with respect to his own Diocese, a Statement in Writing of the facts, and in other cases a Copy in Writing of the aforesaid Representation, to be affixed on or near the principal outer-door of the Church, or in some public and conspicuous place in each of such Benefices, Sinecure Rectories, or Vicarages, with notice to any person or persons interested that he, she, or they may, within such 6 weeks, show cause in writing under his, her, or their hand or hands, to the said Archbishop against such Union; and if no sufficient cause be shown within such time, the said Archbishop shall certify the Inquiry and Consent aforesaid to His Majesty in Council; and thereupon it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to make and issue an Order or Orders for uniting such Benefices, Sinecure Rectory or Rectories, Vicarage or Vicarages, into one Benefice, with Cure of Souls, for ecclesiastical purposes only; and it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to give directions for regulating the course and succession in which the Patrons, if there be more than one Patron, shall present or nominate to such United Benefice, from time to time, as the same shall become vacant: "

And whereas the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, hath, pursuant to the provisions of the said Acts, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Certificate in writing, bearing date the 29th day of July, 1914, in the words following:—

"We, Randall Thomas, Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury, Primate of all Eng-

land and Metropolitan, do hereby certify to Your Majesty in Council:—

“That the Right Reverend Archibald, Lord Bishop of Exeter, as Bishop of the Diocese within which are situate the Rectory of Tetcott, and the Rectory of Luffincott, both in the County of Devon, having represented unto us that the said Benefices, being contiguous to each other, and of which the aggregate population is 248 persons, might, with advantage to the interests of religion, be united into one Benefice, we inquired into the circumstances of the case:

“That on such Inquiry it appeared to us that such Union might be usefully made, and would not be of inconvenient extent, and that Sir Hugh Molesworth St. Aubyn, of Clowance and Pencarroa, Baronet, being the Patron or Person entitled to present or nominate to the Rectory of Tetcott, (the same being now vacant), and Thomas Buller Bradshaw, the Patron or Person entitled to present or nominate to the Rectory of Luffincott, subject to the Right of His Most Gracious Majesty King George the Fifth to present or nominate thereto on the present vacancy by reason of lapse, and the Right Honourable Richard Burdon, Viscount Haldane of Cloan, Lord High Chancellor, authorized to consent on behalf of His Most Gracious Majesty in respect of the above-mentioned right to present to the Benefice of Luffincott, have consented to the proposed Union:

“That 6 weeks and upwards before certifying such Inquiry and Consents to Your Majesty in Council we caused a Copy in Writing of the aforesaid Representation of the said Lord Bishop to be affixed to the principal outer door of the Parish Church of each of the said Benefices, with notice to any person or persons interested that he, she, or they, might, within such 6 weeks, show cause in writing under his, her, or their hand, or hands, to us, the said Archbishop, and no such cause has been shown:

“The Representation of the said Lord Bishop of Exeter, our Inquiry into the circumstances of the case, the Statement of Circumstances in reply thereto, the Consents in Writing of the said Patrons, and the Copies of the Representation and Notices before mentioned, are hereunto annexed:

“And we do hereby certify the Inquiry and Consents aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council, to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may, in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do, make and issue an Order for uniting the said Benefices into one Benefice with Cure of Souls for ecclesiastical purposes only, and for declaring that the Patronage or right of presentation to the said Benefices after the same shall be united into one Benefice, and come to be holden by the same Incumbent, shall be exercised by the Patrons of the present respective Benefices in manner following, that is to say, the Patron of the Benefice of Tetcott shall make the first presentation thereto, and the course and succession in which the said Patrons for the time being shall afterward present and nominate shall be as follows, that is to say, the first turn of every set of 3 turns of the right to present or nominate shall belong to and be exercised by the Patron of Luffincott; and the second and third turns of every such

set of 3 turns shall belong to and be exercised by the Patron of Tetcott.

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the Rectory of Luffincott, situate in the County of Devon, and Diocese of Exeter, and the Rectory of Tetcott, situate in the same County and Diocese, shall be united into one Benefice with Cure of Souls for ecclesiastical purposes only.

And His Majesty in Council, by and with the advice of His said Council, is further pleased to direct that the Patronage or right of presentation to the said Benefices, after the same shall be united into one Benefice, and come to be holden by the same Incumbent, from time to time, as the same shall become vacant, shall be exercised in the following manner, that is to say:—the Patron of the said Benefice of Tetcott shall make the first presentation thereto, and the course and succession in which the respective Patrons for the time being shall afterwards present or nominate shall be as follows, that is to say:—the first turn of every set of 3 turns of the right to present or nominate shall belong to, and be exercised by, the Patron of the said Benefice of Luffincott, and the second and third turns of every such set of 3 turns shall belong to and be exercised by the Patron of the said Benefice of Tetcott.

