A PROCLAMATION

FOR PROHIBITING THE IMPORTATION OF MACHINE TOOLS INTO THE UNITED KINGDOM.

GEORGE R I

WHEREAS by Section forty-three of the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876, it is provided that the importation of arms, ammunition, gunpowder, or any other goods may be prohibited by Proclamation

And whereas it is expedient that the importation into the United Kingdom of machine tools and parts thereof, excluding small tools, should be prohibited as hereinafter provided

Now, therefore, We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, in pursuance of the said Act and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby proclaim, direct and ordain as follows:—

As from and after the 21st day of December, 1915, subject as hereinafter provided, all machine tools and parts thereof, excluding small tools, shall be prohibited to be imported into the United Kingdom.

Provided always, and it is hereby declared, that nothing in this Proclamation shall apply to machine tools and parts thereof, imported under the licence of the Board of Trade and subject to the provisions and conditions of such licence.

This Proclamation may be cited as the Machine Tools (Prohibition of Import) Proclamation, 1915.

said Act to be expedient for the purpose of the successful prosecution of the present War that the sale and supply of intoxicating liquor should be controlled by the State, and to apply to such area so defined the Regulations issued by His Majesty in pursuance of the said Act under the Defence of the Realm Consolidation Act, 1914:

And whereas His Majesty in Council in pursuance of the said first-mentioned Act has issued the Defence of the Realm (Liquor Control) Regulations, 1915, under the said last-mentioned Act:

And whereas it appears to His Majesty that it is expedient for the purpose of the successful prosecution of the present War that the sale and supply of intoxicating liquor in the area defined and specified in the Schedule hereto should be controlled by the State on the grounds that War material is being made, loaded, unloaded and dealt with in transit therein, and that men belonging to His Majesty's Naval and Military forces are assembled therein.

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

The Defence of the Realm (Liquor Control) Regulations, 1915, and any Regulations amending the same shall be, and are, hereby applied to the area defined and specified in the Schedule hereto

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council.

“And whereas we are of opinion that the responsibilities undertaken by Ordinary and Boy Telegraphists of Your Majesty's Navy who are employed as Cabinet Watchkeepers, are such as to warrant the payment to them of an allowance additional to their pay:

“We beg leave humbly to submit that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the payment, as from the 1st October, 1915, and during the period of the present War, of an allowance of 6*d.* per diem to Ordinary Telegraphists, and of 3*d.* per diem to Boy Telegraphists, while regularly employed as Cabinet Watchkeepers in main or auxiliary wireless offices of Your Majesty's Ships.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

“Whereas by ‘The Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865,’ it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all Pay, Wages, Pensions, Bounty Money, Grants, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine, or to the widow or any relative of a deceased Officer, Seaman, or Marine, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas by Order in Council bearing date the 5th day of December, 1865, it is provided that payment of remittances of the wages of Men of Your Majesty's Naval Service may not be made until the payee's identity has been certified by a Magistrate, or Minister of Religion, or other specified authority:

“And whereas we consider it expedient that such Certificates of Identity should no longer be required, and that a system of payment by Post Office Money Order should be substituted for the existing method of payment by ‘Wages Remittance Bill’

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to cancel the said Order in Council of the 5th December, 1865, so far as relates to Certificates of Identity, and to authorize the adoption of the system of payment by Money Order.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, and other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council—

"And whereas by Sub-section (1) of Section 57A of the Naval Discipline Act provision is made for the trial by a Disciplinary Court, in lieu of trial by Court-Martial, of any Officer borne on the books of any of Your Majesty's Ships in commission, who is, in time of War, alleged to have been guilty of a disciplinary offence.

