Regimental No.	Rank.	Name.	Corps.	Action for which commended.
8790	Private ...	Robinson, H. ...	1st Battalion, Highland Light Infantry	For gallant conduct and devotion to duty on the 27th April, 1915, near Ypres, when he constantly carried messages under heavy shell fire from the firing line to the support.
7145	Serjeant (Acting Company Serjeant-Major)	Robinson, I. ...	1st Battalion, Northumberland Fusiliers	For conspicuous gallantry on 16th June, 1915, at Hooge. When all his Officers had become casualties he took command of the parties of men of various regiments in the trench and handled them with ability, although himself wounded.
1031	Corporal ...	Rogers, J. N. ...	Royal Flying Corps ...	For conspicuous gallantry on the 10th May, 1915, when he was acting as Gunner with an Officer Pilot in the neighbourhood of Lille. A German aeroplane, armed with a machine-gun, was attacked at a height of about 10,000 ft.; the hostile pilot was hit, and his aeroplane dived, but was followed and the fight continued until at an altitude of about 1,500 feet; it turned on its back and fell to the ground.
3822	Private ...	Ross, A. ...	2nd Battalion, Scots Guards	For gallant conduct on the 16th-18th May, 1915, at Festubert, in carrying messages through the Germans under a heavy fire. He showed conspicuous courage and devotion to duty.
1442	Private ...	Sagar, N. H. ...	18th County of London Battalion, The London Regiment (London Irish Rifles) (T.F.)	For conspicuous gallantry on the night of 25th-26th May, 1915, at Givenchy. The telephone line having been cut near the Keep, he went out and repaired the wire, although at the time exposed to a very heavy shell fire. He also repeatedly took messages across the courtyard of the Keep, while shells were bursting in and around it.
633	Lance-Corporal	Salter, H. ...	Military Mounted Police	For great bravery and consistent good work from the 9th to 28th May, 1915, near Ypres. He was employed, both day and night, in collecting stragglers, directing traffic, and collecting war material. During the 24th May he assisted to places of safety several hundred men, who were suffering from gas poison. Most of the time, and especially on the 24th and 25th May, the town was being heavily shelled.
45928	Bombardier	Samuels, J. E. W.	9th Battery, Royal Field Artillery	For conspicuous gallantry on the 9th May, and between the 16th and 20th May, 1915, near Rue du Bois, when he maintained communication between the Observing Station and the Battery by continually repairing the wires, whenever cut, and laying new lines under constant and heavy shell fire. The observing party were shelled out of three stations.
5628	Serjeant ...	Sanders, A. ...	1st Battalion, Liverpool Regiment	For conspicuous gallantry on 21st June, 1915, at Cuinchy. He entered a mine full of poison gas a second time (having failed in the first effort), and, after traversing the deadly fumes for a distance of 115 yards, he succeeded in rescuing four of his comrades.
1481	Corporal (Acting Serjeant)	Sargent, J. E. ...	108th Heavy Battery, Royal Garrison Artillery	For conspicuous gallantry and ability throughout the campaign, especially at Ypres on the 5th and 24th May, and 16th June, 1915, when he repaired the wires repeatedly under shell fire. He has rendered excellent service in keeping up communication between the Battery and the Observation Station since the commencement of the war.
