A PROCLAMATION

RELATING TO THE EXPORTATION OF ALL ARTICLES TO CHINA AND SIAM DURING THE PRESENT WAR.

GEORGE R.I.

WHEREAS by section 1 of the Exportation of Arms Act, 1900, it is enacted that We may, by Proclamation, prohibit the exportation of all or any of the following articles, namely:—Arms, ammunition, military and naval stores and any article which We shall judge capable of being converted into or made useful in increasing the quantity of arms, ammunition or military or naval stores to any country or place therein named whenever We shall judge such prohibition to be expedient, in order to prevent such arms, ammunition or military or naval stores being used against Our forces or against any forces engaged or which may be engaged in military or naval operations in co-operation with Our forces:

And whereas by section 1 of the Customs

(Exportation Restriction) Act, 1914, it is enacted that the above-recited section 1 of the Exportation of Arms Act, 1900, shall have effect whilst a state of war in which His Majesty is engaged exists as if, in addition to the articles therein mentioned there were included all other articles of every description:

And whereas by section 1 of the Customs (Exportation Restriction) Act, 1915, it is enacted that the power of His Majesty under section 1 of the Exportation of Arms Act, 1900, as amended by the Customs (Exportation Restriction) Act, 1914, by Proclamation to prohibit the exportation of articles to any country or place named in the Proclamation, shall, during the continuance of the present war, include the power to prohibit the exportation of any article to any such country or place unless consigned to such person or persons as may be authorised by or under the Proclamation to receive such article:

Now, therefore, We have thought fit, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, in virtue and in exercise of the powers aforesaid, to declare and it is hereby declared, that the exportation of the articles mentioned in the second column of the Schedule hereto is pro-

hibited to the countries named in the first column of the said Schedule unless those

articles are consigned to the persons referred to in the third column of the said Schedule.

Given at Our Court at *Buckingham Palace*, this Twenty-fourth day of *September*, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, and in the Sixth year of Our Reign.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council, dated the twenty-eighth day of November, nineteen hundred and fourteen, His Majesty was pleased to make Regulations (called the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914) under the Defence of the Realm Consolidation Act, 1914, for securing the public safety and the defence of the Realm:

And whereas the said Act has been amended by the Defence of the Realm (Amendment) Act, 1915, the Defence of the Realm (Amendment) No. 2 Act, 1915, and the Munitions of War Act, 1915:

And whereas the said Regulations have been amended by Orders in Council, dated the twenty-third day of March, the thirteenth day of April, the twenty-ninth day of April, the second day of June, the tenth day of June, the sixth day of July, and the twenty-eighth day of July, nineteen hundred and fifteen:

And whereas it is expedient further to amend the said Regulations in manner herein-after appearing:

Now, THEREFORE, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the following amendments be made in the said Regulations:—

1. After Regulation 6A the following Regulation shall be inserted:—

6B. The Secretary of State may grant licences for the establishment of new or the alteration of existing factories and magazines for gunpowder and other explosives intended for war purposes notwithstanding that the assent of the local authority to the grant of any such licence has not been obtained in accordance with the requirements of the Explosives Act, 1875, and any licence so granted shall, during the continuance of the present war, have the like effect as if such assent had been obtained in manner provided by that Act.

2. At the end of Regulation 14 the following paragraph shall be inserted:—

If any person remains in or enters any area in contravention of an order under this Regulation he may be removed therefrom by the direction of the competent naval or military authority.

3. After Regulation 30 the following Regulation shall be inserted:—

30A. No person shall, without a permit issued under the authority of the Admiralty or Army Council or the Minister of Munitions, either on his own behalf or on behalf of any other person—

(a) buy, sell, or deal in; or

(b) offer or invite an offer or propose to buy, sell, or deal in; or

(c) enter into negotiations for the sale or purchase of or other dealing in;

any war material to which this Regulation may for the time being be applied by order of the Admiralty or Army Council or the Minister of Munitions, whether or not the sale, purchase, or dealing is, or is to be, effected in the United Kingdom.

