His Majesty the KING has been graciously pleased to approve of the award of the Distinguished Conduct Medal to the undermentioned Warrant Officers, Non-Commissioned Officers and Men, for acts of gallantry and devotion to duty whilst serving with the Expeditionary Forces in France and Flanders and in Mesopotamia.

448 Corporal T. Bennett, Royal Flying Corps.

For conspicuous bravery and skill on the 13th September, 1915, over Bois De Biez. While on patrol duty, with Second Lieutenant H. S. Shield, at an elevation of about 10,000 feet, a German Albatross was sighted. The Officer dived towards it, and engaged it at about 7,000 feet. While diving they were subjected to heavy anti-aircraft gun fire. The Germans used during the engagement a machine-gun very conveniently mounted, but Corporal Bennett handled his gun with great coolness and skill, and succeeded in disabling the German machine, which sideslipped, nose-dived, and came to ground in our lines.

8725 Private W. Bridger, 2nd Battalion, Royal West Kent Regiment.

For conspicuous bravery on the 24th July, 1915, near Nasiriyah (Mesopotamia), when, as a stretcher bearer, he returned on six occasions to the firing line, and searched for wounded men under a heavy and continued fire. He gave a fine example of coolness, courage and devotion to duty.

7788 Serjeant A. Bull, 1st Battalion, Wiltshire Regiment.

For conspicuous gallantry on the 2nd September, 1915, at Hooge. Although not on duty in the fire trenches at the time, Serjeant Bull went to the crater, and during the very heavy shelling of it, he was injured and buried, several men being killed at the same time by a trench mortar. He extricated himself, dug out under heavy shell fire the men who were still alive, and then went round all the bombing posts. On previous occasions, notably on the 16th June, Serjeant Bull has been mentioned for gallant conduct, and he has consistently given a fine example of bravery and devotion to duty.

2314 Private J. Bullivant, 1/7th (Robin Hood) Battalion, Nottinghamshire and Derbyshire Regiment, T.F.

For conspicuous gallantry near Ypres on the night of 30th-31st July, 1915, when he advanced some 60 yards in front of a trench and helped to bring in wounded men under fire. He further distinguished himself by bringing in men who had been killed and buried in a trench by the enemy's heavy trench mortars.

9511 Private E. T. Bye, 2nd Battalion, Royal West Kent Regiment.

For conspicuous gallantry on the 24th July, 1915, near Nasiriyah (Mesopotamia) when, although wounded while applying first aid, he finished his task, and went to dress a second wounded man. While doing so he was again wounded. His devotion to duty was most marked.

2101 Private G. W. Cartwright, 1st/4th Battalion, Cheshire Regiment, T.F. (attached 1/5th Battalion).

For conspicuous gallantry in "Section D.1" on 1st September, 1915. When the enemy had exploded a mine and blown up or buried an Officer and several men, Private Cartwright volunteered to go down and investigate the crater. He was under heavy and very close fire till he got right down into the crater.

He found some wounded men, and returned twice under the same close fire for food and water for them. He brought back a wounded Serjeant, and wished to return for a Private, but was ordered to wait till dusk. At dusk, though no longer on duty, he went out to help in further rescue.

His conduct throughout was very gallant.

79708 Sapper E. Cassidy, 176th Tunnelling Company, Royal Engineers (formerly No. A/5671, 2nd Battalion, Royal Scots Fusiliers).

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty at Givenchy on 25th August, 1915. He was blown 15 feet down a mine gallery by a German mine explosion, but, though stunned for a moment, as soon as he recovered he tried to get down to the face to rescue the men there. He insisted in following his Officer down the gallery till ordered back; but, on hearing a cry for help he at once went down again and assisted in rescuing the Officer and a Corporal who had been gassed.

96947 Sapper J. Chadwick, 175th Tunnelling Company, Royal Engineers.

For conspicuous gallantry on the night of the 24th-25th August, 1915, in the trenches in front of Ypres. After verifying the existence of German mines under the trench, he bored down and placed a charge, which failed to explode. He then volunteered, at great risk, to reopen the bore hole, and a charge subsequently fired successfully exploded the German mine.

