At the Council Chamber, *Whitehall*, the 27th day of *October*, 1915.

By the Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

WHEREAS under the Elections and Registration Act, 1915, power is conferred on the appropriate Government Department by Order to apply the provisions of Section 1 of that Act (which relate to the postponement of certain local elections and to the method to be temporarily employed for filling casual vacancies), to, inter alia, the election of members of any kind of local or other body:

And whereas the General Council of Medical Education and Registration of the United Kingdom is a body within the meaning of the above-recited provision, and the election of certain members thereof, being direct representatives of registered medical practitioners resident in the United Kingdom, is, under the provisions of the Medical Act, 1886, conducted in accordance with regulations made by the Privy Council:

And whereas the statutory terms of office of two of the existing direct representatives are due to expire on the 28th February, 1916, and the 18th May, 1916, respectively, and it is expedient that the provisions of the said Act

should be applied to the elections which would otherwise forthwith be held for the purpose of filling the vacancies so caused, and that provision should be made at the same time for filling any casual vacancy which may occur among the direct representatives on the General Council before the 1st November, 1916:

Now, therefore, Their Lordships, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by the said Act of 1915, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

The provisions of Section 1 of the Elections and Registration Act, 1915, are hereby applied to the said elections of members of the General Council, subject, however, in their application to those elections, to the following modifications:—

(1) The date until which the term of office of the said members is extended shall be the 31st December, 1916, and the holding of the elections in accordance with the provisions of Section 8 of the Medical Act, 1886, shall be correspondingly postponed.

(2) The method of filling casual vacancies provided for in Subsection (2) of the said Section shall be employed until the 1st November, 1916, and not thereafter, and shall be employed only in the case of a

casual vacancy amongst the said direct representatives; and a person chosen in the manner provided by that Subsection to fill any casual vacancy shall hold office until the 31st December, 1916, and no longer.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Modification of Order.

1. The Somerset and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1915 is modified in manner hereinafter appearing.

*Movement into or within the Zone for
Immediate Slaughter.*

2.—(1.) An animal may, subject as hereinafter provided, be moved by railway or by vessel without a licence from premises not situate within the Scheduled District to a railway station or landing-place situate within the Zone described in the First Schedule hereto (hereinafter referred to as "the Zone"); and an animal so moved may be moved from the railway station or landing-place to any slaughterhouse situate within the Zone if accompanied by a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the railway station or landing-place is situate.

(2.) An animal may, subject as hereinafter provided, be moved by road from any premises not situate within the Scheduled District to any slaughterhouse in the Zone, or be moved from any premises in the Zone to any slaughterhouse in the Zone, if accompanied in each case by a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the slaughterhouse is situate.

Prohibition of Markets, &c., of Animals.

3. No market, fair, sale, or exhibition of animals shall be held in the Zone or in any other part of the Scheduled District.

*Provision for Movement of Animals from
Bristol (Cumberland Basin) Irish Animals
Landing Place.*

4. The movement from the Bristol (Cumberland Basin) Irish Animals Landing Place of animals landed thereat shall be subject to the provisions of this Order, except that the licence authorising such movement shall be one granted by an Inspector of the Board.

Provisions as to Movement Licences.

5.—(1.) Where the movement authorised by a Movement Licence granted under this Order is movement by road into the Zone, or is movement to a slaughterhouse in the Zone from premises in the Zone other than a railway station or landing-place, an animal shall not be moved with the Licence unless before the

movement is commenced it is marked by and at the expense of the owner in manner following:—

Cattle.—By the clipping of a broad arrow
↑ about six inches long on the left hind-quarter of each of the cattle and by the clipping of the hair off the end of the tail.

Sheep.—By the clipping of a broad arrow
↑ on the forehead of each of the sheep; and also by the painting or stamping of the letter M about six inches long, on both sides of each of the sheep with the following composition, namely: Rosin, five parts; oil of turpentine, two parts; and blue or red ochre, one part; melted and used warm; or with some other adhesive composition of a blue or red colour.