"That the Right Reverend Edgar Charles Sumner, Lord Bishop of Gloucester, as Bishop of the Diocese within which are situate the Benefice of Coln Rogers, and the Benefice of Coln St. Denis, both in the County of Gloucester, having represented unto us that the said Benefices are contiguous to each other, and of which the aggregate population does not exceed 1,500 persons, might, with advantage to the interests of religion, be united into one Benefice, we inquired into the circumstances of the case:

"That on such Inquiry it appeared to us that such Union might be usefully made, and would not be of inconvenient extent, and that the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of the Holy and Indivisible Trinity in Gloucester, being the Patrons or persons entitled to present or nominate to the Benefice of Coln Rogers (in case the same were now vacant), and The Master, Fellows, and Scholars, of Pembroke College, in the University of Oxford, being the Patrons or persons entitled to present to the Benefice of Coln St. Denis, (in case the same were now vacant), have consented to the proposed Union:

"That 6 weeks and upwards before certifying such Inquiry and Consents to Your Majesty in Council we caused a Copy in Writing of the aforesaid Representation of the said Lord Bishop to be affixed to the principal outer door of the Parish Church of each of the said Benefices, with Notice to any person or persons interested that he, she, or they, might, within such 6 weeks show cause in writing, under his, her, or their hand, or hands, to us the said Archbishop against such Union, and no such cause has been shown:

"The Representation of the said Lord Bishop of Gloucester, our Inquiry into the

circumstances of the Case, the Statement of Circumstances in reply thereto, the Consents in Writing of the said Patrons, and the copies of the Representation and Notices before-mentioned, are hereunto annexed:

"And we do hereby certify the Inquiry and Consents aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council, to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may, in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do, make and issue an Order for uniting the said Benefices into one Benefice with Cure of Souls for ecclesiastical purposes only.

"And we recommend that the Patronage of the said United Benefice shall be vested in the said Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of the Holy and Indivisible Trinity in Gloucester, and the said Master, Fellows, and Scholars, of Pembroke College, in the University of Oxford, alternately, and that the first right of presentation, after the said Benefices shall come to be holden by the same Incumbent, shall belong to the said Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of the Holy and Indivisible Trinity in Gloucester.

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the Rectory of Coln Rogers, situate in the County and Diocese of Gloucester, and the Rectory of Coln Saint Denis, situate in the same County and Diocese, shall be united into one Benefice with Cure of Souls for ecclesiastical purposes only.

And His Majesty in Council, by and with the advice of His said Council, is further pleased to direct that the Patronage or right of presentation to the said Benefices, after the same shall be united into one Benefice, and come to be holden by the same Incumbent, from time to time, as the same shall become vacant, shall be exercised in the following manner, that is to say:—the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of the Holy and Indivisible Trinity in Gloucester, and the Master, Fellows, and Scholars, of Pembroke College, in the University of Oxford, alternately, and the first turn, or right of presentation, shall belong to, and be exercised by, the said Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of the Holy and Indivisible Trinity in Gloucester.

The following Scheme for the adjustment of the property, rights, liabilities, etc., of the Urban District of Aylesbury, in the County of Buckingham, and for other purposes, as settled by a Committee of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1882":—

WHEREAS by the Municipal Corporation Acts, 1882 and 1885, it is enacted that where a Petition for a Charter of Incorporation is referred to the Committee of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, and it is proposed by the Charter to extend the Municipal Cor-

poration Acts to the Municipal Borough to be created by the Charter, the said Committee of Council may settle a Scheme for the purposes in the said Acts named, and containing such provisions as are in the said Acts particularized:

And whereas in the month of December, 1913, certain Inhabitant Householders of the Urban District of Aylesbury, in the County of Buckingham, petitioned His Majesty the King praying for the Grant of a Charter of Incorporation:

And whereas the said Petition for a Charter was referred to the Committee of Council, and it was proposed by the Charter to create the Urban District of Aylesbury, hereinafter described, a Municipal Borough, and to extend to such Borough and to the inhabitants thereof all the powers, privileges and provisions of the Municipal Corporation Acts:

And whereas under and by virtue of the Local Government Act, 1848, the Local Board for the Parish of Aylesbury was constituted in the year 1849 and then became invested with various powers and duties, and the Local Board was constituted the Urban Sanitary Authority for the Parish of Aylesbury:

And whereas under and by virtue of the Local Government Act, 1894, the Local Board became the Urban District Council for the Urban District of Aylesbury (hereinafter called "the District Council"):

And whereas a Burial Board was constituted for the parish of Aylesbury under the provisions of the Burial Act, 1852, at a Meeting of the Vestry for the said Parish held on the fourteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-six:

And whereas the said Burial Board have borrowed the sum of £400 for Cemetery purposes, of which sum the amount of £220 is now outstanding:

And whereas tables of fees duly allowed and approved in accordance with the provisions of the Burial Acts are now in force within the District:

And whereas in pursuance of the powers for that purpose contained in Section 62 of the Local Government Act, 1894, the powers, duties, and liabilities of the Burial Board for the Parish of Aylesbury were transferred to the District Council as from the 25th day of March, 1908, by a Resolution of the District Council passed on the 10th day of February, 1908:

And whereas the following Acts have been adopted by the District Council, and are now in force in the District (that is to say):—

1. The Infectious Disease (Prevention) Act, 1890, adopted on the fourteenth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and ten.
2. The Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1890, adopted on the third day of January, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight.
3. The Private Street Works Act, 1892, adopted on the twenty-fourth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and ten.

