PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council dated the twenty-eighth day of November, nineteen hundred and fourteen, His Majesty was pleased to make Regulations (called the "Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914") under the Defence of the Realm Consolidation Act, 1914, for securing the public safety and the Defence of the Realm:

And whereas the said Act has been amended by the Defence of the Realm (Amendment) Act, 1915, the Defence of the Realm (Amendment) (No. 2) Act, 1915, and the Munitions of War Act, 1915:

And whereas the said Regulations have been amended by various subsequent Orders in Council:

And whereas it is expedient further to amend the said Regulations in manner herein-after appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the following amendments be made in the said Regulations:—

1. In Regulation 25 after the words "or use any signal" there shall be inserted the words

"or send up any balloon or fly any kite which is of such a nature as to be capable of being used as a means of signalling."

2. At the end of Regulation 27 the following paragraph shall be added:—

"If any person without lawful authority or excuse has in his possession or on premises in his occupation or under his control any document containing a report or statement the publication of which would be a contravention of the foregoing provisions of this regulation, he shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations, unless he proves that he did not know and had no reason to suspect that the document contained any such report or statement, or that he had no intention of transmitting or circulating the document or distributing copies thereof to or amongst other persons."

3. After Regulation 30A the following regulation shall be inserted:—

"30B. It shall not be lawful for any person on his own behalf or on behalf of any other person to sell or buy, or to offer to sell or buy,

(a) any of the following metals:—Iron (including pig-iron), Steel of all kinds, Copper, Zinc, Brass, Lead, Antimony, Nickel, Tungsten, Molybdenum, Ferro-alloys; or

(b) any other metal which may be specified in an order of the Admiralty or

Army Council or the Minister of Munitions as being a metal required for the production of any war material,

unless in the case of a seller the metal to be sold is in the possession of the seller or is in the course of production for him, or in the case of a buyer the purchase is made for or on behalf of a consumer; and it shall be lawful for the Admiralty or Army Council or the Minister of Munitions, or any person authorised by them or him for the purpose, to require any person who on his own behalf or on behalf of any other person, has sold or bought, or offered to sell or buy any such metals, to prove that the sale or purchase complies with the requirements of this regulation, and if any such person on being so required fails to produce satisfactory proof that it does so comply he shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations, and if such person is a company every director and officer of the company shall also be guilty of an offence against these regulations.

Provided that it shall be lawful for the Admiralty or Army Council or the Minister of Munitions by order to exclude from the provisions of this regulation any of the metals above mentioned, and whilst any such order remains in force this regulation shall have effect as if such metal were not mentioned therein."

4. After Regulation 44 the following regulation shall be inserted:—

"44A. If any person uses in relation to any establishment which is not a controlled establishment within the meaning of the Munitions of War Acts, 1915 and 1916, the designation "controlled," or any other designation calculated to lead to the belief that the establishment is such an establishment as aforesaid, or otherwise falsely represents that the establishment is such an establishment as aforesaid, he shall be guilty of a summary offence against these regulations."

5. After paragraph (f) of Regulation 45 the following paragraph shall be inserted:—

"or (g) personates or falsely represents himself to be a person in the employment of or as acting for or on behalf of His Majesty or any Government Department; or, without lawful authority or excuse, makes any statement or does any act or thing calculated to induce the belief that he is in any way connected with any Government Department."

6. In Regulation 55, after the words "who is suspected of having committed an offence against these regulations" there shall be inserted the words "or of being in possession of any article or document which is being used or intended to be used for any purpose or in any way prejudicial to the public safety or the defence of the realm; and anything found on any person so arrested which there is reason to suspect is being so used or intended to be used may be seized, and the competent naval or military authority may order anything so seized to be destroyed or otherwise disposed of."

