PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council, dated the twenty-eighth day of November, nineteen hundred and fourteen, His Majesty was pleased to make Regulations (called the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914) under the Defence of the Realm Consolidation Act, 1914, for securing the public safety and the defence of the Realm:

And whereas the said Act has been amended by the Defence of the Realm (Amendment) Act, 1915, the Defence of the Realm (Amendment) No. 2 Act, 1915, and the Munitions of War Act, 1915:

And whereas the said Regulations have been amended by various subsequent Orders in Council:

And whereas it is expedient further to amend the said Regulations in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to

order, and it is hereby ordered, that the following amendments be made in the said Regulations:—

1. In lieu of the second paragraph of Regulation 11 the following paragraph shall be substituted:—

“The Secretary of State may also by order require that between such hours, within such area, and during such period, as may be specified in the order, such lamps as may be so specified shall be carried by all vehicles or vehicles of any specified class or description and in connection with traffic of any other specified class or description, and shall be properly trimmed, lighted, and attached or carried, and any police constable may stop any vehicle or other traffic found without lamps as required by the order, and, in the case of a vehicle, may seize the same, and the person in charge or having control of the vehicle or other traffic shall be guilty of a summary offence against these regulations.”

2. After Regulation 14B the following regulation shall be inserted:—

“14c.—(1) A person coming from or intending to proceed to any place out of the United Kingdom as a passenger shall not, without the

special permission of a Secretary of State, land or embark at any port in the United Kingdom unless he has in his possession a valid passport issued to him not more than two years previously, by or on behalf of the Government of the country of which he is a subject or a citizen, or, in the case of a person coming from a place outside the United Kingdom, either such a passport or some other document satisfactorily establishing his nationality and identity.

"To every such passport and document as aforesaid there must be attached a photograph of the person to whom it relates.

"In the case of British subjects resident in Ireland special permission to embark may be given by the Lord Lieutenant of Ireland instead of by a Secretary of State.

"(2) If any person lands or embarks in contravention of this regulation, or if, where any such special permission to land has been granted by a Secretary of State subject to any conditions, the person to whom it was granted fails to comply with any such condition, he shall be guilty of a summary offence against these regulations.

"(3) For the purposes of this regulation the expression 'passenger' includes any person carried on a ship other than the master and persons employed in the work or service of the ship."

3. After Regulation 22a the following regulation shall be inserted:—

"22b.—(1) Every person who carries on, whether alone or in conjunction with any other business, the business of receiving for reward letters, telegrams, or other postal packets for delivery or forwarding to the persons for whom they are intended, shall as soon as may be send to the chief officer of police for the district, for registration by him, notice of the fact together with the address where the business is carried on, and the chief officer of police shall keep a register of the names and addresses of such persons, and shall if required by any person who sends such a notice furnish him on payment of a fee of one shilling with a certificate of registration, and every person so registered shall from time to time furnish to the chief officer of police notice of any change of address at which the business is carried on and such other information as may be necessary for maintaining the correctness of the particulars entered in the register.

"(2) Every person who carries on such a business as aforesaid shall cause to be entered in a book kept for the purpose the following particulars:—

(a) the name and address of every person for whom any postal packet is received, or who has requested that postal packets received may be delivered or forwarded to him;

(b) any instructions that may have been received as to the delivery or forwarding of postal packets;

(c) in the case of every postal packet received the place from which the postal packet comes and the date of posting (as shown by the post-mark) and the date of receipt, and, if registered, the date and office of registration and the number of the registered packet;

(d) in the case of every postal packet delivered, the date of the delivery and the

name and address of the person to whom it is delivered;

(e) in the case of every postal packet forwarded, the name and address to which and the date on which it is forwarded;

and shall not deliver a letter to any person until that person has signed a receipt for the same in such book as aforesaid.

"(3) The books so kept and all postal packets received by a person carrying on any such business and any instructions as to the delivery or forwarding of postal packets received by any such person, shall at all reasonable times be open to inspection by any police constable or by any person appointed for the purpose by the competent naval or military authority.

"(4) If any person contravenes or fails to comply with any of the provisions of this regulation he shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations.

"(5) Nothing in this regulation shall apply to postal packets addressed to any office where any newspaper or periodical is published, being postal packets in reply to advertisements appearing in such newspaper or periodical."

4. In Regulation 42, after the words "civilian population," there shall be inserted the words "or to impede, delay, or restrict the production, repair, or transport of war material, or any other work necessary for the successful prosecution of the war."

