

At the Court at *Buckingham Palace*, the 12th day of *April*, 1916.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS under the Defence of the Realm (Amendment) (No. 3) Act, 1915, His Majesty has power by Order in Council to define any area wherein it appears to His Majesty, on the grounds specified in the said Act, to be expedient for the purpose of the successful prosecution of the present War that the sale and supply of intoxicating liquor should be controlled by the State, and to apply to such area so defined the Regulations issued by His Majesty in pursuance of the said Act under the Defence of the Realm Consolidation Act, 1914:

And whereas His Majesty in Council, in pursuance of the said first-mentioned Act, has issued the Defence of the Realm (Liquor Control) Regulations, 1915, under the said last mentioned Act:

And whereas it appears to His Majesty that it is expedient for the purpose of the successful prosecution of the present War that the sale and supply of intoxicating liquor in the area defined and specified in the Schedule hereto should be controlled by the State on the grounds that War material is being made and dealt with in transit therein, and that men belonging to His Majesty's Military Forces are assembled therein:—

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

The Defence of the Realm (Liquor Control) Regulations, 1915, and any Regulations amending the same, shall be, and are, hereby applied to the area defined and specified in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

The Staffordshire area, being the area comprising the City of Lichfield, the County Boroughs of Burton-upon-Trent and Stoke-on-Trent, and the County of Stafford (excepting the Borough of Wednesbury, and the Petty Sessional Divisions of Bilston, Dudley, Kingswinford and Wordsley, Rowley Regis, Rushall, Wednesbury and Wolverhampton); and the Petty Sessional Division of Buxton, in the County of Derby.

And whereas His Majesty in Council, in pursuance of the said first-mentioned Act, has issued the Defence of the Realm (Liquor Control) Regulations, 1915, under the said last-mentioned Act:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased, in pursuance of the said first-mentioned Act, to apply the said Regulations and any Regulations amending the same by an Order in Council, dated the 6th day of July, 1915, to certain areas known as the areas of Newport, Cardiff and Barry, and more particularly described in paragraphs 4, 5, and 6 of the Schedule thereto, and by further Orders in Council, dated respectively the 10th day of November, and the 22nd day of December, 1915, to an area comprising the County of Pembroke, and the Town and County of Haverfordwest, and it appears to be expedient that each of the said areas should form part of the area defined and specified in the Schedule hereto:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased, in pursuance of the said first-mentioned Act, to apply the said Regulations and any Regulations amending the same by an Order in Council, dated the 27th day of January, 1916, to an area in which was included the County of Flint, excepting the Petty Sessional Division of Overton and the Parish of Merford and Hoseley, and it appears to be expedient that the said County should form part of the area defined and specified in the Schedule hereto:

And whereas it appears to His Majesty that it is expedient for the purpose of the successful prosecution of the present War that the sale and supply of intoxicating liquor in the area defined and specified in the Schedule hereto should be controlled by the State on the grounds that War material is being made, loaded, unloaded, and dealt with in transit therein, and that men belonging to His Majesty's Naval and Military Forces are assembled therein:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

The Defence of the Realm (Liquor Control) Regulations, 1915, and any Regulations amending the same, shall be, and are, hereby applied to the area defined and specified in the Schedule hereto.
