A PROCLAMATION

MAKING CERTAIN ADDITIONS TO AND AMENDMENTS IN THE LIST OF ARTICLES TO BE TREATED AS CONTRABAND OF WAR.

GEORGE R.I.

WHEREAS on the 14th day of October, 1915, We did issue Our Royal Proclamation specifying the articles which it was Our intention to treat as contraband during the continuance of hostilities, or until We did give further public notice;

And whereas on the 27th day of January, 1916, We did by Our Royal Proclamation of that date make certain additions to and modifications in the list of articles to be treated as contraband;

And whereas it is expedient to make certain further additions to and modifications in the said list:

Now, therefore, We do hereby declare, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, that during the continuance of the war or until We do give further public notice, the following articles will be treated as absolute contraband

in addition to those set out in Our Royal Proclamations aforementioned:—

Gold, silver, paper money, and all negotiable instruments and realisable securities.

Metallic chlorides, except chloride of sodium; metalloidal chlorides; halogen compounds of carbon.

Starch.

Borax, boric acid, and other boron compounds.

Sabadilla seeds and preparations therefrom.

And We do hereby further declare that as from this date the following amendments shall be made in Schedule 1 of Our Royal Proclamation aforesaid:—

In item 3 the following shall be substituted for the present wording:—

“Lathes, machines, and tools capable of being employed in the manufacture of munitions of war.”

In item 8 for “ether” shall be substituted “formic ether; sulphuric ether.”

And We do hereby further declare that no gold, silver, or paper money captured after this date shall be treated as conditional contraband, and that, except as to captures already effected, item 14 shall as from this date be

struck out of Schedule II of Our Royal Proclamation aforementioned.

Given at Our Court at *Buckingham Palace*, this twelfth day of *April*, in the year of our Lord, one thousand nine hundred and sixteen, and in the Sixth year of Our Reign.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council dated the twenty-eighth day of November, nineteen hundred and fourteen, His Majesty was pleased to make Regulations (called the "Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914") under the Defence of the Realm Consolidation Act, 1914, for securing the public safety and the defence of the realm:

And whereas the said Act has been amended by the Defence of the Realm (Amendment) Act, 1915, the Defence of the Realm (Amendment) (No. 2) Act, 1915, and the Munitions of War Act, 1915:

And whereas the said Regulations have been amended by various subsequent Orders in Council:

And whereas it is expedient further to amend the said Regulations in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the following amendments be made in the said Regulations:

1. After Regulation 2b the following Regulation shall be inserted:—

"2c. It shall be lawful for the Army Council or any person duly authorised by them—

"(a) to enter on any land for the purpose of inspecting and marking trees, whether standing or felled, and to take possession of any such trees;

"(b) to enter upon and take possession of land or buildings for the purpose of felling standing trees, converting trees, or storing or removing felled or converted trees, or for any purpose connected therewith, and to fell, convert, store, and remove any such trees;

"(c) to enter on and take possession of any land buildings or premises, and to take possession of any plant, used or capable of being used for the felling, storing, or conversion of trees, and to take possession of any vehicles, locomotives, or animals required for the transport of trees or such plant as aforesaid, or for any purposes in connection therewith;

"(d) to provide housing accommodation for workmen employed for any such purposes as aforesaid by taking possession of any land or unoccupied premises;

"(e) to utilise any water supply or motive power available for any of the purposes aforesaid."

2. In Regulation 7 after the words "and to the rate of profit usually earned in respect of the output of such factory or workshop before the war" there shall be inserted the words "and to whether such rate of profit was unreasonable or excessive."

3. After Regulation 30b the following Regulation shall be inserted:—

"30c. Any person brought before a court of summary jurisdiction charged with having in his possession or under his custody or control any tungsten, or tungsten ore or products therefrom, high-speed steel or scrap therefrom, molybdenum, vanadium, cobalt, nickel, or any alloy used in the manufacture of high-speed steel, or any other metal required for the production of war material for the time being specified in an order made for the purpose by the Admiralty or Army Council or the Minister of Munitions, which may be reasonably suspected of being stolen or unlawfully obtained or acquired, who does not give an account to the satisfaction of the court how he came by the same, shall be guilty of a summary offence against these regulations."

4. After the third paragraph of Regulation 40 the following paragraph shall be inserted:—

"The Admiralty or Army Council may by order prohibit, either absolutely or except on compliance with such conditions as may be specified in the order, the sale or supply to or for any member of any of His Majesty's forces of any narcotic or stimulant drug or preparation specified in the order, and if any person acts in contravention of any such order he shall be guilty of a summary offence against these regulations."