"And whereas Article 1410 of the Regulations for the government of Your Majesty's Naval Service provides for the payment of certain allowances to the persons appointed to officiate as the Deputy Judge Advocate, and Provost Marshal, respectively, at a trial by Court-Martial

"And whereas we consider it desirable that provision should be made for the payment of allowances to the corresponding Officials at a Disciplinary Court, namely, the Clerk of the Court, and the Provost Marshal—

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the payment of the following allowances accordingly—

WHEREAS by Treaty, grant, usage, sufferance, and other lawful means His Majesty the King has jurisdiction in China

And whereas it is desirable to make further provision with reference to the exercise of jurisdiction over British Companies carrying on business within the limits of this Order:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by "The Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890," or otherwise, in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows—

1. This Order may be cited as "The China (Companies) Order in Council, 1915," and shall be read as one with the "China Order, 1904" (hereinafter called the "Principal Order"), and with any Order amending the same.

2. In this Order—

"The Ordinance" means "The Companies Ordinance, 1911, of the Colony of Hong Kong," and includes any Ordinance amending or substituted for the same

"The Life Insurance Companies Ordinance" means the Life Insurance Companies Ordinance, 1907, of the Colony of Hong Kong, and includes any Ordinance amending or substituted for the same.

"China Company," means a Company limited by shares or by guarantee incorporated under the Ordinance, and the operations of which are directed and controlled from some place within the limits of this Order.

"Hong Kong China Company" means a Company incorporated under the Ordinance which carries on some part of its business within the limits of this Order, and the operations of which are directed and controlled from some place in Hong Kong.

"British Company" means a Company incorporated in the United Kingdom, or in a British Possession, and includes a China Company and a Hong Kong China Company.

3—(1) The Consul-General at Shanghai, including any person acting for such Consul-General, shall be Registrar of Companies at Shanghai.

(2) All acts done within the limits of this Order in pursuance of the provisions of the Ordinance or of the Life Insurance Companies Ordinance by, to, with, or before the Registrar of Companies at Shanghai, shall, subject to the provisions of this Order, be of the same force and validity as if they had been done by, to, with, or before the Registrar of Companies in Hong Kong.

(3) The Registrar of Companies at Shanghai shall be entitled to initiate such proceedings in the Court as he may think necessary to enforce compliance with the provisions of this Order on the part of British Companies in China.

4 The Judge may by Rules of Court confer upon Provincial Courts jurisdiction in matters dealt with in the Ordinance, and may specify in such Rules the Courts by which, and the classes of cases in which, such jurisdiction shall be exercised, but subject thereto the jurisdiction conferred by the Ordinance upon any Court shall within the limits of this Order be exercised by the Supreme Court.

5. In all matters relating to a Hong Kong China Company the jurisdiction of the Supreme Court and of the Supreme Court of Hong Kong shall be concurrent, and the said two Courts shall in all respects be auxiliary to each other.

6 Where any proceedings relating to a Hong Kong China Company, or for the winding up of any such Company, are commenced in the Supreme Court, and it appears that the principal part of such Company's business is carried on within the limits of Hong Kong, or that for any other reason such proceedings might more conveniently be carried on at Hong Kong, the Supreme Court may, of its own motion, or on the application of any party, make an Order transferring the proceedings to the Supreme Court of Hong Kong.

7 The Supreme Court shall enforce within the limits of this Order any Order or Decree made by the Supreme Court of Hong Kong in the course of any proceedings relating to a Hong Kong China Company, or for the winding up of any such Company.

8.—(1) The majority of the Directors of a China Company shall be British Subjects resident within the limits of this Order.

(2) If at any time the proportion of Directors who are British Subjects resident within the limits of this Order falls to or below one-half, it shall be the duty of the Directors and also of the Shareholders of the Company to take within 30 days, or such further period as the Court may allow, all necessary steps for the appointment of such number of Directors who are British Subjects resident within the limits of this Order as may be necessary to comply with the provisions of this article.

(3) If default is made in compliance with this article the Company shall be liable to a fine not exceeding 50 dollars for every day during which the default continues, and every Director and every Manager of the Company who knowingly authorizes or permits the default shall be liable to the like penalty.

(4) Failure to comply with the provisions of this article shall be a ground upon which an Order for winding up the Company may be made by the Court.

