

day the Earl of Athlone arrived here from Holland. On the third instant in the Night, was committed here a most horrible Murder in a little Tavern or Beer House, where the Master of the House, his Wife, and 3 persons more were found dead in the morning; the Game of the Town have been kept shut ever since, in order to discover and Apprehend the Murderers.

Brussels, Febr. 10. The French have lately made a little motion towards the *Mais*, and reinforced the Garisons of *Huy* and *Namur*; Four hundred men are sent to *Leuven* to reinforce the Spanish Garison there. The person that committed the late barbarous Murder is discovered and seized.

Brussels, Febr. 14. There arrived lately in *Zeland* a Recruit of 450 Spaniards, who are since come to *Antwerp*; and there are daily expected to Recruit the Spanish and Italian Regiments in the service of these Countries. They write from *Mastrecht*, that an Order was come thither from the Duke of *Hollstein-Plon* to have 6 Regiments of Foot, and all the Horse of that Garison, in a readiness to march upon the first command. We hear from *Mons*, that a Magazine of 240000 Bushels of Hay was burnt there about 15 days ago. On Friday last, the person who alone committed the horrid murder before-mentioned, in order to steal a sum of money he knew was in the House, having confessed the Fact, was executed in the great Market-place of this City; first his Breasts were torn with red hot Pincers, then his right hand was cut off, and after that he was bound upon a Wheel, where his feet, Legs, and Thighs were broke. &c.

Brussels, Febr. 17. The *Marschal de Bossiers*, who is still at *Lille*, hastens all he can the preparations that are making by the French for the next Campaign, and causes great Stores of Provision and Forage to be laid up for the Cavalry which is very quickly to leave their Winter Quarters. We are told that the Pretenders to the Bishoprick of *Lice*, are the Elector of *Cologne*, the Great Master of the Teutonic Order, already Coadjutor of *Mentz*, his Brother the Bishop of *Brissaw*, the Bishop of *Munster*, the Prince of *Saxe-Zuth*, who lately took Orders at *Rome*, and is now at *Vienne*, the Prince of *Hesse-Rhinfeild*, *Monsieur de Meau* Great D. an of *Leige*, the *Baron de Berle* one of the *Cannons*, and the Cardinal of *Bouillon*: The Orders lately published here against furnishing the French with Corn, are very strictly executed.

Hague, Febr. 9. The States have sent Orders to *Monseigneur Desbouts*, now at *Brussels*, to go to *Liege* to negotiate some matters with that Chapter upon the death of their Bishop. A new Envoy is arrived here from *Portugal*.

Hague, Febr. 12. *Monseigneur Lenth*, Envoy Extraordinary from *Denmark*, had on Wednesday last a Conference with the Deputies of the States, and received their Answer in Writing about the Ships lately stop in the *Sound*. The States of *Holland* are separated till the 10th of *March*. The States-General are sending another Deputation to the States of *Holland*.

Hague, February 16. The States have resolved to make Reprisals for the Dutch Ships arrested in the *Sound*; and in pursuance thereof, between 30 and 40 Danish Ships were on Friday last seized at *Amsterdam*, and Guards put on board them. Yesterday died here the *Heer Van Englebong* Great Bayliff of *Baldac*. The Duke of *Hollstein-Plon* is expected here the latter end of this week.

Hague, Febr. 19. N. S. The States have given the Place of Great Bayliff of *Baldac* to the *Baron Van Heckeren*, their Envoy at the Court of *Sueden*. *Monseigneur Hop*, *Monseigneur Biber*, and *Monseigneur Dornberg*, are gone to *Friseland*, as Deputies from the States-General, intending to be there at the Meeting of the States of that Province on Friday next.

Dublin, February 7. The *Elizabeth* and *Anne* of *Bristol*, of about 300 Tun and 18 Guns, which was lately taken by two French Privateers out of *Kilmare* River; And retaken on the 24th of the last month by Their Majesties Ship the *Monkey*, about 60 Leagues Westward of *Scilly*, being afterwards separated from the said Frigate in bad Weather, put into this Harbour on Friday last, where the still continues. By Letters from *Kinsale* of the 2d instant, we have an account, That the day before came into that Port, the *Oxbridge* of *London*, Captain *Dixon* Commander, bound home from the *Barbadoes*; This Ship was on the 22d of *December*, about 100 Leagues S. W. from *Cape Clear*, taken by a French Privateer of 40 Guns, who took out all her Men except the Master and Boatswain, and put 13 men, with his first Lieutenant, on board her; but the Winds proving contrary, so that they could not reach any

Port of *France*, and the Vessel being Leaky, and their Provisions falling short, whereby they were brought into great Distress, the French gave up the Government of the Ship to the English Master to carry her to the first Port he could make, and he brought her into *Kinsale*, where she is secured. We have Advice likewise, That the *Beefton* of *London*, Captain *Sicavel* Commander, of 300 Tun and 28 Guns, laden with Sugar, Indigo, &c. from *Jamaica*, came on the 29th past into *Costloe* Bay, about 10 miles from *Galway*; The *Tyger* of *London*, who was in her Company, Foundered at Sea.

Portsmouth, Febr. 13. Yesterday Sailed from *Spithead* Rear Admiral *Mitchel* with several of Their Majesties Ship under his Command.

Whitehall, Febr. 14. Yesterday in the Evening Prince *Levis* of *Baden* took his leave of Their Majesties at *Kensington*, and this Afternoon his Highness parted from hence in order to Embark for *Holland*, being Saluted in his passing down the River by the great Guns from the Tower.