And whereas by an Order made by the Local Government Board and dated the 1st day of February, 1909, the following Parts and Sections of the Public Health Acts

Amendment Act, 1907, were declared to be in force in the District, viz.—Sections 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24, 25, 26, 27, 28, 29, 30, 31, and 33, comprised in Part II., Sections 34, 35, 36, 37, 38, 43, 44, 45, 46, 47, 49, and 51, comprised in Part III., Sections 52, 53, 54, 55, 56, 57, 58, 59, 60, 62, 64, and 65, comprised in Part IV.; Part V.; and Part VI.

And whereas by an Order made by the Secretary of State for the Home Department, and dated the 21st day of September, 1908, the following Sections of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907, were declared to be in force in the District, viz.—Section 81 comprised in Part VII., and Sections 87, 88, and 89, comprised in Part VIII.

And whereas the following Local Acts are now in force within the District, viz.:—

The Aylesbury Market Act, 1863.

The Aylesbury Market (Amendment) Act, 1867.

The Chiltern Hills Spring Water Act, 1870.

The Aylesbury Gas Act, 1905.

And whereas the property and undertaking of the Aylesbury Market Company, incorporated by the said Aylesbury Market Act, 1863, were purchased by the District Council on the second day of July, 1901, pursuant to the powers and subject to the limitations mentioned in Section 166 of the Public Health Act, 1875.

And whereas the District Council have obtained the following Orders which are now in force in the District, viz.:—

The Aylesbury Electric Lighting Order, 1912, confirmed 7th August, 1912.

The Aylesbury Order, 1913, for compulsory purchase of land for sewage disposal purposes, confirmed 4th July, 1913.

And whereas the Local Government Board under and by virtue of Section 33 of the Local Government Act, 1894, have made the following Orders affecting the District, viz.:—

1. On the fourth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six, an Order conferring on the District Council the powers, duties and liabilities of a Parish Council with respect to any Charity held wholly or partly for the benefit of the inhabitants of the Parish, under Section 14 of the Local Government Act, 1894.

2. On the twelfth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six, an Order confirming an Order of the Buckinghamshire County Council for altering the boundaries of the Parishes of Aylesbury-with-Walton and Bierton-with-Broughton.

3. On the ninth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven, an Order conferring on the District Council the power and duty of appointing Overseers for each Parish wholly comprised within the Urban District.

4. On the eighteenth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven, an Order conferring on the District Council the power of appointing and revoking the appointment of any Assistant Overseer for each Parish in the District.

5. On the third day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven, an Order transferring to the District Council

such of the powers, duties and liabilities of the Vestry of the Parish of Aylesbury-with-Walton as would if the Parish had been a Rural Parish with a Parish Council have been transferred to such Council by Sub-Section (1) of Section 6 of the Local Government Act, 1894.

6. On the second day of January, one thousand nine hundred and one, an Order transferring to the District Council the powers, duties and liabilities of the Overseers of the Parish of Aylesbury-with-Walton, with respect to appeals or objections by the Overseers in respect of the valuation list or appeals in respect of the poor rate or county rate or the basis of the county rate, and the powers of a Parish Council under paragraphs (h), (i), and (k) of Sub-Section (1) of Section 8 of the Local Government Act, 1894.

And whereas under the provisions of the Public Health Act, 1875, the District Council have made the following Bye-laws which were allowed by the Local Government Board on the dates hereinafter named:—

With respect to New Streets and Buildings, Nuisances, and Common Lodging Houses, all of which were allowed by the Local Government Board on the 2nd day of August, 1884:

With respect to Slaughterhouses, which were allowed by the Local Government Board on the 21st day of February, 1889:

With respect to the Recreation Ground, which were allowed by the Local Government Board on the 24th day of May, 1911:

With respect to the Market, which were allowed by the Local Government Board on the 29th day of November, 1902, together with a Schedule of Market Tolls; and on the 20th day of December, 1910:

And whereas the District Council have made Regulations under the Allotments Act, 1887, with respect to Allotments, which were allowed by the Local Government Board on the 28th day of November, 1902:

And whereas the District Council on the fourteenth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and four, made Regulations under the Dairies, Cowsheds, and Milkshops Order of 1885:

And whereas the County Council of Buckinghamshire have made certain Bye-laws for the good rule and government of the Administrative County of Buckingham, and the same are now in force in the District:

And whereas the establishment in the said District, if incorporated, of a new separate Police Force not consolidated with the Police Force of the County of Buckingham is prohibited by Section 215 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, the population of the said District according to the last Census being under 20,000:

And whereas the District Council is a Local Authority within the meaning of the Municipal Corporation Acts, 1882 and 1885:

And whereas this Scheme was, before being settled by the Committee of Council, referred for consideration to His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, to the Board of Trade, and to the Local Government Board:

And whereas it is expedient that the County Council of the Administrative County of Buckingham should retain in and for the Borough of Aylesbury all the powers, duties and liabilities in relation to the several matters set out in Section 39 of "The Local Government Act, 1888," which have heretofore been exercisable by or attached to the said County Council, excepting so far as the said Section relates to gas or gas meters:

And whereas it is expedient that a Scheme should be made and settled containing the provisions hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, pursuant to the Municipal Corporation Acts, 1882 and 1885, and every other power enabling them in that behalf, the Committee of Council have settled a Scheme containing the provisions herein, and do hereby direct, order and declare as follows:—

1. This Scheme may be cited for all purposes as "The Borough of Aylesbury Scheme, 1915."

2. The Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Aylesbury are in this Scheme referred to as "the Corporation."