9. No person other than a British Subject shall be entitled to act as the auditor of a China Company. The appointment of any such person as the auditor of a China Company shall be void, and any certificate or other document given, or act done, by any person who is not a British Subject purporting to act as auditor of a China Company shall not be held to comply with any requirements of the Ordinance.

10. No person other than a British Subject shall be appointed to act within the limits of this Order as liquidator of a British Company or as receiver or manager on behalf of the debenture-holders of the property of a British Company except with the sanction of the Court.

11.—(1) All documents and other written information which a Company is required by the Ordinance to file with the Registrar of Companies shall, in the case of a China Company, be filed with the Registrar of Companies at Shanghai, and a copy of all such documents and other written information shall, in the case of a Hong Kong China Company, be filed with the Registrar of Companies at Shanghai.

(2) If any Company to which this article applies fails to comply with its provisions, the Company and every Officer and Agent of the Company who is knowingly a party to the default shall be liable to a fine not exceeding 50 dollars for every day during which such default has continued.

12. The registered office of a China Company shall be situated within the limits of this Order.

13.—(1) No shares shall be issued by a China Company except either as fully paid up shares or upon the term that the shares shall be paid up in full within a specified period not exceeding *three* months after allotment.

(2) Shares issued by a China Company otherwise than as fully paid up shares shall be deemed to be issued upon the condition that if not paid for in full before the expiration of one week from the date upon which the final payment was due, they shall be forfeited by the Directors, and it shall be the duty of the Directors at the expiration of that period to forfeit the said shares. Notice of the forfeiture of any such shares shall forthwith be given to the registered holder.

Any shares so forfeited shall be deemed to be the property of the Company, and the Directors may sell, re-allot, or otherwise dispose of the same in such manner as they think fit. Certificates or other documents of title relating to shares forfeited under this article shall be returned to the Company.

(3) Within one month of the expiration of the time allowed for the completion of the payment of all sums due upon the shares, the Secretary of the Company shall forward to the Registrar of Companies at Shanghai a return signed by the auditor of the Company giving particulars of the shares issued, of the amounts paid thereon, of the shares in respect of which default has been made in payment of sums due, and of the shares forfeited.

(4) If shares are issued by a China Company on terms which fail to comply with the provisions of this article, or if other default is made in complying therewith, the Company, and every Director, Manager, Secretary, and other

Officer, who is knowingly a party to such issue or default, shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable to a fine not exceeding 500 dollars for every day during which such offence continues.

(5) Where on application made it is established to the satisfaction of the Court that there has been a failure to comply with the provisions of this article through inadvertence or accidental miscalculation or from some other reasonable cause, and not from any want of good faith, the Court may, if under all the circumstances it considers it just so to do, give relief from any forfeiture or penalty which has been incurred by the applicant, or to which he is, or may be, liable upon such terms as it may think fit.

(6) The provisions of this article shall only apply to shares issued by a China Company after the date when this Order comes into effect.

14.—(1) No China Company limited by guarantee shall be allowed to operate in China without the consent of the Minister.

(2) As a condition of this consent the Minister may require that no person other than a British Subject shall be a Member of the Company, or that any Member of the Company who is not a British Subject shall deposit in Court or give security for or conform to such arrangement as the Minister shall think fit, for ensuring the payment of the amount for which he would be liable under the guarantee.

(3) If any China Company limited by guarantee operates in China without the consent of the Minister, or if any terms imposed by him as a condition of his consent are not complied with, the Company and every Director, or Manager, Secretary, and other Officer, who is knowingly a party thereto, shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable to a fine not exceeding 500 dollars for every day during which such offence continues.

(4) Where on application made it is established to the satisfaction of the Court that there has been a failure to comply with the provisions of this article through inadvertence or accidental miscalculation or from some other reasonable cause, and not from any want of good faith, the Court may, if under all the circumstances it considers it just so to do, give relief from any forfeiture or penalty which has been incurred by the applicant, or to which he is, or may be, liable upon such terms as it may think fit.

(5) The provisions of this article shall not apply to China Companies limited by guarantee operating in China at the date of this Order.

