Lieutenant Thomas Arthur Bond, R.A.N.R.

On 11th September, 1914, during the attack upon the Wireless Station, Bitu Paka, German New Guinea, Lieutenant Bond displayed conspicuous ability and coolness under fire in leading his men through most difficult country and enforcing the terms of surrender whilst drawing off an attack by another body of the enemy. He showed great daring, when accompanied by only one officer and one man, in suddenly disarming 8 Germans in the presence of 20

German native troops drawn up under arms, all of whom were then marched off and held prisoners. Later he personally captured 5 armed natives.