3. This Scheme, when confirmed, shall come into operation on the day of the first Meeting of the Council of the Municipal Borough created by the said Charter, and this Scheme shall be construed and applied as if it had been dated and confirmed by Parliament or Order in Council, on the day before the day of the said first Meeting, and everything thereunder shall be done and had accordingly. This date is hereinafter referred to as "The commencement of this Scheme." So far as may be necessary this Scheme shall operate retrospectively.

4. From and after the commencement of this Scheme, the Municipal Borough created by the said Charter shall be placed within the jurisdiction of the Corporation acting by the Council of the Borough as the Sanitary Authority of the said Borough.

5. The District Council and its powers, duties, rights, obligations and privileges shall continue, and be deemed to have continued, to exist until the commencement of this Scheme, unaffected in any manner whatsoever by the grant of the said Charter or the creation of the said Borough. From and after the commencement of this Scheme the District Council shall be and the same is hereby abolished, and the powers, rights, duties, obligations, and privileges thereof shall cease and determine.

6. The Council of the said Borough shall not exercise any of the powers or duties or be subject to the liabilities under any of the Acts relating to the following matters mentioned in section thirty-nine of "The Local Government Act, 1888," namely:—

(a) The appointment of Analysts under the Acts relating to the sale of Foods and Drugs, or

(b) The execution of the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, or the Destructive Insects Act, 1877, or

(c) Weights and Measures.

All the powers, duties and liabilities in respect of the above matters shall be exercised by and attached to the County Council of the Administrative County of Buckingham and the area of the Borough shall for all purposes of the Acts relating to these matters form part

of the County in like manner as if it were not a Borough.

The Council of the said Borough shall exercise the powers and duties and be subject to the liabilities under the Acts relating to Gas and Gas Meters referred to in the said Section 39 of the Local Government Act, 1888.

7. The Tables of Fees duly allowed and approved in accordance with the provisions of the Burial Acts shall continue in force in regard to the respective Burial Grounds until the same are repealed or varied by the Council of the Borough with such approval as is required by law.

8. All the jurisdiction, powers, duties and property respectively vested in or possessed by the District Council, or by any person or body in trust for them, or any of their members as such (and not otherwise dealt with or transferred by or under any part of this Scheme), shall vest in the Corporation, and shall be exercised, held and applied for the municipal and public purposes of the said Borough.

9. All duties and liabilities which immediately before the commencement of this Scheme respectively attached to and were enforceable against the District Council or the property thereof shall attach to and be enforceable against the Corporation.

10. Any investigation, legal proceeding, or remedy in respect of any debt, liability, penalty or forfeiture due to or incurred by or on behalf of the District Council before the commencement of this Scheme, may be continued, prosecuted, or enforced by or against the Corporation.

11. The term "property" in this Scheme means and includes all property real and personal, and all things in action, and all rights of common and commonable rights and rights to toll, and all franchises, privileges and rights which have any pecuniary value, and all charters, records, deeds, books and documents, and all rights and all claims to relief, and all rights to avoid contracts or otherwise, and includes any estate or interest, legal or equitable, in or in respect of any property so defined.

12. The District Fund and the General District Rate of the Borough of Aylesbury shall for all purposes whatsoever (subject to the provisions of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, with respect to the Borough Fund and Borough Rate and Watch Rate respectively) take the place of and be substituted for the District Fund and General District Rate respectively of the District Council, and all sums of money respectively payable to, from, or out of, and all liabilities charged upon or attaching to the District Fund and General District Rate of the said Urban District shall (subject as aforesaid) be paid to, from, or out of, and shall be charged upon the said District Fund and General District Rate of the said Borough respectively.

13. All the rights, interests, powers, property, liabilities or obligations vested in or attached to the District Council under "The Public Health Act, 1875"; "The Aylesbury Market Act, 1863"; "The Aylesbury Market (Amendment) Act, 1867" (but subject as regards the two last mentioned Market Acts to the limitations contained in Section 166 of the Public Health Act, 1875); "The Chiltern Hills Spring Water Act, 1870"; "The Aylesbury Gas Act, 1905"; "The Aylesbury Electric Lighting Order, 1912"; "The Aylesbury

Order, 1913, for Compulsory Purchase of Land for Sewage Disposal Purposes"; "The Infectious Disease (Prevention) Act, 1890"; "The Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1890"; "The Private Street Works Act, 1892"; "The Local Government Act, 1894"; "The Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907, sections 15 to 31 inclusive, 33 to 38 inclusive, 43 to 47 inclusive, 49, 51 to 60 inclusive, 62, 64, 65, 69 to 77 inclusive, 81, 87, 88, and 89"; shall pass to, devolve upon, be exercisable by or against, vested in or attached to the Corporation acting by the Council as the Sanitary Authority of the Borough, and from and after the commencement of this Scheme the Corporation shall be and continue the legal successors of the Urban District Council of Aylesbury for all purposes. The Town Clerk of the Borough shall be substituted for and perform the duties of the Clerk to the District Council.

