aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Cuthbert, Portsea.'

"And with the like consent of the said Edward Stuart, Bishop of Winchester, (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said Church of Saint Cuthbert, Portsea, situate as aforesaid, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the Minister of the same Church for the time being: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us the said Commissioners to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism, or for the registration thereof.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal Consideration, and to make such Order with respect thereto as to Your Majesty, in Your Royal Wisdom, shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint Cuthbert, Portsea, being:—

"All that part of the New Parish (some-time Chapelry District) of Saint James, Milton, in the County of Southampton, and in the Diocese of Winchester, which is bounded upon the east partly by the Parish of South Hayling and partly by the Parish of Bedhampton, upon the north-east by the Parish of Farlington, upon the north by the Parish of Wymering, upon the west partly by the New Parish of Saint Mark, North End, Portsea, partly by the Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Alban, Portsea, and partly by the Parish of Portsea, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the south, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Portsea from the said New Parish of Saint James, Milton, at the centre of the bridge which carries St. Mary's Road across the Portsmouth Line of the London and South Western and London Brighton and South Coast Railway, and extending thence eastward along the middle of St. Mary's Road for a distance of twelve chains or thereabouts to its junction with Milton Road, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Milton Road for a distance of three chains and a quarter or thereabouts to a point opposite to the wall or fence forming the boundary between the Isolation Hospital and the allotment gardens lying to the south of the houses and premises situate on the southern side of Langstone Road, and extending thence eastward to and along the said wall or fence for a distance of seven chains and a half or thereabouts to its eastern end at the south-eastern corner of the said allotment gardens, and extending thence in a straight line due east for a distance of one mile and a half or thereabouts to a point in the middle of Langstone Channel upon the boundary which divides the said New

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Winchester.
