At the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 15th day of November, 1915.

By the Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

WHEREAS by virtue and in exercise of the powers conferred on Him by section one of the Exportation of Arms Act, 1900, as extended by section one of the Customs (Exportation Restriction) Act, 1914, and section one of the Customs (Exportation Restriction) Act, 1915, His Majesty was pleased to issue a Proclamation dated the twenty-fifth day of June, nineteen hundred and fifteen, declaring that the exportation of the articles mentioned in the second column of the Schedule to that Proclamation is prohibited to the country named in the first column of the said Schedule unless those articles are consigned to the persons referred to in the third column of the said Schedule:

And whereas by section two of the Customs (Exportation Restriction) Act, 1914, any Proclamation made under section one of the Exportation of Arms Act, 1900, may be varied

or added to whilst a state of war exists by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Trade:

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a recommendation from the Board of Trade to the following effect:—

That the amended Schedule to the Proclamation of the 25th day of June, 1915, which was brought into force by the Order of Council of the 7th day of October, 1915, should be further amended by adding Tobacco to the List of excepted articles which are not required to be consigned to the Authorized Persons referred to in the said Schedule:

Now, therefore, Their Lordships, having taken the said recommendation into consideration, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the same be approved.

Whereof the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs and Excise, the Director of the War Trade Department, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

THE ROYAL RED CROSS WARRANT.

GEORGE R.I.

GEORGE THE FIFTH by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India. To all whom these Presents shall come Greeting:—

Whereas Her late Majesty Our Beloved Grandmother Queen Victoria by a Warrant dated the 23rd day of April, 1883, did institute, constitute and create a Decoration designated "The Royal Red Cross" to be awarded in recognition of special services rendered in nursing the sick and wounded of Our Army and Navy and did make, ordain and establish certain rules and ordinances for the government of the same, which rules and ordinances were subsequently amended by Royal Warrants dated the 11th day of December, 1897, the 24th day of July, 1902, and the 8th day of September, 1909:

And whereas it is Our Royal Will and Pleasure that further provision shall be made for the recognition of such special services rendered in nursing the sick and wounded of Our Army and Navy:

Now therefore We do hereby declare that the rules and ordinances heretofore in force for the government of the said Decoration shall be abrogated, cancelled and annulled, and We are pleased to make, ordain and establish the following rules and ordinances in substitution for the same, which shall from henceforth be inviolably observed and kept:—

Firstly—The Decoration shall be styled and designated "The Royal Red Cross," and shall be divided into two Classes.

The First Class shall consist of a Cross, enamelled red, edged with gold, having on the arms thereof the words, Faith, Hope, Charity, with the date of the institution of the Decoration; the centre having thereon in relief the Royal and Imperial Effigy. On the reverse thereof the Royal and Imperial Cipher and Crown shall be shown in relief on the centre.

The Second Class shall consist of a Cross which shall be of the same form and size as in the First Class, but shall be of frosted silver and shall have superimposed thereon a Maltese Cross enamelled red not exceeding half its dimensions, the centre having thereon in relief the Royal and Imperial Effigy. The reverse shall have inscribed on the arms thereof the words Faith, Hope, Charity and the date of institution of the original Decoration, and shall bear in the centre in relief the Royal and Imperial Cipher and Crown.

Secondly.—The Cross in either Class shall be attached to a dark blue riband edged red, of one inch in width, tied in a bow and worn on the left shoulder.

Thirdly.—The decoration may be worn by the Queen Regnant, the Queen Consort, or the Queen Dowager of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland; and it shall be competent for Us, Our Heirs and Successors, to confer the Decoration upon any of the Princesses of the Royal Family of Great Britain and Ireland; also upon the Queens or Princesses of Foreign Countries who may have specially exerted themselves in providing for the nursing of the sick and wounded of Foreign Armies and Navies.

Fourthly.—It shall be competent for Us, Our Heirs and Successors, to confer either Class of this Decoration upon any members of the Nursing Services without restriction as to rank, or upon other persons engaged in nursing duties whether subjects or foreign persons, who may be recommended to Our notice by Our Secretary of State for War or by the First Lord of the Admiralty, as the case may be, for special devotion and competency which they may have displayed in their nursing duties with Our Army in the Field, or in Our Naval and Military Hospitals.

Fifthly.—The number of awards in the First Class of the Decoration shall not exceed two per cent. of the total establishment of Nurses, and the number of awards in the Second Class of the Decoration shall not exceed five per cent. of the total establishment of Nurses, the allotments to be proportionate to the numbers of each Nursing Service provided nevertheless that it shall be competent for Us, Our Heirs and Successors, to make such additions as, under exceptional circumstances, We may deem fitting.

Sixthly.—Recipients of the Second Class of the Decoration shall be eligible for advancement to the First Class as vacancies may arise.

Seventhly.—Recipients of the First Class of the Decoration shall be designated Members of the Royal Red Cross, and shall be entitled to the letters R.R.C. following their names. Recipients of the Second Class of the Decoration shall be designated Associates of the Royal Red Cross, and shall be entitled to the letters A.R.R.C. following their names.