At the end of the same regulation the following paragraph shall be inserted:—

"This regulation, so far as it relates to the production, repair, and transport of war material, and such other work as aforesaid, shall be deemed, for the purposes of Regulation 56, to be a regulation in which the Minister of Munitions has concurrent powers."

5. In paragraph (b) of Regulation 45, after the words "has been duly issued," there shall be inserted the words "or with intent to obtain any such pass, permit, certificate, licence or other document or passport, whether for himself or for any other person, knowingly makes any false statement."

WHEREAS by the Isle of Man (War Legislation) Act, 1914, His Majesty has power to extend to the Isle of Man any Act which, in the opinion of His Majesty, was passed for the purpose of meeting any emergency created by the present War, subject to adaptations for the purpose of making the Act applicable to the Isle of Man:

And whereas by Order in Council, dated the 17th day of December, 1914, His Majesty was pleased to order that the Defence of the Realm Consolidation Act, 1914, and the Defence of

the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, should extend to the Isle of Man subject to the adaptations therein contained:

And whereas the said Act and Regulations have been amended by certain other Acts and Regulations, which Acts and Regulations have been extended to the Isle of Man by Orders in Council, dated the 27th day of May, 1915, the 28th day of July, 1915, and the 14th day of September, 1915, subject to the adaptations therein contained:

And whereas the said Regulations have been further amended by Orders in Council dated the 24th day of September, 1915, and the 14th day of October, 1915:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Regulations amending the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, issued by His Majesty by Orders in Council dated the 28th day of September, 1915, and the 14th day of October, 1915, shall extend to the Isle of Man, subject to the following adaptations:—

1. *In the Regulations of the 24th September, 1915.*

For Regulation 6B the following provision shall be substituted:—

“The Lieutenant Governor may (notwithstanding that the provisions of the Dangerous Goods Acts, 1871 to 1894, have not been complied with) grant licences for the establishment of new or the alteration of existing factories and magazines for gunpowder and other explosives intended for war purposes, and any licence so granted shall, during the continuance of the present War, have the like effect as if such licence had been obtained in manner provided by those Acts.”

In Regulation 30A, after the words “United Kingdom” there shall be read the words “or the Isle of Man.”

2. *In the Regulations of the 14th October, 1915.*

In Regulation 18B, after the words “United Kingdom” there shall be read the words “or the Isle of Man.”

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 27th day of November, 1915, in the words following, viz.:—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas the Regulations for the Government of Your Majesty's Naval Service

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provide that Seaman and Marine Pensioners called upon to serve in time of emergency shall be allowed to draw their pensions in addition to their pay, and to receive increases of pension in respect of such service:

“And whereas we have had under our consideration the emoluments of such Pensioners as may be promoted to Acting, Temporary, or Permanent Warrant or Commissioned Rank for the period of such service:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the application of the following Regulations to these Officers as from the outbreak of the present War:—

“(1) to be allowed to draw their man's pension in addition to the pay of the rank, but bonus not to be payable:

“(2) To be allowed, on reversion to the pension list, to draw, in lieu of their man's pension, the regulated pension or retired pay calculated on their actual service as Officers, subject, however, to the following exceptions:—

(a) that, if more advantageous to them, the pension or retired pay be awarded on the Seaman's or Non-Commissioned Officer's scale, time as Acting, Temporary, or Permanent Warrant or Commissioned Officer, counting as Chief Petty Officer's or Non-Commissioned Officer's time;

(b) that, in the event of discharge for misconduct, &c., the pension or retired pay be subject to the regulations governing such cases:

“(3) Men of the Royal Fleet Reserve who were discharged from that Force on account of promotion to be allowed, if more to their advantage, to return to the Reserve as men, and abandon any claim to pension as an Officer.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 24th day of November, 1915, in the words following, viz.:—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having

been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas under the Regulations for the government of Your Majesty's Naval Service the Field Allowance granted to Officers and Men employed in military operations on shore is not payable when quarters are provided at the public expense:

"And whereas we consider that this restriction should be modified during the existing Hostilities, and that Officers and Men of Your Majesty's Navy, Royal Naval Reserve, Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve, Royal Naval Auxiliary Sick Berth Reserve, and Royal Marines borne on Ship's Books, who may be provided with quarters at the public expense for any portion, but not the whole, of a given period should be paid Field Allowance continuously during the whole of such period at two-thirds of the full rate of the Allowance:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction this arrangement.

