WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 18th day of January, 1916, in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas we are of opinion that the services that Special Service Seamen and Stokers in Your Majesty's Navy are called upon to perform during the War are such as to warrant a revision of their new and prospects:

warrant a revision of their pay and prospects:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that
Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by

Your Order in Council, to sanction the following proposals for the duration of the War, to take effect from the 5th November, 1915:—

take effect from the 5th November, 1915:—
"(1) That the pay of Leading Seaman (Special Service) be increased to 1s. 11d. per diem.

"(2) That Stokers (Special Service) may be considered eligible for advancement to the Acting and confirmed rate of Leading Stoker (Special Service) with pay at the rate of 2s. 5d. per diem.

2s. 5d. per diem.

"We further beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the grant of an increase of pay of 3d. per diem to Special Service Seamen and Stokers who have over 6 years man's service, as from the 2nd August, 1914.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by Section 737 of the "Mer-VV chant Shipping Act, 1894," it is provided that where, under that Act, anything is authorized to be done by, to, or before, a British Consular Officer, and in any place outside His Majesty's Dominions in which His Majesty has jurisdiction there is no such Officer, such thing may be done in that place by, to, or before, such Officer as His Majesty in Council may direct:

And whereas the "Merchant Shipping Act, 1894," has been amended by the following Acts, namely, the "Merchant Shipping Act, 1897," the "Merchant Shipping (Exemption from Pilotage) Act, 1897," the "Merchant Shipping (Liability of Shipowners) Act, 1898," the "Merchant Shipping (Mercantile Marine Fund) Act, 1898," the "Merchant Shipping (Liability of Shipowners and others) Act, 1900," the "Merchant Shipping Act, 1907," the "Merchant Shipping Act, 1907," the "Merchant Shipping Act, 1911," the "Merchant Shipping Act, 1911," and chant Shipping (Certificates) Act, 1914," and the "Merchant Shipping (Conventions) Act, 1914," which Acts are to be construed as one with the "Merchant Shipping Act, 1894:"
And whereas the "Merchant Shipping (Sea-

men's Allotment) Act, 1911," was passed to remove doubts as to the true interpretation of Section 142 of the "Merchant Shipping Act, 1894," and Section 62 of the "Merchant Shipping Act, 1906: "

And whereas all the before-mentioned Acts, together with any Act amending the same, are hereinafter referred to as the Merchant Shipping Acts:

And whereas the State of North Borneo is a place outside His Majesty's Dominions in which His Majesty has jurisdiction, but in which there is no Consular Officer:

And whereas it has been made to appear to His Majesty that it is expedient that the Officer hereinafter named should exercise and perform in the said State the powers and duties of a British Consular Officer under the Merchant Shipping Acts:

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council, by virtue of the power vested in Him by Section 737 of the "Merchant Shipping Act, 1894," is pleased to direct that anything which is, under the Merchant Shipping Acts, authorized to be done by, to, or before, a British Consular Officer may be done in the State of North Borneo by, to, or before, the Officer for the time being acting as District Officer, Tawao, North Borneo.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council, dated the 11th day of October, 1912, and expressed to be made in pursuance of the "Merchant Shipping Act, 1894," and of the Mersey Channels Act, 1897," His Majesty, on the application of the Mersey Docks and Harbour Board, being the Harbour Trust or Body Corporate owning or exercising jurisdiction upon the waters of the River Mersey and the Sea Channels or approaches thereto, was pleased to make certain Rules, set forth in the Schedule to such Order, concerning the Lights or Signals to be carried, and concerning the steps for avoiding collision to be taken, by vessels navigating the River Mersey and the Sea Channels or approaches to the River Mersey between the Rock Lighthouse and the furthest point seawards to which such Channels or approaches respectively are, for the time being, buoyed on both sides:

And whereas the said Mersey Docks and Harbour Board have applied to His Majesty in Council to make, and have submitted for approval, certain new Rules concerning Lights or Signals to be carried, and the steps for avoiding collision to be taken, by vessels navigating the River Mersey and the Sea Channels or approaches thereto within certain specified limits, to be substituted for, and in lieu of, the Rules set forth in the Schedule to the said recited Order in Council of the 11th day of October, 1912, and in such new Rules there are embodied, subject to certain exceptions and additions therein mentioned, the "Regulations for preventing Collisions at Sea," made in pursuance of the "Merchant Shipping Act, 1894," and which may from time to time be

And whereas the provisions of Section 1 of the "Rules Publication Act, 1893," have been complied with:

And whereas the new Rules so submitted as aforesaid appear to be reasonable and proper:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the powers in Him vested by the "Merchant Shipping Act, 1894," and by the "Mersey Channels Act, 1897," and of any other powers Him thereunto enabling, and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to declare that the said Order in Council of the 11th day of October, 1912, shall, as from the 28th day of February, 1916, be revoked, and His Majesty is further pleased to make the Rules set forth in the Schedule hereto, and to direct that the same shall continue in operation as from the said 28th day of February, 1916.

