to say, the second and all succeeding turns of nomination and presentation, shall be vested in, and shall and may be exercised by, the said Edward Marsham Moore, Wentworth Watson, Reginald Henry Duthy, Edwin Forbes Jeffries, and Alexander Hamilton Thompson, their heirs and assigns for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or any other Act of Parlia-

ment.
"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of All Saints, Kettering,

"All that part of the Parish of Kettering, in the County of Northampton, and in the Diocese of Peterborough, which is bounded upon the south partly by the New Parish of Saint Andrew, Kettering, and partly by the New Parish of Saint Mary, Kettering, upon the east by the said New Parish of Saint Mary, Kettering, upon the north-east by the Parish of Weekley, upon the north-west partly by the Parish of Glendon and partly by the Parish of Rothwell, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the west, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said Parish of Rothwell from the said Parish of Kettering crosses the middle of the lines of the Midland Railway, and extending thence southward along the middle of the said lines of railway for a distance of 42½ chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Kettering from the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Kettering.

And whereas Drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the herein-before mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patron and to the Incumbent of the Parish of Kettering, out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patron and Incumbent have respectively signi-

fied their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Peterborough.

ing, that is to say:—
"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a Consolidated Chapelry to the Consecrated Church of Saint John the Baptist, Belmont, situate within the Parish of Cheam, in the County of Surrey, and in the Diocese of Southwark:

Whereas at certain extremities of the said Parish of Cheam, and of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Christ Church, Sutton, in the said County and Diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several Churches of such Parish and New Parish:

And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said Parish of Cheam, and of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Sutton, should be formed into a Consolidated Chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said Church of Saint John the Baptist, Belmont, situate as afore-

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Hubert Murray, Bishop of Southwark, as such Bishop, (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Representation), with the consent of the President and Scholars of Saint John Baptist College, in the University of Oxford, as the Patrons of the Rectory of the said Parish of Cheam, (in testimony whereof they have hereunto affixed their Common or Corporate Seal), and with the consent of the Reverend Herbert William Turner, Clerk in Holy Orders, the Rector or Incumbent of the Rectory of the Parish of Sutton, in the said County and Diocese, and as such Rector or Incumbent the Patron of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Sutton, (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said Parish of Cheam, and of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Sutton, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the Map or Plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one Consolidated Chapelry for the said Church of Saint John the Baptist, Belmont, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint John, Belmont.