"We further beg leave to recommend that the provisions of Your Majesty's Order in Council of the 29th day of April, 1915, may be hereby cancelled.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS, by virtue of the Cyprus (Annexation) Order in Council, 1914, the Island of Cyprus has been annexed to and forms part of His Majesty's Dominions:

And whereas the Convention of Defensive Alliance between Her late Majesty Queen Victoria and His Imperial Majesty the Sultan of Turkey, signed on June the 4th, 1878, the Annex to the said Convention, signed on July the 1st, 1878, and the Agreement signed on behalf of Her said late Majesty and His Imperial Majesty the Sultan on August the 14th, 1878, have become annulled and are no longer of any force or effect:

And whereas it is expedient that provision should be made for the administration of the property, funds, and lands belonging to

mosques, cemeteries, Mussulman schools, and other religious establishments existing in Cyprus, as heretofore:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

(1) His Majesty's High Commissioner for Cyprus shall appoint two delegates, one of whom shall be a Mussulman resident in Cyprus, to superintend the administration of all property, funds, and lands belonging to mosques, cemeteries, Mussulman schools, and other religious establishments existing in Cyprus.

(2) Any such appointment shall take effect as from a date to be named by the High Commissioner, and all acts and things done or performed after the said date by such persons in the performance of their duties shall be deemed to be valid and effectual as if such persons had been duly appointed on that date.

(3) His Majesty may from time to time revoke, alter, add to, or amend this Order.

(4) This Order may be cited as "The Cyprus (Mussulman religious property) Order in Council, 1915."

And the Right Honourable Andrew Bonar Law, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, of the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and of the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme or Representation, bearing date the 15th day of July, in the year 1915, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, of the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and of the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme or Representation for altering the boundaries of the New Parish of Saint Hilda, Griffithstown, in the County of Monmouth, and in the Diocese of Llandaff:

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council, bearing date the 19th day of May, in the year 1898, and published in the London Gazette on the 20th day of the same month, a Consolidated Chapelry comprising portions of the New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Llanfrechfa Upper,

and of the Parish of Panteg, both in the said County and Diocese, was assigned to the Consecrated Church of Saint Hilda, Griffithstown, situate in the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Llanfrehfa Upper, and the said Consolidated Chapelry was named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Hilda, Griffithstown':

"And whereas the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Hilda, Griffithstown, has, under the provisions of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, become a New Parish of the character contemplated by that Act, by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and by the above-mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

"And whereas it has been represented to us, and it appears to us to be expedient, that the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint Hilda, Griffithstown, should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Joshua Pritchard, Bishop of the said Diocese of Llandaff, (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend, and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation, and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint Hilda, Griffithstown, shall be altered so that all that portion of the said Parish of Panteg, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, and is delineated and set forth upon the Map or Plan hereunto annexed, and is thereon coloured pink, shall be dissevered from such Parish, and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Hilda, Griffithstown.

"And we further represent, recommend, and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending, or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

"The territory to be dissevered from the Parish of Panteg, in the County of Monmouth, and in the Diocese of Llandaff, and to be annexed to the New Parish of Saint Hilda, Griffithstown, in the same County and Diocese, being:—All that isolated portion of the said Parish of Panteg which is bounded upon all sides as follows, that is to say, upon the east by the said New Parish of Saint Hilda, Griffithstown, upon the north by the Consolidated Chapelry of Saint James, Pontypool, upon the west by the Parish of Mynyddislwyn, and upon the south by the New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Llanfrehfa Upper, all in the said County and Diocese."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme or Representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such Scheme or Representation,

and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto:

And whereas the said Scheme or Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme or Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Llandaff.

WHEREAS the Local Government Board, after giving to the Incumbent and the Churchwardens of the Parish of Llanddewi Brefi, in the County of Cardigan, ten days' previous notice of their intention in that behalf, have, under the provisions of the Burial Act, 1853, as amended by the Burial Act, 1900, made a Representation to His Majesty in Council, to the effect that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new burial ground in the Civil Parish of Gorwydd, in the said Parish of Llanddewi Brefi, save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, should be prohibited, and that burials should be discontinued therein, as follows, viz.:—

Gorwydd.—Forthwith and entirely in the Church of St. David, in the Parish of Llanddewi Brefi, in the County of Cardigan; and in the Churchyard attached thereto, with the following exceptions, that is to say:—

In any earthen grave now existing in the said Churchyard, the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than 3 feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give notice of such Representation, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council, on the 11th day of January next.