If any person acts in contravention of the foregoing provision, or aids or abets any other person, whether or not such other person is in the United Kingdom, in doing anything which if done in the United Kingdom would be a contravention of the foregoing provision, or fails to comply with any condition subject to which a permit under this Regulation has been granted, such person shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations, and if such person is a company, every director and officer of the company shall also be guilty of an offence against these Regulations unless he proves that the contravention took place without his knowledge or consent:

Provided that nothing in this Regulation shall affect any transaction authorised by a permit of the competent naval or military authority under Regulation 30.

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

The Defence of the Realm (Liquor Control) Regulations, 1915, and any Regulations amending the same, shall be, and are, hereby applied to the area defined and specified in the Schedule hereto.

The area comprised in the County Borough of Barrow-in-Furness, the Townships of Angerton, Broughton West, Dalton-in-Furness, Egton-with-Newland, Kirkby-Ireleth, Mansriggs, Osmotherly, Pennington and Ulverston, and the Parishes of Aldingham and Urswick, in the County of Lancaster, and the Parishes of Millom Urban, Millom Rural and Whicham, in the County of Cumberland.

And the Defence of the Realm (Liquor Control) Regulations and any Regulations amending the same shall be and are hereby applied to the said area as herein defined:

“Whereas at certain extremities of the said Parish of Saint George and of the Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Matthew, Moorfields, in the said County and Diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and

are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several Churches of such Parish and Consolidated Chapelry:

“And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said Parish of Saint George and of the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Matthew, Moorfields, should be formed into a Consolidated Chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Ambrose, Whitehall, Bristol, situate as aforesaid:

“Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend George, Bishop of Bristol, as such Bishop, and also as the Patron, in right of his See, of the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Matthew, Moorfields, and with the consents of Madeline, the wife of the Reverend Arthur Henry Nevill Parker, of Greystoke, in the County of Cumberland, Clerk in Holy Orders, and of John William Robinson Parker, of Browsholme Hall, Clitheroe, in the County of York, a Colonel in Your Majesty's Army, as the Patrons of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Saint George, and of James Gettliffe Platt, of Brentwood, Worsley Road, Winton, in the County of Lancaster, Esquire, as having an interest in the patronage of the same Vicarage, (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said Parish of Saint George and of the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Matthew, Moorfields, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one Consolidated Chapelry for the said Church of Saint Ambrose, Whitehall, Bristol, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named ‘The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Ambrose, Whitehall, Bristol.’

“We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal Consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal Wisdom shall seem meet.

“The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

“The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Ambrose, Whitehall, Bristol, comprising:—

“I. All that portion of the Parish of Saint George, in the County of Gloucester, and in the Diocese of Bristol, which is bounded upon the west by the Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Matthew, Moorfields, upon the north-west by the New Parish of Saint Mark, Easton, upon the north by the New Parish of Saint John, Fishponds, upon the east partly by the last-named New Parish and partly by the New Parish of Two Mile Hill, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides,

that is to say, upon the south-east and upon the south, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Two Mile Hill from the said Parish of Saint George at the junction of Speedwell Road with the road connecting Duncombe Lane and Whiteway Road, and extending thence westward along the middle of Speedwell Road for a distance of 53 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called Plummer's Hill, and extending thence first southward and then south-westward along the middle of Plummer's Hill for a distance of 17 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Hudd's Vale Road, and extending thence, that is to say, from the junction of Plummer's Hill with Hudd's Vale Road, first westward, then north-westward, and then south-westward, along the middle of the roadway connecting Plummer's Hill and Hudd's Vale Road with Howard Street for a distance of 12½ chains or thereabouts to the junction of such roadway with Howard Street, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Howard Street for a distance of 1 chain or thereabouts to its junction with the road called Park Crescent, and extending thence first westward, and then south-westward, along the middle of Park Crescent for a distance of 19½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Lake View Road, and extending thence southward along the middle of Lake View Road for a distance of 5½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Lyndale Road, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Lyndale Road for a distance of 10 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Chalks Road upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Saint George from the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Matthew, Moorfields.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 59th year of His late Majesty King George the Third, Chapter 134, of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 49, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a District Chapelry to the Consecrated Church of Saint Thomas, Acton Vale, situate in the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Dunstan, East Acton, in the County of Middlesex, and in the Diocese of London:

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a District Chapelry should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Thomas, Acton Vale, situate as aforesaid:




