By the Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

WHEREAS His Majesty was pleased, in exercise of the power in that behalf conferred on Him by Section one, sub-section one, of the Trading with the Enemy (Extension of Powers) Act, 1915, by a Proclamation dated the 29th day of February, 1916, to prohibit all persons or bodies of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, resident, carrying on business, or being in the United Kingdom from trading with any of the persons or bodies of persons mentioned in the List contained in the said Proclamation:

And whereas by Section one, sub-section two, of the said Act, it is provided that any List of persons and bodies of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, with whom such trading is prohibited by a Proclamation under the said Act may be varied or added to by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of a Secretary of State, such List as so varied or added to being in the said Proclamation referred to as the "Statutory List":

And whereas the List contained in the said

Proclamation has been varied and added to by subsequent Orders of Council:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased by a Proclamation, dated the 26th day of April, 1916, and entitled "The Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation, 1916, No. 2," to amend the said Proclamation dated the 29th day of February, 1916, in certain particulars:

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a recommendation from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs to the following effect:—

That the "Statutory List" of persons and bodies of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, with whom trading is prohibited, should be further amended by the variation and addition of the names set forth in the Schedule hereto.

Now, therefore, Their Lordships, having taken the said recommendation into consideration, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the same be approved.

Whereof the Right Honourable Sir Edward Grey, Bart., K.G., one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, the Controller of the Foreign Trade Department, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

TRADE BOARDS ACT, 1909.

#### TAILORING TRADE BOARD.

(GREAT BRITAIN.)

Proposal to vary certain minimum rates of wages for female workers in certain branches of the tailoring trade in Great Britain which are engaged in making garments to be worn by male persons.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the above Act by the Board of Trade, and dated the 27th of April, 1910, the Trade Board established under the above Act for certain branches of the tailoring trade in Great Britain which are engaged in making garments to be worn by male persons, as defined in the Regulations made by the Board of Trade and dated the 10th January, 1914,

Hereby give notice, as required by Section 4 of the above Act, that the Trade Board propose to vary the minimum rates at present fixed and made obligatory under Orders of the Board of Trade dated the 20th February, 1913, and the 20th January, 1916, in respect of the following class of workers, that is to say:—

Female workers employed in cutting, trim-

ming, and fitting-up.

In respect of such class of workers the Trade Board propose to vary the minimum rates now payable under their notices dated the 19th August, 1912, and the 19th July, 1915, so that in lieu of such rates the minimum rates payable shall be as follows:

For female workers when employed under 19 years of age, 4d. per hour.

For female workers when employed at 19 and under 20 years of age, 5½d. per hour.

For female workers when employed at 20 years of age and over, 6d. per hour.

Provided that in the event of any female worker being employed for the first time at such work at or over the age of nineteen years the rate to be paid during the first two months

of her employment shall be at 1d. per hour less than the rate appropriate to her age as set out above.

For the purpose of this notice and the proposed variation the terms: Cutting, Trimming and Fitting-up shall include the following processes, that is to say :-

Marking in or marking up, Laying up or folding cloth or linings or other materials,

Cutting, Dividing, Fitting-up,

and any other processes usually carried on in and connected with the cutting, trimming and fitting-up branch of the trade.

The Trade Board will consider any objections to the above proposal to vary which may be lodged with them within three months from 3rd May, 1916. Such objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address) and should be sent to the Secretary of the Tailoring Trade Board (Great Britain), 5, Chancery-lane, London, W.C.

It is desirable that the objections should state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.
