1915, should also be eligible for this rate of pay:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the removal of the foregoing restriction accordingly.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by the Burial Act, 1853, as amended by the Burial Act, 1900, it is provided that, in case it appears to His Majesty in Council, upon the representation of the Local Government Board, that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new burial ground in any city or town, or within any other limits, save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, should be prohibited, or that burials in any city or town, or within any other limits, or in any burial grounds or places of burial, should be wholly discontinued, or should be discontinued subject to any exception or qualification, it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order that no new burial ground shall be opened in such city or town, or within such limits, without such previous approval, or (as the case may

require) that, after a time mentioned in the Order, burials in such city or town, or within such limits, or in such burial grounds or places of burial, shall be discontinued wholly, or subject to any exceptions or qualifications mentioned in such Order, and so from time to time as circumstances may require: Provided always that notice of such representation, and of the time when it shall please His Majesty to order the same to be taken into consideration by the Privy Council, shall be published in the London Gazette, and shall be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some other conspicuous places within, the parishes affected by such representation, one month before such representation is so considered: Provided also that no such representation shall be made in relation to the burial ground of any parish until ten days' previous notice of the intention to make such representation shall have been given to the Incumbent and the Vestry Clerk or Churchwardens of such Parish:

And whereas the Local Government Board, after giving to the Incumbent and the Churchwardens of the Parish of Stradbroke, in the County of East Suffolk, and the Parish of Eastwood, in the County of Nottingham, respectively, ten days' previous notice of their intention in that behalf, have made representations to His Majesty in Council that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new burial ground in the Civil Parishes of Stradbroke and Eastwood, save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, should be prohibited, and that burials should be discontinued therein as hereinafter directed:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased, by His Order in Council of the 28th day of July, 1915, to give notice of such representations, and to order that the same should be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council, on the 8th day of September, 1915, and such Order has been published in the London Gazette, and copies thereof have been affixed, as required by the said Act:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that no new burial grounds shall be opened in the said Civil Parishes save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, and that burials therein shall be discontinued as follows, viz.:—

STRADBROKE.—Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of All Saints, in the Parish of Stradbroke, in the County of East Suffolk; and in the Churchyard attached thereto, with the following exceptions, that is to say:—

(a) In the brick grave now existing in the said Churchyard, and belonging or reputed to belong to Charles Rush, burial may be allowed subject to the condition that the coffin buried in such grave be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b) In the earthen graves now existing in the said Churchyard, and belonging or reputed to belong to Benjamin Webb, Joseph Ling, Elizabeth Boash, George Rose, Louisa Cooper, Lucy Rutter, and William Girling, the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such graves, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level

of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

EASTWOOD.—Forthwith and entirely in the Church of St. Mary, in the Parish of Eastwood, in the County of Nottingham; and in the Churchyard attached thereto, with the following exceptions, that is to say:—

(a) In any walled grave now existing in the said Churchyard, burial may be allowed subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such grave be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b) In any earthen grave now existing in the said Churchyard, the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

And whereas it is provided by Section 2 of the Customs (Exportation Restriction) Act, 1914, that any Proclamation made under Section one of the Exportation of Arms Act, 1900, may, whether the Proclamation was made before or after the passing of the Act now in recital, be varied or added to, whilst a state of war exists, by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Trade:

And whereas by a Proclamation, dated the 28th day of July, 1915, and made under Section 8 of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, and Section one of the Exportation of Arms Act, 1900, and Section one of the Customs (Exportation Prohibition) Act, 1914, the exportation from the United Kingdom of certain articles to certain or all destinations was prohibited:

And whereas by Orders of Council, dated respectively the 30th day of July, 1915, the 3rd day of August, 1915, and the 12th day of August, 1915, the said Proclamation was amended and added to in certain particulars:

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a recommendation from the Board of Trade to the following effect:—

That the Proclamation, dated the 28th day of July, 1915, as amended and added to by the Orders of Council, dated respectively the 30th day of July, 1915, the 3rd day of August, 1915, and the 12th day of August, 1915, should be further amended by making

the following amendments in and additions to the same:—

(1) That the heading "Animals, pack, saddle and draught, suitable for use in war" in the list of goods the exportation of which is prohibited to all destinations should be deleted, and there be substituted therefor the heading "Animals, pack, saddle and draught, suitable or which may become suitable for use in war."

(2) That the heading "Diamonds, rough, suitable for industrial purposes" in the list of goods the exportation of which is prohibited to all destinations should be deleted, and there be substituted therefor the heading "Diamonds, rough, suitable for industrial purposes, including Brazilian carbon."

(3) That the exportation of the following goods should be prohibited to all destinations:—

Iron ore, Cumberland hæmatite.

(4) That the exportation of the following goods, which is at present prohibited to all destinations, should be prohibited to all destinations abroad other than British Possessions and Protectorates:—

Beans, including haricot beans, Burma and Rangoon beans;

Compound cakes and meal;

Cottonseed cake, decorticated and undecorticated, and cottonseed meal;

Lentils;

Linseed cake and meal;

Maize;

Malt dust, malt flour, culms, sprouts or combings;

Patent and proprietary cattle foods of all kinds;

Rice meal (or bran) and dust.

(5) That the heading "Bone ash" in the list of goods the exportation of which is prohibited to all destinations abroad other than British Possessions and Protectorates should be deleted, and there be substituted therefor the heading "Bones for manure, dissolved bones, bone flour, bone meal and bone ash."

(6) That the exportation of the following goods should be prohibited to all destinations abroad other than British Possessions and Protectorates:—

Chlorides of sulphur;

Fustic (chips and extract) and logwood (chips and extract, including hæmatine crystals and other logwood preparations);

Whale meal.

