PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, and of the Act of the 37th and 38th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 63, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 18th day of November, in the year 1915, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, and of the Act of the 37th and 38th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 63, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme with respect to the three Archdeaconries of Oxford, Berkshire, and Buckingham, in the Diocese of Oxford, and to some of the Rural Deaneries within such Archdeaconries:

“Whereas it has been represented to us by the Right Reverend Charles, Bishop of Oxford, that the arrangements which are hereinafter recommended and proposed with

respect to the said Archdeaconries of Oxford, Berkshire, and Buckingham, and with respect to some of the Rural Deaneries within such Archdeaconries, are desirable, and should be carried into effect, and we are of opinion that the same may be properly carried into effect:

“Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Charles, Bishop of Oxford (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and episcopal seal to this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that, as from the day on which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette, and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, first, a new Rural Deanery shall be formed out of the Rural Deanery of Buckingham, within the said Archdeaconry of Buckingham, and shall be named the Rural Deanery of Wolverton, and secondly the said Archdeaconries of Oxford, Berkshire, and Buckingham, shall comprise and consist of those Rural Deaneries the names of which are set down in order under its name and are numbered consecutively in the Schedule to this Scheme annexed, and that the name which in such Schedule is given to any Rural Deanery shall be the name thereof, and that every Parish, or Cure, or Church the name of which is set down in numbered order under the name of any Rural Deanery in the first column of the said Schedule shall belong to, and be, and form part of, the Rural Deanery and Archdeaconry under the names of which it is set down as aforesaid, and shall be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of

the Rural Dean of the Rural Deanery, and of the Archdeacon of the Archdeaconry, under which it is so set down as aforesaid, and shall not belong to or be a part of any other Rural Deanery or Archdeaconry, nor be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of any other Rural Dean or Archdeacon.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other matter or thing with respect to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, by virtue of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

TRADE BOARDS ACT, 1909.

PAPER BOX TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

In accordance with Regulations made under section 18 of the above Act by the Board of Trade and dated 27th April, 1910, the Trade Board established for that branch of the Box trade in Great Britain which is engaged in the making of boxes or parts thereof made wholly or partially of paper, cardboard, chip or similar material, have given notice, as required by section 4 of the above Act, that they have varied the following minimum or lowest time-rates of wages for female workers fixed by them on the 11th of March, 1912, viz.:—

(a) For female workers other than homeworkers from 3d. to 3½d. an hour.

(b) For female homeworkers from 3d. to 3½d. an hour.

The Trade Board have also given similar Notice that they have varied certain minimum time-rates fixed for learners (as defined by the Trade Board) and also certain clauses relating to the application of the minimum rates for female learners and for female workers other than learners.

DEFENCE OF THE REALM (LIQUOR CONTROL).

ORDER (EXPLANATORY) OF THE CENTRAL CONTROL BOARD (LIQUOR TRAFFIC) FOR THE LONDON AREA.

Whereas doubts have been expressed as to whether licensed premises situate in that part

of the London Area, as defined by Article 1 of the Order of the Board made on the 18th day of November, 1915, as is not within the Metropolis as defined in Schedule 6 of the Licensing (Consolidation) Act, 1910, may be open on Sundays for the sale and supply of intoxicating liquor until the hour of 3 p.m.

And whereas further doubts have been expressed as to the hours during which licensed premises and clubs may be open for the sale and supply of intoxicating liquor on Christmas Day.

Now therefore we the Central Control Board (Liquor Traffic) in pursuance of the Powers conferred upon us by the Acts and Regulations relating to the Defence of the Realm hereby make the following Order:—

1. All licensed premises within the Area notwithstanding the fact that they are not situate within the Metropolis as above defined, may be open for the sale and supply of intoxicating liquor up to the hour of 3 p.m. on Sundays.

2. The hours during which intoxicating liquor may be sold and supplied for consumption on or off the premises in licensed premises and clubs in the Area, whether situate within the Metropolis as above defined or not, on Christmas Day, shall be the hours during which by the provisions of Article 2 of the said Order for the London Area such sale or supply for consumption on or off the premises is respectively permitted on Sundays, and the said Article shall be read as if the provisions of this Article were inserted therein.