And His Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the London Gazette, and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the Churches or Chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the Parish affected by such Representation one month before the said 11th day of January.

DEFENCE OF THE REALM (LIQUOR CONTROL).

ORDER (AMENDMENT) OF THE CENTRAL CONTROL BOARD (LIQUOR TRAFFIC) FOR THE WESTERN BORDER AREA.

We the Central Control Board (Liquor Traffic) in pursuance of the powers conferred upon us by the Acts and Regulations relating

to the Defence of the Realm, hereby make the following Order:—

1. The parish of Brampton shall be included among the parishes mentioned in paragraph (a) of Article 2 (1) of the Board's Order made on the Eleventh day of November, 1915, for the Western Border Area, and the provisions of the said paragraph of the said Article shall apply to the said parish of Brampton: and the said paragraph shall be read as if the name of "Brampton" were inserted after the name of "Irthington."

2. The names of "Woodside" and "Wigton" shall be substituted for the names of "Wigton Rural" and "Wigton Urban" in the said paragraph of the said Article.

3. This Order shall come into force on the Fourth day of December, 1915.

General Order of the Local Government Board.

NOTIFICATION AND TREATMENT OF MEASLES AND GERMAN MEASLES.

To the Mayor, Aldermen, and Commons of the City of London, in Common Council assembled;—

To the Councils of the several Metropolitan Boroughs, Municipal Boroughs, and other Urban Districts in England and Wales;—

To the Councils of the several Rural Districts in England and Wales;—

To all Medical Practitioners;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS We, the Local Government Board, are empowered by Section 130 of the Public Health Act, 1875, as amended by the Public Health Act, 1896, from time to time, to make, alter, and revoke Regulations with a view to the treatment of persons affected with any endemic or infectious disease and for preventing the spread of the disease; and to provide for the enforcement and execution of the Regulations;

And whereas by Section 133 of the Public Health Act, 1875, any local authority may, with Our sanction, themselves provide or contract with any person to provide a temporary supply of medicine and medical assistance for the poorer inhabitants of their district;

And whereas Measles and German Measles are endemic and infectious diseases:

NOW THEREFORE, We, by this Our Order and in the exercise of the powers conferred upon Us by the Public Health Act, 1875, the Public Health (London) Act, 1891, and the Public Health Act, 1896, and of every other power enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

Definitions.

ARTICLE I.—In these Regulations, unless the contrary intention appears:—

(a) Words importing the masculine gender include females;

(b) Words in the singular include the plural, and words in the plural include the singular;

(c) Expressions referring to writing include references to printing, and to other modes of representing or reproducing words in a visible form, and references to printing include references to other mechanical modes of so representing or reproducing words;

(d) The expression "Local Authority" means, as the case may be, the Mayor, Aldermen, and Commons of the City of London in Common Council assembled, the Council of a Metropolitan Borough, the Council of a Municipal Borough or other Urban District, or the Council of a Rural District;

(e) The expression "District" means the District subject to the jurisdiction of the Local Authority for the purposes of the Public Health (London) Act, 1891, or of

the Public Health Act, 1875, as the case may be;

(f) The expression "Medical Officer of Health" means Medical Officer of Health of a Local Authority;

(g) The expression "Medical Practitioner" means any person for the time being registered under the Medical Acts.

Commencement of Regulations.

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the First day of January, one thousand nine hundred and sixteen, and shall then and thereafter apply and have effect throughout England and Wales, and shall be enforced and executed by every Local Authority.

Notice of Provisions of Regulations.

ARTICLE III.—(1) The Local Authority shall forthwith cause notice to be given to all Medical Practitioners resident or practising within the District of the Local Authority of the duties imposed upon them by these Regulations.

(2) Fourteen days at least before the date on which these Regulations come into operation, the Local Authority shall give public notice of the effect of the provisions of the Regulations by advertisement in some one or more newspapers circulating within the District and by causing notice thereof to be affixed to the principal doors of every church and chapel in the place in which notices are usually fixed, and otherwise in such manner as the Local Authority think sufficient for giving notice thereof to all persons interested.

Supply of Forms of Notification.