5. After the first paragraph in Regulation 55 the following paragraph shall be inserted:—

"Any person so arrested shall, if so ordered by the competent naval or military authority, or by the chief officer of police for the district, be photographed and finger-print impressions of the fingers and thumbs of both of his hands taken, and if any person refuses to allow such photograph or impressions to be taken, or obstructs the taking thereof, he shall be guilty of a summary offence against these regulations:

Provided that—

(a) no photograph of a person so taken shall be published except for the purpose of tracing that person, nor shall a copy of any such photograph be shown to any person except a person officially authorised to see it; and

(b) If the person arrested neither has been nor is subsequently convicted of an offence against these regulations, all photographs (both negatives and copies) and finger-print impressions so taken shall be destroyed as soon as they are no longer required for the purposes of these regulations, and in any case forthwith after the termination of the present war."

And whereas His Majesty was pleased, in pursuance of the said first-mentioned Act, to apply the said Regulations and any Regulations amending the same by an Order in Council, dated the 27th day of January, 1916, to an area in which was included the County of Flint, excepting the Petty Sessional Division of Overton and the Parish of Merford and Hoseley, and it appears to be expedient that the said County should form part of the area defined and specified in the Schedule hereto:

And whereas it appears to His Majesty that it is expedient for the purpose of the successful prosecution of the present War that the sale and supply of intoxicating liquor in the area defined and specified in the Schedule hereto should be controlled by the State on the grounds that War material is being made, loaded, unloaded, and dealt with in transit therein, and that men belonging to His Majesty's Naval and Military Forces are assembled therein:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

The Defence of the Realm (Liquor Control) Regulations, 1915, and any Regulations amending the same, shall be, and are, hereby applied to the area defined and specified in the Schedule hereto.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 4th day of April, 1916, in the words following, viz.:—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is

enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased, by Your Orders in Council bearing date the 10th November, 1915, and 15th February, 1916, respectively, to approve the grant of a Climate Allowance for service in the Cameroons, and the Gulf of Aden:

"And whereas the discomforts inseparable from service ashore at Bathurst (West Africa), and Aden, are similar to those experienced on board Your Majesty's Ships employed in the afore-mentioned areas:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the payment of an Allowance at the same rates, and for similar periods, to the Naval Ranks and Ratings serving at Your Majesty's Naval Establishments at Bathurst and Aden.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Churches and Cure or Cures (hereinafter

called "the said Benefice") of Kelling with Salthouse, in the County of Norfolk, and in the Diocese of Norwich:

"Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Kelling with Salthouse is vested for an estate in fee simple, in possession, free from incumbrances, in Selina Louisa Rebecca Mather, of Grove Lodge, Broadwater, Worthing, in the County of Sussex, Widow:

"And whereas the said Selina Louisa Rebecca Mather is desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Kelling with Salthouse, now vested in her as aforesaid, should be transferred to, and be vested in, the Right Reverend Francis James, now Bishop of Liverpool, and his Successors in the same Bishopric:

"And whereas the said Francis James, now Bishop of Liverpool, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness he the said Francis James, Bishop of Liverpool, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Bertram, now Bishop of Norwich, has also executed this Scheme in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited, or by some or one of them, is made necessary:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Kelling with Salthouse, which is hereinbefore mentioned, and hereinafter recommended and proposed, will, in our opinion, tend to make better provision for the Cure of Souls in the Parishes in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson, so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid, arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parishes of Kelling and Salthouse:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme, and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), and with the consent of the said Selina Louisa Rebecca Mather, (in testimony whereof she has signed and sealed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Francis James, Bishop of Liverpool, (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme, and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Kelling with Salthouse, now vested in her the said Selina Louisa Rebecca Mather as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said Francis James, Bishop of Liverpool, and his Successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in, and shall and may from time to time be exercised by, the said Francis James, Bishop of Liverpool, and his Successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters afore-

said, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Norwich.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 59th year of His late Majesty King George the Third, Chapter 134, of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 49, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Representation, bearing date the 23rd day of March, in the year 1916, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 59th year of His late Majesty King George the Third, Chapter 134, of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 49, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a District Chapelry to the Consecrated Church of Saint John the Divine, Rastrick, situate in the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Matthew, Rastrick, in the County of York, and in the Diocese of Wakefield:

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a District Chapelry should be assigned to the said Church of Saint John the Divine, Rastrick, situate as aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend George Rodney, Bishop of Wakefield, (testified by his having signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said New Parish of Saint Matthew, Rastrick, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the Map or Plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a District Chapelry to the said Church of Saint John the Divine, Rastrick, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint John, Rastrick.'

"And with the like consent of the said George Rodney, Bishop of Wakefield, (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials, should be solemnized or performed at the said Church of Saint John the Divine, Rastrick, situate as aforesaid, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns, and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices, should be paid and belong to the Minister of the same Church for the time being: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us, the said Commissioners, to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism, or for the registration thereof.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal Consideration and to make such Order with respect thereto as to Your Majesty, in Your Royal Wisdom, shall seem meet.