15.—(1) Subject to the provisions of this Order, the jurisdiction of the Court in respect of all British Companies carrying on business in China shall be exercised, so far as circumstances admit, in conformity with the provisions of the Ordinance and of the Life Insurance Companies Ordinance, except that Section 16 of the Companies Amendment Ordinance, 1913, shall not apply in China.

(2) Where reference is made or inferred in any Section of the said Ordinances to any other Ordinance of the Colony of Hong Kong which does not apply within the limits of this Order, such Section shall be read as though the corresponding law or enactment applicable in England were referred to therein.

(3) The duties of the Governor, or of the Governor in Council, or of the Colonial Treasurer under Sections 20, 21, 120 (4), 219, 253, and 255 of the Ordinance shall, within the limits of this Order, be exercised by the Minister, and under Sections 141 (1), 149, 185, 217, and 261 shall within the limits of this Order be exercised by the Judge.

(4) In the application of the said Ordinances "legal practitioner" is substituted for "counsel" or "solicitor" or "solicitor and counsel," and "such newspaper as the Judge may direct" is substituted for "the Gazette."

(5) All offences under the said Ordinances made punishable by fine may, if committed within the limits of this Order, be prosecuted summarily under article 48 of the Principal Order, provided that the maximum fine which can be imposed in the case of offences under the Ordinances tried summarily shall be 200*l.* instead of 20*l.*

16.—(1) The power of the Judge under article 119 of the Principal Order to make Rules of Court shall extend to any matter which under the Ordinance or under the Life Insurance Companies Ordinance is to be regulated by Rules.

(2) Any Rules in force at Hong Kong at the date of this Order relating to matters dealt with in the said Ordinances shall, unless and until they are repealed by Rules made under this article, apply, so far as circumstances admit, within the limits of this Order.

17 All fees prescribed by or under the Ordinance or by or under the Life Insurance Companies Ordinance which are paid to the Registrar of Companies at Shanghai shall be paid by him to the Colonial Treasurer at Hong Kong.

18 Nothing in this Order shall prejudice or affect the jurisdiction of the Supreme Court over British Companies other than China Companies and Hong Kong China Companies within the meaning of this Order.

19. This Order shall come into effect on the 1st day of January, 1916.

WHEREAS on the 20th day of January, 1914, an International Convention for the Safety of Life at Sea, and for purposes incidental thereto, was duly entered into by His Majesty and the other Signatory Powers more especially referred to and set out in the said Convention.

And whereas a Statute 4 & 5 Geo V. c. 50, intituled "An Act to make such amendments of the Law relating to Merchant Shipping as are necessary or expedient to give effect to an International Convention for the Safety of Life at Sea," (being the Convention above referred

to), was passed on the 10th day of August, 1914, the short title of which is "The Merchant Shipping (Convention) Act, 1914":

And whereas by Section 29, Sub-section 5, of the said Act, it was provided as follows:—

"This Act shall come into operation on the 1st day of July, 1915:

"Provided that His Majesty may, by Order in Council, from time to time postpone the coming into operation of this Act for such period not exceeding on any occasion of postponement one year as may be specified in the Order"

And whereas by Order in Council dated the 2nd day of June, 1915, His Majesty did postpone the coming into operation of the said Act until the 1st day of January, 1916.

And whereas His Majesty deems it expedient, owing to a state of War, that the provisions of the Merchant Shipping (Convention) Act, 1914, should be further postponed

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, in pursuance of the powers vested in Him by the above-recited provision, and of all other powers Him thereunto enabling, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that the provisions of the Merchant Shipping (Convention) Act, 1914, shall be postponed from coming into operation until the 1st day of July, 1916

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 4th day of November, in the year 1915, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice') of Barnham, in the County of Sussex, and in the Diocese of Chichester:

"Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Barnham is vested for an estate in

fee simple, in possession, free from incumbrances, in the Right Reverend Charles John, now Bishop of Chichester, in his private capacity:

"And whereas the said Charles John, Bishop of Chichester, is desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Barnham, now vested in him as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Chichester for the time being