7. In paragraph (3) of Regulation 56, for the words "such a minor character as" there shall be substituted the words "such a character that it"; and in paragraphs (5) and (6) of the same regulation the word "minor" shall be omitted wherever that word occurs; and in paragraph (8) of the same regulation for the words "such a minor character as aforesaid"

there shall be substituted the words "such a character that it can adequately be dealt with by a court of summary jurisdiction."

8. In Regulation 58, after the words "sheriff court" there shall be inserted the words "In Ireland for the purposes of such trial a summons may be issued by a justice to a witness who is not within his jurisdiction and any such summons may, in Ireland, be issued, served and enforced in the same manner as a summons to a witness within the jurisdiction of the issuing justice."

9. In Regulation 62, after the words "these regulations referred to as a competent naval or military authority," there shall be inserted the following words:—

"Where the holder of a designated office has been appointed to be a competent naval or military authority, or any powers of the competent naval or military authority have been delegated to the holder of a designated office, then, unless express provision is made to the contrary, the appointment or delegation shall be deemed to extend, and shall be deemed always to have extended, to the person for the time being performing the duties of the office designated, if he is so qualified as aforesaid."

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Liverpool Cathedral Act, 1902, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 27th day of January, in the year 1916, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Liverpool Cathedral Act, 1902, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for substituting the Chapel of Saint Nicholas for the Church of Saint Peter as the Parish Church for the Parish of Liverpool, in the County of Lancaster, and in the Diocese of Liverpool, and for effecting certain other measures incidental to or arising out of such substitution:

"Whereas it is provided in the 25th Section of the said Liverpool Cathedral Act, 1902, that at any time after the passing of the Act the Ecclesiastical Commissioners may cause to be prepared a Scheme or Schemes for the purposes following, namely:—

(1) For substituting the Chapel of Saint Nicholas for the Church of Saint Peter as the Parish Church of Liverpool, such substitution to take effect at or after the date of the opening of any portion of the Cathedral Church for Divine Service:

(2) For the transfer, as from the date of such substitution, and so far as may be practicable, of all parochial and personal rights, privileges, duties, and obligations from the Church of Saint Peter to the Chapel of Saint Nicholas:

(3) For any re-arrangement and re-assignment of the seats in the Chapel of

Saint Nicholas which may appear desirable in order to give effect to the said transfer :

(4) For the disposal of the monuments and memorial tablets in the Church of Saint Peter :

" And whereas by an Instrument under the Common Seal of us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, dated the 9th day of June, 1910, it was declared that a portion of the Cathedral Church, that is to say, the Chapel dedicated to the Blessed Virgin Mary, sufficient for the due solemnization of Divine Service therein had been erected and fitted up, and such portion has since been opened for Divine Service accordingly, and thereupon in accordance with the provisions of the said Act the said Church of Saint Peter ceased to be the Cathedral Church of the Bishopric of Liverpool, but the said Church of Saint Peter remains the Parish Church of the Parish of Liverpool :

" And whereas it is desired that the Chapel of Saint Nicholas in the Parish of Liverpool may be substituted for the said Church of Saint Peter as the Parish Church of the said Parish of Liverpool as from the 1st day of May, in the year 1916, and that thereupon the Church of Saint Peter, and the site and churchyard thereof may vest in us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, upon the trusts, and for the purposes, set out in the 28th Section of the said Liverpool Cathedral Act, 1902 :

" And whereas there are no appropriated seats in the said Church of Saint Peter, or in the said Chapel of Saint Nicholas :

" And whereas it is desired that the arrangements hereinafter mentioned may be made for the disposal of the monuments and memorial tablets in the Church of Saint Peter :

" And whereas it has been made to appear to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, that certain re-arrangements of seats and other alterations and improvements to the interior of the said Chapel of Saint Nicholas are desirable in connection with the adaptation of the Chapel to the purpose of a Parish Church for the said Parish of Liverpool, and we are of opinion that provision should be made for any such re-arrangements and other alterations and improvements :

