And whereas His Majesty in Council in pursuance of the said first-mentioned Act has issued the Defence of the Realm (Liquor Control) Regulations, 1915, under the said last-mentioned Act:

And whereas by Order in Council dated the 6th day of July, 1915, His Majesty was pleased in pursuance of the said first-mentioned Act to apply the aforesaid Regulations to an area comprising certain Urban Districts and Parishes in the County of Kent, which form part of the area defined and specified in the Schedule hereto:

And whereas it appears to His Majesty that it is expedient for the purpose of the successful prosecution of the present War that the sale and supply of intoxicating liquor in the area defined and specified in the Schedule hereto should be controlled by the State on the grounds that War material is being made, loaded, unloaded and dealt with in transit therein, and that men belonging to His Majesty's Naval and Military forces are assembled therein:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

The Defence of the Realm (Liquor Control) Regulations, 1915, and any Regulations amending the same, shall be, and are, hereby applied to the area defined and specified in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

London Area, being the Area comprised in the City of London; The Metropolitan Police District; The Urban District of Watford, in the County of Herts; The Petty Sessional Division of Romford, in the County of Essex; The Urban District of Dartford, and the Parishes of Darenth, Stone, Sutton-at-Hone, Swanscombe and Wilmington, in the County of Kent.

WHEREAS by Order in Council, dated the 6th day of July, 1915, His Majesty was pleased, in pursuance of the Defence of the Realm (Amendment) (No. 3) Act, 1915, to define a certain area, that is to say:—

The area within the circumference of a circle having a radius of ten miles measured

from the Town Hall in the County Borough of Barrow-in-Furness,

and to apply to the said area so defined the Defence of the Realm (Liquor Control) Regulations and any Regulations amending the same:

And whereas the Central Control Board (Liquor Traffic), being the prescribed Government Authority in pursuance of the said Regulations, on the 22nd day of July, 1915, duly issued an Order controlling the sale and supply of intoxicating liquor within the said area, which said Order is now in force in the said area:

And whereas it is expedient to amend the definition of the said area:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

The definition of the said area shall be and is hereby amended and the said area shall be and is hereby defined as follows, that is to say:—

The area comprised in the County Borough of Barrow-in-Furness, the Townships of Angerton, Broughton West, Dalton-in-Furness, Egton-with-Newland, Kirkby-Ireleth, Mansriggs, Osmotherly, Pennington and Ulverston, and the Parishes of Aldingham and Urswick, in the County of Lancaster, and the Parishes of Millom Urban, Millom Rural and Whicham, in the County of Cumberland.

And the Defence of the Realm (Liquor Control) Regulations and any Regulations amending the same shall be and are hereby applied to the said area as herein defined:

And the aforesaid Order of the Central Control Board (Liquor Traffic) shall be in force and continue to be in force in the said area as herein defined unless and until the same is revoked or amended by the said Board.

WHEREAS by the Foreign Jurisdiction Acts, 1890 and 1913, it is, amongst other things, provided that it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council by Order to direct that Section 20 of the Finance Act, 1894, shall extend, with or without any exceptions, adaptations, or modifications in the Order mentioned, to any Foreign Country in which, for the time being, His Majesty has jurisdiction, and that thereupon that Section shall, to
