WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 8th day of August, 1915, in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas His late Majesty was graciously pleased, by His Order in Council bearing date the 18th day of October, 1909, to extend the opportunity of attaining Warrant Rank to the Writer and Ship's Steward Classes by establishing the Warrant Ranks of Warrant Writer and Head Steward:

"And whereas we consider it desirable that these two Classes should be enabled to attain

Commissioned Warrant Rank, and that the initial rate of pay for Warrant Writers and Head Stewards should be improved, and the number of posts allowed increased:

"And whereas we further consider that the title of Head Steward should be changed to

Warrant Steward:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that
Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by
Your Order in Council, to sanction the pro-

posals contained in the annexed schedule.
"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's
Treasury have signified their concurrence in
these proposals."

"SCHEDULE.

" WRITER CLASS.

"Commissioned Warrant Rank to be established with the title of Commissioned Writer.

"The scale of pay to be as follows:—

On promotion 11s. a day, with subsequent biennial increments of 6d. a day to a maximum of 13s

"Pension, pensions for hurts and wounds, widows' pensions, and compassionate allowances to children, to be granted on the scales laid down for and under the conditions applicable to Chief Artificer Engineers.

"The pay of Warrant Writers for the first five years of service to be increased from 7s. to

7s. 6d. a day.

"SHIP'S STEWARD CLASS.

"Commissioned Warrant Rank to be established with the title of Commissioned Steward.

"The scales of pay, pension, etc., to be as provided above for Commissioned Writers. The title of Head Steward to be altered to

Warrant Steward.

"The pay of Warrant Stewards for the first five years of service to be increased from Ss. to 8s. 6d. a day.

" NUMBERS.

"During hostilities the numbers of Com-issioned Writers, Commissioned Stewards, missioned Warrant Writers, and Warrant Stewards, to be fixed by us subject to the approval of the Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions

herein accordingly.

HEREAS by the Medical Act, 1886, it is provided (amongst other things) that His Majesty may, from time to time, by Order in Council, declare that the Second Part of the said Act shall be deemed, on and after a day to be named in such Order, to apply to any British Possession which, in the opinion of His Majesty, affords to the Registered Medical Practitioners of the United Kingdom such privileges of practising in the said British Possession as to His Majesty may seem just; and that from and after the day named in such Order in Council such British Possession shall be deemed to be a British Possession to which the said Act applies, within the meaning of the said Second Part thereof, but that until such Order in Council has been made in respect of any British Possession the said Second Part of the said Act shall not be deemed to apply to any such Possession:

And whereas, by the Medical Act (1886) Amendment Act, 1905, it is provided that for the purposes of the Medical Act, 1886, where any part of a British Possession is under a Central and also under a Local Legislature, His Majesty may, if He thinks fit, by Order in Council, declare that the part which is under the Local Legislature shall be deemed a separate British Possession:

And whereas the Province of Ontario, in the Dominion of Canada, is under a Central and

also under a Local Legislature:

And whereas the said Province of Ontario affords, in His Majesty's opinion, to the Registered Medical Practitioners of the United Kingdom such privileges of practising in the said Province as to His Majesty seem just:

Now, therefore, His Majesty doth hereby,. by and with the advice of His Privy Council, order and declare that the Province of Ontario,. in the Dominion of Canada, shall be deemed a separate British Possession, and that the Second Part of the Medical Act, 1886, shall be deemed, as from the date of this Order, to apply to the said Province of Ontario.

WHEREAS by the Isle of Man (War Legis-V lation) Act, 1914, His Majesty has power to extend to the Isle of Man any Act which, in the opinion of His Majesty, was passed for the purpose of meeting any emergency created by the present War, subject to-adaptations for the purpose of making the Act applicable to the Isle of Man:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Maintenance of Live Stock Act, 1915, shall extend to the Isle of Man, adapted as set out in the-

Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

Power to Make Orders for the Maintenance of Stock.

- 1.—(1) The Lieutenant-Governor may, for the purpose of maintaining a sufficient stock: of animals to which this Act applies, by Order applicable to the Isle of Man, or any part thereof-
 - (a) prohibit or restrict the slaughter of animals;
 - (b) prohibit or restrict the sale or exposure for sale of meat of immature animals which has not been imported;
 - (c) authorize any Officer of the Government or Loc-1 Government Board or of a Local Authority to enter any slaughterhouse or other premises on which animals are. slaughtered for human food and examine any animals or carcases therein;

(d) prohibit or restrict the movement of animals out of any area in which theslaughter of such animals is prohibited or

restricted :

(e) revoke, extend, or vary any Order so made.

(2) The animals to which this Act applies are cattle, sheep, and swine.

Offences.

2. If any person acts in contravention of or fails to comply with any of the provisions of an. Order made under this Act, or obstructs, or impedes any Officer in the execution of his powers or duties under any such Order, he shall, on conviction before a High Bailiff or two Justices of the Peace, be liable to a fine not exceeding £20, or, if the offence is an offence committed with respect to more than four animals, to a fine not exceeding £5 for each animal.

Recovery of Penalties.

3. Any penalty imposed by this Act may be sued for and recovered in the name of the Head Constable of this Isle or in the name of any Inspector or Sergeant of Police.

Definition.

4. In this Act "Local Authority" means for the Borough of Douglas, the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the said Borough; and otherwise, the Commissioners of a Local Government District under the Local Government Act, 1886, and any Act amending the same.

Short Title and Duration.

5.—(1) This Act may be cited as "The MAINTENANCE OF LIVE STOCK (ISLE OF MAN) Act, 1915."

(2) This Act shall remain in force during the continuance of the present War, and for a period of twelve months thereafter and no longer, but the expiration of this Act and of any Order then in force shall not prejudice or affect the institution or prosecution of any proceedings for any offence committed before such expiration.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 1st day of July, in the year 1915, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a Sevarate District for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the New Parish (sometime Chapelry District) of All Saints, Elton, partly out of the New Parish (sometime Chapelry District) of Saint Anne, Tottington, and partly out of the New Parish (sometime District) of Christ Church, Walshaw, all in the County of Lancaster, and in the Diocese of Manchester:

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said New Parish of All Saints, Elton, the said New Parish of Saint Anne, Tottington, and the said New Parish of Christ Church, Walshaw, are Cures wherein, or in parts whereof, the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the Inhabitants thereof, and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said New Parish of All Saints, Elton, of the said New Parish of Saint Anne, Tottington, and of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Walshaw, which are hereinafter mentioned and described, should be constituted a Separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed Separate District any Consecrated Church or Chapel in usefor the purpose of divine worship:

And whereas by a certain Indenture, bearing date on or about the 1st day of July, in the year 1915, and made or expressed to be made under the authority of the New Parishes Acts, 1843, 1844, and 1856, or some or one of them, between the Reverend John Charles Hill, Rector or Incumbent of the Rectory of the Parish of Bury, in the said County and Diocese, of the first part, The Right Honourable Edward George Villiers, Earl of Derby,... the Patron of the said Rectory of the Parish of Bury, of the second part, the Right Reverend Edmund Arbuthnott, Bishop of Manchester, the Ordinary of the said Rectory of the Parish of Bury, of the third part, and us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, of the fourth part, (which Indenture is intended to be enrolled in the Chancery Division of the High Court of Justice), the said John Charles. Hill did, with the consents of the said Edward George Villiers, Earl of Derby, as such Patron as aforesaid, and of the said Edmund Arbuthnott, Bishop of Manchester, as such Bishop as aforesaid, grant and confirm unto the Minister of the District hereinafter recommended to be constituted, and to his Successors, and when such District shall have become a New Parish, then to the Vicar or Incumbent of such New Parish, and to his Successors, one perpetual clear yearly rent-charge or net annual sum of £250, to be payable quarterly on the usual quarter days in every year free from and clear of all charges for First Fruits and Tenths, and of all deductions, taxes, charges, rates, assessments, and outgoings whatsoever, (except on account of the tax on income or property, if any), the first of such quarterly payments in respect of the said clear yearly rent-charge or net annual sum of £250 to be made on such of the said quarter days as shall happen next after the date when an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette, and to be a proportionate part of the said quarterly payment calculated from the date of the issue of the said Gazette to the said quarterly day of payment, the said yearly rent-charge to be for ever issuing and payable out of and charged upon all that the said Rectory of the Parish of Bury, and the tithes or tithe commutation rent-charges, glebe lands, hereditaments, endowments, and emoluments for the time being to the said Rectory belonging:

"And whereas the said yearly rent-charge ornet annual sum of £250 has been granted as aforesaid upon the understanding that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District, and of the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof, should be assigned in the manner hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the said John Charles Hill has nominated the Rector or Incumbent for the time being of the said Rectory of the Parish of Bury as the person to whom he desires that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District shall be assigned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Edmund Arbuthnott, Bishop of Manchester, (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said New Parish of All Saints, Elton, of the said New Parish of Saint Anne, Tottington, and of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Walshaw, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth upon the Map or Plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, become and be constituted a Separate District for spiritual purposes, and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint James, Woolfold.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said District so recommended to be constituted, and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of such New Parish, and of the nomination of an Incumbent thereto, shall, without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme, and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same, and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid, be assigned to, and be absolutely vested in, and shall and may from time to time be exercised by, the said John Charles Hill and by his Successors, Rectors or Incumbents of the said Rectory of the Parish of Bury for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measure relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint James, Woolfold, comprising: -All those contiguous portions of the New Parish (sometime Chapelry District) of All Saints, Elton, of the New Parish (sometime Chapelry District) of Saint Anne, Tottington, and of the New Parish (sometime District) of Christ Church, Walshaw, all in the County of Lancaster, and in the Diocese of Manchester, which, taken together, are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the New Parish of Saint Stephen, Elton, in the said County and Diocese, from the said New Parish of All Saints, Elton, at the junction of Wood Street with Pine Street, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Pine Street for a distance of 10½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Walshaw Road and Fenton Street, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Fenton Street for a distance of 9 chains or thereabouts to its junction

with Tottington Road and Taylor Street, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Taylor Street and in a straight line in continuation thereof for a distance in all of 8½ chains or thereaboute to a point in the middle of Woodhill Brook, and extending thence first north-westward, and then in various directions, along the middle of Woodhill Brook for a distance of 16 chains or thereabouts to the point where such brook is crossed by the boundary which divides the said New Parish of All Saints, Elton, from the said New Parish of Saint Anne, Tottington, and extending thence first north-eastward, and then generally north-westward, along the lastmentioned boundary for a distance of 50 chains or thereabouts to the point in the footpath leading from Lower Brandlesholme to Green-halgh Moss where the last-mentioned boundary meets the boundary of the County Borough of Bury, and extending thence south-westward along the said borough boundary for a distance of 201 chains or thereabouts to the point at or near the junction of Bury Road with Scobell Street, where such boundary meets the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Anne, Tottington, from the said New Parish of Christ Church, Walshaw, and extending thence first south-westward, then north-westward, and then westward along the last-mentioned boundary (thereby following the middle of Scobell Street) for a distance of 11 chains or thereabouts to the point where Scobell Street is joined by the footpath leading from Bolholt House, and extending thence first southward, and then south-eastward, along the middle of the last-mentioned footpath for a distance of 21 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the roadway running along the northeastern side of Bolholt House, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of such roadway for a distance of 43 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road leading from Wash Brow and Wash Terrace past Bolholt Farm to Walshaw Road, upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Christ Church, Walshaw, from the said New Parish of Saint Anne, Tottington, and extending thence first south-westward, and then southward, along the last-mentioned boundary (thereby following the middle of the last described road) for a distance of 7 chains or thereabouts to the junction of such road with Walshaw Road, and extending thence first westward, and then south-westward, along the middle of Walshaw Road for a distance of 193 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road running past the western side of Owler Barrow Farm, and extending thence southward along the middle of such road for a distance of 4½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with the footpath leading from Owler Barrow Farm to the house called Scholes's, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of such footpath for a distance of 10½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road leading past the northern side of the house called Scholes's to Elton Fold where the boundaries of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Walshaw, the said New Parish of Saint Stephen, Elton, and the said New Parish of All Saints, Elton, all meet, and extending thence generally eastward along the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Stephen, Elton, from the said New Parish of All Saints, Elton (thereby following the middle of the last-mentioned road) for a distance of 53 chains or thereabouts to the junction of such road with Wood Street and Pine Street, at which point the said imaginary line commenced."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the three New Parishes out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patrons and also the Incumbents of two of the said New Parishes have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the Incumbent of the New Parish of All Saints, Elton, has offered certain objections to the said Scheme:

And whereas a period of more than one calendar month has elapsed since the transmission of such Drafts as aforesaid:

And whereas, notwithstanding the said objections, the said Scheme has been approved

by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Representation, bearing date the 1st day of July, in the year 1915, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a Consolidated Chapelry to the Consecrated Church of Saint Andrew, Coulsdon, situate within the Parish of Beddington, in the County of Surrey, and in the Diocese of Southwark:

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said Parish of Beddington, the Parish of Coulsdon, the Parish of Woodmansterne, the Parish of Carshalton, and the Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Mark, Woodcote, Purley, all in the said County and Diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several Churches of such Parishes and Consolidated Chapelry:

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said Parish of Beddington, the said Parish of Coulsdon, the said Parish of Woodmansterne, the said Parish of Carshalton, and the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Mark, Woodcote, Purley, should be formed into a Consolidated Chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Andrew, Coulsdon, situate as aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the: Right Reverend Hubert Murray, Bishop of Southwark, as such Bishop, and also as the Patron, in right of his See, of the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Mark, Woodcote, Purley, with the consent of John Henry Bridges, of Ewell Court, Epsom, Esquire, as the Patron of the Rectory of the said Parish of Beddington, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Archbishop of Canterbury, as the Patron, in right of his See, of the Rectory of the said Parish of Coulsdon, with the consent of the Right Honourable Stanley Owen, Baron Buckmaster of Cheddington, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, acting on behalf of Your Majesty, as the Patron of the Rectory of the said Parish of Woodmansterne, and with the consent of John Cator, of Woodbastwick Hall, Norwich, Esquire, a Member of the Commons House of Parliament, as the Patron of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Carshalton, (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said Parish of Beddington, the said Parish of Coulsdon, the said Parish of Woodmansterne, the said Parish of Carshalton, and the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Mark, Woodcote, Purley, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof. are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one Consolidated Chapelry for the said Church of Saint Andrew, Coulsdon, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Andrew, Coulsdon.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your Royal Consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal Wisdom shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Andrew, Coulsdon, comprising:—All those contiguous portions of the Parish of Beddington, the Parish of Coulsdon, the Parish of Woodmansterne, the Parish of Carshalton, and the Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Mark,

Woodcote, Purley, all in the County of Surrey, and in the Diocese of Southwark, which, taken together, are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Mark, Woodcote, Purley, from the said Parish of Coulsdon, at the junction of Smitham Downs Road and the Brighton .Road, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the Brighton Road for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Stoats Nest Road, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of . 

River Tyne Boom Defence—Entrance Signals and Traffic Regulations.

Former Notice.—No. 408 of 1915; hereby cancelled.

The undermentioned regulations have been made, in regard to the Boom Defence of the River Tyne, under the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, and will remain in force until further Notice:—

The following signals will be displayed to indicate that the Boom is open to traffic:—

By Day - 2 Black Balls, vertical. By Night - 2 White Lights, vertical.

The above signals will be hoisted on board H.M.S. "Satellite" and at the following Distant Signal Stations:—

- (a) For Incoming Traffic.—At the Lighthouse on the end of the North Arm of the Breakwater.
- (b) For Outgoing Traffic.—At Ballast Hill. Shipping at Dunstan and Tyne Docks should ascertain by telephone from H.M.S. "Satellite" whether they can proceed down river. A telephone for this purpose is kept

at the Staith Master's Office, Dunstan, and at the Dock Master's Office, Tyne Docks.

The absence of these signals will denote that the Boom is closed to traffic.

Vessels entering or leaving the Tyne, after passing the Pier Heads when bound inwards, and after passing Hay Hole Point when bound outwards, are to so regulate their speed that until the line of the Boom is passed they shall not come within a distance of 200 yards from their stem to the stern of the next vessel ahead proceeding in the same direction. Whilst navigating between Hay Hole Point and the Pier Heads no vessel should attempt to overhaul and pass ahead of another vessel proceeding in the same direction.

When crossing the line of the Boom all vessels are to preserve a mid-channel course as far as is consistent with safe navigation. Vessels of 25 feet draught and above are to stop their engines when crossing the line of the Boom at or about the time of low water.

Incoming and outgoing vessels must not cross the line of the Boom at the same time. Vessels proceeding against the tidal stream must so regulate their speed that any vessels proceeding with the tide shall first pass the obstruction.

With the above exceptions, the Rules and Regulations for the Navigation of the Tyne are to be adhered to.

Note.—This Notice is a repetition of Notice No. 408 of 1915, with the exception that Ballast Hill is now the only Distant Signal Station for outgoing traffic.