79731 Lance-Corporal R. Clapson, 172nd Tunnelling Company, Royal Engineers (formerly No. 8592, 4th Battalion, Middlesex Regiment).

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty on the 4th September, 1915, at St. Eloi. During tunnelling operations an old working was struck and two Officers and two Sappers were slightly gassed. One of the Officers then sent for an oxygen apparatus, which he put on in order to explore, stationing Lance-Corporal Clapson at the bottom of the shaft with a rope round him, as he had no appa-The Officer reached the face, and ratus. then, finding something wrong with the apparatus, turned to come out, but collapsed. Lance-Corporal Clapson took off his rope, ran in and tied it round the Officer, and dragged him out, thus undoubtedly saving his life.

82622 Sapper C. M. Collette, 173rd Tunnelling Company, Royal Engineers.

For conspicuous bravery and decision when engaged, with another man, in pushing forward advanced galleries through those of the enemy, thereby determining the success of the mining operations. Any loss of coolness and presence of mind would have led to the discovery and loss of the advanced workings, and possibly also to the destruction of the whole of the galleries.

208 Serjeant C. W. Crawley, 1/7th (Robin Hood) Battalion, Nottinghamshire and Derbyshire Regiment, T.F.

For conspicuous gallantry near Ypres on the night of 30th-31st July, 1915, when, with the assistance of four others, he brought in over 20 wounded men of another Regiment and several of his own under artillery and rifle fire. These wounded men were lying out in front of a new trench which had been dug during the night.

1206 Lance-Corporal J. Cronise, 1/6th Battalion, North Staffordshire Regiment, T.F. (attached 137th Brigade Mining Section).

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion on the 10th September, 1915, near Ypres. The enemy blew in a mine, burying two men. Another Non-Commissioned Officer who was in the mine sent all the uninjured men to the shaft, and then attempted to reach the buried men, with no protection save his smoke helmet, which was useless against the gas caused by the explosion. Driven back by the gas, he repeated his attempt, accompanied by Lance-Corporal Cronise. Both were badly affected by the gas, but managed to reach the shaft.

Later in the day it was decided to camouflet the enemy, and, although the gas overcame most of the men working in shifts, Lance-Corporal Cronise continued working until he had to be carried to the shaft. Both Non-Commissioned Officers showed the

greatest bravery and devotion.

86421 Serjeant J. Currie, 173rd Tunnelling Company, Royal Engineers.

For conspicuous bravery and decision when engaged, with another man, in pushing forward advanced galleries through those of the enemy, thereby determining the success of the mining operations. Any loss of coolness and presence of mind would have led to the discovery and loss of the advanced workings, and possibly also to the destruction of the whole of the galleries.

2825 Private H. W. Elkins, 1/4th Battalion, Hampshire Regiment, T.F.

For conspicuous gallantry on the 5th July, 1915, at Gurmah Safhah (Mesopotamia), in returning to the steamer for ammunition, and carrying it, under a heavy shell and rifle fire, to the firing line.

5619 Company Serjeant-Major A. G. Elliott, 2nd Battalion, Royal West Kent Regiment.

For conspicuous gallantry and ability on the 24th July, 1915, near Nasiriyah (Mesopotamia), when he was one of the first to reach the enemy's trenches, and later on led several bayonet charges in the close fighting which ensued. Company Serjeant-Major Elliott showed great bravery in assisting a wounded comrade under a heavy fire.

79432 Sapper J. W. Fox, 176th Company, Royal Engineers (formerly No. 6129, 2nd Battalion, Wiltshire Regiment).

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty at Givenchy on 25th August, 1915. He twice entered a mine gallery, the first time to assist in the rescue of an Officer and a Corporal who had been gassed, the second time to try and rescue the men at the face. He was finally overcome by gas and had to be dragged out, but as soon as he had partly recovered he insisted in going on with his work till ordered to stop by an Officer.