Swine.—By the painting or stamping of the letter M about six inches long, on both sides of each of the swine with the composition above mentioned.

(2.) A Movement Licence under this Order shall not be granted by an Inspector of a Local Authority unless he is satisfied that the proposed movement will not involve movement on a road in the Scheduled District which is not in the Zone.

(3.) Every Licence shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the Licence is granted, the number and description of the animals authorised to be moved, and the name or description of the several premises to and from which the animals are authorised to be moved.

(4.) Where animals are moved with a Licence under this Order the Licence shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up to an officer of the Local Authority or be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station in the same District by the person in charge of the animals at the time of completing the movement.

(5.) A Movement Licence granted under this Order shall be in force for four days, inclusive of the day of issue, and shall be in the form set forth in the Second Schedule to this Order or to the like effect.

(6.) A Movement Licence granted under this Order shall not be available if granted by the owner of the animal to be moved, or by his agent, or by the consignee of the animal, or by the occupier of the farm or premises or slaughterhouse from or to which the animal is to be moved, or by any individual member of an Executive Committee or Sub-Committee of a Local Authority.

(7.) A copy of a Licence which authorises movement to premises in a District other than the District for which the person granting the Licence acts as Inspector shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector to the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination is situate.

General Provisions as to Movement.

6. Animals while being moved under this Order shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all animals which are not being so moved, and shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to the slaughterhouse specified in the Licence, where they shall be detained until they are slaughtered.

Exception of certain Animals from Provisions as to Movement.

7. Nothing in this Order shall be construed as authorising—

(i.) movement of an animal which is affected with foot-and-mouth disease, or which has during the preceding twenty-eight days been in any way exposed to the infection of such disease; or

(ii.) movement into or out of a foot-and-mouth disease infected place; or

(iii.) movement of an animal the movement of which is prohibited by notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board.

Saving for Orders and Regulations.

8. Movement of animals under this Order is subject to any other Order of the Board, and also subject to any Regulation made by a Local Authority under any Order of the Board for prohibiting or regulating the movement of animals.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

9.—(1.) Any person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, necessary for the movement, and shall allow it to be read, and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Offences.

10.—(1.) If a person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted on any animal as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

11. In this Order—

“The Act of 1894” means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

“The Board” means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.

“Animals” means cattle, sheep, goats and swine.

“Slaughterhouse” means any premises where animals are habitually slaughtered, and includes a bacon factory.

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Revocation.

12. The Somerset and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1915 (No. 2) is hereby revoked.

Commencement.

13. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of November, nineteen hundred and fifteen.

14. This Order may be cited as the SOMERSET AND DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1915 (No. 3), and shall be read with the Order referred to in Article 1.

PEMBROKESHIRE (FOOT-AND-MOUTH
DISEASE) ORDER OF 1915 (No. 2).

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of very other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

PART I.

Application of Order.

1. This Order shall apply to the Scheduled District described in the Pembrokeshire (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1915 (hereinafter referred to as "the Scheduled District").

Division of Scheduled District into Three Zones.

2.—(1.) The Scheduled District shall for the purposes of this Order be divided into the three Zones described in the First Schedule to this Order (hereinafter referred to respectively as Zone I, Zone II, and Zone III), to which the provisions hereinafter set forth shall apply.

(2.) If any farm (except any detached part) is partly within and partly without a Zone, the whole shall be deemed to be within the Zone, and where the farm extends to two Zones, the whole shall be deemed to be in the inner Zone.

PART II.

PROVISIONS AS TO ZONE I.

Prohibition of Movement of Animals into, out of, or within Zone I.

3. No cattle, sheep, goats, or swine shall be moved into or out of Zone I, or be moved along, over, or across, or be allowed by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon, a highway or thoroughfare within that Zone.

Prohibition of Markets, &c., of Animals in Zone I.