SCHEDULE.

Rules concerning the Lights or Signals to be carried, and concerning the steps for avoiding Collision to be taken, by VESSELS navigating the RIVER MERSEY and the Sea Channels or approaches thereto, between the Rock Lighthouse and the furthest point seawards to which such Sea Channels or approaches respectively are for the time being buoyed on both sides.

1. Every vessel, of whatever description, used in navigation, when in any part of the

River Mersey, or in the Sea Channels or approaches thereto as above defined, shall, on and after the 28th day of February, 1916, observe and obey the "Regulations for preventing Collisions at Sea" made in pursuance of the "Merchant Shipping Act, 1894," hereinafter called "the General Regulations," which may from time to time be in force, with the exceptions and additions mentioned in the following Rules.

2.—(a) A vessel when lying at any Stage shall carry the lights prescribed by Articles 2 and 5 of the General Regulations and Rule 5

(b) A tug, tender, lighter, or barge, when (except as provided for such vessels respectively by Rules 3 and 4 hereof, and Article 15 (e) of the General Regulations) attached to another vessel shall not carry any of the lights or give any of the signals prescribed by these Rules or by the General Regulations.

- 3. A vessel being towed shall, in addition to the lights prescribed by Article 5 of the General Regulations, carry the white light at her stern prescribed by Rule 5 hereof, and if such vessel is a steam vessel with steam up she shall, although being towed, also carry the masthead light prescribed by Article 2 (a), and may carry the additional light allowed by Article 2 (e) of the General Regulations.
- -(a) A steam vessel when towing another vessel or vessels or when attached for the purpose of towing or manœuvring such vessel or vessels, shall carry the compulsory lights prescribed by Article 3 of the General Regulations, and such steam vessel when towing or attached as aforesaid to a vessel of 450 feet or upwards in length shall carry the additional bright white light prescribed by the said Article 3.
- (b) Further, a steam vessel when towing or attached as aforesaid shall carry abaft the funnel or after-mast a small white light fixed and carried in a lantern so constructed, fitted and screened that it shall throw an unbroken light over an arc of the horizon of 12 points of the compass, viz., for 6 points from right aft on each side of the vessel, and such steam vessel if less than 160 feet in length shall not carry the stern light prescribed by Rule 5 hereof, but if she is 160 feet or upwards in length she may carry such stern light.

The length of a vessel shall be deemed to be the length appearing in her Certificate of

Registry

5. In lieu of Article 10 of the General Regulations, a vessel under way shall carry at The light shall be her stern a white light. fixed and carried in a lantern so constructed, fitted and screened that it shall throw an unbroken light over an arc of the horizon of 12 points of the compass, viz., for 6 points from right aft on each side of the vessel, so as to be visible at a distance of at least a mile. Such light shall be carried as nearly as practicable on the same level as the side lights.

Provided that a vessel within Article 7 of the General Regulations (viz. Steam Vessels of less than 40, and vessels under oars or sails of less than 20, tons gross tonnage respectively, and rowing boats), shall not be obliged to carry the light prescribed by this Rule, but if they do not carry such light they shall, when being overtaken by another vessel, show from the stern a white light or a flare up light as required by Article 10 of the General Regulations.

6. In lieu of Article 11 of the General Regulations, a vessel, when at anchor, shall carry in the forward part of the vessel, a White Light, in a lantern so constructed as to show a clear, uniform and unbroken light visible all round the horizon at a distance of at least a mile; and at or near the stern of the The forward light vessel another such light. shall be carried at a height so as to be clear of the superstructure or other erections other than the funnel on the vessel, but in no case less than 20 feet above the hull, and the stern or after light shall not be less than 15 feet lower than the forward light.

Provided that a vessel within Article 7 of the General Regulations (viz. Steam Vessels of less than 40, and vessels under oars or sails of less than 20, tons gross tonnage respectively, and rowing boats) when at anchor shall not be obliged to carry the lights prescribed by this Rule, but if they do not carry them each of such vessels shall carry in a place where it can. best be seen, and at a height above the gunwale of not less than 9 feet, a white light in a lantern so constructed as to show a clear, uniform and unbroken light visible all round the horizon at a distance of at least a mile.

7. A steam vessel, when at anchor, shall, between sunrise and sunset, carry in the forward part of the vessel, a black ball not less than 2 feet in diameter, and at or near the stern of the vessel, another such ball. forward ball shall be carried at a height so as to be clear of the superstructure or other erections other than the funnel on the vessel but in no case less than 20 feet above the hull, and the stern or after ball shall not be less than 15 feet lower than the forward ball. Provided that in the case of a steam vessel within Article 7 of the General Regulations, one such black ball only may be carried at a height above the gunwale of not less than 9 feet.

8. A vessel, having on board any explosive, except ships' ammunition, shall, when at anchor, carry a Red Light, in a globular lantern not less than 10 inches in diameter, 6 feet above the forward White Light pre-

scribed by Rule 6 hereof.

Provided that a vessel entitled to carry and carrying the White Light prescribed by the proviso to Rule 6, shall carry the Red Light above described, not less than 3 feet above such White Light.

9. A vessel of 350 feet or upwards in length when at anchor shall, during fog, mist, falling snow or heavy rain storms, whether by day or

night,

(1) ring in the forward part of the vessel the Bell prescribed by Article 15 (d) of the

General Regulations.

(2) sound at or near the stern of such vessel a loud-toned Gong or a loud-toned Triangle or other loud-toned article that cannot be mistaken for a Bell, Whistle, Siren or Foghorn.

he Bell shall be rung, and the Gong, Triangle, or other article sounded, respectively, for a period of about 5 seconds at intervals of not more than one minute.

The length of a vessel shall be deemed to be the length appearing in her certificate of registry.

10. A vessel must not come into

(i) any of the buoyed channels,

(ii) the main (i.e. the Queen's and Crosby) channel from a side channel,

(iii) a side channel from the main channel,

at such a time and in such a manner as to hamper traffic passing up and down such channel (see Articles 27 and 29 of the General Regulations).

11. Every Steam Vessel under way shall, when it is safe and practicable, keep to that side of the fairway or mid-channel which lies on the starboard side of such vessel.

WATCH VESSELS.

12. The words "Watch Vessel" shall mean a vessel anchored to mark the position of a wreck or other obstruction.

13. A Watch Vessel shall carry in all

weathers:

(a) Between Sunset and Sunrise-

Four Green Lights in globular lanterns not less than 10 inches in diameter, and so constructed as to show a clear, uniform and unbroken light visible all round the horizon, at a distance of at least a mile, the four lights to be carried as follows:—Two in a vertical line, one over the other, not less than 6 feet apart, at each end of a cross yard on the foremast, with a horizontal distance between the lights at either end of the cross yard not exceeding 25 feet. The height of the two lower lights not to exceed 20 feet above the hull of the Watch Vessel.

(b) Between Sunrise and Sunset— Four Green Balls in the positions ordered with regard to the lights aforementioned.

14. A Watch Vessel during fog, mist, falling snow or heavy rainstorms, whether by day or night, shall ring a deep-toned bell as follows:—Three strokes in succession, to be repeated three times in a period of about fifteen seconds in each minute, to be followed by an interval of about forty-five seconds silence.

DREDGERS.

15. The word "Dredger" shall mean any Vessel fitted with plant or apparatus for dredging or excavating or fitted with plant or apparatus for eroding or dispersing sand and other material.

16. A Dredger, when at work or in position for working, shall carry the following Lights and Signals, viz.:—

LIGHTS BETWEEN SUNSET AND SUNRISE.

(i)—(a) Forward.—In the forward part of the Dredger, at a height of not less than 20, and not exceeding 40, feet above the hull, a White light, in a lantern so constructed as to show a clear, uniform and unbroken light visible all round the horizon at a distance of at least a mile.

(b) Amidships.—Three such White Lights placed in triangular form not less than 8 feet apart, the base of the triangle to be at least 10 feet higher than the forward Light, and to be also higher than and clear of the framework, funnels, or any other erections upon the Dredger.

(c) Aft.—One such White Light, at or near the stern of the Dredger, and at such a height that it shall be not less than 15 feet lower than

the forward Light.

(ii) A Dredger when not making any way through the water shall not carry side or stern Lights, but when making way shall carry the usual red and green side Lights and the stern Light prescribed by Rule 5 hereof.

SIGNALS BETWEEN SUNRISE AND SUNSET.

Amidships.—Three red balls of not less than 2 feet in diameter placed in triangular form not less than 8 feet apart, the base of the triangle to be higher than and clear of the framework, funnels, or any other erections upon the Dredger.

17. The Lights and Signals required to be carried by Rule 13 are to be taken by other vessels as signals that the vessel showing them is not under command, and cannot therefore

get out of the way.

