

Baillies or other Judges Ordinary of the Jurisdiction within the which they live, before the Third and Eleventh days of April next, viz. those on this side the Water of Tay before the Third, and those on the other side before the Eleventh day, to deliver up all their Horses above the foresaid value of a Hundred Marks the Head, whether in their own keeping, or the keeping of any others, with all their Arms except a Walking Sword, to the same Judge at the Tolbooth of the Head Burgh of the foresaid Jurisdiction within which they live, which Horses and Arms so delivered are to be reaped by the said Judge the first Mercat day thereafter to the best avail, and the Price is to be given to the Deliverers and Owners aforesaid, certifying all such as shall contravene, and not give ready Obedience hereunto, that they shall incur the foresaid Penalty of One thousand Marks, the one half to Their Majesties, and the other half to the Informer, over and above the loss of their Horses and Arms, which are also to be reaped as aforesaid to the best avail.

By another Proclamation the Heretors and others liable to furnish any Men for the new Levy appointed by the Seventh Act of the 4th Session of this Parliament, are required to have their several proportions of the said Levy ready and in good case, and to deliver the same to such Officers, and at such places, as shall be appointed by the Privy-Council, or by Sir Thomas Livingstone Commander in Chief of Their Majesties Forces within this Kingdom, on or before the 23d of this month. And the Lords of the Privy-Council named in the said Proclamation are appointed for the several Shires to judge and determine upon all Differences and Debates that may arise betwixt the Commissioners of the said Shires, and the Officers ament the sufficiency or insufficiency of the Men to be outreiked for this present Levy.

Another Proclamation of the same date with the two former, (viz. the 13th of this Month) Strictly prohibits the importing of any Meal, or other Vistual whatsoever, or of any Horses, Mares or Cows from the Kingdom of Ireland into this Kingdom, in pursuance of divers Laws and Acts of Parliament made in that behalf.

Falmouth, March 17. This morning arrived here the *Spanish-Alliance* Pacquet Boat, *John Hutchins* Commander, and the *Spanish-Expedition*, *Francis Eyles*, in 5 days from the *Groyne*. The *Alliance* the day after she went last out of this Port, took a Vessel of about 70 Tun laden with Wines and Brandy from *Nantz*; as also a French Ship of 16 Guns, laden with Wines and Provisions for the *West-Indies*, both which she carried to the *Groyne*.

Plimouth, March 18. Yesterday came in the *Germion*, having on the French Coasts re-taken two small Vessels called the *Anne* and the *Angel* bound from *Portugal* to *London*.

Chester, March 19. Yesterday Brigadier *Stewart's* Regiment of Foot, which is come from *Ireland*, landed at *Nesson*, and in the Evening marched into this City.

London, March 21. On the 26th Instant was launched at *Redriff* a new Fireship called the *Phoenix*, built by Mr. *Dalton* and Mr. *Gardner*.

The 17th a new Fourth Rate of 60 Guns at

Souhampton named the *Sunderland*, built by Mr. *Winter*.

The 19th a new Sixth Rate of 24 Guns at *Chatham* called the *Lizard*.

A new Fifth Rate of 32 Guns at *Shoreham* named the *Surlings*, built by Mr. *Burrel*.

And Two new Advice Boats at *Perthmouth*, one called the *Mercury*, and the other the *Fly*.