2315 Private W. Francis, 1st/6th Battalion, West Yorkshire Regiment, T.F.

For conspicuous gallantry on the night of the 30th-31st August, 1915, near Ypres. A Non - Commissioned Officer had been wounded while on listening patrol. His companion returned for help, and Private Francis, accompanied by a Non - Commissioned Officer, went out to bring him in. Whilst binding up the wound both were wounded by a bomb, but they proceeded to carry the wounded man in, and, although he also was again wounded, they stuck to him and only handed him over to the stretcher-bearers on the order of an Officer. Private Francis attempted to walk in, but ultimately he had to give in and be

79707 Sapper A. Gitty, 176th Tunnelling Company, Royal Engineers (formerly No. 6238, 2nd Battalion, Royal Scots Fusiliers).

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty at Givenchy on 25th August, 1915. After his Officer and relief Commander had both been gassed by fumes, he organised their rescue and endeavoured to rescue the men at the face of the mine. He also assisted in the rescue of a Non-commissioned Officer who was gassed when working with him, and assisted a Serjeant in arranging air-pipe lines to clear the gases after making certain that there was no hope of rescuing the men at the face.

79941 Sapper T. Gillespie, 173rd Tunnelling Company, Royal Engineers.

For conspicuous gallantry on the 6th September, 1915, at Cambrin. In company with another man he assisted to lay and fire a charge in an underground mine gallery. It was merely a question of seconds whether the British or German mine could be laid and fired first. Success to either side meant the destruction of their opponents.

34355 Corporal H. Gold, 131st Battery, Royal Field Artillery.

For conspicuous bravery and consistent good work from the 22nd April to the 5th May, 1915, when in charge of the wagon lines. On one occasion he took command of the wagon line of the 62nd Battery in addition to his own, and he invariably displayed great courage and marked ability under the heaviest fire.

2 Staff Serjeant C. V. Heath, Australian Flying Corps.

For conspicuous pluck and determination in Mesopotamia on 1st August, 1915. He assisted to pole a "bellum" (long flatbottomed boat) 28 miles in 12 hours in most intense heat in order to rescue aviators who had been forced to descend in the enemy's country.

2665 Private J. Hill, 1/4th Battalion, Hampshire Regiment, T.F.

For conspicuous bravery on the 24th July, 1915, near Nasiriyah (Mesopotamia). Private Hill was one of the two first to enter the enemy's trenches in advance of his Regiment, and his courage and devotion to duty set a fine example to all ranks.

8739 Private G. Howe, 2nd Battalion, Royal West Kent Reginent.

For conspicuous gallantry on the 24th July, 1915, near Nasiriyah (Mesopotamia). Private Howe went to the assistance of Lieut. A. L. Hill, who was wounded and engaging the enemy with his sword. He bayonetted four of them and shot one, thereby saving the Officer's life.

96961 Acting Second Corporal T. Howell, 175th Tunnelling Company, Royal Engineers.

For conspicuous gallantry on the night of the 24th-25th August, 1915, in the trenches in front of Ypres. After verifying the existence of German mines under the trench, he bored down and placed a charge, which failed to explode. He then volunteered, at great risk, to reopen the bore hole, and a charge, subsequently fired, successfully exploded the German mine.

14113 Corporal E. H. King, 1st Battalion, Lincolnshire Regiment (attached 175th Company, Royal Engineers).

For conspicuous gallantry on the night of the 4th-5th September, 1915, at Hooge. Corporal King, with another Non-Commissioned Officer, was at the mine shaft with the outgoing and incoming relief. When the front trenches were destroyed by minenwerfer, there were several casualties in killed, wounded and missing. The shaft was cut off by the destruction of the trenches, and the enemy opened a heavy fire and bombardment. Although his companion was wounded, this Non-Commissioned Officer brought in the wounded to cover under the trying conditions existing, and displayed the greatest bravery and devotion to duty.

10187 Serjeant J. King, 7th Battalion, Royal Sussex Regiment.

For conspicuous gallantry during the months of July and August, 1915, in patrol work, usually alone. On the 9th September at Hobbs Farm, Serjeant King ambuscaded three Germans going to their listening post, and on their refusal to surrender he shot them He has invariably shown great courage, zeal and resource in the performance of dangerous and difficult duties.

