The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by Section 16 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, as amended by the Pluralities Act, 1850, it is, amongst other things, enacted, "That whenever it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, with respect to his own Diocese, and whenever it shall be represented to him by the Bishop of any Diocese, or by the Bishops of any two Dioceses, that two or more Benefices, or that one or more Benefice or Benefices, and one or more Spiritual Sinecure Rectory or Rectories, Vicarage or Vicarages, in his or their Diocese or Dioceses, being either in the same Parish or contiguous to each other, and of which the aggregate Population shall not exceed 1,500 Persons, may, with advantage to the interests of Religion, be united into one Benefice, the said Archbishop of the Province shall inquire into the circumstances of the case; and if on such Inquiry it shall appear to him that such union may be usefully made, and will not be of inconvenient extent, and that the Patron or Patrons of the said Benefices, Sinecure Rectory or Rectories, Vicarage or Vicarages respectively, is or are consenting thereto, such

Consent being signified in writing under the hands of such Patron or Patrons, the said Archbishop shall, 6 weeks before certifying such Inquiry and Consent to His Majesty as hereinafter directed, cause, with respect to his own Diocese, a Statement in Writing of the facts, and in other cases a Copy in Writing of the aforesaid Representation, to be affixed on or near the principal outer door of the Church, or in some public and conspicuous place in each of such Benefices, Sinecure Rectories, or Vicarages, with Notice to any Person or Persons interested that he, she, or they, may, within such 6 weeks, show cause in writing under his, her, or their hand or hands, to the said Archbishop, against such union; and if no sufficient cause be shown within such time, the said Archbishop shall certify the Inquiry and Consent aforesaid to His Majesty in Council, and thereupon it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to make and issue an Order or Orders for uniting such Benefices, Sinecure Rectory or Rectories, Vicarage or Vicarages, into one Benefice, with Cure of Souls, for ecclesiastical purposes only:

And whereas the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, pursuant to the provisions of the said Acts, hath duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Certificate in Writing, bearing date the 30th day

of January, in the year of our Lord 1915, in the words following:—

“We, Randall Thomas, Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury, Primate of All England and Metropolitan, do hereby certify to Your Majesty in Council:

“That the Right Reverend Bertram, Lord Bishop of Norwich, as Bishop of the Diocese within which are situate the Rectory of East Lexham, and the Rectory of West Lexham, both in the County of Norfolk, having represented unto us that the said Benefices are contiguous to each other, and of which the aggregate population does not exceed 1,500 persons, might, with advantage to the interests of religion, be united into one Benefice, we inquired into the circumstances of the case:

“That on such Inquiry it appeared to us that such union might be usefully made, and would not be of inconvenient extent, and that Augustus Leverton Jessop, being the Patron or person entitled to present to the Rectory of East Lexham (if the same were now vacant), and also to the Rectory of West Lexham (the same being now vacant), has consented to the proposed union:

“That 6 weeks and upwards before certifying such Inquiry and Consent to Your Majesty in Council we caused a Copy in Writing of the aforesaid Representation of the said Lord Bishop to be affixed to the principal outer door of the Parish Church of each of the said Benefices, with notice to any person or persons interested that he, she, or they, might, within such 6 weeks, show cause in writing under his, her, or their hand or hands, to us, the said Archbishop, against such union, and no such cause has been shown:

“The Representation of the said Lord Bishop of Norwich, our Inquiry into the circumstances of the case, the Statement of Circumstances in reply thereto, the Consent in Writing of the said Patron, and the copies of the Representation and Notices before mentioned, are hereunto annexed:

“And we do hereby certify the Inquiry and Consent aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council, to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may, in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do, make and issue an Order for uniting the said Benefices into one Benefice with Cure of Souls for ecclesiastical purposes only.

“RANDALL, CANTUAR.”

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the Rectory of East Lexham, situate in the County of Norfolk, and Diocese of Norwich, and the Rectory of West Lexham, situate in the same County and Diocese, shall be united into one Benefice with Cure of Souls for ecclesiastical purposes only.

