

*Plimouth, Febr. 18.* Yesterday arrived here a Portuguese Ship with Wine and Fruit from O-Porto bound for London; and this day Their Majesties Ships the *Boyne*, *Deptford*, and *Mary Galley*, with divers Merchant Ships came in from the Eastward.

*Weymouth, Febr. 17.* On Thursday came in here the *Revenge* Privateer, Captain *Clarke* Commander, from *Guernsey*; Letters from thence of the 30th past give an account, that two Privateers of that Island, commanded by Captain *Jupper*, and Captain *Stephens*, brought in the Sunday before a French Prize of about 200 Tuns laden with Salt; and the same day another *Guernsey* Privateer commanded by Captain *Slowley* was taken by the French and carried to *St. Malo*.

*Weymouth, Febr. 19.* On Saturday last stopp'd in *Portland Road* the *St. Christiana* of and for *Rotterdam*, of 20 Guns, laden from *Malaga*; Whence she came about 7 weeks ago without Company, and brings no News.

*Deale, Febr. 19.* Yesterday came in a Dutch Man of War and Privateer from the Westward; The latter brought in three Prizes, two laden with Salt, and the other with Wine; They were all taken about 15 days ago off *Havre-de-Grace*.

*Deale, Febr. 20.* Yesterday sailed out of the *Downes* 15 Sail of Vessels bound from *Ireland* for *Offend*, with their Convoy; The same day sailed the Dutch Man of War and Privateer with the 3 French Prizes for *Zeland*. This morning passed through the *Downes* 6 or 7 Vessels for the River.

*Whitehall, Febr. 19.* The Honourable *Peregrine Bertie Esq;* was this day Sworn Vice-Chamberlain to His Majesty in the place of the Right Honourable *Sir John Lowther of Lowther* Baronet, who had desired His Majesties Leave to resign the same.

plexion, brown Hair curled and short, aged about 30, wears a blue Coat. *John Prin*, a short well set Man, round Visaged, flat Nosed, aged about 23, wearing a brown coloured Frize Coat somewhat worn. *John Roberts*, a tall thin Man, long Visaged, and pale Complexion, his Hair light coloured and lank, aged about 22, wearing a brown Frize Coat. The two last were committed since the other five, and had several sorts of Apparel for Men and Women about them when taken. Any Persons who have been robbed may have a sight of the said Prisoners at the said Gaol.
