PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the Declaration of London Order in Council No. 2, 1914, His Majesty was pleased to declare that, during the present hostilities, the provisions of the said Declaration of London should, subject to certain exceptions and modifications therein specified, be adopted and put in force by His Majesty's Government; and

Whereas, by Article 57 of the said Declaration, it is provided that the neutral or enemy character of a vessel is determined by the flag which she is entitled to fly; and

Whereas it is no longer expedient to adopt the said Article:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after this date Article 57 of the Declaration of London shall cease to be adopted and put in force.

In lieu of the said Article, British Prize Courts shall apply the rules and principles formerly observed in such Courts.

This Order may be cited as "The Declaration of London Order in Council, 1915." And the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and each of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, the President of the Probate, Divorce, and Admiralty Division of the High Court of Justice, all other Judges of His Majesty's Prize Courts, and all Governors, Officers, and Authorities whom it may concern, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

WHEREAS by the Isle of Man (War Legislation) Act, 1914, His Majesty has power to extend to the Isle of Man any Act which, in the opinion of His Majesty, was passed for the purpose of meeting any emergency created by the present War, subject to adaptations for the purpose of making the Act

applicable to the Isle of Man:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Elections and Registration Act, 1915, shall extend to the Isle of Man, adapted as set out in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

Postponement of Local Elections.

1.—(1) The next statutory elections of members shall be postponed for a year, and the term of office of the existing members shall accordingly be extended by one year.

This section shall apply only where the next statutory election would take place before the

1st day of November, 1916.

(2) Any casual vacancy, requiring to be filled by election and occurring among the members of any board shall, until a new register comes into force, instead of being filled by an election, be filled by means of the choice by the board of a person to fill the vacancy, and a member so chosen shall hold office in the same manner in all respects as if he had been elected to fill the vacancy.

(3) The provisions of this section may be applied, if necessary, to the election, appointment or co-optation of the chairman, vice-chairman, or member of a board or committee of a board, by order of the Lieutenant Governor, and may be so applied with the necessary modifications and either generally as regards all boards of any particular kind, or specially as regards any particular heard

- specially as regards any particular board.

 (4) Any provisions of any Act or Order or Regulations relating to any such member, or to any such chairman, vice-chairman, or member of a board, shall be construed as if they were modified in such a manner as to give effect to the provisions of this section, and the Lieutenant Governor, if any question arises, may by Order specify the actual modification which is to be made in pursuance of this section.
- (5) For the purposes of this section the expression "statutory election" means an election to fill the place of members retiring on the expiration of their term of office, and the expression "existing members" means members who are in office at the time when the next retirement of members after the passing of this Act would, but for this Act, have taken place.

Postponement of Registration.

2. The register of voters, under the House of Keys Election Acts, the Douglas Municipal Corporation Act, 1895, and the Local Government (Registration of Voters and Election by Rallot) Act, 1904, in force at the time of the passing of this Act shall remain in force until Parliament provides for special registers being made or otherwise directs, and the Act making such provisions shall have been extended to the Isle of Man.

Definitions.

3. In this Act the expression "board" shall mean the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Douglas, the Commissioners of a Town, the Commissioners of a Village District, the Commissioners of a Parish District,

a Higher Education Board, a School Board, the Board of Guardians of the Poor of any District, and any other Board or Body to which this Act may be applied by the Lieutenant Governor, and the expression "member" or "members" shall mean a member or members of a "board."

Short Title.

4. This Act may be cited as "The Elections and Registration (Isle of Man) Act, 1915."


