BY an Order of the Chancery Division of the High Court of Justice made in the above Matters, it was directed that the following inquiry be made, viz. :—

(1) An inquiry what debts of the enemy firm to persons within the United Kingdom, not being enemies within the meaning of the above mentioned Act, remain unpaid.