14. Any rules and regulations under the Public Health Act, 1875, and the Dairies, Cowsheds, and Milkshops Order of 1885, and any Bye-law made or continued by the District Council or their predecessors and any table of fees and charges and any Schedule of Market Tolls in force within the Urban District of Aylesbury at the commencement of this Scheme shall, unless duly repealed, revoked, or varied, continue in force and have operation in the Borough in like manner, and with the like effect as if the Corporation acting by the Council and their officers and the Borough were referred to therein, instead of the Local Board or the District Council (as the case may be) and their officers and the District.

Provided always that the Bye-laws with respect to New Streets and Buildings and with respect to Slaughter Houses in force in the Urban District shall be continued in force in the Borough for a period of two years only after this Scheme has come into operation unless repealed before the expiration of that period.

15. The Bye-laws for the good rule and government of the Administrative County of Buckingham so far as they are in force in the Urban District of Aylesbury, shall continue in force and be enforced within the Municipal Borough of Aylesbury until the expiration of two years from the commencement of this Scheme, or until other Bye-laws for good rule and government made by the Corporation shall have come into force whichever shall first occur.

Saving for Rates, &c.

16. Notwithstanding the Incorporation of the Borough and the provisions of this Scheme, all rates, assessments, compositions, charges, mortgages, contracts, leases, conveyances, deeds, documents, acts, matters and things made, entered into or done before the commencement of this Scheme, by, to, or with reference to the District Council, shall be as good, valid and effectual, to all intents and purposes whatsoever for, against and with reference to the Corporation, as if the same had been done, entered into, or done by, to, or with reference to the Corporation instead of the District Council, and may be proceeded on or enforced in the same manner in all respects as if the Corporation instead of the District Council had been party or privy to the same and had been named or referred to therein.

17. In case any Officer of the District Council, who shall have been employed by the Dis-

trict Council, shall not be employed by the Council of the said Borough nor offered by the said Council a position in their employ of a similar character and of an equal value to that formerly held by him, he shall be entitled to be paid, by way of compensation for the loss of his position, out of the funds of or under the control of the Corporation acting by the Council as the Sanitary Authority for the said Borough, and the amount to be paid in each case shall be determined in accordance with the provisions of Section 120 of the Local Government Act, 1888, and Sub-sections (1) to (7) inclusive of that Section shall apply as if they formed part of this Scheme, with the substitution of the words "Borough Council" for "County Council," and "this Scheme" for "this Act," and with such other modifications as are necessary to make them applicable hereto.

Provided, nevertheless, that if any such Officer be so employed by the said Corporation and discharged by them (otherwise than for misconduct) within four years of the commencement of this Scheme, he shall be entitled to compensation in the same manner as if he had not been employed by the said Corporation. Provided that the term "Officer" shall include only persons employed by the said Council whose salaries or emoluments are payable at intervals of not less than one month, and no other persons.

18. The Accounts of the District Council and their Officers shall be made up to the date of the commencement of this Scheme and shall be (as soon as conveniently may be after this Scheme comes into operation) audited by the District Auditor in like manner, and subject to the like powers, duties, provisions, and right of appeal as if the Charter had not been granted, and the provisions of Sections 247 and 250 of "The Public Health Act, 1875," as amended by "The District Auditors Act, 1879," and any regulations duly issued by the Local Government Board with respect to the audit of accounts of Local Boards or Urban District Councils, and of their Officers, shall apply to such audit, and the provisions of this Scheme with respect to the District Council shall be construed so as to admit of such exceptions as may be necessary to enable such audit to be duly made, but such exceptions shall be strictly limited in time, extent, character, and operation to the purposes of such audit; any money certified to be due from any person by the District Auditor at such audit shall be paid by such person to the Treasurer of the Borough.

Displayed conspicuous ability and initiative during operations between May 5th and 10th, near Krithia, Cape Helles; owing to his judgment and skill as Officer Commanding the forward line, losses, though heavy, were less severe than they would otherwise have been.

Lieutenant-Commander Bernard C. Freyberg, Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve.

Displayed conspicuous gallantry on April 25th during the landing operations in the

Gulf of Xeros. He swam ashore towing rafts with flares, and although alone, reconnoitred the enemy's position and swam back; he was over two hours in the water.

Lieutenant Ernest G. Boissier, Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve.

Behaved with gallantry in charge of a machine-gun on May 7th, during operations South of Achi Baba, and effected the destruction of an enemy machine-gun.

Lieutenant James Cheetham, Royal Marine Light Infantry.

Conducted himself with gallantry on May 1st during operations South of Achi Baba. When the enemy, in strength of about a Battalion, attacked an outpost of 30 men, Lieutenant Cheetham called for two volunteers, and, dashing out to a flank under heavy fire into the open, brought rapid fire to bear on the enemy and thus checked the attack and saved the outpost line.

Lieutenant George S. Davidson, Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve.

Displayed great courage and coolness in action on May 6th during operations South of Achi Baba.

Chief Petty Officer Richard F. Toy, Royal Navy.

