PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 59th year of His late Majesty King George the Third, Chapter 134, of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 49, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Representation, bearing date the 18th day of November, in the year 1915, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 59th year of His late Majesty King George the Third, Chapter 134, of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 49, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a District

Chapelry to the Consecrated Church of Saint Nicholas, Kingston-upon-Hull, situate in the Parish of Hessle, in the County of York, and in the Diocese of York:

“ Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a District Chapelry should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Nicholas, Kingston-upon-Hull, situate as aforesaid:

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of York, (testified by his having signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said Parish of Hessle which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a District Chapelry to the said Church of Saint Nicholas, Kingston-upon-Hull, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named ‘The District Chapelry of Saint Nicholas, Kingston-upon-Hull’:

“ And with the like consent of the said Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of York, (testified

as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said Church of Saint Nicholas, Kingston-upon-Hull, situate as aforesaid, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns, and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices, should be paid and belong to the Minister of the same Church for the time being: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us the said Commissioners to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism, or for the registration thereof.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal Consideration, and to make such Order with respect thereto as to Your Majesty, in Your Royal Wisdom, shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint Nicholas, Kingston-upon-Hull, being:—All that part of the Parish of Hessle, in the County of York, and in the Diocese of York, which is bounded upon all sides as follows, that is to say, upon the south by the middle of the River Humber, upon the east partly by the New Parish of Saint Mary and Saint Peter, Dairy-coates, and partly by the New Parish of The Transfiguration, Newington, upon the north and upon part of the west by the Parish of Anlaby, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining part of the west by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said Parish of Anlaby from the said Parish of Hessle diverges westward from the middle of the Common West Drain, and extending thence first south-westward and then southward along the middle of the Common West Drain (which follows in part the western side of Second Lane and passes under Hull Road at Second Lane Bridge) for a distance of 69 chains or thereabouts to the point, distant 7 chains or thereabouts from the centre of Second Lane Bridge, where the said Common West Drain diverges westward, and extending thence in a straight line due south to a point in the middle of the River Humber."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of York.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by Section 16 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, as amended by the Pluralities Act, 1850, it is, amongst other things, enacted "That whenever it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, with respect to his own Diocese, and whenever it shall be represented to him by the Bishop of any Diocese, or by the Bishops of any two Dioceses, that two or more Benefices, or that one or more Benefice or Benefices, and one or more Spiritual Sinecure Rectory or Rectories, Vicarage or Vicarages, in his or their Diocese or Dioceses, being either in the same Parish or contiguous to each other, and of which the aggregate population shall not exceed 1,500 persons, may, with advantage to the interests of religion, be united into one Benefice, the said Archbishop of the Province shall inquire into the circumstances of the case; and if on such Inquiry it shall appear to him that such union may be usefully made, and will not be of inconvenient extent, and that the Patron or Patrons of the said Benefices, Sinecure Rectory or Rectories, Vicarage or Vicarages, respectively, is or are consenting thereto, such Consent being signified in writing under the hands of such Patron or Patrons, the said Archbishop shall, six weeks before certifying such Inquiry and Consent to His Majesty as hereinafter directed, cause, with respect to his own Diocese, a Statement in Writing of the facts, and in other cases a copy in Writing of the aforesaid Representation, to be affixed on or near the principal outer door of the Church, or in some public and conspicuous place in each of such Benefices, Sinecure Rectories, or Vicarages, with notice to any person or persons interested that he, she, or they may, within such six weeks, show cause in writing under his, her, or their hand or hands, to the said Archbishop against such union; and if no sufficient cause be shown within such time, the said Archbishop shall certify the Inquiry and Consent aforesaid to His Majesty in Council; and thereupon it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to make and issue an Order or Orders for uniting such Benefices, Sinecure Rectory or Rectories, Vicarage or Vicarages, into one Benefice, with Cure of Souls, for ecclesiastical purposes only; and it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to give directions for regulating the course and succession in which the Patrons, if there be more than one Patron, shall present or nominate to such United Benefice, from time to time, as the same shall become vacant":