Eighthly.—It shall be competent for Us, Our Heirs and Successors, to confer either Class of the Decoration upon any ladies, whether subjects or foreign persons, who may be recommended to Our notice by Our Secretary of State for War as having voluntarily undertaken the duties of establishing, conducting or assisting in hospitals for the treatment of sick and wounded soldiers and sailors of Our Army and Navy, or of Our Indian Military Forces or of the Naval and Military Forces of Our Self-governing Dominions beyond the Seas, or as

having performed valuable services with the Red Cross or kindred societies at home or abroad, or as having otherwise rendered eminent services in the care of sick and wounded soldiers and sailors of Our Army and Navy; and it is hereby ordained that all persons appointed under this Clause shall be regarded as Honorary Members or Associates, and their appointments shall be additional to the establishment ordained in the Fifth Clause of this Our Royal Warrant.

Ninthly.—The names of those upon whom We may be pleased to confer the Decoration shall be published in the London Gazette, and a registry thereof kept in the office of Our Secretary of State for War.

Tenthly.—In order to make such additional provision as shall effectually preserve pure this honourable distinction, it is ordained that if any person on whom such distinction shall be conferred shall by her conduct become unworthy of it, her name shall be erased, by an order under the Royal Sign Manual, from the register of those upon whom the said Decoration shall have been conferred. And it is hereby declared that We, Our Heirs and Successors, shall be the sole judge of the conduct which may require the erasure from the register of the name of the offending person, and that it shall at all times be competent for Us, Our Heirs and Successors, to restore the name if such restoration should be justified by the circumstances of the case.

Lastly.—We reserve to Ourselves, Our Heirs and Successors, full power of annulling, altering, abrogating, augmenting, interpreting, or dispensing with these Regulations, or any part thereof, by a notification under the Royal Sign Manual.

Given at Our Court at *St. James's*, this Tenth day of *November*, 1915, in the Sixth year of Our Reign.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Withdrawal of Existing Order.

1. The Pembrokeshire (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1915 (No. 3) is hereby revoked.

Prohibition of Movement out of Certain Area.

2. No cattle, sheep, goats or swine shall be moved out of the area described in the Schedule hereto: Provided that nothing in this Article shall be deemed to apply to the movement of animals out of such Area where they are moved through such Area by railway from a place outside such Area to another place outside such Area without unnecessary delay and without the animals being untrucked within such Area except for the purposes of

feeding or watering the animals within the railway station premises where such untrucking takes place.

Local Authority to Enforce Order.

3. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

4. If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the animal is moved shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

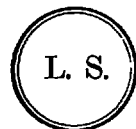

An Area comprising such portion of the parish of Angle, in the administrative county of Pembroke, as lies to the north and west of a boundary line commencing at a point in the eastern boundary of the parish where it is crossed by the high-water mark of Angle Bay, and proceeding in a westerly direction along the high-water mark to the western side of the road leading from the Boat House (via Coombs) to Jeffersonwalls, thence in a southerly direction along the western side of that road to its junction with the road leading from Kilpaison Burrows to Cartersgreen, thence in a westerly direction along the northern side of that road for a distance of about 80 feet to a point opposite a fence running due south from the southern side of that road to the high-water mark in the Bristol Channel, thence in a southerly direction across the road and along that fence to the high-water mark.

**SOMERSET AND DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1915
(No. 5).**

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Modification of Order.

1. The Somerset and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1915 and the Somerset and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1915 (No. 4), hereinafter referred to as Order (No. 1) and Order (No. 4) respectively, are modified in manner hereinafter appearing.

Continued Prohibition of Movement in certain Prohibited Areas.

2. The prohibition of movement of animals contained in Order (No. 1) shall apply without modification to the Areas described in the Schedule hereto (hereinafter referred to as Prohibited Areas).

Movement within Zone I, and into Zone I for Immediate Slaughter.

3.—(1.) The provisions of Order (No. 4) applicable to the Zone described in the First Schedule thereto shall cease to apply to that Zone, and shall apply to the Zone I described in the Schedule hereto.

(2.) For the purpose of movement into Zone I for immediate slaughter, Zone II shall be treated as if it were not in the Scheduled District.

Free Movement into and within Zone II; Movement out of Zone II for slaughter only.

4.—(1.) The prohibition of movement of animals contained in the Order (No. 1) shall not apply to any movement of animals—

(a) within Zone II described in the Schedule hereto;

(b) into Zone II from premises situate outside the Scheduled District; or

(c) out of Zone II to a slaughterhouse, provided that in any case in which the place of destination is in Zone I the movement shall be in accordance with Article 2 of Order (No. 4), and that in any case in which the place of destination is outside the Scheduled District, the animal shall be accompanied by a movement Licence, authorizing such movement, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the premises from which the animal is to be moved are situate, and shall be marked before the movement is commenced, by and

at the expense of the owner, in the manner prescribed in Article 6 (1) of Order (No. 4).

(2.) A copy of a Licence which authorizes movement to premises in a District other than the District for which the person granting the Licence acts as Inspector shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector to the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination is situate.