8135 Corporal F. Leach, 1st Battalion, Wiltshire Regiment.

For conspicuous gallantry on the 31st August, 1915, at Hooge. During the bombardment of the trenches, a part of the parapet was blown in, burying a man. Corporal Leach went round the débris across the open under a heavy fire, and dug the man out just in time to save his life. He had previously been brought to notice for gallant conduct at St. Eloi, when he rallied his men and opened a rapid fire on the Germans immediately after they had exploded a mine close to our parapet.

1892 Lance-Corporal H. Martin, 1st/4th (Hallamshire) Battalion, Royal Lancaster Regiment, T.F.

For conspicuous gallantry and resource on the night of 8th-9th September, 1915, near "Point 432." He was on duty at a listening post about 12.30 a.m., when he saw a German Officer and two men approaching him. He remained silent till they were quite close, when he sprang suddenly intoview shouting "Hands up!" They dropped their arms and put their hands up. He then saw a fourth German, and ordered the Officer to make him lay down his arms and join the party, which he did. He then stood guard over his prisoners and shouted for an escort, which marched them in.

Lance-Corporal Martin then returned to his post, after collecting one revolver and three rifles belonging to the prisoners.

86428 Lance-Corporal S. Mayer, 173rd Tunnelling Company, Royal Engineers.

For conspicuous bravery on the 6th September, 1915, at Cambrin, when, under a heavy fire, he succeeded in placing, in an underground gallery occupied by Germans, a bag of blastine in such a position that a charge could be fired, thereby rendering possible the success of the operations in progress.

10777 Private H. McCabe, 2nd Battalion, Scottish Rifles.

For conspicuous gallantry at Neuve-Chapelle from 10th to 14th March, 1915. On one occasion, although wounded in two-places, he continued to hold back wire in order to let his Section pass through.

1397 Acting Company Serjeant-Major A. M. McKay, 1st/4th Battalion, Yorkshire Regiment, T.F.

For conspicuous and consistent gallantry and devotion to duty throughout his period of service with the Battalion.

On the night of 5th-6th July, 1915, near Wulverghem, he assisted an Officer to place eight "knife rests" (entanglements) in position only 40 yards from the German trench, while exposed to heavy rifle fire.

On the night of 6th-7th August he

On the night of 6th-7th August he assisted the same Officer to complete the work of wiring in front of his fire trench, after the remainder of the wiring party had been withdrawn owing to heavy machinegun fire.

79942 Sapper J. McKay, 173rd Tunnelling Company, Royal Engineers.

For conspicuous gallantry on the 6th September, 1915, at Cambrin. In company with another man, he assisted to lay and fire a charge in an underground mine gallery. It was merely a question of seconds whether the British or German mine could be laid and fired first. Success to either side meant the destruction of their opponents.

5706 Company Serjeant-Major E. J. Newbrook, 2nd Battalion, Royal West Kent Regiment.

For conspicuous gallantry and resource on the 24th July, 1915, throughout the action

near Nasiriyah (Mesopotamia). Although severely wounded Company Serjeant-Major Newbrook remained with his command until the end of the day's operations, giving a fine example of bravery and devotion to duty.

12058 Lance-Corporal F. J. J. Oke, 57th Field Company, Royal Engineers.

For conspicuous gallantry and ability on four nights between the 25th and 31st August, 1915, on the Yser Canal, near Boesinghe, when engaged in building a bridge. The work was carried out under extremely difficult and dangerous conditions, it having to be stopped every few minutes for flares, several times owing to searchlight, and twice from heavy shelling. On one night, although two men were killed and four wounded, and his party reduced to four, he finished twelve bays. His bravery and example under trying conditions enabled the work to be satisfactorily completed.

1176 Serjeant J. Paterson, 1st/7th (Fife) Battalion, Royal Highlanders, T.F. (attached 179th Company, Royal Engineers).

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty at La Boiselle on 26th August, 1915. A Non-Commissioned Officer and private descended a mine, but the Non-Commissioned Officer, overcome by gas, fell to the bottom of the shaft. The private went to his rescue, but himself collapsed. Serjeant Paterson at once descended to attempt their rescue, but he also collapsed, and, though he succeeded in regaining the surface, had to be taken to hospital badly gassed.