WHEREAS by Section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, after reciting that “Whereas in some instances Tithings, Hamlets, Chapeltries, and other Places or Districts

may be separated from the Parishes or Mother Churches to which they belong, with great advantage, and Places altogether extra-parochial may, in some instances, with advantage be annexed to Parishes or Districts to which they are contiguous, or be constituted separate Parishes for ecclesiastical purposes,” it is, amongst other things, enacted, “That when with respect to his own Diocese it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or when the Bishop of any Diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop, that any such Tithing, Hamlet, Chapelry, Place or District within the Diocese of such Archbishop, or the Diocese of such Bishop, as the case may be, may be advantageously separated from any Parish or Mother Church, and either be constituted a separate Benefice by itself, or be united to any other Parish to which it may be more conveniently annexed, or to any other adjoining Tithing, Hamlet, Chapelry, Place, or District, parochial or extra-parochial, so as to form a separate Parish or Benefice, or that any Extra-Parochial Place may with advantage be annexed to any Parish to which it is contiguous, or be constituted a separate Parish for ecclesiastical purposes; and the said Archbishop, or Bishop, shall draw up a Scheme in Writing (the Scheme of such Bishop to be transmitted to the said Archbishop for his consideration) describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alteration may best be effected, and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent charges, and other ecclesiastical dues, rates, and payments, and in respect to patronage and rights to pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested; and if the Patron or Patrons of the Benefice or Benefices to be affected by such alteration shall consent in writing under his or their Hands to such Scheme, or to such modification thereof, as the said Archbishop may approve, and the said Archbishop shall, on full consideration and inquiry, be satisfied with any such Scheme, or modification thereof, and shall certify the same and such Consent as aforesaid, by his Report to His Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to make an Order for carrying such Scheme, or modification thereof, as the case may be, into effect.”

And whereas the Right Reverend Charles Gore, Lord Bishop of Oxford, hath made a Representation in writing, dated the 10th day of May, 1915, to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, as follows:—

“I, Charles Gore, by Divine Permission Lord Bishop of Oxford, do, in pursuance of the 26th Section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, hereby represent to your Grace as follows:—

“There is in the County of Berks, and my Diocese of Oxford, the Vicarage of Cumnor, the Parish whereof, containing a population of 1,103 or thereabouts, has a Church accommodating 300 persons:

“The net annual value of the said Benefice is £261 Os. Od. or thereabouts:

“There is also in the said County and Diocese the Vicarage of North Hinksey, the Parish whereof, containing a population of 657 or thereabouts, has a Church accommodating 160 persons:

“The net annual value of the said Benefice is £221 Os. Od. or thereabouts:

"There is also in the said County and Diocese the Perpetual Curacy of Wootton, the Parish whereof, containing a population of 470 or thereabouts, has a Church accommodating 150 persons:

"The net annual value of the said Benefice is £200 Os. Od. or thereabouts:

"A certain portion of the said Parish of Cumnor (described in the Scheme hereto annexed) lies at a distance of about 2 miles from the Parish Church of Cumnor, and within 1 mile of the Parish Church of North Hinksey; it is intended that a new Church shall be built upon the said portion near Elms Farm to serve the District:

"A certain other portion of the said Parish of Cumnor (described in the Scheme hereto annexed) lies at a distance of about 2 miles from the Parish Church of Cumnor, and about 1 mile from the Parish Church of Wootton:

"It appears to me that under the provisions of the said Pluralities Act, 1838, the said two portions of Cumnor may be advantageously separated therefrom, and annexed to the said contiguous Parishes of North Hinksey and Wootton respectively:

"The Benefice of Cumnor is in the Patronage of The Honourable Osbert William Craven, of Ashdown Park, in the said County of Berks, and The Reverend Arthur Dudley Wilkinson is the present Incumbent thereof:

"The Benefice of North Hinksey is in the Patronage of myself as Bishop of Oxford, and The Reverend Osborne Mills Jones is the present Incumbent thereof:

"The Benefice of Wootton is in the Patronage of the said Honourable Osbert William Craven, and The Reverend William John Francis Keatley Stride is the present Incumbent thereof:

"Pursuant to the directions contained in the said 26th Section of the first-mentioned Act of Parliament, I, the said Lord Bishop, have drawn up a Scheme in writing, annexed to this Representation, describing the portions so as aforesaid proposed to be annexed to the several Parishes of North Hinksey, and Wootton, and the mode in which it appears to me the alterations may be best effected, and how the changes consequent thereon in respect of ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent-charges, and other ecclesiastical dues, rates, and payments, and in respect to patronage and rights to pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested; and I hereby submit the same to your Grace, together with the Consents in writing of the said Patrons and Incumbents, to the intent that, if your Grace shall on full consideration and inquiry be satisfied with such Scheme, you may certify the same and such Consents to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop of Oxford and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

"SCHEME.

