# COURTS (EMERGENCY POWERS), ENGLAND.

THE COUNTY COURTS (EMERGENCY POWERS) Rule, 1916, DATED 13TH APRIL, 1916.

The following Rule under the Courts (Emergency Powers) Act, 1914, shall stand in lieu of Rule 25 of the County Courts (Emergency Powers) Rules, 1914 (Rule 3 of the County Courts (Emergency Powers) Rules, 1915).

This Rule shall come into operation on the first day of May, 1916, and shall apply to all proceedings pending on that day, except that paragraph 2, sub-paragraph (a), shall not apply to any summons issued before that day.

#### Fees.

1. The following fees shall be payable under the Treasury Order regulating Fees in the County Courts, on proceedings under the Act and the Rules for County Courts made there-under, in lieu of all other fees heretofore prescribed on such proceedings, viz. :-

(1.) On any notice of application under—

Rule 1, paragraph 1;

Rule 2, paragraph (ii);
Rule 4 (Rule 2 of the County Courts.
(Emergency Powers) Rules, 1915), paragraph (ii) or paragraph (iii);

Rule 5, paragraph 2; Rule 7, paragraph 2;

a fee under Schedule B, Part I., of the Fees. Order, of 6d. in the £ or part of a £ on the amount of the subject-matter of the application, not exceeding 2s. 6d.

Provided that where an order of commitment has before the coming into operation of this Rule been made on the hearing of a judgment summons served with a notice annexed thereto in accordance with Rule 3, paragraph 1, of theCounty Courts (Emergency Powers) Rules, 1914 (which was annulled by the County Courts (Emergency Powers) Rules, 1915), no fee shall be payable on a notice of application under Rule 4 (Rule 2 of the County Courts (Emergency Powers) Rules, 1915), paragraph (iii), for leave to issue the order.

The fee on a notice of application shall include drawing, sealing, and issuing the order (if any), other than an order for the appointment of a receiver, and the fee prescribed by paragraph 12 of Schedule B, Part I., of the

Fees Order shall not be taken.

(2.) On any summons under Rule 11-

(a) a fee under Schedule A of the Fees Order of 6d. in the £ or part of a £ on the amount of the subject-matter of the sum-

mons, not exceeding 2s. 6d.

- (b) for drawing, sealing, and issuing the order (if any), a fee under Schedule B, Part I., of the Fees Order of 6d. in the £ or part of a £ on the amount of the subject-matter of the summons, not exceeding 2s. 6d., and the fee prescribed by paragraph 12 of Schedule B, Part I., of the Fees Order shall not be taken.
- (3.) The court may remit or excuse in whole or in part any fees paid or payable under this Rule, other than the fee prescribed by paragraph 2, sub-paragraph (a).

The KING was pleased, on Saturday, the 8th instant, at Buckingham Palace, to present to Lieutenant-Commander Arthur Richard Shaw Warden, R.N., the Albert Medal of the First Class, which was conferred upon him by His Majesty for gallantry in saving life, as detailed below:

On the morning of the 26th October, 1915, the Orderly Officer on duty at the Bassin Loubet, Boulogne, was informed that a fire had broken out in the after hold of the S.S. "Maine" Ammunition Ship, in which a quantity of high explosives was stowed, and he at once reported the fact to Lieutenant-Commander Warden, at the Office of the Naval Transport Officer.

In the meantime the ship was abandoned by her officers and crew, and steps were taken by the local fire brigade to rig the shore fire hoses.

Lieutenant-Commander Warden immediately proceeded on board, and on arrival at the after hold found smoke issuing from between the high explosive cases in the centre of the hatch. He went down into the hold, lifted up one of the cases, and called for the fire hose, which was passed to him by Private Edward Gimble, 1st Battalion, Middlesex Regiment, who had followed him on board.

This case, and the one next to it, were alight on their adjacent sides. Lieutenant-Commander Warden played the hose on them and extinguished the fire. Subsequent investigation showed that the fire was in all probability due to the ignition by friction or spontaneous combustion of amorphous phosphorus, which had leaked from boxes containing that substance stowed above the cases containing the high explosives.

There is little doubt that the prompt and gallant action of Lieutenant-Commander Warden prevented an explosion which would have had serious and possibly disastrous results with almost certain loss of life.

The Albert Medal of the Second Class has been awarded to Private Gimble.

ALIENS RESTRICTION (CONSOLIDATION) ORDER, 1916.

