The KING has been pleased to grant unto  
 Edmund Walter Estcourt, of Estcourt, in the  
 county of Gloucester, Clerk in Holy Orders,  
 Master of Arts of the University of Oxford,  
 his Royal Licence and Authority that he may  
 take and henceforth use the surname of  
 Sotheron in addition to and before that of  
 Estcourt, that he may bear the arms of  
 Sotheron quarterly with those of Estcourt, and  
 that such surname and arms may in like  
 manner be taken, borne and used by his issue;  
 the said arms being first duly exemplified  
 according to the Laws of Arms and recorded in  
 His Majesty's College of Arms, otherwise the  
 said Royal Licence and Permission to be void  
 and of none effect. And to command that the  
 said Royal Concession and Declaration be  
 recorded in His Majesty's said College of Arms.

#### THE FAIRS ACT, 1873.

##### ASHBORNE HORSE AND CATTLE FAIRS.

Whereas on the 21st June, 1915, a repre-  
 sentation was made to me, as Secretary of  
 State for the Home Department, by the Ash-  
 borne Urban District Council to the effect that  
 it would be for the convenience and advantage  
 of the public that the Fairs for the sale of  
 Horses and Cattle which have been held  
 at Ashborne on the third Thursday in the  
 months of February, May, August, October,  
 and November in each year should, from and  
 after the 1st February, 1916, be held on  
 Thursday the second Cattle Market Day in  
 each of the said months:

And whereas notice of the said representa-  
 tion and of the time when the same would be  
 taken into consideration has been duly pub-  
 lished in pursuance of the Fairs Act, 1873:

And whereas on such representation and con-  
 sideration it appears to me that the alteration

of the dates of the Fairs as proposed would be  
 for the convenience and advantage of the  
 public:

Now therefore I, as Secretary of State for  
 the Home Department, in exercise of the  
 powers vested in me by the Fairs Act, 1873,  
 do hereby order that the Fairs for the sale of  
 Horses and Cattle which have been held  
 at Ashborne on the third Thursday in the  
 months of February, May, August, October,  
 and November in each year shall, from and  
 after the 1st February, 1916, be held on  
 Thursday the second Cattle Market Day in  
 each of the said months.