And whereas the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, hath, pursuant to the provisions of the said Acts, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Certificate in Writing, bearing date the 18th day of February, 1915, in the words following:—

"We, Randall Thomas, Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury, Primate of All England and Metropolitan, do hereby certify to Your Majesty in Council:—

"That the Right Reverend John, Lord Bishop of Hereford, as Bishop of the Diocese within which are situate the Rectory of Felton,

and the Vicarage of Preston Wynne, both in the County of Hereford, having represented unto us that the said Benefices, being contiguous to each other, and of which the aggregate population does not exceed 1,500 persons, might with advantage to the interests of religion be united into one Benefice, we inquired into the circumstances of the case.

"That on such Inquiry it appeared to us that such union might be usefully made, and would not be of inconvenient extent, and that John Wood, Esq., M.P., and William Sidebottom, Esq., being the Patrons or persons entitled to present (jointly as Trustees) to the Rectory of Felton, if the same were now vacant, and the said Lord Bishop of Hereford, in right of his Bishopric, being the Patron or person entitled to collate to the Vicarage of Preston Wynne, if the same were now vacant, have consented to the proposed union.

"That six weeks and upwards before certifying such Inquiry and Consents to Your Majesty in Council we caused a Copy in Writing of the aforesaid Representation of the said Lord Bishop to be affixed to the principal outer door of the Parish Church of each of the said Benefices, with notice to any person or persons interested that he, she, or they might, within such six weeks, show cause in writing under his, her, or their hand or hands, against such union to us, the said Archbishop, and no such cause has been shown.

"The Representation of the said Lord Bishop, our Inquiry into the circumstances of the case, the Statement of Circumstances in reply thereto, the Consents in Writing of the said Patrons, and the Copies of the Representation and Notices before mentioned, are hereunto annexed.

"And we do hereby certify the Inquiry and Consents aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council, to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may, in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do, make and issue an Order for uniting the said Benefices into one Benefice, with Cure of Souls, for ecclesiastical purposes, and for declaring that the course and succession in which the respective Patrons for the time being shall present or collate to the said Benefices, after the same shall be united into one Benefice, and come to be holden by the same Incumbent, from time to time as the same shall become vacant, shall be as follows, that is to say:—the first turn of every set of three turns of the right to present shall belong to and be exercised by the said Lord Bishop of Hereford, and his Successors, and the second and third turns of every such set of three turns shall belong to and be exercised by the said John Wood and William Sidebottom, and their Successors, and so on in like order and succession.

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the Rectory of Felton, situate in the County and Diocese of Hereford, and the Vicarage of Preston Wynne, situate in the same County and Diocese, shall be united into one Benefice, with Cure of Souls, for ecclesiastical purposes only.

And His Majesty in Council, by and with the advice of His said Council, is further pleased to direct that the course and succession

in which the respective Patrons for the time being shall present, or collate, to the said Benefices, after the same shall be united into one Benefice, and come to be holden by the same Incumbent, from time to time as the same shall become vacant, shall be as follows, that is to say:—the first turn of every set of three turns of the right to present shall belong to, and be exercised by, the said Lord Bishop of Hereford, and his Successors, and the second and third turns of every such set of three turns shall belong to, and be exercised by, the said John Wood and William Sidebottom, and their Successors, and so on in like order and succession.