"And whereas the said Charles John, Bishop of Chichester, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned in token of his desire, and also in token of his willingness as such Bishop to accept such transfer, and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which, by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited, or by some or one of them, is made necessary

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Barnham, which is hereinafter mentioned, and hereinafter recommended and proposed, will, in our opinion, tend to make better provision for the Cure of Souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson, so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid, arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parish of Barnham.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Charles John, Bishop of Chichester (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme, and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Barnham, now vested in him the said Charles John, Bishop of Chichester, in his private capacity as aforesaid, shall be transferred to himself the said Charles John, Bishop of Chichester, as such Bishop, and to his Successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in, and shall and may from time to time be exercised by, the said Charles John, Bishop of Chichester, and his Successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

Chapelry for the said Church of Saint Paul, Goose Green, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Paul, Goose Green.'

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference

THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS ACT, 1868.

The Governing Body of Winchester College having, on the 30th day of October, 1915, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by the above-named Act, and of the Acts amending the same, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, made a Statute in the terms hereafter set forth, and the said Statute having this day been laid before His Majesty in Council, the same is hereby published in the London Gazette in accordance with the provisions in that behalf contained in the said Act.

And notice is hereby given that any person, body of persons, or body corporate, authorized in that behalf by the said Act, may, within two months after the publication of this notification, petition His Majesty in Council to withhold His approval from the whole or any part of the said Statute.

WINCHESTER COLLEGE

A STATUTE MADE BY THE WARDEN AND FELLOWS
ON THE 30TH DAY OF OCTOBER, 1915.

WHEREAS it is expedient that provision should be made for assisting the education of boys of the following class, that is to say, boys who

need the assistance, and whose fathers, while serving in any of His Majesty's Forces in the present War, and while in action or on duty in such Service, shall have lost their lives, or shall have received wounds or other injury, hurt or harm, or shall have contracted disease or illness, which wounds, injury, hurt, harm, disease or illness, shall have caused or materially contributed to their deaths —

Now, We, the Warden and Fellows of Winchester College, being the Governing Body of Winchester College, do hereby, in exercise of the powers of the Public Schools Act, 1868, and of the Acts amending the same, and of all other powers enabling us in that behalf, resolve and enact as follows:—

1. The Warden and Fellows shall have power from time to time, as and when they shall think fit, to do all or any of the following things:—

(1) To increase the number of the Scholarships within the College beyond seventy by providing additional Scholarships to be tenable only by boys of the aforesaid class, which said additional Scholarships and the holders thereof are in this Statute referred to respectively as "War Scholarships" and "War Scholars".

Provided that the number of the War Scholars shall not at any one time exceed ten.

Provided also that the Warden and Fellows shall, with respect to any War Scholarship, have power at any time to determine that the same, if then vacant, shall not be filled up or that the same shall not be filled up upon the next vacancy occurring therein:

(2) To make Regulations for enabling boys of the aforesaid class to receive education and maintenance at the School, as Commoners thereof in the Boarding Houses belonging to the School, or in such of the said Boarding Houses as the said Regulations shall indicate, upon special terms with respect to all or any of the fees to be paid by such boys.

Provided that such Regulations shall be so framed as to limit the number of the boys who may enjoy the benefit thereof at any one time in any one Boarding House to a number not exceeding two.

(3) To make grants out of the income of the College towards meeting any expenses relating to the education at the School of the boys for the time being enjoying the benefit of any Regulations which shall have been made under Clause (2) of this Section, being expenses which the fees receivable under such Regulations shall not suffice to meet.

2. (1) This Statute shall apply only to any boy of the aforesaid class as to whom the Warden and Fellows shall be satisfied that by reason of his pecuniary circumstances it is proper that this Statute should apply.

(2) The decision of the Warden and Fellows upon any question arising under this Statute as to whether a boy belongs to the aforesaid class or as to the pecuniary circumstances of a boy shall for the purposes of this Statute be conclusive and final.