"The Schedule to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint John, Rastrick, being:—

"All that part of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Matthew, Rastrick, in the County of York, and in the Diocese of Wakefield, which is bounded upon part of the north by the New Parish of Saint Martin, Brighouse, upon the north-east by the New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Clifton, upon the south-east by the New Parish of Saint Thomas, Bradley, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south-west, upon the west, and upon the remaining part of the north, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Thomas, Bradley, from the said New Parish of Saint Matthew, Rastrick, at the centre of the footbridge which carries the footpath leading from Bradley Wood to Ryecroft Lane across the stream known as Bradley Park Dike, and extending thence northward along the middle of the said footpath for a distance of 6½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with the footpath leading into Firth House Lane, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the last-mentioned footpath for a distance of 6½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Firth House Lane, and extending thence first westward, and then north-westward, along the middle of Firth House Lane for a distance of 22 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Woodhouse Lane, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Woodhouse Lane for a distance of 2½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with the footpath leading into Huddersfield Road, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the last-mentioned footpath for a distance of 11½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Huddersfield Road and Knowle Road, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Knowle Road for a distance of 10½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called Bowling Alley, and extending thence first north-eastward, and

then northward, along the middle of Bowling Alley for a distance of 5 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the eastern end of the fence which divides the close numbered 338 upon the Ordnance Survey Map of the Civil Parish of Rastrick, published in the year 1907 upon the scale of 25 inches to a mile, and also upon the Map or Plan annexed to this Representation, from the close numbered 370 upon the same Maps, and extending thence north-westward to and along the said fence and along the fence which divides the close numbered 337 upon the said Maps from the close numbered 372 upon the same Maps for a distance in all of 12 chains or thereabouts to the western end of the last-mentioned fence upon the eastern side of Rastrick Common Road, and extending thence first north-westward to, and then north-eastward along, the middle of Rastrick Common Road for a distance of 12 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Clara Street, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Clara Street for a distance of 2½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Brook Street, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Brook Street for a distance of 1½ chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the eastern end of the wall or fence forming the northern boundary of the Bramston Street Recreation Ground, and extending thence north-westward to and along the said wall or fence for a distance of 5 chains or thereabouts to its western end on the eastern side of Bramston Street, and extending thence first north-westward to, and then north-eastward along, the middle of Bramston Street for a distance of 6 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Denham Street, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Denham Street for a distance of 4 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Thornhill Road and Longroyd Road, and extending thence westward along the middle of Longroyd Road for a distance of 9 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road running along the eastern side of the house and premises known as Longroyd Lodge, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the last-mentioned road, and along the middle of the footpath and roadway in continuation thereof, for a distance in all of 14½ chains or thereabouts to the junction of such roadway with Lillands Lane, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Lillands Lane for a distance of 12½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called Stoney Hill, and extending thence in a straight line due north, (thereby crossing the line of the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway), for a distance of 1½ chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the River Calder upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Matthew, Rastrick, from the said New Parish of Saint Martin, Brighouse."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this

Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Wakefield.

WHEREAS it is provided by Section 2 of the Customs (Exportation Prohibition) Act, 1914, that any Proclamation or Order in Council made under Section 8 of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, as amended by the Act now in recital, may, whilst a state of war exists, be varied or added to by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Trade:

And whereas it is provided by Section 2 of the Customs (Exportation Restriction) Act, 1914, that any Proclamation made under Section 1 of the Exportation of Arms Act, 1900, may, whether the Proclamation was made before or after the passing of the Act now in recital, be varied or added to, whilst a state of war exists, by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Trade:

And whereas by a Proclamation, dated the 28th day of July, 1915, and made under Section 8 of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, and Section 1 of the Exportation of Arms Act, 1900, and Section 1 of the Customs (Exportation Prohibition) Act, 1914, the exportation from the United Kingdom of certain articles to certain or all destinations was prohibited:

Condenser tubes;

Steel plates and sectional materials for shipbuilding;

Soap containing more than one per cent. of glycerine;

Steel in bars, angles, rods and shapes or sections;

Steel blooms, billets and slabs;

Steel bridge, boiler and other plates not under ½ inch thick;

Steel girders, beams, joists and pillars;

Steel ingots;

Steel tubes of all descriptions;

Steel wire, except barbed and galvanised wire (the exportation of which remains prohibited to all destinations abroad other than British Possessions and Protectorates).

(2) That the exportation of the following goods should be prohibited to all destinations abroad other than British Possessions and Protectorates:—

Aluminium Sulphate and aluminio-ferric; Files;

Lacs, not including lac dye;

Soap, soft, containing one per cent. and less of glycerine.