18. A Dredger, when not at work nor in position for working, shall carry the ordinary Lights and Signals required to be carried by vessels for avoiding collisions, as provided by these Rules and by the Rules and Regulations now and from time to time in force under the "Merchant Shipping Act, 1894," and the "Mersey Channels Act, 1897."

Note.—The numbers quoted in these Rules refer to the Articles in the General Regulations made on the 13th October, 1910.

The following Statutes made by the Governing Body of Christ Church, in the University of Oxford, on the 16th day of June, 1915, have been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of their having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877."

STATUTES amending the existing Statutes of Christ Church, in the University of Oxford, duly made, under the provisions of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, at a Meeting of the Governing Body, specially summoned for the purpose, on the 16th day of June, 1915, and passed at that Meeting by the votes of two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting, and submitted to His Majesty the King in Council.

- (1). Statute XVI., Clauses 23 and 24, as altered by the Governing Body on the 16th day of June, 1915.
 - (a) by substituting, in Clause 23, for the words "not exceeding for the fifteen years" the word "of"; and
 - (b) by substituting, in Clause 24, for the words "not exceeding" the word "of."

STATUTE XVI.—THE STUDENTS.

23. Any Student who, having served the House for a period of 15 years as an Official Student, shall be compelled to retire by reason of ill-health, shall be entitled to receive a pension of £200 a year, which shall be increased by a sum not exceeding £15 a year for each additional year's service in this class.

24. Any Student who has served the House for a period of 25 years as an Official Student shall be entitled to retire on a pension of £350 a year, which shall be increased by the sum of £10 a year for each additional year's service as such Student; but no such pension shall exceed the sum of £400 a year.

the sum of £400 a year.

Provided that, if and so long as a retiring Student hold any post at this or any other University, his pension shall not exceed such amount as, with the income derivable by him from such sources, will make up £1,000 a year.

(2). Statute XVII., as altered by the Governing Body on the 16th day of June, 1915.

(a) by substituting, in Clause 2, for the words "in agreement with the House" the words "after consultation with the House";

(b) by adding a twelfth Clause.

STATUTE XVII.—DR. LEE'S PROFESSORS AND READERS.

The election or appointment to the Lee's Professorships of Anatomy and Chemistry shall be made in each case by a Board of 7 persons, of whom one shall be the Dean and one other shall be nominated to hold office for a period of 5 years by the Governing Body. The election or appointment to the Lee's Professorship of Experimental Philosophy shall be made in accordance with the Statute made for the University concerning the Professor of Experimental Philosophy as amended by the University. Upon the occurrence of any vacancy in any of the Lee's Professorships, it shall be determined by the University, after consultation with the House, what part or parts of the science concerned shall be assigned to the Professorship so falling vacant during the tenure of office of the person next elected thereto.

12. The provisions of the Statute made by the University of Oxford Commissioners on the 16th day of June, 1881, in part for the University and in part for the Cathedral or House of Christ Church, concerning Dr. Lee's Readers, and approved by Her late Majesty Queen Victoria in Council on the 3rd day of May, 1882, in so far as it is a Statute for

Christ Church, are hereby repealed.

The Admiralty, under the powers given to them by the Defence of the Realm Consolidation) Act, 1914, and the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, hereby make the following Order:-

(1) This Order shall relate to the ports and territorial waters adjacent to the United King-

dom from and including Plymouth eastward up to and including Great Yarmouth, with the exception of the existing pilotage district of Arundel.

- (2) Any bye-law in force for the time being in the area to which this Order relates shall have effect only subject to the provisions of this Order and of Orders made by the Trinity House in accordance with instructions hereunder
- (3) The Trinity House, as defined in the Pilotage Act, 1913, is hereby instructed as
 - (i) to suspend, if it shall think fit, the licences of all or any present pilots and the existing pilotage certificates of all or any masters or mates within the said area.
 - (ii) Subject to the provisions of this Order and to the approval of the Admiralty to make orders in respect of the said area for all or any of the purposes specified in Regulation 39 of the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914.
- 4) No licence shall be granted by the Trinity House for the Area to which this Order relates for a period longer than 14 days, and all licences shall be revocable and renewable at the absolute discretion of the Trinity House.

(5) A licence shall not be granted unless the pilot signs an agreement to conform with the

Trinity House Orders.

(6) The Trinity House is authorised to make new rates or to modify existing rates for pilotage.

Note.—Any person failing to comply with the provisions of this Order or of the orders issued by the Trinity House will be guilty of an offence against the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, and liable to be dealt with accordingly.