WHEREAS by Section 21 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, after reciting that "Whereas from the increase of population, or from other circumstances, it may be expedient that two or more Benefices which have been heretofore united, or which may be hereafter united, under the provisions of this Act should be disunited," it is, amongst other things, enacted "That when two or more Benefices shall have been united, or may be hereafter united into one Benefice, and, with respect to his own Diocese, it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or the Bishop of any Diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop of the Province, that one or more of the Benefices within his Diocese, of which such United Benefice shall consist, may be separated therefrom with advantage to the interests of religion, the said Archbishop shall inquire into the circumstances of the case, and if, on such Inquiry, it shall appear to him that such union may be usefully dissolved, so far as respects such Benefice or Benefices, he shall, six weeks at least before certifying such Inquiry to His Majesty as hereinafter directed, cause, with respect to his own Diocese, a Statement in Writing of the facts, and in all other cases a Copy in Writing of the aforesaid Representation to be affixed on or near the principal outer door of the Church or in some public and conspicuous place in each of the Benefices forming part of the United Benefice, with notice to any person or persons interested that he, she, or they may, within such six weeks, show cause in writing under his, her, or their hands to the said Archbishop against any such disunion, and, if no sufficient cause be shown within such time, the Archbishop shall certify the Inquiry and Consent, when the Patron's Consent is necessary, to His Majesty in Council, and thereupon it shall be lawful for His Majesty to issue an Order for separating such last-mentioned Benefice or Benefices from such United Benefice, and for declaring the rights of patronage of the several Patrons, if there be more than one Patron, and such Order shall be registered in the Registry of the Diocese to which such United Benefice shall belong, which Order the Registrar of such Diocese, immediately on the receipt thereof, is hereby required to register accordingly, and thereupon

immediately, if such United Benefice shall be then vacant, otherwise on the first avoidance thereof, such union shall be, *ipso facto*, dissolved, so far only as regards such Benefice or Benefices so proposed to be separated from such United Benefice, but in all other respects shall remain in full force and effect, and thenceforward such last-mentioned Benefice or Benefices shall be, and be deemed and taken to be, a separate and distinct Benefice or Benefices to all intents and purposes whatever as if no such union had taken place, and the Patron or Patrons thereof shall and may according to the terms of such Order present or nominate thereto respectively, and so, from time to time, upon each and every avoidance of the same: Provided always, that no Benefices which have been united for more than sixty years before the passing of this Act shall be disunited without the Consent in writing of the Patron or Patrons thereof”:

And whereas by Section 23 of the said Act it is further enacted that “Whenever two or more Benefices which have at any time been united into one Benefice shall be disunited and become separate Benefices under the provisions of this Act, whether the Order for disunion shall extend to the whole number of Benefices of which such United Benefice consisted, or to one or more of such Benefices only, it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council, on the recommendation of the Archbishop of the Province, with the Consent of the Patron or Patrons of such Benefices respectively (such Consent to be signified in writing under the hands of such Patron or Patrons) to assign and attach such portion of the glebe lands, tithes, moduses, rent-charges, or other endowments or emoluments belonging to or arising or accruing within the limits of such United Benefice to each of such Benefices respectively as to His Majesty in Council shall seem fit, notwithstanding such proportion of glebe lands, tithes, rent-charges, moduses, or other endowments or emoluments, or any part thereof, may not arise or accrue within the limits of the Benefice to which the same shall be so assigned and attached as aforesaid, or may not have belonged thereto, and also to divide and apportion between such Benefices all such charges and outgoings as before the disunion thereof were imposed upon the whole United Benefice”:

And whereas the Right Reverend John, Lord Bishop of Hereford, hath made a Representation in writing, dated the 21st day of September, 1914, to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, as follows:—

“I, John, Lord Bishop of Hereford, do hereby represent to your Grace that it appears to me that the disunion of the United Benefices of Stoke Prior and Docklow, in the County of Hereford, and my Diocese of Hereford, by the separation of the Rectory of Stoke Prior from the Vicarage of Docklow, may be made with advantage to the interests of Religion.

