The following Rules have been issued by the authority for making Rules of the Supreme Court:—

SUPREME COURT OF JUDICATURE.

RULES OF THE SUPREME COURT.

1. Rule 2 (a) of the Rules of the Supreme Court dated December 18, 1914, shall be amended by adding Bristol to the excepted towns therein mentioned and the whole of Rule 2 of the said Rules as so amended shall be incorporated in Order XXXVI. of the Rules of the Supreme Court 1883 as Rule I.B of that Order.

2. Order XXXVI., Rule 22B, is hereby annulled and the following Rule shall stand in lieu thereof:—

After notice of trial has been given of any cause, matter, or issue to be tried elsewhere than in London or Middlesex, Manchester, Liverpool, and such other places as the Lord Chancellor shall from time to time direct, either party may, at any time, in the case of Leeds, Birmingham, Bristol, Cardiff, and Swansea, not less than seven days, and in all other places (except as hereinbefore excepted) not less than twenty-one days before the day proposed for the Commission day at such place in the Order in Council on that subject in force for the time being enter the trial at the next Assizes in the District Registry (if any) of the city or town where the trial is to be had or with the Associate. No later entry shall be allowed, except by leave of a Judge going that Circuit, or by order of a Judge at Chambers, subject to the consent of a Judge going that Circuit.

- 3. These Rules may be cited as the Rules of the Supreme Court January, 1916.
- 4. These Rules are declared urgent within the meaning of the Rules Publication Act, and shall come into operation forthwith.
