THE PUBLIC HEALTH ACTS AMEND-MENT ACT, 1907.

To all whom it may concern.

NOTICE is hereby given, that the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the County Borough of Swansea (hereinafter referred to as "the Local Authority") have applied to the Local Government Board for an Order declaring certain Parts and Sections of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907, to be in force in the District of the Local Authority (hereinafter referred to as "the district"), and that the Local Government Board have, in pursuance of their powers in that behalf and by an Order, dated the 15th July, 1915, ordered and declared as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—(1) On and after the day on which the Order comes into operation, sections 16, 17, 19, 20, 22, 23, 30, 31, and 33, comprised in Part II; sections 34, 35, 36, 37, 38, 39, 40, 41, 42, 44, 45, 46, 48, 49, 50, and 51, comprised in Part III; sections 53, 55, 57, 58, 59, 60, 62, 63, 64, 65, 67, and 68, comprised in Part IV; Part V; Part VI; and Part X of the Act of 1907 shall be in force in the district.

(2) Where a section to which reference is made in the first column of the First Schedule to the Order is a section comprised in Part V, Part VI, or Part X, or is one of the sections by subdivision (1) of this Article described as comprised in Part II, Part III, or Part IV, and declared to be in force, the section shall be in force in the district subject to the conditions and adaptations mentioned in the First Schedule to the Order, unless and until the Local Government Board by a further Order otherwise declare, specify and direct.

ARTICLE II.—(1) On and after the date of the confirmation of any bye-laws made by the Local Authority under the Public Health Acts, 1875 to 1907, with respect to the matters mentioned in section 92 of the Act of 1907, section 144 of the Swansea Improvement Act, 1844, so far as the said section relates to any subjectmatter of bye-laws authorised by section 92 of the Act of 1907, and section 107 of the Swansea Corporation Act, 1889, shall be no longer in force in the district.

- (2) On and after the date on which the Order comes into operation section 119 of the Swansea Improvement Act of 1844, sections 61, 62, 67, 90, 97 and 99 of the Swansea Corporation Act, 1889, and section 95 of the Swansea Corporation Act, 1902, shall be no longer in force in the district.
- (3) Where an enactment in a Swansea Local Act, other than an enactment specified in Article II. (2) hereof contains provisions which alter, amend, apply or otherwise relate to an enactment so specified, those provisions, to the extent to which they are inconsistent with any section or part to which Article I. of the Order applies, shall not be in force in the district on and after the day upon which that enactment in pursuance of subdivision (1) or subdivision (2), as the case may be, of this Article ceases to be in force in the district.

ARTICLE III.—Within the period of three weeks immediately following the date of the Order, or where, in the opinion of the Local Government Board, the circumstances so require, within such later period as they by Order prescribe, the Local Authority shall cause the Order to be published by advertising the same once at least in one or more of the

newspapers circulating in the district, and shall also cause a statement of the effect of the Order to be published in the London Gazette.

ARTICLE IV.—The Order shall come into operation on the 2nd September, 1915.

Part II. Section Thirty.

"Nothing in this section shall apply to any wall or other structure in so far as the same is used either for the support of any street or public foot-path, or for the protection of any street or public footpath from damage or obstruction, by reason of the surface of the street or footpath being above or below the level of the surface of the adjoining land, unless the wall or other structure was built after the street or footpath became a highway repairable by the inhabitants at large by or at the expense of a person other than the highway authority responsible for the repair of the street or footpath."

Part III. Section Thirtyfive.

"Nothing in this section shall render a person liable to a penalty in respect of a nuisance in relation to the construction of any such cistern as is described in this section, where the cistern has been so constructed as to comply with any regulation of the local authority in force in the district, unless the local authority can show that the said person received and reoffer jected \mathbf{their} bear one-half of the expenses of all necessary work of alteration or

new construction.
"This section, so far as it relates to the deposit of material, shall have effect subject to the first proviso to section ninety-one of the Public Health Act, 1875.

"Bye-laws made in pursuance of section sixteen of the Local Government Act, 1888, for the prevention and suppression of nuisances shall not, in relation to any subject-matter of this section, be of any force or effect within the district."

Section Thirtyeight. "Nothing in this section shall prejudicially affect any power or right exerciseable by or attaching to an owner or occupier of premises by virtue of section twenty-two of the Public Health Act, 1875, or of section eighteen of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1890."

Part IV. Section Fiftynine.

"(6) Nothing in this section shall apply to a public or circulating library which is not within the district."

Part V. Section Seventyfive.

"(3) The date of the Order of the Local Government Board by which this Part is declared to be in force shall be the beginning of the period within which the local authority shall give notice for the purposes of sub-section (1) of this section."

Part VI. Section Seventysix.

"(5) So long as there remains in force any provision contained in sections 69, 70, 71, 72, and 73 of the Swansea Corporation Act, 1902, which is similar to a provision in any of the paragraphs (d), (e), (f), (g), (h), or (i) of sub-section (1) of this section, no effect shall be given to the provision in such paragraph."

Part X. Section Ninety-two.

"Nothing in any Local Act shall affect the making or confirmation of any bye-laws under this section; and on and after the date of the confirmation of bye-laws under this section the power of enforcing bye-laws with respect to any subjectmatter of this section shall, so far as that power is conferred by a Local Act, cease to be exerciseable."