(3) The Warden and Fellows may from time to time make Regulations or give directions with respect to the evidence to be furnished by or on behalf of a candidate for a War Scholarship, or for any other benefit mentioned in this Statute, for the purpose of proving that he is duly qualified to receive the same.

3. The provisions with respect to Scholarships and Scholars contained in Statute II and Sections 2 to 12 (inclusive) of Statute XI and Sections 1 and 2 of Statute XII of the Statutes of the College, approved by His late Majesty King Edward the Seventh in Council on the 24th day of October, 1904, shall apply to War Scholarships and War Scholars in the like manner as they apply to other Scholarships and other Scholars of the College, but subject, nevertheless, with respect to Sections 2, 5, 6 and 11 of Statute XI, to the following provisions, that is to say:—

(1) With respect to Section 2:—

A candidate who shall be otherwise duly qualified, may, notwithstanding that his age be above the higher of the age limits mentioned in that Section, be elected to a War Scholarship, if at the time of the election thereto he shall be a member of the School.

(2) With respect to Sections 5 and 6:—

(a) The Examination relating to War Scholarships may be, and the Election-roll relating to War Scholarships shall be, separate and distinct from the Examination and the Election-roll relating to other Scholarships:

(b) In the arranging of names upon the Election-roll relating to War Scholarships the Warden and Fellows shall have a discretionary power of departing from the strict order of merit as shown by the Examination and of giving preferences to candidates who, in the opinion of the Warden and Fellows, ought to be preferred:

(c) In the filling up of vacancies among War Scholars a vacancy shall be ignored if the Warden and Fellows shall have determined that the same shall not be filled up.

(3) With respect to Section 11 —

The fees payable on behalf of War Scholars shall not be higher, and may, if the Warden and Fellows shall think fit, be lower, than the fees for the time being payable on behalf of other Scholars.

4. The Warden and Fellows shall have power from time to time to amend, alter, or annul any Regulation which shall have been made in exercise of powers of this Statute.

5 This Statute shall come into force immediately upon the approval thereof by His Majesty the King in Council.

Notice of Minimum Rates for Workers in the Tin Box and Canister Trade (Great Britain) Operative from 29th November, 1915 *

A.—FEMALE WORKERS.

Section 1.—In accordance with Regulations made under section 18 of the above Act by the Board of Trade and dated 27th April, 1910, the Trade Board established under the above Act and the Trade Boards Provisional Orders Confirmation Act, 1913, for the Tin Box and Canister Trade in Great Britain as defined in the Regulations made by the Board of Trade and dated 12th June, 1914, hereby give notice, as required by section 4 (3) of the above Act, that they have fixed the following minimum or lowest time-rates of wages, clear of all deductions,† for female workers, that is to say —

Subject to the following conditions.—

(a) That notwithstanding the above rates workers under 18 years of age shall be paid at a minimum rate 14s. 1d. per week if employed on power presses which, on account of their size or heaviness, or the risk of personal injury involved or upon other grounds, are unsuitable for the employment of such workers. In the interpretation of this clause regard shall be had for the practice of good employers.

(b) That as regards workers under 18 years of age the above minimum rates are payable subject to the provision that the worker during the whole or a substantial part of her time is learning any branch or process of the trade under conditions which afford her a reasonable prospect of advancement to the minimum rate of 14s 1d per week. Otherwise the minimum rate payable shall be 14s 1d. per week irrespective of age.

(c) That female workers of 18 years of age and over who have been employed in the trade for an aggregate period of less than 12 months, and who cannot suitably be employed on piece-work, shall, until the expiry of such 12 months' period of employment, be paid at a minimum rate of not less than 12s. per week.

Section 2.—The above rates are weekly rates based on a week of 52 hours, but they shall be subject to a proportionate deduction or increase according as the number of hours actually spent by the worker in the factory or work-

shop under contract of employment in any week is less or more than 52.

