Warfaw, Ollober 26. The King of Poland continues full at Zolkiew. The Circular Letters are fent out for the fummoning of a General Dyet, to meet here on the 20th of December. The Forces of this Crown are connect, and marched to their Quarters, and the Generals are come to Limberg, where they are to hold a Council of War to Comider about providing for their Subhiftence during the Winter.

From General Veterani's Camp at Kapalnas on the Frontiers of Tianfilvania, October 25. After we had lain some time at Lugos we received addice that a Body of Turks and Tartars was marched rowards the River Maros, upon which we decamped on the 18th, and came on the 21th to this place; The design of our several Marches and Encampnions being, according to the account we had of the Enemis Motions, to Cover the Principality of Transitionania against their Incustions. Since our coming hydrer, we understand that the Enemy, after having plugatered and burnt 14 or 15 Villages about Debrecam, are returned to Temesurer; and that from thence the Tartars intend to gohome, and the Furks to their Winter-Quarters; which has made our General resolve to separate his sources likewise, and to send them to the several Garistons in Transituania where they are to Winter.

Vienna, November 7. All the Advices from the Turk kish Frontiers say, that the Grand Visier is returned too wards Advianople, having lest a strong Garisson in Belgrade, and posted several thousand Men along the Saves. The General Count de Hardripheira is arrived at Osfin or Budas to adjust Matters with the Deputies of the States of Hungary about the Substitence of the Imperial Forces in their Winter-Quarters. The Imperial Court is returned hither from Neuslades.

tell us, that new Levies are making for the E-lector of Brandenburgh, within his own Territories. The Electoral Prince of Hanouer passed through Minden on the 11th Instant in his return home from the Campagne in Flanders.

Hague, Nov. 20. N. S. They write from Paris, that the People there suffer extreamly through the scarcity of Corn, which occasions a great cry among them; infomuch that fome Commotion is feared: The French King to appeale them of-

fers 80 thousand Crowns a month to provide Bread for the poorer fort, but double this Sum will not fuffice; The first President of the Parliament is ordered to seek out some Expedient to remedy this growing Evil; which he finds very difficult to do; belides Money becomes very scarce in France, and their Commerce is quite ruined. The City of Paris, to comply with the Kings demand, has promifed to furnish Five Millions of Livres, and they are going to raise it by a Poll-Tax. The Letters from Basil of the 8th Instant fay, they had advice from Piedmon that the French had quitted their delign against-Coni, the heavy Cannon that was brought to Saluffes, as they gave out, for that Siege, being fent back to Pignerol.