"That the portion of the said Parish of Cumnor hereinbefore referred to, which is shown on the Map hereto annexed, and is thereon coloured blue, and which lies, as to part thereof, to the north of the Oxford and Witney Main Road, and to the east of the Private Road leading from such 'Main Road' to Tilbury Farm, and, as to the remaining part thereof, to the south of the Oxford and Faringdon Main Road and to the east of an imaginary straight line starting from a point immediately opposite the footpath from the Oxford and Faringdon Main Road to Hutchcomb's Farm, and thence from such last-mentioned point in a south-easterly direction past Hutchcomb's Farm to the extreme western point of the present boundary of North Hinksey, shall be separated from the said Parish of Cumnor and annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the adjoining Parish of North Hinksey, such portion being bounded on the north by the Parish of Binsey, and on the east by the Parish of North Hinksey.

"That the other portion of the said Parish of Cumnor hereinbefore referred to, which is shown on the Map hereto annexed, and is thereon coloured yellow, and which lies to the east of an imaginary line drawn from the extreme western point of the Parish of North Hinksey to the extreme northern point of the Parish of Wootton, shall be separated from the said Parish of Cumnor and annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the adjoining Parish of Wootton.

"That the Incumbent of North Hinksey shall have the sole and exclusive Cure of Souls within the said two portions so annexed to North Hinksey.

"That the Incumbent of Wootton shall have the sole and exclusive Cure of Souls within the said portion so annexed to Wootton.

"That the Inhabitants of such portions, so separated as aforesaid, shall be entitled to accommodation in the Churches of the Parishes to which the said portions shall be respectively annexed, and in common with the Parishioners of those Parishes, and shall not henceforth be entitled to any accommodation in the Churches of the Parishes from which such portions shall be separated, except nevertheless any person or persons (if any) possessing a legal right by Faculty or otherwise to any pew or sitting in the last-mentioned Churches, and who may not be willing to relinquish or give up the same.

"That marriages, baptisms, churchings, burials, and other ecclesiastical offices shall be solemnized and performed for the Inhabitants of such portions so separated as aforesaid in the Churches of the Parishes to which they shall be annexed, and that the Fees for all such offices, and all such other ecclesiastical dues, offerings, and emoluments, usually payable to the Incumbent of a Benefice, as shall arise or become payable within or in respect of each of such portions shall henceforth belong to the Incumbent of the Parish to which each shall respectively be annexed.

"That no other alterations shall be made in

respect of the emoluments of the said Benefices of Cumnor, North Hinksey, or Wootton.

"That no alteration shall be made in the Patronage of the said Benefices, or any or either of them."

" CONSENTS.

"We, the Right Reverend Charles Gore, Lord Bishop of Oxford, by virtue of our Bishopric the Patron or person entitled to present or nominate to the Benefice of North Hinksey, (in case the same were now vacant), The Reverend Osborne Mills Jones, the Incumbent of the same Benefice, The Honourable Osbert William Craven, the Patron or person entitled to present or nominate to the Benefices of Cumnor and Wootton, (in case the same, or either of them, were now vacant), The Reverend Arthur Dudley Wilkinson, and the Reverend William John Francis Keatley Stride, the respective Incumbents of the same Benefices, do hereby respectively signify to your Grace our several Consents to the Scheme above proposed, and to every matter and thing therein contained.

"In witness whereof we have hereunto set our hands this 21st day of April, 1915.

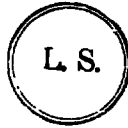

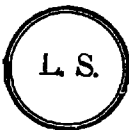

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

No. 667 of the year 1915.
ENGLAND, SOUTH COAST.

Former Notice.—No. 550 of 1915; hereby cancelled.

Notice is hereby given that, under the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, the following orders with regard to the undermentioned areas have been made, and are now in force:—

(1) *Beachy head to St. Albans head—Restrictions regarding Trading, Fishing and Pleasure craft.*

1. Area A.—Enclosed by a line from Beachy head to Owers Light-vessel to Boulder Bank buoy, thence north-west (true) to the Portsmouth Defence area.

Area B.—Enclosed by a line from Culver cliff to a point 3 miles east (true) of Culver cliff, thence within the 3-mile limit to a

point 3 miles south (true) of Freshwater Gate, thence to Freshwater Gate.

Area C.—Enclosed by a line joining Christchurch head to St. Albans head.