Section 3—The above rates shall, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Act, apply to all female workers occupied during the whole or any part of their time in the trade for which the Trade Board is established, namely, the making of boxes and canisters from tinsplate, excluding the sealing of filled boxes and canisters with solder, and excluding the following branches of work, namely—The lining of packing cases with tinsplate, the making of trunks, uniform cases, suit and dress cases, bonnet and helmet boxes, cash and deed boxes, despatch boxes, letter boxes, kegs and drums, and any other branch of work which does not form part of the tin box and canister trade. Provided that notwithstanding anything contained in this section the above minimum rates shall not apply to persons occupied merely as clerks, saleswomen, travellers, cleaners of premises, or to any other workers whose work stands in a relationship to the trade similar to that of the foregoing excluded classes.

Section 4—The above minimum rates are without prejudice to workers earning higher rates of wages.

(a) That as regards workers employed under 21 years of age the above minimum rates are payable subject to the provision that the worker, during the whole or a substantial part of his time, is learning any branch or process of the trade under conditions which afford him a reasonable prospect of advancement to the minimum rate of 26s. per week. Otherwise the minimum rate payable shall be 26s. per week irrespective of age.

(b) That male workers of 21 years of age and upwards, who have been employed in the trade for an aggregate period of less than 12 months, and who cannot suitably be employed on piece-work shall, until the expiry of such 12 months' period of employment, be paid at a minimum rate of not less than 22s 6d. per week.

Section 2—The above rates are weekly rates based on a week of 52 hours, but they shall be subject to a proportionate deduction or increase according as the number of hours actually spent by the worker in the factory or workshop under contract of employment in any week is less or more than 52.

Section 3.—The above rates shall, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Act, apply to all male workers occupied during the whole or any part of their time in the trade for which the Trade Board is established, namely, the making of boxes and canisters from tinsplate, excluding the sealing of filled boxes and canisters with solder, and excluding the following branches of work, namely, the lining of packing cases with tinsplate, the making of trunks, uniform cases, suit and dress cases, bonnet and helmet boxes, cash and deed boxes, despatch boxes, letter boxes, kegs and drums, and any other branch of work which does not form part of the tin box and canister trade. Provided that, notwithstanding anything contained in this section, the above minimum rates shall not apply to persons occupied merely as Clerks, Salesmen, Travellers, Carpenters, Vanmen, Watchmen, Outside Messengers, Cleaners of Premises, Timekeepers, or to any other workers whose work stands in a relationship to the trade similar to that of the foregoing excluded classes.

Section 4.—The above minimum rates are without prejudice to workers earning higher rates of wages.

* The above minimum rates fixed to come into force on 29th November, 1915, have at first a limited operation as follows —

(a) Employers must pay wages at not less than the minimum rate unless there is a written agreement under which the worker agrees to accept less. If there is no such written agreement the employer would not be liable to a fine for payment of wages at less than the minimum rate, but wages at the minimum rate could be recovered from the employer as a debt by the worker, or (in cases where the worker has lodged a formal complaint with the Trade Board) by the Trade Board acting on behalf of the worker.

(b) Any employer may give notice to the Trade Board that he is willing to be bound by the rate fixed, and must give such notice before he can receive a contract from a Government Department or Local Authority involving work to which the minimum rates are applicable. In such cases, agreements to accept less than the minimum rates would not be valid, and the employer would be liable to a fine if he paid wages at less than the minimum rate.

The limited operation period continues until the Board of Trade make an Order making the minimum rates obligatory. Such Order can be made on the expiration of six months from the date on which the rate came into force.

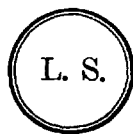

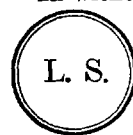

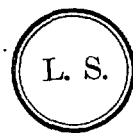

6. Craft unable to return to harbour owing to failing wind or fog, &c, are to anchor and show the regulation anchor lights at night. No bright lights are permitted.

7. Fishing is permitted by all *bonâ fide* fishermen in sailing craft, provided they are in possession of a permit which can be obtained from their District Fishery officers. When applying for these permits, they are to state the port from which they intend to work and this will be entered on the permit.