Behaved with conspicuous gallantry on May 6th during operations South of Achi Baba, leading his platoon after his Company Commander had been wounded, and bringing in Lieutenant-Commander Ford (wounded) under heavy fire.

Able Seaman George H. Doe, Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve.

Displayed conspicuous gallantry on May 7th during operations South of Achi Baba in continuing to work his machine-gun after the remainder of the crew had been wounded; this resulted in the enemy's shrapnel being turned from the advancing infantry on to himself.

Private Charles J. Braddock, Royal Marine Light Infantry.

Behaved with distinguished gallantry on May 1st during operations South of Achi Baba. When the enemy in greatly superior numbers attacked an outpost of 30 men he volunteered in company with Lieutenant Cheetham and one other man to counter-attack the enemy on a flank in the open under heavy fire, thus assisting to save the outpost line.

Bugler Ernest Sillence, Royal Marine Light Infantry.

Behaved with distinguished gallantry on May 4th during operations South of Achi Baba in volunteering to throw back enemy bombs into enemy lines at great personal risk, thereby saving the lives of many of his comrades.

Petty Officer Walter Mason, Royal Navy.

On 9th May, during operations South of Achi Baba, volunteered to bring back two wounded men lying 200 yards in advance of the trenches. This he did, bringing them in one after the other under fire.

Leading Seaman John Rogerson, Royal Navy.

On May 7th, during operations South of Achi Baba, performed valuable work in making a reconnaissance under fire.

Stoker Herbert H. Purnell, Royal Navy.

On May 8th, during operations South of Achi Baba, did excellent work in bringing up machine-guns under severe fire, and later bringing up ammunition under fire when wounded.

Serjeant N. Roberts, Royal Marine Light Infantry.

On May 2nd, during operations South of Achi Baba, displayed coolness and gallantry in carrying men out of fire.

MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

under the said Order by a Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority of the said borough.

NORTH SEA, RIVER THAMES AND ENGLISH CHANNEL.

Pilotage and Traffic Regulations.

Former Notice.—No. 537 of 1915; hereby cancelled.

All Orders in this Notice are now in force, and have been made under the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914.

I. All ships (other than British ships of less than 3,500 tons gross tonnage, when trading coastwise or to or from the Channel islands and not carrying passengers) whilst bound from, and whilst navigating in the waters from, the Downs Pilot Station to Gravesend or *vice versa*, must be conducted by pilots licensed by the London Trinity House.

2. All ships (other than British ships of less than 3,500 tons gross tonnage, when trading coastwise or to or from the Channel islands and not carrying passengers) whilst bound from, and whilst navigating in the waters from, Gravesend to Great Yarmouth or *vice versa*, must be conducted by pilots licensed by the London Trinity House.

3. All ships (other than British ships of less than 3,500 tons gross tonnage, when trading coastwise or to or from the Channel islands and not carrying passengers) whilst navigating in the waters from Gravesend to London Bridge or *vice versa*, must be conducted by pilots licensed by the London Trinity House.

4. The Trinity House Pilot Station at Dungeness having been discontinued, pilotage is therefore not compulsory between the Downs Pilot Station and Dungeness, except for ships bound into or out of the Harbours of Dover and Folkestone.

II. Trinity House Pilot Stations have been established at the undermentioned places, and merchant vessels not under compulsion of pilotage are very strongly advised to take pilots:—

(a) THE DOWNS, where ships proceeding north can obtain pilots capable of piloting as far as Great Yarmouth, and also pilots for the River Thames, and for Folkestone and Dover harbours. The pilot steamers attached to the Downs Station will cruise in the

vicinity of a position two miles south-east of Deal Pier.

(b) GREAT YARMOUTH, where ships from the North Sea bound for the River Thames or the English Channel can obtain pilots capable of piloting as far as the Downs.

The Pilot Steamer attached to the Great Yarmouth Station will cruise between the Corton Light-vessel and the South Scroby buoy.

(c) THE SUNK LIGHT-VESSEL, where ships crossing the North Sea between the parallels of 51° 40' and 51° 54' North Latitude, but no others, can obtain pilots for the River Thames and the Downs.

(d) Pilots can also be obtained at LONDON and HARWICH for the Downs and Great Yarmouth (including the River Thames and approaches).

Note.—The pilots referred to in this Notice are the pilots licensed by the London Trinity House and no others.

III. RIVER THAMES.—All traffic into and out of the River Thames must pass through the Edinburgh Channels, or through the Black Deep south of the Knock John and Knob Light-buoys, and through the Oaze Deep, until further notice.

No vessels are to remain under way in the above-mentioned Channels between Chapman Lighthouse on the west, and the Sunk-head Light-buoy or a line joining the positions of the South Long Sand and East Shingles buoys, on the east, between the hours of 11 p.m. and 2 a.m.

Vessels at anchor within these limits must not exhibit any lights between the hours of 11 p.m. and 2 a.m.

All other Channels are closed to navigation.

2. No yachts or pleasure boats under sail or steam, or otherwise mechanically driven, are allowed in the Estuary of the Thames east of a line drawn between the Grain spit and West Shoebury buoys.

The Estuary of the Thames mentioned in the preceding paragraph is to be considered to include the north coast of Kent from North Foreland to Sheerness, and the coast of Essex from Shoeburyness to the Naze.

