#### A PROCLAMATION

ADDING TO THE LIST OF ARTICLES TO BE TREATED AS CONTRABAND OF WAR.

GEORGE R.I.

WHEREAS on the 23rd day of December, 1914, We did issue Our Royal Proclamation specifying the articles which it was Our intention to treat as contraband during the continuance of hostilities or until We did, give further notice; and

Whereas on the 11th day of March and on the 27th day of May, 1915, We did, by Our Royal Proclamations of those dates, make certain additions to the list of articles to be treated as contraband of war; and

Whereas it is expedient to make certain further additions to the said lists:

Now, therefore, We do hereby declare, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, that during the continuance of the war or until We do give further public notice, the following articles will be treated as absolute contraband in addition to those set out in Our Royal Proclamations aforementioned:—

Raw cotton, cotton linters, cotton waste, and cotton yarns.

And We do hereby further declare that this Our Royal Proclamation shall take effect from the date of its publication in the London Gazette.

Given at Our Court at the Royal Pavilion, Aldershot Camp, this twentieth day of August, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, and in the Sixth Year of Our Reign.

#### PRESENT.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 14th day of August, 1915, in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being, or having been, an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Your Majesty's Order in Council dated the 7th day of March, 1913, authority was given for the entry on a Supplementary List of Your Majesty's Navy of a certain number of Officers of the Mercantile Marine:

"And whereas we consider that Officers thus entered who may perform meritorious service during war, or specially distinguish themselves in action, should be eligible for transfer, at our discretion, to the General List of Officers of Your Majesty's Fleet in vacancies, and, if so transferred, should be allowed to count the service which they were entitled to count when on the Supplementary List:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to authorize us to make

such transfers accordingly.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concur-

rence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a Consolidated Chapelry to the Consecrated Church of Saint Mark, Basford, situate within the Parish of Wolstanton, in the County of Stafford, and in the Diocese of Lichfield:

the Diocese of Lichfield:

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said
Parish of Wolstanton, and of the New Parish
(sometime Particular District) of the Holy
Trinity, Hartshill, in the said County and
Diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous

one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several Churches of such Parish and New Parish:

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said Parish of Wolstanton, and of the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Hartshill, should be formed into a Consolidated Chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Mark, Basford, situate as aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend John Augustine, Bishop of Lichfield, as such Bishop, and also as the Patron, in right of his See, as well of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Wolstanton as of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Hartshill, (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said Parish of Wolstanton, and of the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Hartshill, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one Consolidated Chapelry for the said Church of Saint Mark, Basford, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Mark, Basford.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your Royal Consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal Wisdom shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Mark, Basford, comprising: -All those contiguous portions of the Parish of Wolstanton, and of the New Parish (sometime Particular District) of the Holy Trinity, Hartshill, both in the County of Stafford, and in the Diocese of Lichfield, which are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing at the point at or near the junction of George Street, Stoke Road, and Shelton New Road, where the boundaries of the New Parish of Saint George, Newcastle-under-Lyme, the New Parish of Saint Paul, Newcastle-under-Lyme, both in the said County and Diocese, and the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Hartshill, all meet, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Shelton New Road for a distance of  $17\frac{1}{2}$  chains or thereabouts to its junction with Victoria Street, and extending thence southward along the middle of Victoria Street for a distance of 4 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Stoke Old Road, and extending thence first north-eastward, and then northward, along the middle of Stoke Old Road for a distance of 17½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Shelton New Road, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Shelton New Road for a distance of 5½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Brick Kiln Lane, and extending thence first north-east-

ward, then north-westward, and then northward, along the middle of Brick Kiln Lane for a distance of 40 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Etruria Road upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Hartshill, from the said Parish of Wolstanton, and extending thence first north-eastward, and then south-eastward, along such boundary (thereby following in part the middle of Etruria Road which passes the northern side of Etruria Station) for a distance of 5 chains or thereabouts to the point in the middle of Fowlea Brook where the said boundary meets the boundary which divides the New Parish of Etruria, in the said County and Diocese, from the said Parish of Wolstanton, and extending thence first eastward, and then northward, along the last-mentioned boundary (thereby following for the most part the middle of Fowlea Brook) for a distance of 17 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the eastern end of the fence forming the boundary between the close numbered 262 upon the Ordnance Map of the Civil Parish of Wolstanton published in the year 1900 upon the scale of 25 inches to a mile, and also upon the map or plan which is annexed to this Representation, from the close numbered 263 upon the same maps, and extending thence westward to and along the said fence for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts to its western end upon the eastern side of the line of the North Staffordshire Railway, and extending thence westward in a straight line across the said line of railway for a distance of 23 chains or thereabouts to the eastern end of the fence which divides the close numbered 276 upon the said maps from the close numbered 265 upon the said maps, and extending thence south-westward along the last-mentioned fence for a distance of 6 chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the northern side of the roadway leading from Etruria Station towards Highfields, and extending thence first south-westward to, and then northwestward along, the middle of the said roadway for a distance of 4 chains or thereabouts to the point where it is crossed by the fence forming the eastern boundary of the northern part of the close numbered 275 upon the said maps, and extending thence southward along the last-mentioned fence for a distance of 2 yards or thereabouts to the point where such fence crosses the middle of the stream which flows through the said close numbered 275 and the close numbered 398 upon the said maps, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the said stream for a distance of 14 chains or thereabouts to its source near the western boundary of the said close numbered 398, and extending thence first north-westward to the eastern end of the fence which divides the close numbered 373 upon the said maps from the close numbered 397 upon the said maps, and then first north-westward, and then westward, along such fence for a distance in all of 5½ chains or thereabouts to its western end, and continuing thence westward along the fence forming the southern boundary of the said close numbered 373 and along the fence in continuation thereof for a distance in all of 12 chains or thereabouts to the western end of the last-mentioned fence upon the eastern side of Oxford Road, and extending thence first westward to, and then southward along, the middle of Oxford Road for a dis-

