WESTON-SUPER-MARE GRAND PIER.

(Power to Official Receiver to Sell Undertaking of Weston-super-Mare Grand Pier Company and Provisions incidental thereto; Application of Consideration for Purchase; Application to Purchaser of Existing Acts; Power to Purchaser to Work, Maintain or Abandon the Undertaking; Tolls, Rates and Charges; Creditors and Holders of Stock and Shares or other Securities of the Company to Accept Consideration in Substitution for their Securities; Winding-up of Company; General and Incidental Provisions; Extension of Time for Completion of Works; Amendment or Repeal of Certain Sections of Weston-super-Mare Grand Pier Acts, 1893, 1897, 1899, 1904, 1907 and 1912; Agreements; Incorporation and Amendment of Acts; and other purposes.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing Session for leave to bring in a Bill (hereinafter called "the Bill") for all or some of the following among other purposes, that is to say:—

To empower the Official Receiver in Companies Liquidation, as liquidator of the Weston-super-Mare Grand Pier Company (in this Notice referred to as "the Official Receiver" and "the Company" respectively) on the one hand and any corporation, company or person (in this Notice referred to as "the Purchaser") on the other hand, to enter into and carry into effect any agreement or agreements for the sale to and purchase by the Purchaser of the undertaking of the Company upon such terms and conditions as may be agreed between the Official Receiver and the Purchaser, and for that purpose to confer upon the Official Receiver all such powers of sale and otherwise as may be necessary or expedient, and to provide that the receipt of the Official Receiver or some person appointed by him for any purchase money or other consideration paid to him by the Purchaser upon any such sale and purchase shall be a good and sufficient discharge to the Purchaser therefor, and that the undertaking of the Company shall upon any such sale and purchase vest in the Purchaser absolutely.

To provide for the application by the Official Receiver of moneys so paid to him, and for the distribution of such moneys, or any part thereof, among the persons entitled thereto or otherwise.

To extend and apply to the Purchaser all or any of the provisions of the Acts of or relating to the Company.

To empower the Purchaser to hold, exercise
