"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:-

"And whereas by Your Majesty's Order in Council, bearing date the 26th day of October, 1914, sanction was given for the Entry of Engineer-Lieutenants and Engineer Sub-Lieutenants for temporary service in Your-Majesty's Fleet during the period of Hostili-

"And whereas, in order to meet the needs, of Your Majesty's Navy, we deem it desirable to make provision for the transfer to the Permanent List of certain of these Officers who. may be considered suitable:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by your Order in Council, to sanction the transferof such Temporary Éngineer Officers to the Permanent List of Your Majesty's Fleet, in such numbers, and under such conditions as. regards pay, as we may determine in consultation with the Lords Commissioners of Your-Majesty's Treasury.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

"And whereas Section 52, Sub-section 11, cf the Naval Discipline Act provides for the infliction in Your Majesty's Navy of such minor punishments as are now inflicted according to the custom of the Navy, or may from time to

time be allowed by the Admiralty:

"And whereas we consider it desirable that
a system of fines shall be instituted as a punishment for the reckless, negligent, or improper driving of motor or other mechanically propelled vehicles:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to direct that if any person in Your Majesty's Naval Service below the rank of subordinate Officer drives a motor, or other mechanically propelled vehicle so recklessly, negligently, or improperly, as to bring discredit on the Service, his total daily pay may be reduced by one-sixth, for a period not exceeding 3 calendar months."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

"And whereas these rates are inappropriate in the case of Merchant Ships, Yachts, and other small Craft, taken up for Your Majesty's Naval Service, to which definite complements are not assigned:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to approve of allowances for such Ships being paid at the following rates, as from the 16th day of December, 1915:—

Vessels whose gross tonnage does not exceed 750 5 0

Vessels of gross tonnage between 750 and 1,500 7 6

Vessels of gross tonnage of over

1,500 10 0 and that in exceptional cases an allowance within a limit of 10s. may be granted at our discretion.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, and of the Act of the 37th and 38th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 63, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 16th day of December, in the year 1915, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, and of the Act of the 37th and 38th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 63, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme with respect to some of the Rural Deaneries within the 3 Archdeacon-

ries of York or the West Riding, the East Riding, and Cleveland, in the Diocese of York:

"Whereas it has been represented to us by the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of York, that the arrangements which are hereinafter recommended and proposed, with respect to some of the Rural Deaneries within the said Archdeaconries of York or the West Riding, the East Riding, and Cleveland, are desirable and should be carried into effect, and we are of opinion that the same may be properly carried into effect:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of York, (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and Archiepiscopal Seal to this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that, as from the day on which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette, and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, firstly, within the said Archdeaconry of York or the West Riding, the following Parishes, now forming parts of the Rural Deanery of Pontefract, shall be formed into a new Rural Deanery, to be named the Rural Deanery of Hemsworth, namely the Parishes of Saint John the Evangelist Carlton, Cudworth, Felkirk with Brierley, Grimethorpe, Hems-worth, Monk Bretton, Royston, Ryhill, Skelbrooke, South Elmsall, and South Kirkby; secondly, within the same Archdeaconry, the Parishes of Aberford, and Ledsham with Fairburn, shall be transferred from the Rural Deanery of Pontefract to the Rural Deanery of Selby; thirdly, within the same Arch-deaconry, the Parish of Dunnington shall be transferred from the Rural Deanery of Escrick to the Rural Deanery of Bulmer; fourthly, within the said Archdeaconry of the East Riding, the Parish of Westow shall be transferred from the Rural Deanery of Pocklington to the Rural Deanery of Settrington; fifthly, within the same Archdeaconry, the Parish of Saint Nicholas Hull shall be transferred from the Rural Deanery of Howden to the Rural Deanery of Kingston-upon-Hull; sixthly, the names of the Rural Deaneries of Hedon, and Hornsea, within the same Archdeaconry, shall be altered to South Holderness, and North Holderness, respectively; seventhly, within the said Archdeaconry of Cleveland, the Parish of Saint Hilda Bilsdale, otherwise Bilsdale Kirkham, shall be transferred from the Rural Deanery of Helmsley to the Rural Deanery of Stokesley; eighthly, within the same Archdeaconry, the Parishes of Carlton in Cleveland, Faceby, and Whorlton, shall be transferred from the Rural Deanery of Northallerton to the Rural Deanery of Stokesley; ninthly, within the same Archdeaconry, the Parishes of Thornton - le - Street, North Thornton-le-Moor, South Otterington, shall be transferred from the Rural Deanery of Thirsk to the Rural Deanery of Northallerton; and tenthly, within the same Archdeaconry, the Parishes of Easington with Liverton, and Loftus, shall be transferred from the Rural Deanery of Whitby to the Rural Deanery of Middlesbrough; and that each of the Parishes hereinbefore referred to shall be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of the Rural Dean of the Rural

Deanery to which it is hereby transferred, and shall not belong to, or be a part of, any other Rural Deanery, nor be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of any other Rural Dean.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other matter or thing with respect to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, by virtue of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of York.

shall have been given to the Incumbent and the Vestry Clerk or Churchwardens of such Parish:

And whereas the Local Government Board, after giving to the Incumbent and the Churchwardens of the Parish of Boxwell St. Mary with Leighterton St. Andrew, in the County of Gloucester, 10 days' previous Notice of their intention in that behalf, have made a Representation to His Majesty in Council that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new Burial Ground in the Civil Parish of Boxwell with Leighterton, in the County of Gloucester, save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, should be prohibited, and that Burials should be discontinued in the said Civil Parish as hereinafter directed:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased, by His Order in Council of the 10th day of November, 1915, to give Notice of such Representation, and to order that the same should be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council, on the 22nd day of December, 1915, and such Order has been published in the London Gazette, and copies thereof have been affixed, as required by the said Act:

Whereas by the Naval and Military War Pensions, &c., Act, 1915, it is enacted that for the purposes therein mentioned relating to pensions and grants and allowances made in respect of the present war to officers and men in Our naval and military services and their wives, widows, children and other dependants, and the care of officers and men disabled in consequence of the present war, there shall be constituted a Statutory Committee of the Royal Patriotic Fund Corporation consisting of twenty-seven members; that the term of office of a member of the Statutory Committee shall be three years, a retiring member being eligible for re-appointment; and that of the said twenty-seven members twelve (of whom one shall be chairman and one vice-chairman and some shall be women and not less than two shall be representatives of labour) shall be appointed by Us:

On the 19th August, 1915, an aeroplane, piloted by the late Captain C. H. Collet, D.S.O., R.M.A., was ascending from Imbros Aerodrome, and had reached a height of 150 feet when the engine stopped. The machine was upset by the powerful air currents from the cliffs, and fell vertically to the ground, while the petrol carried burst into flames which immediately enveloped the aeroplane and pilot.

Chief Petty Officer Keogh, upon arriving at the scene of the accident, at once made an attempt to save Captain Collet by dashing into the midst of the wreckage, which was a mass of flames. He had succeeded in dragging the fatally injured officer nearly clear of the flames when he was himself overcome by the burns which he had received from the blazing petrol.