Whereas the Aliens Restriction (Consolidation) Order, 1916, provides that Articles 12-A (Provisions with respect to landing of alien seamen) and 19-A (Registration of alien seamen) thereof shall respectively apply to such ports as the Secretary of State may order,

Now I hereby order that the aforesaid: Articles 12-A and 19-A of the Aliens Restriction (Consolidation) Order, 1916, shall apply to the ports of—

Aberdeen, Amble, Barrow-in-Furness, Belfast, Blyth, Boston, Bristol (including Avonmouth and Portishead), Brixham, Cardiff (including Barry Dock and Penarth), (including Queenstown), Dublin, Fleetwood, Dundee, Fowey (including Charlestown and Par), Glasgow, Gloucester (including Sharpness and Lydney), Greenock, Hull, Inverness, Ipswich, King's: Lynn, Lancaster (including Glasson Dock), Liverpool, Llanelly, Londonderry, Lowes-Liverpool, Lianeny, Lost, Middlesbrough, Newcastle-on-Tyne, Newport (Mon.), North Shields, Poole, Portsmouth, Port Talbot, Preston, Seaham, South Shields, Stockton, Southampton, South Shields, Stockton,. Sunderland, Swansea, West Hartlepool (in-cluding Hartlepool), Weymouth, Wick, and Yarmouth,

And that Article 12-A shall apply to the ports of Falmouth, Goole and Manchester. This Order shall have effect as from the 1st.

This Order shall have effect as from the 1st May next, and I hereby revoke as from that date the Order made by the Secretary of State on the 28th August, 1915, applying to the ports specified therein Articles 1 and 2 of the Aliens Restriction (Seamen) Order, 1915.

# DEFENCE OF THE REALM (LIQUOR CONTROL).

ORDER OF THE CENTRAL CONTROL BOARD (Liquor Traffic) for the Staffordshire

Any person contravening any provision of this Order or of the Liquor Control Regulations is liable to imprisonment for six months with hard labour and a fine of £100.

We, the Central Control Board (Liquor Traffic), in pursuance of the powers conferred upon us by the Acts and Regulations relating

to the Defence of the Realm, hereby make the following Order: -

# Limits of Area.

1. The area to which this Order applies is the Staffordshire Area, being the area comprising the City of Lichfield, the County Boroughs of Burton-upon-Trent and Stoke-on-Trent, the County of Stafford (excepting the Borough of Wednesbury and the Petty Sessional Divisions of Bilston, Dudley, Kingswinford and Wordsley, Rowley Regis, Rushall, Wednesbury and Wolverhampton), and the Petty Sessional Division of Buxton in the County of Derby.

Hours during which intoxicating liquor may be sold :-

#### A.—For Consumption ON the Premises.

2. (1) The hours during which intoxicating liquor may be sold or supplied in any licensed premises or club for consumption premises shall be restricted and shall be as follows:-

# On Weekdays:-

(a) In the County Borough of Stoke-on-Trent, the Borough of Newcastle-under-Lyme, the Petty Sessional Divisions of Cheadle, Leek, Pirehill North and Stone, and the Parishes of Swynnerton, Croxden, Rocester, Denstone, Prestwood, Ellastone, Calwich, Mayfield, Okeover, Stanton, Wootton and Ramshorn in the County of Stafford,

The hours between 12 noon and 2.30 p.m.

and between 6 p.m. and 9 p.m.

(b) In the Petty Sessional Division of

Buxton in the County of Derby, The hours between 12 noon and 2.30 p.m.

and between 6.30 p.m. and 9.30 p.m. (c) In the rest of the area,

The hours between 11.30 a.m. and 2 p.m. and between 6 p.m. and 9 p.m.

#### On Sundays:---

The hours between 12.30 p.m. and 2.30 p.m. and

(d) In the Petty Sessional Division of Buxton in the County of Derby,

The hours between 6 p.m. and 9 p.m.

(e) In the rest of the area, The hours between 6.30 p.m. and 9 p.m.

Except between the hours respectively prescribed no person shall:

(i) Either by himself or by any servant or agent sell or supply to any person in any licensed premises or club any intoxicating liquor to be consumed on the premises; or

(ii) Consume in any such premises or club

any intoxicating liquor; or

(iii) Permit any person to consume in any such premises or club any intoxicating liquor.

# B.—For Consumption OFF the Premises.

(2) The hours during which intoxicating liquor may be sold or supplied in any licensed premises or club for consumption off the premises shall (subject to the additional restrictions as regards spirits) be restricted, and be the same in each case as the hours during which intoxicating liquor may be sold or supplied for consumption on the premises, except that in each case such sale or supply for consumption off the premises shall cease in the evening

one hour earlier than the sale or supply for consumption on the premises.