tance of  $2\frac{1}{2}$  chains or thereabouts to its junction with Laundry Street, and extending thence westward along the middle of Laundry Street for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Basford Road, and extending thence westward and in a straight line for a distance of 143 chains or thereabouts to the north-eastern corner of the house and premises known as May Bank Cottage, and extending thence north-westward along the fence forming the north-eastern boundary of such house and premises for a distance of 1 chain or thereabouts to its western end on the eastern side of the road leading from Wolstanton to Newcastle, and extending thence first north-westward to, and then south-westward along, the middle of the last-mentioned road for a distance of 16 chains or thereabouts to the point where it is crossed by the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint George, Newcastle-under-Lyme, from the said Parish of Wolstanton, and extending thence first south-westward, and then in various directions, along such boundary and along the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint George, Newcastle-under-Lyme, from the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Hartshill, for a distance in all of 50 chains or thereabouts to the point at or near the junction of George Street, Stoke Road, and Shelton New Road, where the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint George, Newcastle-under-Lyme, the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Newcastle-under-Lyme, and the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Hartshill, all meet, at which point the said imaginary line commenced."

And whereas the said Representation has

been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Lichfield.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Edwyn, Bishop of Southwell, (testified by his having signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said Parish of Glossop, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a District Chapelry to the said Church of Saint James, Bugsworth, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Chinley with Bugsworth.'

"And with the like consent of the said Edwyn, Bishop of Southwell, (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said Church of Saint James, Bugsworth, situate as aforesaid, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns, and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices, should be paid and belong to the Minister of the same Church for the time being: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us, the said Commissioners, to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism, or for the registration thereof.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal Consideration, and to make such Order with respect thereto as to Your Majesty, in Your Royal Wisdom, shall seem meet.

"The Schedule to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Chinley with Bugsworth, being:—All that isolated part of the Parish of Glossop, in the County of Derby, and in the Diocese of Southwell, which is comprised within, and is co-extensive with, the Civil Parish of Chinley, Bugsworth, and Brownside."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Southwell.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

THEREAS by the Burial Act, 1853, as amended by the Burial Act, 1900, it is provided that, in case it appears to His Majesty in Council, upon the Representation of the Local Government Board, that, for the protection of the public health, the new opening of any burial in any City or Town, or within any other limits, save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, should be prohibited, or that burials in any City or Town, or within any other limits, or in any burial grounds or places of burial, should be wholly discontinued, or should be discontinued subject to any exception or qualification, it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order that no new burial ground shall be opened in such City or Town, or within such limits, without such previous approval, or (as the case may require) that, after a time mentioned in the Order, burials in such City or Town, or within such limits, or in such burial grounds or places of burial, shall be discontinued wholly, or subject to any exceptions or qualifications mentioned in such Order, and so from time to time as circumstances may require: Provided always that notice of such Representation, and of the time when it shall please His Majesty to order the same to be taken into consideration by the Privy Council, shall be published in the London Gazette, and shall be affixed on the doors of the Churches or Chapels of, or on some other conspicuous places within, the Parishes affected by such Representation, one month before such Representation is so considered: Provided also that no such Representation shall be made in relation to the burial ground of any Parish until 10 days' previous notice of the intention to make such Representation shall have been given to the Incumbent and the Vestry Clerk or Churchwardens of such Parish:

And whereas the Local Government Board, after giving to the Incumbent and the Churchwardens of the Parish of St. Andrew, High Ham, in the County of Somerset, 10 days' previous notice of their intention in that behalf, have made a Representation to His Majesty in Council that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new burial ground in the Civil Parish of High Ham, in the County of Somerset, save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, should be prohibited, and that burials should be discontinued in the said Civil Parish as herein-after directed:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased, by His Order in Council of the 13th day of July last, to give notice of such Representation, and to order that the same should be taken into

consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council, on the 17th day of August, 1915, and such Order has been published in the London Gazette, and copies thereof have been affixed,

as required by the said Act:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that no new burial ground shall be opened in the said Civil Parish save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, and that burials in the said Civil Parish shall be discontinued as follows, viz.:-

HIGH HAM.—Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of St. Andrew, High Ham, in the County of Somerset; and in the Churchyard attached thereto, with the following ex-

ceptions, that is to say:

(a) In the family vaults or walled graves now existing in the said Churchyard, and belonging, or reputed to belong, to Mrs. A. M. Barnard, John and James Barnard, and Thomas W. Rowsell, burial may be allowed, subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such vaults or graves be separately enclosed by stonework or brick-

work properly cemented;

(b) In the family earthen graves now existing in the said Churchyard, the burial may be allowed of the bodies of the following persons, at their decease, namely:—Mrs. Jane Ford, Mrs. Mary Keevil, Mrs. Sophia Lee, Mrs. Ann Lloyd, Mrs. Anna Lloyd, Adam Vile Sherrin, and Miss Tryphena Small, subject in each case to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than 3 feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave;

(c) In the said Churchyard, in a reserved grave space in which no interment has taken place within a period of 14 years prior to the date of this Order, the burial may be allowed of the body of Mrs. Alfred Sherrin and of any Member of the Family of the late Edwin Thyer, at their decease, subject in each case to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than 3 feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

The Board of Trade, by virtue of the power conferred on them by section 369 (2) of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, do order that Sea Fishing Boats registered at ports of the United Kingdom which were before the date of this Order engaged mainly as steam liners or drifters, shall be exempt, and are hereby exempted, from the requirements of section 413 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, if and when as trawlers they are engaged in trawling off or around the coasts of the United Kingdom provided that they carry a skipper and second hand holding an authority or certificate issued by the Board of Trade entitling them to act as skipper or second hand respectively of liners or drifters.

This Order shall come into force on 1st September, 1915, and shall remain in force until the termination of the present hostilities and for three months thereafter.

The survivors, however, rushed up to and cut the wire entanglements, notwithstanding the terrific fire from the enemy, and, after overcoming supreme difficulties, the cliffs were gained and the position maintained.

Amongst the many very gallant Officers and men engaged in this most hazardous undertaking, Captain Willis, Serjeant undertaking, Captain Willis, Serjeant Richards and Private Keneally have been selected by their comrades as having performed the most signal acts of bravery and devotion to duty.

Amendment Act, 1907 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1907"), applied to Us, the Local Government Board, to declare certain Parts of the Act of 1907 to be in force in the Urban District of Skelmanthorpe (hereinafter referred to as "the District");

And whereas proof has been given to Oursatisfaction of the advertisement required by sub-section (2) of section 3 of the Act of 1907,. and at least one month has elapsed after the

date of that advertisement:

Now, therefore, in the exercise of Our powers in that behalf, We by this Order declare, specify, and direct as follows; that is to say:-

ARTICLE I.—(1) On and after the day on which this Order comes into operation, Part II, Part III, Part IV, and Part V of the Act of 1907 shall be in force in the District.

(2) Where a section to which reference ismade in the first column of the Schedule to this Order is a section comprised in Part II, Part III, Part IV, or Part V, the section shall be in force in the District subject to the following conditions and adaptations; that is to say,

Unless and until We, by a further Ordermade on such application, and after compliance with such requirements as are described and set forth in section 3 of the Act of 1907, otherwise declare, specify, and direct, the said section, in its application to the District and in relation to the exercise of the powers and to the discharge of the duties of the Local Authority under that section, shall have effect as if the words and figures set forth in the second column of the said Schedule opposite to the reference to that section in the first column of that Schedule were added to and formed part of the section.

ARTICLE II.—Within the period of three weeks immediately following the date of this Order, or, where in Our opinion the circumstances so require, within such later period as We by Order prescribe, the Local Authority shall cause this Order to be published by advertising the same once at least in one or more of the newspapers circulating in the District, and shall also cause a statement of the effect of this Order to be published in the London Gazette.

ARTICLE III.—This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-second day of September, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen.

"Nothing in this section shall prejudicially affect any power or right exerciseable by or attaching to an owner or occupier of premises by virtue of section twenty-two of the Public Health Act, 1875, or of section eighteen of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1890."

Part IV. Section Fiftynine.

"(6) Nothing in this section shall apply to a public or circulating library which is not within the district."

Part V. Section Seventyfive.

"(3) The date of the Order of the Local Government Board by which this Part is declared to be in force shall be the beginning of the period within which the local authority shall give notice for the purposes of sub-section (1) of this section."
