gallantry, ability, and devotion to duty from 22nd April to 5th May, 1915, near Ypres. Shortly after the German gas attack on 22nd April, when his billets were being heavily shelled and the gas began to affect his men, he skilfully got away his transport under heavy fire and withdrew his dismounted sappers to Brigade Headquarters, where he entrenched himself, and held an important position barring the enemy's approach from the north. The splendid example set by Major Wright, and his ability and coolness under fire, did much towards keeping up the spirits of his men under circumstances of the greatest difficulty.

Captain Henry Mallinson, 1st Battalion, The King's Own (Yorkshire Light Infantry).

For conspicuous gallantry and ability on 8th May, 1915, at Frezenberg, where he held his own in his trenches all day under a severe and accurate bombardment, and drove off each infantry attack delivered by the

enemy. Towards nightfall, when both his flanks were turned and no relief had arrived, he fought his way back to the second line 1,000 yards in rear.

His Majesty the KING has been graciously pleased to confer the Military Cross on the undermentioned Officers, in recognition of their gallantry and devotion to duty in the Field:—

Captain Paul Pechell, 2nd Battalion, The Essex Regiment.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty on 25th April, 1915, near St. Julien. When the men of his company were overcome by asphyxiating gas, he and a Non-commissioned Officer remained in their trench with a mere handful of men and drove back the advancing Germans.

Lieutenant (temporary) Philip Dunstan Bishop, attached The King's African Rifles.

For conspicuous gallantry and ability on the 9th September, 1914, when in command of a post at Karonga, Nyasaland. His party consisted of about 10 Europeans and 50 native soldiers and police, and these were attacked by a force of about 350 men from German East Africa, with three machine guns. Lieutenant Bishop defended his position for four hours with great success until the arrival of a relieving column, when the enemy were completely defeated and their guns captured.

Lieutenant Elliott Nial Eveleigh, Royal Engineers.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. At the commencement of the war he was wounded in five places while with the 2nd Signal Company, and was sent home. In December, 1914, he returned to France with the 27th Divisional Signal Company, and since his return he has worked incessantly superintending the repair of cables and almost daily under fire. He has set a fine example to all by his energy, courage and devotion to duty.

Lieutenant Robert Vaughan Kestell-Cornish, 3rd Battalion (attached 1st Battalion), The Dorsetshire Regiment.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty on the night of 1st May, 1915, on "Hill 60." When most of the Officers, Non-commissioned Officers and men had been asphyxiated, and he himself was suffering from the effects of gas, he rallied the few men who remained fit and held the hill until reinforcements arrived.

Lieutenant Thomas Welch, 6th Battalion, The Durham Light Infantry.

For conspicuous gallantry and tenacity at Zonnebeke from 26th to 30th April, 1915, when he with his company held a trench under heavy shell fire. His company was short of water and rations, and he had no flare pistols or periscopes and no previous experience of trench warfare. The losses of his company in killed and wounded were 45 out of a total of 120.