" Now, therefore, with the approval of the Right Reverend Francis James, Bishop of the said Diocese of Liverpool, (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme, and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), and with the approval of the Reverend Stephen Edward Gladstone, of Manley Hall, Helsby, in the County of Chester, Clerk in Holy Orders, the Patron of the Rectory of the said Parish of Liverpool, (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), being the persons whose approval of this Scheme is required by the 26th Section of the said Liverpool Cathedral Act, 1902, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that, as from the 1st day of May, in the year 1916, the said Chapel of Saint Nicholas, situate within the said Parish of Liverpool, shall be substituted for the said Parish Church (dedicated to Saint Peter, as aforesaid) of the same Parish, and that the said Chapel of Saint Nicholas shall be the Parish Church of the said Parish of Liverpool in lieu of the said Parish Church of Saint Peter as fully in all respects as if the said

Chapel of Saint Nicholas, so hereby substituted, had been originally the Parish Church of the same Parish : and that, as from the date upon which such substitution shall as aforesaid take effect, all the endowments, emoluments, and rights of or belonging to the said Parish Church of Saint Peter, or of or belonging to the Rector or Incumbent thereof, shall be transferred to the said Chapel of Saint Nicholas, and to the Rector or Incumbent thereof, and his Successors, for ever, and, so far as may be practicable, all other parochial and personal rights, privileges, duties, and obligations of or in relation to the said Church of Saint Peter shall be transferred therefrom to or in relation to the said Chapel of Saint Nicholas.

" And we further recommend and propose that at any time after such substitution shall have taken effect, and before the said Church of Saint Peter shall have been taken down or demolished, the monuments and memorial tablets in the said Church of Saint Peter shall be disposed of in the following manner, namely :—

" *First* the monument to Bishop Ryle shall be removed by us to the Cathedral Church of Liverpool ; the monument to Foster Cunliffe, Esquire, shall be handed over by us to his descendant, Sir Foster Cunliffe, Baronet, if the said Sir Foster Cunliffe be then alive and willing to accept the same ; and the monument to Alderman Earle shall be handed over by us to his descendant, Arthur Earle, Esquire, if the said Arthur Earle be then alive and willing to accept the same.

" *Secondly* as regards the monuments hereinafter mentioned in the event of the specific proposals in relation thereto failing to be accepted and as regards all other monuments and memorial tablets in the said Church of Saint Peter before any such monument or memorial tablet is removed from the said Church of Saint Peter an advertisement shall be published by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for 3 successive days in 2 local newspapers circulating in the City of Liverpool to the effect that it is intended that such monuments shall be transferred to the Gallery of the Chapel of Saint Nicholas, or otherwise dealt with as the Bishop of Liverpool may determine, and such advertisement shall have embodied in it the substance of the following clauses :—

(a) At any time within 2 months after the first publication of such advertisement any person who is an heir, executor, administrator, or relative of any person to whose memory any monument or memorial tablet has been erected in Saint Peter's Church may give Notice in writing to us of his intention to undertake the removal of such monument or memorial tablet, and within 3 months after the first publication of such advertisement he shall be at liberty to cause such monument to be removed and disposed of as he may desire.

(b) If any person giving such Notice as aforesaid shall fail to satisfy us that he is such heir, executor, administrator, or relative as he claims to be, the question shall be determined on the application of either party in a summary manner by the Registrar of the Consistory Court of the Diocese of Liverpool, who shall have power to make an order specifying who shall remove the monument or memorial tablet in question.

(c) The reasonable expense of such removal (not exceeding the sum of £5 0s. 0d. in any one case) shall be defrayed by us.

"And *Thirdly* after the expiry of 3 months from the first publication of the said advertisement the said monuments and memorial tablets, unless otherwise disposed of by persons so giving Notice of their intention to undertake their removal as aforesaid, shall be transferred by us to the Gallery of the said Chapel of Saint Nicholas, or be otherwise disposed of as the Bishop of Liverpool may determine.