2. The term craft as used herein includes ships, barges, boats and vessels of all descriptions, and the orders apply to all fishing and pleasure craft.

3. No craft are to go out in specified areas between sunset and sunrise.

4. All craft from places within these areas are to be on shore or back in their harbour half an hour after sunset.

5. No craft are to put to sea during fog or thick weather, and any caught at sea by fog, &c., are to return to shore or harbour at once, if possible.

6. Craft unable to return to harbour owing to failing wind or fog, &c., are to anchor and show the regulation anchor lights at night. No bright lights are permitted.

7. Fishing is permitted by all *bond fide* fishermen in sailing craft, provided they are in possession of a permit which can be obtained from their District Fishery officers. When applying for these permits, they are to state the port from which they intend to work, and this will be entered on the permit.

8. All fishing craft mentioned in paragraph 7 above must carry either their permit number or their registered number painted on each bow in figures not less than 12 inches in height.

9. Fishing is absolutely prohibited for all steam fishing vessels.

10. Craft found after dark in the areas detailed in paragraph 1 above are liable to be fired upon.

11. No craft are to proceed to sea with any petrol, motor oil, heavy oil, &c., on board with the exception that:—

(i) Traders and all other craft may carry oil, petrol, motor spirit, &c., in bulk, barrels, or as stores for the equipment or navigation of the vessel, provided that the goods are properly pre-entered and that clearance is obtained from the Customs Officials in accordance with the Customs War Powers Act, 1915, paragraphs 1 to 3.

(ii) Sailing vessels may not have on board a quantity of petrol, motor spirit, benzine, paraffin, petroleum, or similar substances, exceeding 2 gallons.

12. Owners of motor craft, pleasure craft, and small craft of all descriptions, are to supply to the Coastguard Officer of the District lists of all their boats and vessels which they may place afloat, and they are to obtain from him permits for them. Without such permits these craft are not to be used. The number of the permit is to be painted on either bow in figures not less than 12 inches in height.

13. Motor craft, pleasure craft, and small craft of all descriptions are not to proceed outside of their ports, creeks or rivers, during the hours of official day, unless in possession of a permit which may be obtained from a Customs Official on personal application, or (in places where there is no Customs Official) from the Coastguard Officer of that district.

14. The areas within which pleasure craft with permits may move during daylight are as follows, and they are forbidden to move in any other areas:—

Newhaven: Within one mile of *occulting* light at entrance.

Brighton and Hove: Within one mile of *fixed* light on western pier.

New Shoreham: Within one mile of high *occulting* light.

Worthing: Within one mile of *fixed* light on pier.

Littlehampton: Within one mile of *fixed red* light at entrance.

Bognor: Within one mile of *green* fishing light.

Sandown bay: Inside the line joining Culver cliff and Dunnose head.

Ventnor: Within one mile of Ventnor pier.

Christchurch: Inside the entrance to Christchurch harbour.

Christchurch head to Sandbanks: Within 400 yards of low water mark.

Poole harbour: Within the line joining North and South Havens.

Studland bay: From opposite Studland village to the Old Breakwater within 400 yards of low water mark.

Swanage bay: To the west of the line joining Ballard and Peverill points.

15. No excursion traffic is allowed except with the written permission of the Commander-in-Chief, to be obtained for the season in regard to standing excursions, and on each occasion for special excursions.

16. Nothing in these orders shall affect the standing orders relating to the Defence Areas at Newhaven, Portsmouth and Poole.

(2) *Portland harbour approach—Restriction of Navigation; Target practice temporarily discontinued.*

(a) Restriction of Navigation:

Caution.—(i) No vessels or boats of any description are to move in the area north of a line joining Portland Bill with St. Albans head, by day or night, unless proceeding into Weymouth anchorage.

(ii) No vessels or boats of any description are to move in the area north of a line joining Portland Bill with Hopes Nose between sunset and sunrise.

No vessels or boats of any description are to put to sea in this prohibited area during fog, and any caught at sea by fog are to return to shore or harbour at once.

Vessels or boats found in this area after dark are liable to be fired upon.

(b) *Target practice temporarily discontinued:*

Details.—Target practice from ships lying in Portland harbour, referred to in the former Notice quoted above, will be discontinued until further notice.

Note.

This Notice is a repetition of Notice No. 550 of 1915, with the exception that Target practice, as mentioned in section (2) (b), has been temporarily discontinued.