Except between the hours respectively pre-

scribed no person shall:

(a) Either by himself or by any servant or agent sell or supply to any person in any licensed premises or club for consumption off the premises or (except as hereinafter ex-pressly provided) dispatch therefrom any intoxicating liquor; or

(b) Take from any such premises or club

any intoxicating liquor; or

(c) Permit any person to take from any such premises or club any intoxicating liquor.

# Additional Restrictions as to Spirits.

- 3. In addition to the above general restrictions as to hours during which intoxicating liquor may be sold or supplied, the sale and supply of spirits in licensed premises and clubs shall be subject to the following special restrictions, that is to say:
  - (a) No orders for spirits to be consumed off the premises shall be given by or accepted from any person actually present in any licensed premises or club except on Mondays, Thursdays Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Fridays, and during the midday hours respectively prescribed by Article 2 of this Order.
  - (b) Spirits to be consumed off the premises must not (except as hereinafter expressly provided) be dispatched from any licensed premises or club, nor must they be taken therefrom by the person to whom they are sold or supplied or by any person acting on his behalf, except on the days and during the hours aforesaid.
  - (c) Spirits to be consumed off the premises shall not be sold or supplied in or taken from any licensed premises or club in any bottle or other vessel not bearing a label showing the name and situation of the premises or club, or in any vessel of a capacity less than one reputed quart, or in any less quantity than one reputed quart, or in any open vessel.
  - (d) No spirits to be consumed off the premises shall be sold or supplied in or taken from any refreshment room in any railway station.

# Conditions as to Distribution.

- No person shall either by himself or any servant or agent-
  - (a) Sell, supply, distribute or deliver any intoxicating liquor from any van, barrow, basket or other vehicle or receptacle unless before the liquor is dispatched it has been ordered and the quantity, description and price thereof together with the name and address of the person to whom it is to be supplied has been entered in a delivery book or invoice, which shall be carried by the person delivering the liquor, and in a day book which shall be kept on the premises from which the liquor is dispatched.
  - (b) Carry or convey in any van, barrow, basket or other vehicle or receptacle while in use for the distribution or delivery of intoxicating liquor, any such liquor not entered in such delivery book or invoice and day book.
  - (c) Distribute or deliver any intoxicating liquor at any address not specified in such delivery book or invoice and day book.

- (d) Refuse to allow any constable to examine such van, barrow, basket or other vehicle or receptacle or such delivery book or invoice.
- (e) Solicit or canvass for orders for, or collect or receive payment for, intoxicating liquor except at the licensed premises.

(f) Send or cause to be sent or leave or cause to be left to or at any premises, or to or with any person, any order form for in-

toxicating liquor.

(g) Cause or permit any payment for intoxicating liquor to be made on his behalf by any person in the service or employment of the vendor of the liquor, or, being a person in such service or employment, make any such payment as the agent or on behalf of the purchaser of the liquor.

#### Hours of Opening for the Supply of Food and Non-Intoxicants.

- 5. Notwithstanding any provisions of this Order or of the Law relating to licensing or the sale of intoxicating liquor:-
  - (a) Licensed premises may be opened for the supply of food and non-intoxicating liquor at the hour of 5.30 in the morning on all days, and be kept open for this purpose from that hour until the evening closing hour prescribed by the general provisions of the Licensing Acts; and,

(b) Refreshment houses may be kept open for this purpose at any time during which they may be kept open under the general

provisions of the said Acts.

#### Saving Provisions.

6. Nothing in the foregoing provisions of this Order shall be deemed to prohibit, in cases where the same is otherwise lawful:

(a) The consumption of intoxicating liquor by any person in any licensed premises

or club where he is residing; or

intoxicating (b) The consumption of liquor at a meal by any person in any licensed premises or club at any time within half an hour after the conclusion of the afternoon and evening hours during which the sale or supply of intoxicating liquor is permitted by this Order; Provided that the liquor was sold or supplied and served during such hours at the same time as the meal and for consumption at the meal; or

(c) The sale or supply of spirits to any person producing a certificate in writing dated and signed by a duly qualified medical practitioner that the spirits are immediately required for medicinal purposes and specifying the quantity of spirits required; Provided that the quantity sold or supplied shall not exceed the quantity specified in such

certificate; or

(d) The dispatch from licensed premises for delivery at a place more than five miles distant of any spirits or other intoxicating liquor in the forenoon of any day on which the sale of the same for consumption off the premises is permitted by Article 2 (2) and Article 3 of this Order as the case may be;