Holding of Markets and Sales in Zone II.

5.—(1.) A market or sale of animals may be held on any premises in Zone II. if the Local Authority are satisfied that the market or sale will be restricted to animals intended for immediate slaughter and the market or sale is authorised by the Local Authority under this Article.

(2.) The Local Authority shall cause a Veterinary Inspector to attend at every market or sale authorised under this Article and examine the animals exposed thereat.

(3.) An animal exposed at a market or sale authorised under this Article shall not be moved therefrom except to a slaughterhouse or bacon factory, and unless it is accompanied by a licence authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the district in which the market or sale is situate. The animal shall, before such movement, be marked, by and at the expense of the owner, in the manner described in Article 6 of Order No. 4.

Movement of Animals through Zones or Prohibited Areas by Railway.

6. For the purposes of this Order, an animal shall not be deemed to be moved into or out of a Zone or Prohibited Area where it is moved through such Zone or Area by railway from a place outside such Zone or Area to another place outside such Zone or Area, without unnecessary delay and without the animal being untrucked within such Zone or Area except for the purposes of feeding or watering the animals within the railway station premises where such untrucking takes place.

Provision as to Farms on borders of Zones or Prohibited Areas.

7. If any farm (*except any detached part*) is partly within and partly outside a Prohibited Area, the whole shall be deemed to be within the Area. Subject to this provision, if any farm (*except any detached part*) is partly within and partly outside a Zone, the whole shall be deemed to be within the Zone, and where the farm extends to two Zones the whole shall be deemed to be in the inner Zone.

Commencement.

8. This Order shall come into operation on the seventeenth day of November, nineteen hundred and fifteen.

Short Title, &c.

9. This Order may be cited as the SOMERSET AND DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1915 (No. 5), and shall be read with the Orders referred to in Article 1.

Such portion of the parish of Stanton Drew as lies to the north and east of the road leading from Chelwood (*via Stanton Wick Farm, Bromley Farm and Stanton Drew*) to Norton Malreward (*but excluding such road*).

Zone I.

A Zone comprising:—

In the Administrative County of Gloucester.

The parishes of Mangotsfield, Kingswood, Siston, Oldland, Hanham Abbots, Bitton, and Cold Ashton, and such portion of the parish of Marshfield as lies to the south of the road leading from Cold Ashton via Marshfield and Star House to North Wraxall.

In the Administrative County of Wilts.

The petty sessional division of Trowbridge;
The petty sessional division of Bradford, excluding such portion thereof as is comprised in Prohibited Area No. 1;

The parishes of Heywood and West Ashton;

Such portions of the parishes of Steeple Ashton, Great Hinton, Semington, and Melksham Without as lie to the west of a boundary line following the main road from Westbury via Bratton, Steeple Ashton, Ashton Common, and Semington, to the boundary of the parish of Melksham Within, and thence following the boundary of that parish in a westerly direction

to its junction with the parish of Broughton Gifford;

The lands common to the parishes of Broughton Gifford and Melksham Without;

ORDER OF 1915.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

Movement into, out of, or within Scheduled District.

1.—(1) No cattle, sheep, goats or swine shall be moved into or out of the District described in the Schedule to this Order, herein-

after referred to as the Scheduled District, or be moved along, over, or across, or be allowed by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon a highway or thoroughfare within the Scheduled District; provided that nothing in this Order shall be deemed to apply to the movement of animals into or out of the Scheduled District where they are moved through such District by railway from a place outside such District to another place outside such District without unnecessary delay and without the animals being untrucked within such District except for the purposes of feeding or watering the animals within the railway station premises where such untrucking takes place.

(2.) If any farm (except any detached part) is partly within and partly without the Scheduled District, the whole shall be deemed to be within the Scheduled District.

Power to restrict Movement of Persons in Certain Cases.

2.—(1.) An Inspector of the Local Authority acting under their direction may serve a notice on the occupier of any field, shed, or other place in the Scheduled District, prohibiting the entry of any person into any such field, shed, or other place, and thereupon, notwithstanding the existence of any footpath or right of way, no person shall enter the field, shed, or other place to which the notice relates while any cattle, sheep, goats or swine are therein, otherwise than in accordance with the following regulations, that is to say:—

(i) The owner of the field, shed, or other place, or of the animals therein, or the agent or servants of such owner, may enter such field, shed, or other place so far as may be necessary for the feeding or tending of the animals.

(ii) Any other person may enter such field, shed, or other place with a licence of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.

(2) Copies of such notice shall be affixed or exhibited by the Inspector in such manner as he shall think desirable for ensuring notification of the restrictions hereby imposed.

(3) A copy of every such notice shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector to the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, 4, Whitehall Place, London, S.W.

Local Authority to Enforce Order.

3. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

4.—(1) If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the animal is moved shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2) If any person enters any field, shed, or other place in contravention of this Order, or of a notice served thereunder, such person shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Short Title.

5. This Order may be cited as the Somerset (Glastonbury District) (Foot - and - Mouth Disease) Order of 1915.

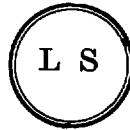