And whereas, on the 26th day of September, 1914, the said Archbishop inquired into the circumstances of the case:

And whereas the said Bishop did, by a further Representation in writing, dated the 10th day of October, 1914, furnish to the said

Archbishop a Statement of Circumstances as follows:—

“Whereas your Grace has, by writing under your hand bearing date the 26th day of September, 1914, in pursuance of the Statute 1 and 2 Victoria, Chapter 106, inquired of us, John, Lord Bishop of Hereford, what are the circumstances of the case upon which we found our opinion that the disunion of the United Benefice consisting of the Rectory of Stoke Prior and the Vicarage of Docklow, in the County and Diocese of Hereford, by the separation of the Rectory of Stoke Prior from the Vicarage of Docklow, might be made with advantage to the interests of religion:

“Now we do hereby state to your Grace as follows:—

“The separation of the Rectory of Stoke Prior from the Vicarage of Docklow is desired in order that the Rectory of Stoke Prior may be subsequently united to the Rectory of Humber, in the County and Diocese of Hereford, and that the Vicarage of Docklow may be subsequently united to the Rectory of Pudleston, in the same County and Diocese.

“The Churches of the Parishes of Stoke Prior and Docklow are distant from each other about three miles, and the Church of Docklow is distant from the Rectory of Stoke Prior about two and a-half miles.

“The Population of the United Parishes of Stoke Prior and Docklow is 603, and the Gross Annual Income amounts to £248 4s. 0d.

“The houses within the Parish of Stoke Prior are so situate that the Parishioners can be most readily visited by a Clergyman serving that Parish with the contiguous Parish of Humber, whilst the Parishioners of Docklow can be conveniently served by a Clergyman holding and residing within the contiguous Parish of Pudleston.

“It is proposed and desired that upon the disunion of the said Parishes the whole of the Tithe-rent-charge (apportioned at £142 0s. 6d.) arising on lands in the Parish of Stoke Prior together with the whole of the glebe land of the United Benefice, (which is at present rented at £22 7s. 0d. per annum), shall continue to belong to and be received by the Incumbent for the time being of the Parish of Stoke Prior.

“That the whole of the Tithe-rent-charge arising on lands in the Parish of Docklow (apportioned at £37 8s. 7d.) shall continue to belong to and be received by the Incumbent for the time being of the Parish of Docklow.

“That of the annual income of £89 17s. 0d. at present derived from the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne out of Endowments held for the United Benefice of Stoke Prior and Docklow there shall be paid annually:—

And whereas, on the 30th day of January,

1915, the said Archbishop certified to His Majesty in Council as follows, that is to say:—

“We, the undersigned, Randall Thomas, Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury, Primate of all England and Metropolitan, do hereby certify to Your Majesty in Council:—

“That the Right Reverend John, Lord Bishop of Hereford, as Bishop of the Diocese within which is situate the United Benefice consisting of the Rectory of Stoke Prior and the Vicarage of Docklow, in the County of Hereford, having represented unto us that the disunion of the said United Benefice by the separation of the Rectory of Stoke Prior from the Vicarage of Docklow may be made with advantage to the interests of religion, we inquired into the circumstances of the case.

“That on such Inquiry it appeared to us that such union might be usefully dissolved, and that the Reverend George Burden, Vicar of the Vicarage of Leominster, in the said County of Hereford, being the Patron or person entitled to present to the said United Benefice, if the same were now vacant, consents to the proposed disunion.

“That six weeks and upwards before certifying such Inquiry and Consent to Your Majesty in Council we caused a Copy in Writing of the aforesaid Representation of the said Lord Bishop to be affixed on the principal outer door of each of the Parish Churches of the said United Benefice with notice to any person or persons interested that he, she, or they might, within such six weeks, show cause in writing under his, her, or their hand or hands, to us the said Archbishop against such disunion, and no such cause has been shown.

“The Representation of the said Lord Bishop of Hereford, Our Inquiry into the circumstances of the case, the Statement of Circumstances in reply thereto, the Consent in writing of the said Patron, and the copies of the Representation and Notice before mentioned, are hereunto annexed.

“And we do hereby certify the Inquiry and Consent aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council, to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may, in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do, make and issue an Order for separating the said Rectory of Stoke Prior from the said Vicarage of Docklow so as to constitute each of them a separate Benefice with Cure of Souls for ecclesiastical purposes only.