1942 Private N. W. Player, 1/4th Battalion, Hampshire Regiment, T.F.

For conspicuous bravery on the 24th July, 1915, near Nasiriyah (Mesopotamia). Private Player was one of the two first to enter the enemy's trenches in advance of his Regiment, and his courage and devotion to duty set a fine example to all ranks.

86980 Acting 2nd Corporal J. Pryor, 175th Tunnelling Company, Royal Engineers.

For conspicuous gallantry on the night of the 24th-25th August, 1915, in the trenches in front of Ypres. After verifying the existence of German mines under the trench, he bored down and placed a charge, which failed to explode. He then volunteered, at great risk, to reopen the bore hole, and a charge subsequently fired successfully exploded the German mine.

9792 Lance Corporal G. R. Raymer, 1st Battalion, Wiltshire Regiment.

For conspicuous gallantry on the night of 25th-26th August, 1915, when in charge of

a listening post in front of the trenches at Hooge. One of the listening post was seriously wounded by rapid fire, but Lance-Corporal Raymer carried him back and over the parapet under heavy fire, being himself wounded in doing so. There was a bright moon at the time.

22944 Private J. H. Richardson, 2nd Battalion, Yorkshire Light Infantry (attached 179th Company, Royal Engineers).

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty at La Boiselle on 26th August, 1915. A corporal and a private had been overcome by gas at the bottom of a mine, and a Serjeant who had attempted a rescue had also been overcome. An Officer, who arrived shortly after, lowered a canary in a cage to test the air, and although the canary collapsed within two feet of the surface, he descended and rescued one of the men.

The Officer then called for a volunteer to rescue the other. Private Richardson, although no safety apparatus was available, at once went down the mine and succeeded in bringing up the other man.

1165 Lance-Corporal A. Smith, 1st/6th Battalion, West Yorkshire Regiment, T.F.

For conspicuous gallantry on the night of the 30th-31st August, 1915, near Ypres. A Non-Commissioned Officer had been wounded while on listening patrol. His companion returned for help, and Lance-Corporal Smith and another man went out to bring him in. Whilst binding up the wound, both were wounded by a bomb, but they proceeded to carry the wounded man in, and, although he also was again wounded, they stuck to him, and only handed him over to the stretcher bearers on the order of an Officer. Their devotion to duty was most marked.

1492 Lance Corporal R. Snow, 1/4th Battalion, Hampshire Regiment, T.F.

For conspicuous gallantry on the 24th July, 1915, near Nasiriyah (Mesopotamia). Lance-Corporal Snow continued to fire his machine-gun with absolute steadiness for a period of three hours under heavy shell and rifle fire, his gun being apparently singled out as a target by the hostile artillery. Although wounded by shrapnel at the end of the second hour, he continued to work his gun until it was put out of action by a shell.

79634 Corporal A. Thomson, 176th Tunnelling Company, Royal Engineers (formerly No. 1424, 1st/8th Battalion, Argyll and Sutherland Highlanders, T.F.).

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty at Givenchy on 25th August, 1915, when as Non-Commissioned Officer in charge of the relief at work in a mine he went down the gallery immediately after the end had been blown in to try and rescue the men at the face. He could not get on as the gas fumes put out his light, but on the arrival of an Officer with a torch he followed him and dragged him out after he had been overcome by the fumes. Corporal Thomson collapsed when half-way out and had himself to be rescued.

30686 Corporal B. Trice, 6th Ammunition Column, Royal Field Artillery.

For conspicuous gallantry on the 24th July, 1915, near Nasiriyah (Mesopotamia), when he acted as Serjeant-Major of the Machine Gun Battery, and was largely responsible for its successful landing from the barge. Subsequently he brought it into action under a heavy fire. His courage, resource and devotion to duty were most marked.

2887 Private E. G. Verrall, 1/4th Battalion, Hampshire Regiment, T.F.

For conspicuous gallantry on the 24th July, 1915, near Nasiriyah (Mesopotamia). During the assault, in which he was wounded, Private Verrall gave a fine exhibition of courage and resource, and his example and devotion to duty were of great encouragement to all with him.