"And we further recommend and propose that of the moneys to be paid to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under the said Liverpool Cathedral Act, 1902, and so soon as such moneys have come into our hands, but after making provision for the discharge of the expenses mentioned in the same Act, we shall hold the sum of £1,000 0s. 0d. available to be expended by us, if so much be required, upon defraying the cost of such re-arrangements of seats and other alterations and improvements to the interior of the said Chapel of Saint Nicholas as may be proposed to us by the Rector and Churchwardens of the Parish of Liverpool, and be approved by us.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"All which we humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Liverpool.

WHEREAS the Local Government Board, after giving to the Incumbent and the Churchwardens of the Parish of Llanbadarn Odyn, in the County of Cardigan, and to the Incumbent and the Churchwardens of the Parish of Llanvihangel Llantarnam, in the County of Monmouth, ten days' previous Notice of their intention in that behalf, have, under the provisions of the Burial Act, 1853, as amended by the Burial Act, 1900, made Representations to His Majesty in Council that, for the protection of the public health,

the opening of any new Burial Ground in the Civil Parishes of Llanbadarn Odyn, in the County of Cardigan, and Llanvihangel Llantarnam, in the County of Monmouth, save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, should be prohibited, and that Burials should be discontinued therein, as follows, viz.:—

LLANBADARN ODYN.—Forthwith and entirely in the Church of Saint Padarn, Llanbadarn Odyn, in the County of Cardigan, and in the Churchyard attached thereto:

LLANVIHANGEL LLANTARNAM.—From and after the 30th September, 1916, entirely in the Parish Church of Saint Michael, Llanvihangel Llantarnam, in the County of Monmouth, and in the Churchyard attached thereto: Provided that

(a) In any vault or walled grave now existing in the said Churchyard burial may be allowed subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such vault or grave be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented:

(b) In any earthen grave now existing in the said Churchyard the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than 3 feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave:

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give Notice of such Representations, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on the 11th day of April next.

And His Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the London Gazette, and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the Churches or Chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the Parishes affected by such Representations one month before the said 11th day of April.

For most conspicuous bravery. He was in the act of throwing a grenade when it slipped from his hand and fell to the bottom of the trench, close to several of our officers and men. He immediately shouted out a warning, and himself jumped clear and into safety; but, seeing that the officers and men were unable to get into cover, and knowing well that the grenade was due to explode, he returned without any hesitation and flung himself down on it. He was instantly killed by the explosion. His magnificent act of self-sacrifice undoubtedly saved many lives.

1053 Private (Shoeing-Smith) Charles Hull, 21st Lancers.

For most conspicuous bravery. When under close fire of the enemy, who were within a few yards, he rescued Captain G. E. D. Learoyd, whose horse had been shot, by taking him up behind him and

galloping into safety. Shoeing-Smith Hull acted entirely on his own initiative, and saved his officer's life at the imminent risk of his own.

No. 10210 Private Harry Christian, 2nd Battalion, Royal Lancaster Regiment.

For most conspicuous bravery. He was holding a crater with five or six men in front of our trenches. The enemy commenced a very heavy bombardment of the position with heavy "minenwerfer" bombs, forcing a temporary withdrawal.

When he found that three men were missing, Private Christian at once returned alone to the crater, and, although bombs were continually bursting actually on the edge of the crater, he found, dug out, and carried one by one into safety all three men, thereby undoubtedly saving their lives.

Later he placed himself where he could see the bombs coming, and directed his comrades when and where to seek cover.

ENGLISH CHANNEL, NORTH SEA, AND
RIVERS THAMES AND MEDWAY.*Pilotage and Traffic Regulations.**Former Notice.*—No. 142 of 1916; hereby cancelled.

Mariners are hereby warned that, under the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, the following Regulations have been made by the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty and are now in force:—

I. ENGLISH CHANNEL AND
NORTH SEA.

1. All ships (other than British ships of less than 3,500 tons gross tonnage, when trading coastwise or to or from the Channel islands and not carrying passengers) whilst bound from, and whilst navigating in the waters from, the Downs Pilot Station to Gravesend or *vice versa*, must be conducted by Pilots licensed by the London Trinity House.