(1) The aggregate marks obtained by him in the Open Competitive Examination are Such as in the opinion of the Civil Service Commissioners might in the decennial period above mentioned have secured for him admission to the Indian Civil Service and

- (2) He is certified by the Civil Service Commissioners to have in other respects the qualifications which the Regulations for the Open Competitive Examination require of Selected Candidates for the Civil Service of India.
- 3. If in any year there are not sufficient Indian candidates qualified as aforesaid to bring the number admitted to the Indian Civil Service in the year by open competition and by nomination under these rules up to the average of the 10 years ending 1914, the Secretary of State in Council may in a subsequent year make good the deficiency from the results list of that year, but no candidate shall be appointed under these rules who does not possess the qualifications set forth in (1) and (2) of the last preceding rule.

4. A candidate nominated under these rules shall be deemed to be a Selected Candidate for the Civil Service of India, and shall be subject to the regulations and rules made under Section 32 of the Government of India Act, 1858, and Section 97 of the Government of India Act, 1915, for the probation and training of Selected Candidates of the year.

IRELAND, SOUTH COAST.

Former Notice.—No. 1025 of 1915; hereby cancelled.

Notice is hereby given that, under the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, the following Regulations have been made by the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty and are now in force:-

(1) Port of Queenstown—Traffic Regulations.

I.—PROHIBITED AREAS.

1. An obstruction has been placed across-Queenstown harbour inside the entrance.

Anchorage is strictly prohibited between the southern limit of Outer Man-of-War roads and a line drawn between the light-buoy exhibiting an occulting white light, to the eastward of Spike island and the light-buoy exhibiting a fixed white light, off Black rock; Corkbeg.

The passage between Spike island and Ringaskiddy point is closed, and no vessel shall approach the area bounded on the south by a line drawn between Golden rock and the southernmost point of Spike island.

No vessel shall use the channels between Haulbowline and Spike island, east of Rocky island, or west of the Military pier on Spike

Passage through Obstruction.

2. Vessels entering the port, not being in charge of a pilot, shall not proceed beyond the Examination anchorage. Vessels wishing to leave the port, not being in charge of a pilot, shall not proceed beyond the southern limit of the Outer Man-of-War anchorage. This applies to all craft except boats drawing less than four feet which have obtained special permission from the King's Harbour Master.

It is compulsory for all vessels desiring to pass through the obstruction in either direction to have on board a licensed pilot, or Master holding a pilot's certificate for the port, whose name has been approved by the Vice-Admiral Commanding Coast of Ireland.

II.—ENTRANCE TO THE PORT.

ENTRY FORBIDDEN DURING FOG.

3. All Mercantile traffic is forbidden to enter the port or to pass beyond the limits of the Examination anchorage during fog.

PILOTAGE.

4. It is compulsory for all merchant vessels to have a licensed local pilot on board when entering the port, except:

Vessels whose masters hold pilot's certificates for the port and whose names have been approved by the Vice-Admiral Commanding Coast of Ireland.

NIGHT AND DURING FOG.

During the hours of official night, no merchant vessels (including fishing craft, barges, boats, yachts, or private vessels of any kind) will be allowed to be under way in the waters, including the creeks of the Dockyard Port of Queenstown, except with special permission from the King's Harbour Master. All vessels, barges, and boats must display the regulation lights. During fog all mercantile traffic is absolutely prohibited.

IV.—VESSELS LEAVING THE PORT. PROHIBITION.

7. No merchant vessels (including fishing craft, barges, boats, yachts, or private vessels of any kind) are permitted to leave the Dockyard Port of Queenstown during the hours of official night except with special permission from the Vice-Admiral Commanding Coast of Ireland, which can be obtained through the Shipping Intelligence Officer. No vessel may leave during fog.

Permission to Leave.

8. Merchant vessels (including those engaged in the coastal trade) must on no account leave the Dockyard Port of Queenstown without permission.

Vessels must obtain such permission from the Collector of Customs, Queenstown.

- (2) Bantry, Kenmare and Dunmanus Bays— Regulations respecting Yachts and Pleasure Craft.
- 1. Yachts and other pleasure craft are not allowed to cross the line in Bantry bay drawn from Sheep head to Dursey head, nor to cross the line in Kenmare bay from Cod head to Bolus head, nor to cross the line in Dunmanus bay from Sheep head to Three Castle head.
- 2. No Regatta shall be held without permission in writing from the Senior Naval Officer, Castletownbere. This applies to the coast from Mizzen head to Sybil point.

3. No Excursion steamer shall run without permission in writing from the Senior Naval Officer, Castletownbere. This applies to the

coast from Mizzen head to Sybil point.
4. The directions as to no craft being under way in the defended port of Berehaven during official night are to be strictly adhered to.