“And we recommend that after the said disunion shall have been carried into effect each Benefice shall retain its own original tithes, endowments, and emoluments, and bear its own charges and outgoings, except that the Parish of Stoke Prior shall retain the whole of the glebe land of the United Benefice, and that of the annual income of £89 17s. 0d. at present derived from the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne out of endowments held for the United Benefice there shall be paid annually to the Incumbent for the time being of the Parish of Docklow £80 0s. 0d. and to the Incumbent for the time being of the Parish of Stoke Prior £9 17s. 0d.

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the said United Benefice consisting of the

Rectory of Stoke Prior and the Vicarage of Docklow, situate in the County and Diocese of Hereford, shall be disunited by separating the said Rectory of Stoke Prior from the said Vicarage of Docklow.

And His Majesty in Council, by and with the advice of His said Council, is further pleased, on the recommendation of the said Archbishop, and with the consent of the Patron, to assign and attach to each of such Benefices respectively its own original tithes, endowments, and emoluments, and to direct that each Benefice shall bear its own charges and outgoings, except that the Parish of Stoke Prior shall retain the whole of the Glebe land of the United Benefice, and that of the annual income of eighty-nine pounds and seventeen shillings (£89 17s.) at present derived from the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne out of endowments held for the United Benefice, there shall be paid annually to the Incumbent for the time being of the Parish of Docklow the sum of eighty pounds (£80), and to the Incumbent for the time being of the Parish of Stoke Prior the sum of nine pounds and seventeen shillings (£9 17s.).

REQUISITIONING OF FOREIGN VESSELS IN ITALIAN PORTS.

His Majesty's Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs has received from His Majesty's Ambassador at Rome the following translation of a Decree issued by the Italian Government (No. 1605). A translation of Decree No. 957 of June 17, 1915, to which reference is made, was published in Parliamentary Paper Miscellaneous No. 18 (1915), Cd. 8104.

TRANSLATION.

Thomas of Savoy, Duke of Genoa, Lieutenant-General of His Majesty King Victor Emanuel III, King of Italy by the grace of God and the will of the nation.

In virtue of the authority delegated to us:

In view of the law of May 22nd, 1915, No. 671, which confers extraordinary powers on the Royal Government:

In view of the Royal Decree dated January 21st, 1915, No. 29, which is to become law, and its subsequent modifications and additions:

In view of the Lieutenant's Decree of June 17th, 1915, No. 957, concerning the use of

confiscated or requisitioned enemy merchant ships:

In view of the advisability of regulating by special measures the requisitioning of merchant ships of foreign nationality:

After consultation with the Council of Ministers:

On the proposal of the Minister of Marine, in concert with the Ministers of Foreign Affairs, of the Exchequer and Agriculture, and of Industry and Commerce:

We have decreed and decree—

Article I.

The rules laid down in the Lieutenant's Decree No. 957 of June 17, 1915, are extended to the requisitioning of merchant ships and yachts flying a foreign flag, and boats and floating craft of foreign ownership, lying in the harbours and territorial waters of the Kingdom and its colonies, subject to the conditions laid down in the following articles.

Article II.

Payment in compensation for requisitioning (to be calculated in accordance with Article V of the above-mentioned Decree) will be made in monthly instalments, not paid in advance, to the interested persons or their legal representatives. The Government have power, however, to suspend payment if special circumstances arise rendering such a course advisable.

Article III.

The requisitioned vessels which come under the terms of the present Decree will be tempo-

rarily inscribed in a special register at the Marine Department of Genoa, and will be authorized to fly the Italian flag in virtue of a special temporary permit.

We order that the present Decree, sealed with the Seal of State, shall be inserted among the Laws and Decrees of the Kingdom of Italy, commanding all concerned to obey it and cause it to be obeyed.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 3RD DECEMBER 1915.)

SOMERSET AND DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-
MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1915
(No. 10).

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

Modification of Order.

1. The Somerset and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1915 (No. 8)—hereinafter referred to as the principal Order—is modified in the manner hereinafter contained.

Substitution of new Prohibited Areas and new Zone.