8. All fishing craft mentioned in paragraph 7 above must carry either their permit number or their registered number painted on each bow in figures not less than 12 inches in height.

9. Fishing is absolutely prohibited for all steam fishing vessels.

10. Craft found after dark in the areas detailed in paragraph 1 above are liable to be fired upon.

11. No craft are to proceed to sea with any petrol, motor oil, heavy oil, &c, on board with the exception that—

(i) Traders and all other craft may carry oil, petrol, motor spirit, &c, in bulk, barrels, or as stores for the equipment or navigation of the vessel, provided that the goods are properly pre-entered and that clearance is obtained from the Customs Officials in accordance with the Customs War Powers Act, 1915, paragraphs 1 to 3.

(ii). Sailing vessels may not have on board

a quantity of petrol, motor spirit, benzine, paraffin, petroleum, or similar substances, exceeding four gallons.

12. Owners of motor craft, pleasure craft, and small craft of all descriptions are to supply to the Coastguard Officer of the District lists of all their boats and vessels which they may place afloat, and they are to obtain from him permits for them. Without such permits these craft are not to be used. The number of the permit is to be painted on each bow in figures not less than 12 inches in height.

13. Motor craft, pleasure craft, and small craft of all descriptions are not to proceed outside of their ports, creeks or rivers during the hours of official day, unless in possession of a permit which may be obtained from a Customs Official on personal application, or (in places where there is no Customs Official) from the Coastguard Officer of that district.

14. The areas within which pleasure craft with permits may move during daylight are as follows, and they are forbidden to move in any other areas:—

Newhaven: Within one mile of *occulting* light at entrance.

Brighton and Hove: Within one mile of *fixed* light on western pier.

New Shoreham: Within one mile of high *occulting* light.

Worthing: Within one mile of *fixed* light on pier.

Littlehampton: Within one mile of *fixed red* light at entrance.

Bognor: Within one mile of *green* fishing light.

Sandown bay: Inside the line joining Culver cliff and Dunnose head.

Ventnor: Within one mile of Ventnor pier

Christchurch: Inside the entrance to Christchurch harbour

Christchurch head to Sandbanks: Within 400 yards of low water mark.

Poole harbour: Within the line joining North and South Havens.

Studland bay. From opposite Studland village to the Old Breakwater within 400 yards of low water mark.

Swanage bay: To the west of the line joining Ballard and Peverill points.

15. No excursion traffic is allowed except with the written permission of the Commander-in-Chief, Portsmouth, to be obtained for the season in regard to standing excursions, and on each occasion for special excursions.

16. Nothing in these orders shall affect the standing orders relating to the Defence Areas at Newhaven, Portsmouth and Poole.

(2) *Newhaven—Closing of the Port.*

The Port of Newhaven is closed to all merchant vessels other than those employed on Government Service, and those which have previously obtained special permission to enter from the Divisional Naval Transport Officer, Newhaven.

(3) *Poole Bay and Solent approach—Restriction of Traffic.*

No craft of any description, other than craft employed on Admiralty work, is to be under way to the northward of a line joining St. Catherine's point and Anvil point, between one hour after sunset and one hour before sunrise, or during fog.

(4) Portland Harbour approach—Restriction of Traffic.

No vessels or boats of any description are to move in the area north of a line joining Portland Bill with St. Albans head, by day or night, unless proceeding into Weymouth anchorage.

Note.

This Notice is a repetition of Notice No. 1059 of 1915, with the addition of the information relating to restriction of traffic in Poole bay and Solent approach contained in section (3).

Caution.

This Admiralty Notice to Mariners is issued under the provisions of the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, and failure to comply strictly with the directions contained in it will constitute an offence against those Regulations.

Any person found guilty of such an offence is liable to severe penalties both of imprisonment and fine.

Any person aiding or abetting the commission of such an offence is himself guilty of an offence against the Regulations.

Attention is also drawn to the fact that any infringement of the directions contained in this Admiralty Notice to Mariners is liable to result in the detention of the ship or vessel.