#### Treating Prohibited.

7. No person shall either by himself or by any servant or agent sell or supply any intoxicating liquor to any person in any licensed premises or in any club for consumption on the premises unless the same is ordered and paid for by the person so supplied; nor shall any person order or pay for or lend or advance money to pay for any intoxicating liquor wherewith any other person has been or is to be supplied for consumption on the premises; nor shall any person consume in any licensed premises or club any intoxicating liquor which any other person has ordered or paid for or agreed to pay for or lent or advanced money to pay for:

Provided always that if such intoxicating liquor is supplied or served for consumption at a meal supplied at the same time and is consumed at such meal the provisions of this regulation shall not be deemed to be contravened if the person who pays for such meal also pays

for such intoxicating liquor.

For the purposes of this regulation consumption on the premises includes consumption of intoxicating liquor in or on any highway open ground or railway station adjoining or near to the licensed premises or club in which the liquor was sold or supplied; and any person consuming intoxicating liquor in or on any such highway open ground or railway station shall be deemed to consume the liquor in such licensed premises or club as the case may be.

# Credit Prohibited.

8. No person shall-

(1) (a) Either by himself or by any servant or agent sell or supply in any licensed premises or club or dispatch therefrom any intoxicating liquor to be consumed either on or off the premises; or

(b) Consume any intoxicating liquor in or take it from such premises or club; unless it is paid for before or at the time when it is supplied or dispatched or taken away.

Provided always that if the liquor is sold or supplied for consumption at a meal supplied at the same time and is consumed at such meal, this provision shall not be deemed to be contravened if the price of the liquor is paid together with the price of such meal and before the person partaking thereof quits the premises.

(2) Introduce or cause to be introduced into the area any intoxicating liquor unless it is paid for before it is so introduced.

# Long Pull Prohibited.

9. No person shall either by himself or by any servant or agent in any licensed premises or club sell or supply to any person as the measure of intoxicating liquor for which he asks an amount exceeding that measure.

# Dilution of Spirits.

10. The sale of whisky, brandy and rum reduced to a number of degrees under proof which falls between 25 and 50, and of gin reduced to a number of degrees under proof which falls between 35 and 50, is hereby permitted, and accordingly, in determining whether an offence has been committed under the Sale of Food and Drugs Acts by selling to the prejudice of the purchaser whisky, brandy, rum or gin not adulterated otherwise than by the admixture of water it shall be a good defence to prove that such admixture has not reduced the spirit more than 50° under proof.

#### Explanatory Provisions.

11.

(a) Nothing in this Order authorises any

licensed premises to be kept open for the sale of intoxicating liquor except during the hours permitted under the general provisions.

of the Licensing Acts.

(b) The prohibition under this Order of the sale supply and consumption of intoxicating liquor except during certain hours is not subject to the exceptions provided for in the Licensing Acts with respect to bond fide travellers and the supply of intoxicating liquor at railway stations or any other provisions in those Acts enabling intoxicating liquor to be supplied during closing hours in special cases.

(c) The expression "licensed premises" includes any premises or place where the sale of intoxicating liquor is carried on under a

icence.

(d) This Order does not affect the sale or dispatch of intoxicating liquor to a trader for the purposes of his trade or to a registered club for the purposes of the club.

(e) This Order does not affect the sale or supply of intoxicating liquor to or in any canteen where the sale of intoxicating liquor is carried on under the authority of a Secretary of State or of the Admiralty.

# Exhibition of the Order.

12. The secretary of every club to which this. Order applies and every holder of a licence for the sale of intoxicating liquor shall keep permanently affixed in some conspicuous place in the club or in each public room in the licensed premises a copy of this Order and any notice-required by the Board to be affixed.

# Commencement of Order.

13. This Order shall come into force on the first day of May, 1916.

The dates between which all sheep in the Area described in the Schedule hereto are to be dipped within the Area by the owner or person in charge of the sheep under and in accordance with Part II of the principal Order, are hereby fixed to be the thirty-first day of August and the sixteenth day of November in each year.

Modification of Part II of the Principal Order. 3. Part II of the principal Order shall, in its application to the Area described in the Schedule hereto, be read and have effect as if paragraphs (2) and (3) of Article 5 and Article 6 were omitted, and as if the following para-

graph were inserted in Article 5:—
"(2.) The dippings shall be carried out on such dates, at such dipping places, and in such manner as shall be required by a Notice signed by an Inspector of the Board or of the Local Authority, and served by post or otherwise on the owner or person in charge of the sheep referred to in the Notice."

Commencement.

4. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of May, nineteen hundred and sixteen.