2. All ships (other than British ships of less than 3,500 tons gross tonnage, when trading coastwise or to or from the Channel islands and not carrying passengers) whilst bound from, and whilst navigating in the waters from, Gravesend to Great Yarmouth or *vice versa*, must be conducted by Pilots licensed by the London Trinity House.

3. All ships (other than British ships of less than 3,500 tons gross tonnage, when trading coastwise or to or from the Channel islands and not carrying passengers) whilst navigating in the waters from Gravesend to London Bridge or *vice versa*, must be conducted by Pilots licensed by the London Trinity House.

4. The Trinity House Pilot Station at Dungeness having been discontinued, pilotage is therefore not compulsory between the Downs Pilot Station and Dungeness, except for ships bound into or out of the Harbours of Dover and Folkestone.

5. Trinity House Pilot Stations have been established at the undermentioned places, and merchant vessels not under compulsion of pilotage are very strongly advised to take pilots:—

(a) THE DOWNS, where ships proceeding north can obtain Pilots capable of piloting as far as Great Yarmouth, and also pilots for the River Thames, and for Folkestone and Dover harbours. The Pilot Steamers attached to the Downs Station will cruise in the vicinity of a position two miles south-east of Deal Pier.

(b) GREAT YARMOUTH, where ships from the North Sea bound for the River Thames or the English Channel can obtain Pilots capable of piloting as far as the Downs.

The Pilot Steamer attached to the Great Yarmouth Station will cruise between the Corton Light-Vessel and the South Scroby Buoy.

(c) THE SUNK LIGHT-VESSEL, where ships crossing the North Sea between the parallels of 51° 40' and 51° 54' North Latitude, but no others, can obtain Pilots for the River Thames and the Downs.

(d) Pilots can also be obtained at LONDON and HARWICH for the Downs and Great Yarmouth (including the River Thames and approaches).

Note.—The Pilots referred to in this Notice are the Pilots licensed by the London Trinity House and no others.

II. RIVERS THAMES AND MEDWAY.

1. All traffic into and out of the River Thames must pass through the Edinburgh Channels, or through the Black Deep south of the Knock John and Knob Light-Buoys, and through the Oaze Deep, until further notice.

No vessels are to remain under way in the above mentioned Channels between a line drawn from London Stone to No. 3 Sea Reach Light-Buoy and thence to Canvey Point on the west, and the Sunk Head Light-Buoy or a line joining the positions of the South Long Sand and East Shingles Buoys, on the east, between the hours of 8.30 p.m. and 4 a.m.

Vessels at anchor within these limits must not exhibit any lights between the hours of 8.30 p.m. and 4 a.m. No merchant or other private vessel is, however, to be at anchor in the Black Deep, Oaze Deep and the Main Channel of the Thames as far west as No. 3 Sea Reach Light-Buoy, to the southward of a line joining East Knock John Buoy, Knob Light-Buoy, West Oaze Buoy, Nore Light-Vessel and No. 3 Sea Reach Light-Buoy, between the hours of 8.30 p.m. and 4 a.m.

All other Channels are closed to navigation.

2. Coasting vessels are not to be under way nor exhibit any lights in the East Swin or Wallet between sunset and sunrise.

3. Cruising of Yachts and Pleasure craft is prohibited in the estuaries of the Thames, Medway, Colne, Blackwater, Crouch and Roach, and adjacent Rivers and Creeks.

Fishing vessels are governed by the terms of the Notices issued by the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.

Note.—This Notice is a repetition of Notice No. 142 of 1916, with amendments to Section II.

Caution.

This Admiralty Notice to Mariners is issued under the provisions of the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, and failure to comply strictly with the directions contained in it will constitute an offence against these Regulations.

Any person found guilty of such an offence is liable to severe penalties both of imprisonment and fine.
