In pursuance of the powers conferred on him  
 by Regulation 30a of the Defence of the Realm  
 (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, the Minister  
 of Munitions hereby orders that the War  
 material, to which the Regulation applies, shall  
 include War material of the following classes  
 and descriptions, that is to say:—

Platinum metal ores, residues and bars  
 containing the same.

His Britannic Majesty's Government and  
 the Government of the French Republic agree  
 to recognize during the present war the ex-  
 clusive competence of the tribunals of their  
 respective Armies with regard to persons be-  
 longing to these Armies, in whatever territory  
 and of whatever nationality the accused may  
 be.

In the case of infringements committed  
 jointly or in complicity by individuals belong-  
 ing to these two Armies, the French authors  
 or accomplices shall be handed over to the  
 French military jurisdiction and the British  
 authors or accomplices shall be handed over to  
 the British military jurisdiction.

The two Governments further agree to  
 recognize during the present war the exclusive  
 competence in French territory of French  
 justice with regard to foreign persons in the  
 British Army who may commit acts prejudicial  
 to that Army, and the exclusive competence in  
 British territory of British justice with regard  
 to foreign persons in the French Army who  
 may commit acts prejudicial to the said Army.