(7) That the exportation of the following goods, which is at present prohibited to all destinations, should be prohibited to all foreign countries in Europe and on the Mediterranean and Black Seas, other than France, Russia (except through Baltic ports), Italy, Spain and Portugal:—

Brewers' and distillers' grains;

Brewers' dried yeast;

Coconut and poonac cake;

Gluten meal or gluten feed;

Maize meal and flour;

Mill dust and screenings of all kinds.

(8) That the heading "Maize germ meal" in the list of goods the exportation of which is prohibited to all destinations should be deleted, and there be inserted in the list of

goods the exportation of which is prohibited to all foreign countries in Europe and on the Mediterranean and Black Seas, other than France, Russia (except through Baltic ports), Italy, Spain and Portugal, the heading "Maize germs and maize germ meal."

(9) That the exportation of salts of aluminium (other than alunite and nitrate of aluminium), which is at present prohibited to all destinations abroad other than British Possessions and Protectorates, should be prohibited to all foreign countries in Europe and on the Mediterranean and Black Seas, other than France, Russia (except through Baltic ports), Italy, Spain and Portugal.

(10) That the heading "Molasses for cattle feeding" in the list of goods the exportation of which is prohibited to all foreign countries in Europe and on the Mediterranean and Black Seas, other than France, Russia (except through Baltic ports), Italy, Spain and Portugal, should be deleted.

(11) That the heading "Iron ore" in the list of goods the exportation of which is prohibited to all foreign countries in Europe and on the Mediterranean and Black Seas, other than France, Russia (except through Baltic ports), Italy, Spain and Portugal, should be deleted and there be substituted therefor the heading:—

"Iron ore (except Cumberland hæmatite iron ore, the exportation of which is prohibited to all destinations)."

(12) That the exportation of the following goods should be prohibited to all foreign countries in Europe and on the Mediterranean and Black Seas, other than France, Russia (except through Baltic ports), Italy, Spain and Portugal:—

Calcium sulphide;

China clay (including China stone and potters' clay);

Gas carbon;

Kapok hempen fibre;

Provisions and victuals which may be used as food for man, namely:—

Bean flour and meal;

Biscuits, bread and cakes, all kinds of;

Corn flour;

Corn grits;

Hominy;

Lentil flour and meal;

Macaroni, spaghetti and vermicelli;

Meat of all kinds (except poultry and game), not including beef and mutton, fresh or refrigerated (the exportation of which is already prohibited to all destinations);

Pea flour and meal;

Prepared foods wholly or partially derived from cereals;

Semolina.

Now, therefore, Their Lordships, having taken the said recommendation into consideration, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the same be approved.

Whereof the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs and Excise, the Director of the War Trade Department, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 14TH SEPTEMBER 1915.)

MIDDLESBROUGH AND DISTRICT (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1915.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Prohibition of Movement of Swine out of Certain Area.

1. No swine, fat or store, shall be moved out of the Area described in the Schedule hereto, except as expressly authorised by this Order: Provided that nothing in this Article shall be deemed to apply to the movement of swine where they are moved through such Area by railway from a place outside such Area to another place outside such Area without unnecessary delay and without the swine being untrucked within such Area.

Swine to be Moved out of Area for Immediate Slaughter only.

2.—(1.) Swine (not being in a Swine-Fever Infected Place) may be moved out of the Area described in the Schedule hereto to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse, or to any lairs, market or saleyard specially authorised by the Local Authority under the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, or the Swine-Fever (Movement from Ireland) Order of 1904, if accompanied by a Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the premises from which the swine are to be moved are situate and subject to the following conditions (namely):

- (i.) The swine shall be marked by and at the expense of the owner by the painting with an indelible composition of red colour of a broad line down the back and another broad line across the loins of each of the swine, thus +, each line being not less than nine inches long.
- (ii.) The swine shall be moved, by railway so far as is practicable, to the bacon factory, slaughterhouse, lairs, market, or saleyard specified in the Licence, and during such movement shall not be permitted to come in contact with swine not marked under this Article.
- (iii.) The Licence shall be in force for not more than eight days inclusive of the day

of issue and shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the Licence is granted and the name or description of the bacon factory or slaughterhouse, lairs, market, or saleyard to which the swine are to be moved.

(iv.) A copy of a licence under this Order which authorises movement of swine to premises in a District other than the District for which the person granting the licence acts as Inspector shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector to the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination specified in the licence is situate.

(v.) Swine moved with a licence under this Order to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse shall be there detained until they are slaughtered.

Licences after Completion of Movement.

3.—(1.) Where swine are moved with a licence under this Order to any lairs, market or saleyard, the licence shall be delivered up in exchange for the licence for movement of the swine from such premises.

(2.) Where swine are moved with a licence under this Order to a bacon-factory or slaughterhouse the licence shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station in the same District by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing the said movement.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

4.—(1.) Any person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the licence, if any, authorising the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

5. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Granting of Movement Licences.

6.—(1.) A movement licence granted under this Order shall not be available if granted by the owner of the swine to be moved, or by his agent, or by the consignee of the swine, or by the occupier of the farm or premises or slaughter-house from or to which the swine are to be moved, or by any individual member of an Executive Committee or Sub-Committee of a Local Authority.

(2.) A movement licence shall not be granted by an Inspector if, in his opinion, it is undesirable to grant it.

Offences.

7.—(1.) If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig, and the consignee or other

person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2.) If a person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(3.) If any person fails to deliver up or send a licence, as required by this Order, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(4.) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted on any pig for the purposes of this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Revocation.

8. The Middlesbrough (Newport Common Piggeries) (Swine Fever) Order of 1912 is hereby revoked.

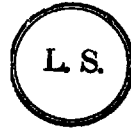

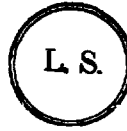