ARTICLE IV.—For the purposes of these Regulations every Local Authority shall provide and maintain a sufficient supply of printed copies of the Form set out in the Schedule to these Regulations, and shall as soon as practicable after these Regulations come into operation, and afterwards from time to time when application is made to them, furnish printed copies of the said Form to every Medical Practitioner resident or practising within the District of the Local Authority.

Notification by Parents or Guardians.

ARTICLE V.—Every Parent or Guardian, or other person, as soon as he becomes aware of, or has reasonable grounds for supposing that any person in his charge is suffering from Measles or German Measles shall, unless the case has been already notified by a Medical Practitioner, forthwith notify the case to the Medical Officer of Health for the District, stating the name and age of the patient, and his address.

Notification by Medical Practitioners.

ARTICLE VI.—(1) Subject to the provisions of these Regulations, every Medical Practitioner, as soon as he becomes aware that a person upon whom he is in professional attendance is suffering from Measles or German Measles, shall forthwith make and sign a noti-

fication of the case in the Form set out in the Schedule to these Regulations, and shall transmit the notification to the Medical Officer of Health for the District:

Provided that a Medical Practitioner shall not be required to notify a case of Measles or German Measles under this Article and shall not be paid a fee for so doing—

(a) if he has reasonable grounds for supposing that the case has already been notified under these Regulations; or

(b) if the case is notifiable or has been notified by a Medical Practitioner under the Infectious Disease (Notification) Act, 1889, Section 55 of the Public Health (London) Act, 1891, or under the provisions of any Local Act or Order made thereunder; or

(c) if a case of the disease which he is attending, whether Measles or German Measles, has to his knowledge occurred in the same household or institution, and been notified within the period of two months immediately preceding the date on which he first becomes aware of the disease in the case he is attending; or

(d) if the case is being treated in a hospital for infectious diseases.

(2) Every Medical Practitioner who transmits to a Medical Officer of Health a notification of a case of Measles or German Measles under the Infectious Disease (Notification) Act, 1889, Section 55 of the Public Health (London) Act, 1891, or under the provisions of any Local Act or Order made thereunder, shall transmit such notification in the Form set forth in the Schedule to these Regulations.

Transmission of Notifications.

ARTICLE VII.—A notification to be transmitted to a Medical Officer of Health in pursuance of these Regulations shall be enclosed in a sealed envelope addressed to that Officer, and may be transmitted by being delivered to him or by being delivered at his office or residence, or may be sent by prepaid letter post addressed to him at his office or at his residence.

Fees for Notification.

ARTICLE VIII.—(1) The Local Authority shall pay to every Medical Practitioner a fee of two shillings and sixpence for each notification duly made, signed and transmitted by him under these Regulations if the case occurs in his private practice, and of one shilling if the case occurs in his practice as medical officer of any public body or institution.

(2) The said fees shall in each case be deemed to cover all expenses, including the cost of transmission.

Duties of Local Authorities and Medical Officers of Health.

ARTICLE IX.—(1) A Medical Officer of Health on receipt of a notification under these Regulations in relation to a case occurring in a house or institution which is not in his District shall forthwith notify the Medical Officer of Health of the District in which the house or institution is situated.

(2) Upon the receipt of a notification under these Regulations, or on becoming aware in

any other way of a case or suspected case of Measles or German Measles in his District, the Medical Officer of Health, or an Officer of the Local Authority acting under the instructions of the Medical Officer of Health, shall make such inquiries, and take such steps as are necessary or desirable for investigating the source of infection, for preventing the spread of infection, and for removing conditions favourable to infection, and if a Medical Practitioner is not in attendance on the patient, the Medical Officer of Health shall also take such steps as are necessary or desirable for ascertaining the nature of the case.

The Local Authority may provide or contract for the provision of medical assistance for the poorer inhabitants of the District when suffering from either of the diseases above mentioned:

Provided that nothing in this Article shall be deemed to authorise a Medical Officer of Health or other Officer to take any of the steps herein mentioned at any Institution other than one belonging to the Local Authority, except with the consent of the Managers of that Institution.

(3) The duties assigned to the Medical Officer of Health by the Sanitary Officers (London) Order, 1891, or the Sanitary Officers (outside London) Order, 1910, as the case may be, shall be deemed to extend to and to include all action by the Medical Officer of Health in the execution of these Regulations.

Notification not required in certain cases.

ARTICLE X.—Nothing in these Regulations shall be deemed to require a notification to be transmitted to a Medical Officer of Health in respect of an inmate of any building, ship, vessel, boat, tent, van, shed, or similar structure belonging to His Majesty the King.