4. No market, fair, sale, or exhibition of animals shall be held in Zone I.

PART III.

PROVISIONS AS TO ZONE II.

Prohibition of Movement of Animals out of Zone II.

5. No cattle, sheep, goats, or swine shall be moved out of Zone II.

Movement into Zone II for Immediate Slaughter only; Movement within Zone II for any necessary or expedient purpose.

6.—(1.) No cattle, sheep, goats, or swine shall be moved into, or be moved along, over, or across a highway or thoroughfare within, Zone II except in accordance with the subsequent provisions of this Article.

(2.) No animal shall be allowed by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon a highway or thoroughfare in Zone II.

(3.) An animal may, subject as hereinafter provided, be moved by railway or by vessel without a Licence from premises in Zone III., or from premises not situate within any District which is for the time being a Scheduled District for the purposes of an Order of the Board relating to Foot-and-Mouth Disease, to a railway station or landing place situate within Zone II; and an animal so moved may be moved from the railway station or landing place to any slaughterhouse situate within Zone II if accompanied by a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the railway station or landing place is situate.

(4.) An animal may, subject as hereinafter provided, be moved by road from any premises in Zone III, or from any premises not situate within any District which is for the time being a Scheduled District for the purposes of an Order of the Board relating to Foot-and-Mouth Disease, to any slaughterhouse in Zone II if accompanied, while being moved by road in Zone II, by a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the slaughterhouse is situate.

(5.) Where an Inspector of the Local Authority considers it necessary or expedient that an animal in his district should be permitted to be moved for any purpose from premises in Zone II to any other premises in that Zone, he may authorise such movement by a Movement Licence.

(6.) A Movement Licence under this Article shall not be granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority unless he is satisfied that the proposed movement will not involve movement on a road in Zone I.

Prohibition of Markets, &c., of Animals in Zone II.

7. No market, fair, sale, or exhibition of animals shall be held in Zone II.

PART IV.

PROVISIONS AS TO ZONE III.

Prohibition of Movement out of Zone III except into Zone II for Slaughter.

8. No animal shall be moved out of Zone III except for the purpose of movement to a slaughterhouse in Zone II, and then only in accordance with the provisions of Article 6 of this Order.

PART V.

GENERAL.

Provisions as to Movement Licences.

9.—(1.) Where the movement authorised by a Movement Licence granted under this Order is movement to a slaughterhouse from premises other than a railway station or landing place, an animal shall not be moved with the Licence unless before the movement is commenced it is marked by and at the expense of the owner in manner following:

Cattle.—By the clipping of a broad arrow ↑ about six inches long on the left hind-quarter of each of the cattle and by the clipping of the hair off the end of the tail.

Sheep.—By the clipping of a broad arrow ↑ on the forehead of each of the sheep; and also by the painting or stamping of the letter M, about six inches long, on both sides of

each of the sheep with the following composition, namely: Rosin, five parts; oil of turpentine, two parts; and blue or red ochre, one part; melted and used warm; or with some other adhesive composition of a blue or red colour.

Swine.—By the painting or stamping of the letter M, about six inches long, on both sides of each of the swine with the composition above mentioned.

(2.) Where the movement authorised by a Movement Licence is movement as often as occasion may require, either between different parts of the same farm, or between different farms, the Licence shall be marked with the words "Occupation Licence," and shall be in force until it is revoked by an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board by a Notice served on the occupier of the farm on which the animals then are.

(3.) Every Licence shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the Licence is granted, the number and description of the animals authorised to be moved, and the name or description of the several premises to and from which the animals are authorised to be moved.

(4.) Where animals are moved with a Licence under this Order, unless the Licence is an Occupation Licence, the Licence shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up to an officer of the Local Authority or be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station in the same District by the person in charge of the animals at the time of completing the movement.

(5.) A Movement Licence granted under this Order, except where it is otherwise expressly authorised by this Order, shall be in force for four days, inclusive of the day of issue, and shall be in the form set forth in the Second Schedule to this Order, or to the like effect.