Pulling boats are not allowed in the waters prohibited above without a licence, which must be obtained by the person to whom the boat belongs from the Chief of the local Police. A separate licence is required for each boat.

3. Yachts and pleasure craft in the River Thames are prohibited from using the area enclosed by a line drawn north and south through the Ovens buoy to a line joining Holehaven point and the Blyth middle buoy.

4. In the rivers Colne, Blackwater, Crouch and Roach, the cruising of yachts and pleasure-craft under sail, steam, or otherwise mechanically driven, and under oars, is permitted subject to the following restrictions:—

(a) All pleasure craft of any description are prohibited from being under way between the hours of 8 p.m. and 6 a.m.

(b) Pleasure boats using the areas mentioned in paragraphs (c) and (d) below, in which cruising is permitted, must obtain a licence from the local Police.

(c) In the rivers Colne and Blackwater and in the Estuaries of these rivers, cruising is permitted in the area to the west of lines drawn from Colne point to N.W. Knoll-buoy and Sales point, to N.W. Knoll-buoy and up these rivers.

(d) In the rivers Crouch and Roach, cruising is permitted in the Crouch river west of a line drawn north and south (True) through Burnham Coastguard station. No pleasure craft are permitted below this line.

Cruising is permitted in the Roach river down to its confluence with the Crouch.

IV. RIVER MEDWAY.—No yachts or pleasure boats under sail or steam, or otherwise mechanically driven, or pleasure pulling boats, are allowed in the Medway to the eastward of Rochester Bridge.

This Notice is a re-publication of Notice No. 537 of 1915 with the addition of certain regulations respecting the rivers Thames, Colne, Blackwater, Crouch and Roach, mentioned in Sub-sections 3 and 4 of Section III.

SCOTLAND, EAST COAST AND ORKNEY ISLES.

Pilotage stations established at certain Ports on account of defensive Minefields.

Former Notice.—No. 391 of 1915; hereby cancelled.

With reference to the extension of the system of Mine defence, notice is hereby given that, under the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, Pilotage is now compulsory at the following ports for all vessels (including fishing vessels) which have a draught of over eight feet, and that it is highly dangerous for any vessel to enter or leave such ports without a pilot. Fishing and other small vessels having a draught of over eight feet are to assemble at the Pilotage stations and will be conducted into and out of port in groups.

(1) FIRTH OF FORTH. All incoming vessels are only permitted to enter the Firth of Forth during daylight hours; they are to pass between the Isle of May and Anstruther Wester, thence they must steer a direct course for Kinghorn ness. On approaching

Inch Keith, the Pilot vessel in the North channel is to be closed, and a pilot embarked.

Merchant vessels approaching the Firth of Forth from the southward are permitted to keep close to the shore until Barnes ness is reached, when course should be shaped for the Isle of May, so as to pass between the Isle of May and Anstruther Wester.

No merchant vessel is permitted to enter the Firth of Forth between the Isle of May and the south shore of the Forth.

Vessels are warned that, after having entered the Firth of Forth, they should on no account pass to the southward of a line joining the north point of the Isle of May and Kinghorn ness, until in the longitude of 3° W., when course may be shaped for the centre of North channel.

Outward bound vessels should steer to pass the longitude of 3° W. in latitude 56° 06' 30" N., then shape course to pass between Anstruther Wester and the Isle of May.

No merchant vessel is permitted to be at an anchorage, during the hours of official night, between Inch Keith and a line drawn from Barnes ness to North Carr rock.

For the purposes of defining the entrance of the Firth of Forth, a line drawn from Barnes ness to North Carr rock is to be considered the eastern limit of the Firth of Forth.

The above orders apply to vessels proceeding to *any* port in the Firth of Forth, whether to the eastward of Inch Keith or not.

(2) MORAY FIRTH. All vessels bound to Cromarty or Inverness must call for a pilot at Wick or Burghhead.

Outgoing vessels are to discharge their pilots at one or the other of these places.

It is dangerous for any vessel to be under way to the south-westward of a line joining Findhorn and Tarbetness without a pilot.

(3) SCAPA FLOW. All entrances are dangerous and entry is absolutely prohibited by any of them except as provided in succeeding paragraphs.

Examination services have been established in the entrances to Hoxa and Hoy sounds: vessels wishing to enter must communicate with the Examination vessel and follow the instructions received from her very carefully.

No vessel is permitted to approach the entrance to Hoxa sound within a radius of 5 miles under any circumstances whatever, except when actually bound to Scapa Flow. Vessels bound to Kirkwall should proceed direct to that port.

The only vessels permitted to enter Hoy sound from the westward are those bound for Stromness: vessels cannot enter Scapa Flow from Stromness.

Vessels are not permitted to enter Hoxa or Hoy sounds by night.

Passage through Cantick sound is entirely prohibited.

ENGLAND, SOUTH COAST.

Notice is hereby given that, under the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, the following orders with regard to the undermentioned areas have been made, and are now in force:—

(1) *Beachy head to St. Albans head—Restrictions regarding Trading, Fishing and Pleasure craft.*

1. Area A.—Enclosed by a line from Beachy head to Owers Light-vessel to Boulder Bank buoy, thence north-west (true) to the Portsmouth Defence area.