Short Title.

ARTICLE XI.—These Regulations may be cited as “The Public Health (Measles and German Measles) Regulations, 1915.”

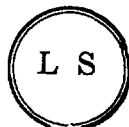

Bye-laws for the Regulation of the
Southampton Docks.

Pilotage and Traffic Regulations.

Former Notice.—No. 1041 of 1915; hereby cancelled.

Mariners are hereby warned that, under the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, the following Regulations have been made by the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty and are now in force:—

I. All ships (other than British ships of less than 3,500 tons gross tonnage, when trading coastwise or to or from the Channel islands and not carrying passengers) whilst bound from, and whilst navigating in the waters from, the Downs Pilot Station to Gravesend or *vice versa*, must be conducted by pilots licensed by the London Trinity House.

2. All ships (other than British ships of less than 3,500 tons gross tonnage, when trading coastwise or to or from the Channel islands and not carrying passengers) whilst bound from, and whilst navigating in the waters from, Gravesend to Great Yarmouth or *vice versa*, must be conducted by pilots licensed by the London Trinity House.

3. All ships (other than British ships of less than 3,500 tons gross tonnage, when trading coastwise or to or from the Channel islands and not carrying passengers) whilst navigating in the waters from Gravesend to London Bridge or *vice versa*, must be conducted by pilots licensed by the London Trinity House.

4. The Trinity House Pilot Station at Dungeness having been discontinued, pilotage is therefore not compulsory between the Downs Pilot Station and Dungeness, except for ships bound into or out of the Harbours of Dover and Folkestone.

II. Trinity House Pilot Stations have been established at the undermentioned places, and merchant vessels not under compulsion of pilotage are very strongly advised to take pilots:—

(a) THE DOWNS, where ships proceeding north can obtain pilots capable of piloting as far as Great Yarmouth, and also pilots for the River Thames, and for Folkestone and Dover harbours. The pilot steamers attached to the Downs Station will cruise in the vicinity of a position two miles south-east of Deal Pier.

(b) GREAT YARMOUTH, where ships from the North Sea bound for the River Thames or the English Channel can obtain pilots capable of piloting as far as the Downs.

The Pilot Steamer attached to the Great Yarmouth Station will cruise between the Corton Light-vessel and the South Scroby buoy.

(c) THE SUNK LIGHT-VESSEL, where ships crossing the North Sea between the parallels of 51° 40' and 51° 54' North Latitude, but *no others*, can obtain pilots for the River Thames and the Downs.

(d) Pilots can also be obtained at LONDON and HARWICH for the Downs and Great Yarmouth (including the River Thames and approaches).

Note.—The pilots referred to in this Notice are the pilots licensed by the London Trinity House and no others.

III. RIVERS THAMES AND MEDWAY.—All traffic into and out of the River Thames must pass through the Edinburgh Channels, or through the Black Deep south of the Knock John and Knob Light-buoys, and through the Oaze Deep, until further notice.

No vessels are to remain under way in the above-mentioned Channels between Chapman Lighthouse on the west, and the Sunk Head Light-buoy or a line joining the positions of the South Long Sand and East Shingles buoys, on the east, between the hours of 6.30 p.m. and 5.30 a.m.

Vessels at anchor within these limits must not exhibit any lights between the hours of 6.30 p.m. and 5.30 a.m.

All other Channels are closed to navigation.

2. Coasting vessels are not to be under way nor exhibit any lights in the East Swin or Wallet between sunset and sunrise.

3. Cruising of yachts and pleasure craft is prohibited in the estuaries of the Thames, Medway, Colne, Blackwater, Crouch and Roach, and adjacent rivers and creeks.

Fishing vessels are governed by the terms of the Notices issued by the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.

Note.—This Notice is a re-publication of Notice No. 1041 of 1915, with amendments to Section III.

Caution.

This Admiralty Notice to Mariners is issued under the provisions of the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, and failure to comply strictly with the directions contained in it will constitute an offence against those Regulations.

Any person found guilty of such an offence is liable to severe penalties both of imprisonment and fine.

Any person aiding or abetting the commission of such an offence is himself guilty of an offence against the Regulations.

Attention is also drawn to the fact that any infringement of the directions contained in this Admiralty Notice to Mariners is liable to result in the detention of the ship or vessel.
