The Prince of Wales's Council Chamber, Buckingham Gate, S.W., 10th January, 1916.

His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales has been pleased to appoint Laurence Edward Halsey, Esquire, Auditor of the Duchy of Cornwall, vice Sir Lesley Charles Probyn, K.C.V.O., resigned.

The Chancellor of the Exchequer has appointed Admiral Lord Charles Beresford, •G.C.B., G.C.V.O., to be Steward and Bailiff of the Manor of Northstead.

With reference to the notification, dated April 24, 1915, which appeared in the London Gazette of April 27 last, His Majesty's Government give notice that the blockade of the coast of the Cameroons has been raised so far as concerns the coast-line from the Akwayafe River to Bimbia Creek. The blockade still remains in force from the Benge mouth of the Sanaga River to Campo.
