Declaration of Swine-Fever Infected Area.

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be a Swine-Fever Infected Area for the purposes of the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the eighteenth day of November, nineteen hundred and fifteen.

PEMBROKESHIRE (FOOT-AND-MOUTH
DISEASE) ORDER OF 1915 (No. 4).

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Withdrawal of Existing Order.

1. The Pembrokeshire (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1915 (No. 3) is hereby revoked.

Prohibition of Movement out of Certain Area.

2. No cattle, sheep, goats or swine shall be moved out of the area described in the Schedule hereto: Provided that nothing in this Article shall be deemed to apply to the movement of animals out of such Area where they are moved through such Area by railway from a place outside such Area to another place outside such Area without unnecessary delay and without the animals being untrucked within such Area except for the purposes of