Area B.—Enclosed by a line from Culver cliff to a point 3 miles east (true) of Culver cliff, thence within the 3-mile limit to a point 3 miles south (true) of Freshwater Gate, thence to Freshwater Gate.

Area C.—Enclosed by a line joining Christchurch head to St. Albans head.

2. The term craft as used herein includes ships, barges, boats and vessels of all descriptions, and the orders apply to all fishing and pleasure craft.

3. No craft are to go out in specified areas between sunset and sunrise.

4. All craft from places within these areas are to be on shore or back in their harbour half an hour after sunset.

5. No craft are to put to sea during fog or thick weather, and any caught at sea by fog, &c., are to return to shore or harbour at once, if possible.

6. Craft unable to return to harbour owing to failing wind or fog, &c., are to anchor and show the regulation anchor lights at night. No bright lights are permitted.

7. Fishing is permitted by all *bonâ fide* fishermen in sailing craft, provided they are in possession of a permit which can be obtained from their District Fishery officers. When applying for these permits, they are to state the port from which they intend to work and this will be entered on the permit.

8. All fishing craft mentioned in paragraph 7 above, must carry either their permit number or their registered number painted on each bow in figures not less than 12 inches in height.

9. Fishing is absolutely prohibited for all steam fishing vessels.

10. Craft found after dark in the areas detailed in paragraph 1 above are liable to be fired upon.

11. No craft are to proceed to sea with any petrol, motor oil, heavy oil, &c., on board with the exception that:—

(i) Traders and all other craft may carry oil, petrol, motor spirit, &c., in bulk, barrels, or as stores for the equipment or navigation of the vessel, provided that the goods are properly pre-entered and that clearance is obtained from the Customs Officials in accordance with the Customs War Powers Act, 1915, paragraphs 1 to 3.

(ii) Sailing vessels may not have on board a quantity of petrol, motor spirit, benzine, paraffin, petroleum, or similar substances, exceeding 2 gallons.

12. Owners of motor craft, pleasure craft, and small craft of all descriptions, are to supply to the Coastguard Officer of the District lists of all their boats and vessels which they may place afloat, and they are to obtain from him permits for them. Without such permits these craft are not to be used. The number of the permit is to be painted on either bow in figures not less than 12 inches in height.

13. Motor craft, pleasure craft, and small craft of all descriptions are not to proceed outside of their ports, creeks or rivers, during the hours of official day, unless in possession of a permit which may be obtained from a Customs Official on personal application, or (in places where there is no Customs Official) from the Coastguard Officer of that district.

14. The areas within which pleasure craft with permits may move during daylight are as follows, and they are forbidden to move in any other areas:—

Newhaven: Within one mile of *occulting* light at entrance.

Brighton and Hove: Within one mile of *fixed* light on western pier.

New Shoreham: Within one mile of high *occulting* light.

Worthing: Within one mile of *fixed* light on pier.

Littlehampton: Within one mile of *fixed* red light at entrance.

Bognor: Within one mile of *green* fishing light.

Sandown bay: Inside the line joining Culver cliff and Dunnose head.

Ventnor: Within one mile of Ventnor pier.

Christchurch: Inside the entrance to Christchurch harbour.

Christchurch head to Sandbanks: Within 400 yards of low water mark.

Poole harbour: Within the line joining North and South Havens.

Studland bay: From opposite Studland village to the Old Breakwater within 400 yards of low water mark.

Swanage bay: To the west of the line joining Ballard and Peverill points.

15. No excursion traffic is allowed except with the written permission of the Commander-in-Chief, to be obtained for the season in regard to standing excursions, and on each occasion for special excursions.

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16. Nothing in these orders shall affect the standing orders relating to the Defence Areas at Newhaven, Portsmouth and Poole.

(2) *Portland Harbour Approach—Restriction of Navigation; Caution re Target Practice.*

Former Notice.—No. 258 of 1915; hereby cancelled.

(a) Restriction of Navigation:

Caution.—(i) No vessels or boats of any description are to move in the area north of a line joining Portland Bill with St. Albans head, by day or night, unless proceeding into Weymouth anchorage.

(ii) No vessels or boats of any description are to move in the area north of a line joining Portland Bill with Hopes Nose between sunset and sunrise.

No vessels or boats of any description are to put to sea in this prohibited area during fog, and any caught at sea by fog are to return to shore or harbour at once.

Vessels or boats found in this area after dark are liable to be fired upon.

(b) Caution re Target practice:

Caution.—Target practice will take place, without further notice, from ships lying in Portland harbour, and it will therefore be dangerous henceforth for vessels to enter the following area:—

Limits of dangerous area:

(i) *On the North.*—By a line drawn in a 97° (S. 67° E. Mag.) direction from the north end of the outer breakwater until St. Albans head bears 18° (N. 34° E. Mag.).

(ii) *On the South.*—By a line drawn in a 119° (S. 45° E. Mag.) direction from the south end of the outer breakwater until St. Albans head bears 18° (N. 34° E. Mag.).

(iii) *On the East.*—By a line joining the eastern extremities of limits (a) and (b).

(iv) *On the West.*—By Portland outer breakwater.
