REGULATIONS.

In the exercise of the powers conferred on me by the British Nationality and Status of Aliens Act, 1914 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), I, the Right Honourable Austen Chamberlain, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, make the following Regulations:—

FORM OF CERTIFICATE OF NATURALIZATION IN BRITISH INDIA.

- 1. A certificate of naturalization granted in British India shall, save as otherwise hereinafter prescribed, be in one of the following forms:—
 - (A) Where the names of children are not included.

REGISTRATION OF CERTIFICATES OF NATU-RALIZATION AND OATHS OF ALLEGIANCE.

REGISTRATION OF DECLARATIONS.

by law in that territory to administer an oath for any judicial or other legal purpose.

Elsewhere-

Any officer in the diplomatic or consular service of His Majesty.

- (2) The oath of allegiance shall be subscribed as well as taken, and the form in which the oath of allegiance is subscribed and attested shall be as follows:—