350 Serjeant F. Wallbank, 1/6th Battalion, North Staffordshire Regiment, T.F. (attached 137th Brigade, Mining Section).

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion on the 10th September, 1915, near Ypres. The enemy blew in a mine, burying two men. Serjeant Wallbank, who was in the mine, sent all the uninjured men to the shaft, and then attempted to reach the buried men with no protection save his smoke helmet, which was useless against the gas caused by the explosion. Driven back by the gas, he repeated his attempt, accompanied by another Non-Commissioned Officer. Both were badly affected by the gas, but managed to reach the shaft.

Later in the day it was decided to camouflet the enemy, and, although the gas overcame most of the men working in shifts, his companion continued working until he had to be carried to the shaft, while Serjeant Wallbank remained until the work was finished, but collapsed on reaching the surface. Both Non-Commissioned Officers showed the greatest bravery and devotion.

7361 Serjeant W. Wannell, 2nd Battalion, Royal West Kent Regiment.

For conspicuous gallantry on the 24th July, 1915, near Nasiriyah (Mesopotamia). Serjeant Wannell was one of the first into the enemy's trenches, and he led a party from point to point in the close fighting which followed, clearing trench after trench with the bayonet or with rifle fire. He also used hand grenades with great effect.

10290 Lance-Corporal (Acting Serjeant) W. H. A. Watkins, 2nd Battalion, Oxfordshire and Buckinghamshire Light Infantry.

For conspicuous gallantry on the 25th August, 1915, at Givenchy. A small mine was exploded at the head of a sap. Lance-Corporal Watkins, a bomber, who was in reserve, on hearing the noise of the explosion, on his own initiative collected two other bombers and hurried up at once to give assistance.

Again on the night of the following day, at the same place, during a determined bomb attack by the enemy, he voluntarily remained on duty all night, at times climbing out of the trench to enable him to reach the German trenches better. His bravery, coolness and example were of the greatest benefit to all ranks.

6690 Staff-Serjeant P. G. Wells, 2nd Battalion, Cameron Highlanders (Indian Unattached List).

For conspicuous gallantry on the 24th July, 1915, near Nasiriyah (Mesopotamia). Staff-Serjeant Wells led his platoon, at a critical period in the attack, with great courage and ability until he fell severely wounded. His fine example was of the greatest value to all ranks with him, and his devotion to duty most marked.

79705 Sapper H. R. Wenlock, 170th Tunnelling Company, Royal Engineers (formerly No. 10485, 2nd Battalion, South Staffordshire Regiment).

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty on the night of the 21st-22nd August, 1915, at Cuinchy, when he sank a shaft, 4 feet deep, in No. 7 Mine, in 2 hours, knowing that the Germans were working within a few feet of him. Twelve men had already lost their lives at different times in the same mine only a few days previously.

Private Wenlock never hesitated to carry out his task, and owing to his bravery and determination the enemy were successfully forestalled.

82129 Sapper J. W. Wood, 170th Tunnelling Company, Royal Engineers.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty on the night of the 21st-22nd August, 1915, at Cuinchy, when he sank a shaft, 4 feet deep, in No. 7 Mine in 2 hours, knowing that the Germans were working within a few feet of him. Twelve men had already lost their lives at different times in the same mine only a few days previously.

Sapper Wood never hesitated to carry out his task, and owing to his bravery and determination the enemy were successfully forestalled.

2030 Private H. G. Wooldridge, 1/4th Battalion, Hampshire Regiment, T.F.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty on the 5th July, 1915, at Gurmah

Safhah (Mesopotamia), when, after being knocked down by the explosion of a shell, and later, when wounded in the shoulder, he refused to leave his post until ordered to do so by the Medical Officer.

102218 Corporal F. R. Young, 175th Company, Royal Engineers.

For conspicuous gallantry on the night of the 4th-5th September, 1915, at Hooge. Corporal Young, with another Non-Commissioned Officer, was at the mine shaft with the outgoing and incoming relief, when the front trenches were destroyed by minenwerfer. There were several casualties in killed, wounded and missing. The shaft was cut off by the destruction of the trenches, and the enemy opened a heavy fire and bombardment. Although Corporal Young was himself wounded, these Non-Commissioned Officers brought in the wounded to cover under the trying conditions existing, and displayed the greatest bravery and devotion to duty.