(6.) A Movement Licence granted under this Order shall not be available if granted by the owner of the animal to be moved, or by his agent, or by the consignee of the animal, or by the occupier of the farm or premises or slaughter-house from or to which the animal is to be moved, or by any individual member of an Executive Committee or Sub-Committee of a Local Authority.

(7.) A copy of a Licence which authorises movement to premises in a District other than the District for which the person granting the Licence acts as Inspector shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector to the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination is situate.

Movement of Animals through Zones by Railway.

10. For the purposes of this Order an animal shall not be deemed to be moved into or out of a Zone where it is moved through such Zone by railway from a place outside such Zone to another place outside such Zone without unnecessary delay and without the animal being untrucked within such Zone except for the purposes of feeding or watering the animal within the railway station premises where such untrucking takes place.

General Provisions as to Movement.

11. Animals while being moved with a Licence under this Order shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all animals which are not being so moved, and shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to the place of destination specified in the Licence, and where the place of destination is a slaughter-house they shall be there detained until they are slaughtered.

Exception of certain Animals from Provisions as to Movement.

12. Nothing in this Order shall be construed as authorising—

(i.) movement of an animal which is affected with foot-and-mouth disease, or which has during the preceding twenty-eight days been in any way exposed to the infection of such disease; or

(ii.) movement into or out of a foot-and-mouth disease infected place; or

(iii.) movement of an animal the movement of which is prohibited by notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board.

Saving for Orders and Regulations.

13. Movement of animals with a Licence under this Order is subject to any other Order of the Board, and also subject to any Regulation made by a Local Authority under any Order of the Board for prohibiting or regulating the movement of animals.

Power to Restrict the Movement of Persons in Certain Cases.

14.—(1.) An Inspector of the Local Authority acting under their direction may serve a Notice on the occupier of any field, shed, or other place in the Scheduled District, prohibiting the entry of any person into any such field, shed or other place, and thereupon, notwithstanding the existence of any footpath or right of way, no person shall enter the field, shed, or other place to which the Notice relates while any cattle, sheep, goats or swine are therein, otherwise than in accordance with the following regulations, that is to say:—

(i.) The owner of the field, shed or other place, or of the animals therein, or the agent or servants of such owner, may enter such field, shed or other place so far as may be necessary for the feeding or tending of the animals.

(ii.) Any other person may enter such field, shed or other place with a licence of an Inspector of the Local Authority, or of the Board.

(2.) Copies of such Notice shall be affixed or exhibited by the Inspector in such manner as he shall think desirable for ensuring notification of the restrictions hereby imposed.

(3.) A copy of every such Notice shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector to the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, Whitehall Place, London, S.W.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

15.—(1.) Any person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector

or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, necessary for the movement, and shall allow it to be read, and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Offences.

16.—(1.) If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the animal is moved shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If a person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(3.) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted on any animal as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(4.) If any person enters any field, shed, or other place in contravention of this Order, or of a notice served thereunder, such person shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Revocation.

17. The Pembrokeshire (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1915 is hereby revoked.

Interpretation.

18. In this Order—

“The Act of 1894” means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

“The Board” means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.

“Animals” means cattle, sheep, goats and swine.

“Slaughterhouse” means any premises where animals are habitually slaughtered, and includes a bacon factory.

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Act of 1894.

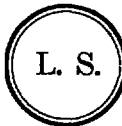

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, the Dogs Act, 1906, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Power to make Regulations.

1.—(1.) The Local Authority of the District specified in the Schedule to this Order may, in accordance with the provisions of this Order, make Regulations, with a view to the prevention of worrying of cattle (including sheep), for requiring that dogs or any class of dogs shall, during all or any of the hours between sunset and sunrise, be kept by the owners thereof under control in manner prescribed by the Regulations.