(3) That the exportation of the following goods should be prohibited to all foreign countries in Europe and on the Mediterranean and Black Seas, other than France, Russia (except through Baltic ports), Italy, Spain and Portugal:—

Asphalt and solid or liquid bitumen;

Fishing gear, except tackle for fishing by rod and line;

Petroleum and its products not already specifically prohibited;

Soap, hard, containing one per cent. and less of glycerine.

Now, therefore, Their Lordships, having taken the said recommendation into consideration, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the same be approved.

The Governments of Their Majesties the King of Great Britain and Ireland and the King of the Belgians are agreed during the present war to recognise the exclusive right of jurisdiction of the tribunals of their respective armies in the field in regard to persons belonging to those armies, irrespective of the nationality of the accused or of the territory in which the armies are operating.

With regard to any infringement of the law, committed conjointly or in collusion on Belgian territory by persons belonging to these two armies, the British principals and their accomplices will be referred to British military jurisdiction, and the Belgian principals and their accomplices to Belgian military jurisdiction.

In the case of infringements committed conjointly or in collusion on British territory by persons belonging to these two armies, the principals and their accomplices will be referred to British military jurisdiction, except in the case of Belgians who have been arrested under Belgian authority.

The two Governments also agree to recognise, during the present war, the exclusive right of jurisdiction, on British territory, of the British tribunals respecting all persons not belonging to the Belgian army committing acts prejudicial to the said army; and the ex-

clusive right of jurisdiction on Belgian territory of the Belgian tribunals respecting persons not belonging to the British army committing acts prejudicial to the said army.

RENFREWSHIRE (CONTROL OF DOGS)
ORDER OF 1916.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, the Dogs Act, 1906, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Power to make Regulations.

1.—(1) The Local Authority of any District specified in the Schedule to this Order may, in accordance with the provisions of this Order,

make Regulations, with a view to the prevention of worrying of cattle (including sheep), for requiring that dogs or any class of dogs shall, during all or any of the hours between sunset and sunrise, be kept by the owners thereof under control in manner prescribed by the Regulations.

(2) The Regulations may apply to the whole or any part of the District, and may exempt any class of dogs either generally or under prescribed conditions.

Confirmation of Regulations.

2.—(1.) Regulations made under this Order shall not take effect unless and until they have been submitted to and confirmed by the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.

(2.) Unless the Board otherwise direct, the following provisions shall apply—

(i.) Notice of intention to apply for confirmation of any Regulation shall be given in one or more of the local newspapers circulating within the District in two successive issues two weeks at least before the making of the application.

(ii.) For two weeks at least before an application, a copy of the Regulations proposed to be confirmed shall be kept at the office of the Local Authority of the District, and be open during office hours thereat to the inspection of ratepayers of the District without fee or reward.

(iii.) The Clerk of the Local Authority shall on the application of any such ratepayer furnish him with a copy of the proposed Regulations on payment of sixpence.

(3.) A copy of any Regulations made by a Local Authority under this Order, signed and certified by the Clerk of the Local Authority to be a true copy and to have been duly confirmed, shall be evidence, until the contrary is proved, in all legal proceedings, of the due making, confirmation, and existence of the Regulations without further or other proof.

Seizure of Dogs where Regulations are Contravened.

3. Any dog in respect of which an offence is being committed against a Regulation made under this Order may be seized and treated as a stray dog under the powers conferred by section three of the Dogs Act, 1906.

Extension of Definition in Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

4. Dogs shall be animals for the purposes of the following sections of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894 (namely):—

Section forty-three (*police*);

Section forty-four (*General administrative provisions*);

and also for the purposes of all other sections of the said Act containing provisions relative to or consequent on the provisions of those sections and this Order, including such sections as relate to offences and legal proceedings.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

5. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

6. This Order may be cited as the RENFREWSHIRE (CONTROL OF DOGS) ORDER OF 1916.

PILOTAGE REGULATION.

Mariners are hereby warned that, under the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, the following Regulation has been made by the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty and will be brought into force on and after 10th April, 1916:—

All ships (other than British ships) whilst navigating in the waters between the Downs Pilot Station and Great Yarmouth and *vice versa*, and between those places and the Sunk light-vessel, or any intermediate Pilot station that may hereafter be established, and *vice versa*, must be conducted by Pilots licensed by the London Trinity House.

Note.

The above Regulation will be incorporated in the next re-publication of Admiralty Notice to Mariners No. 350 of 1916.

Caution.

This Admiralty Notice to Mariners is issued under the provisions of the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, and failure to comply strictly with the directions contained in it will constitute an offence against these Regulations.

Any person found guilty of such an offence is liable to severe penalties both of imprisonment and fine.

Any person aiding or abetting the commission of such an offence is himself guilty of an offence against the Regulations.

Attention is also drawn to the fact that any infringement of the directions contained in this Admiralty Notice to Mariners is liable to result in the detention of the ship or vessel.
