Charges of the War. The Recruits for the Imperial Troops advance with fuch fuccess, that 'tis hoped they will be compleat by the end of March. Provision is made of all forts of Stores to be fent to Hungary; and in the Arsenal here they are at work to prepare a Train of Artillery, with a great quantity of Bombs, Carcasses, &c.
The Conferences are continued about the Affairs of Savoy, and we are told that Orders are given to haften the Succours deligned thither. The Advices from Turkey still speak of their great Preparations for the next Campagne, and that they pretend to be earlier in the Field this year than they were the last: At present all things are quiet on the Frontiers of Hungary and Tempilvania; The Troops the Enemy lately drew together beyond the Theyste, being gone back to their Quarters without attempting any thing. The last Week arrived here Prince Fredericks, Brother to the Elector of Saxony, from Venice; and having had a private Audience of the Emperor, he parted again on the 24th for Dresden.

Francfort, March 7. Some of the French Troops quartered in Alface were lately in motion, but twas only to change and reinforce their Garisons at Landau and Philipsburg. The Imperial Commissaries are still busied with providing Magazines for the Service of the Confederate Forces that are to act on the Upper Rhine. The Allies are