2. The principal Order shall be read and have effect as if the Prohibited Areas and Zone described in the Schedule hereto were substituted respectively for the Prohibited Areas and Zone I to which the provisions of the principal Order apply.

Withdrawal of all restrictions from Zone II.

3. Part III of the principal Order is hereby revoked.

Regulation of Markets, etc., of Animals in the Zone.

4.—(1.) Notwithstanding the prohibition contained in Article 6 of the principal Order, a market or sale of animals may be held on any premises in the Zone described in the Schedule hereto if the Local Authority are satisfied that the market or sale will be restricted to animals intended for immediate slaughter and the market or sale is authorised by the Local Authority under this Article.

(2.) The Local Authority shall cause a Veterinary Inspector to attend at every market or sale authorised under this Article and examine the animals exposed thereat.

(3.) An animal exposed at a market or sale authorised under this Article shall not be moved therefrom except to a slaughterhouse or bacon-factory in the Zone, and unless it is accompanied by a Licence authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the market or sale is situate. The animal shall, before such movement, be marked, by and at the expense of the owner, in the manner following:—

Cattle.—By the clipping of a broad arrow ↑ about six inches long on the left hind-quarter of each of the cattle and by the clipping of the hair off the end of the tail.

Sheep.—By the clipping of a broad arrow ↑ on the forehead of each of the sheep; and also by the painting or stamping of the letter M, about six inches long, on both sides of each

of the sheep with the following composition, namely: Rosin, five parts; oil of turpentine, two parts; and blue or red ochre, one part; melted and used warm; or with some other adhesive composition of a blue or red colour.

Swine.—By the painting or stamping of the letter M, about six inches long, on both sides of each of the swine with the composition above mentioned.

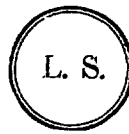
Commencement.

5. This Order shall come into operation on the sixth day of December, nineteen hundred and fifteen.

Short Title, &c.

6. This Order may be cited as the SOMERSET AND DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1915 (No. 10), and shall be read with the principal Order.

SCHEDULE.

Prohibited Area No. 1.

An Area comprising such portions of the administrative counties of Somerset and Wilts, and of the city and county borough of Bath, as lie within the following boundary, namely:—

A boundary commencing at a point where the Wilts County boundary crosses the Great Western Railway between Bathampton and Box, and proceeding in a south-westerly direction along that railway to the boundary of the city and county borough of Bath; thence in a southerly direction following that boundary until it joins the North road by Combe Down Plantation; thence in a westerly direction along the North road and Bradford road to Crossways House; thence in a southerly direction along the road via South Stoke to its junction with the Somerset Coal Canal; thence in an easterly direction along that canal to where it is crossed by the main road from South Stoke to Frome near Midford Railway Station; thence in an easterly direction along that road to the western boundary of the parish of Hinton Charterhouse; thence following the western boundary of that parish and Norton St. Philip until the latter joins the road from Tucker's Grave Inn to Lullington; thence in a south-easterly direction along that road to the point where it is crossed by the southern boundary of the parish of Laverton; thence in an easterly direction along the southern boundaries of the parishes of Laverton, Woolverton and Road to where the boundary of the last-mentioned parish crosses the road from Beckington to Trowbridge; thence in a north-easterly, northerly and westerly direction along the road via Church Row and Road Hill to where that road crosses the River Frome; thence in a northerly direction along that river to its confluence with the River Avon; thence in an

easterly direction along the latter river to the eastern boundary of the parish of Winsley; thence in a north-easterly direction following that boundary to where it is crossed by the road from Trowbridge to Bath near Little Camberwell; thence in a westerly direction along the latter road to its junction with the road to Monkton Farleigh near Farleigh Wick; thence in a northerly direction along the road through Monkton Farleigh until it is crossed by the Wilts County boundary; thence in an easterly and northerly direction along that county boundary to where it crosses the Great Western Railway at the point of commencement.

(Any roads forming parts of the above boundary are excluded from the Area.)