(2.) The Regulations may apply to the whole or any part of the District, and may exempt any class of dogs either generally or under prescribed conditions.

Confirmation of Regulations.

2.—(1.) Regulations made under this Order shall not take effect unless and until they have been submitted to and confirmed by the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.

(2.) Unless the Board otherwise direct, the following provisions shall apply—

(i.) Notice of intention to apply for confirmation of any Regulations shall be given in one or more of the local newspapers circulating within the District in two successive issues two weeks at least before the making of the application.

(ii.) For two weeks at least before an application, a copy of the Regulations proposed to be confirmed shall be kept at the office of the Local Authority of the District, and be open during office hours thereat to the inspection of ratepayers of the District without fee or reward.

(iii.) The Clerk of the Local Authority shall on the application of any such ratepayer furnish him with a copy of the proposed Regulations on payment of sixpence.

(3.) A copy of any Regulations made by the Local Authority under this Order, signed and certified by the Clerk of the Local Authority to be a true copy and to have been duly confirmed, shall be evidence, until the contrary is proved, in all legal proceedings, of the due making, confirmation, and existence of the Regulations without further or other proof.

*Seizure of Dogs where Regulations are
Contravened.*

3. Any dog in respect of which an offence is being committed against a Regulation made under this Order may be seized and treated as a stray dog under the powers conferred by section three of the Dogs Act, 1906.

*Extension of Definition in Diseases of
Animals Act, 1894.*

4. Dogs shall be animals for the purposes of the following sections of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894 (namely):—

Section forty-three (*Police*);

Section forty-four (*General administrative provisions*);

and also for the purposes of all other sections of the said Act containing provisions relative to or consequent on the provisions of those sections and this Order, including such sections as relate to offences and legal proceedings.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

5. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

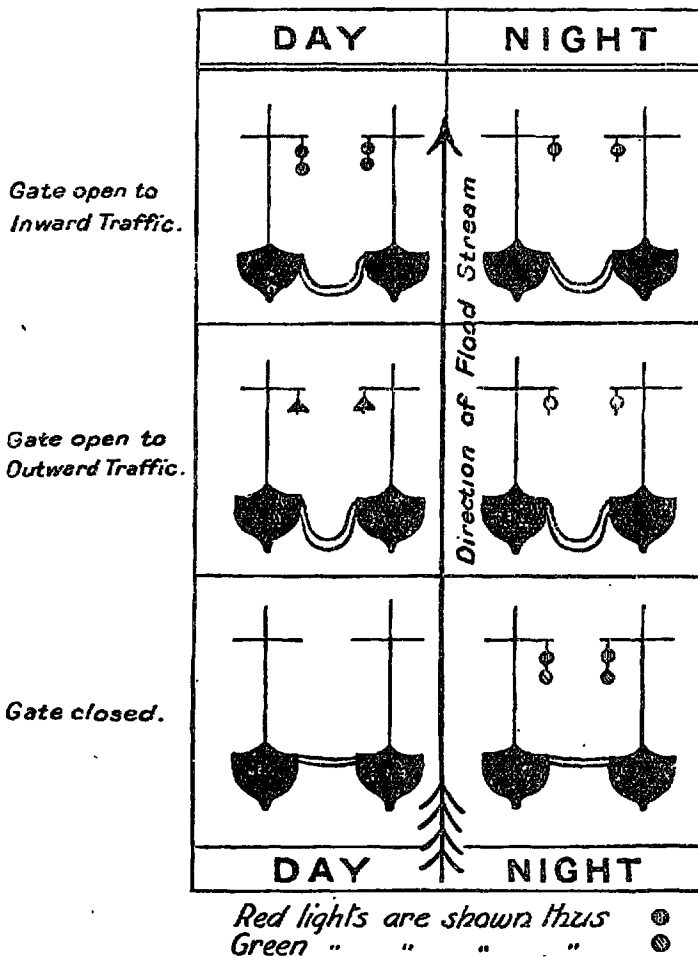
