MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

COUNTY OF FLINT.

Whereas by sub-section 1 of section 9 of the
Motor Car Act, 1903, it is enacted that within
any limits or place referred to in regulations
made by the Local Government Board with a
view to the safety of the public on the applica-
tion of the local authority of the area in which
the limits or place are situate, a person shall
not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten
miles per hour;

And whereas the County Council of Flint
have made applications to the Local Govern-
ment Board for a regulation to be made in
pursuance of the said sub-section putting the
above-mentioned provisions of that sub-section
in force within the limits comprising the follow-
ing roads or parts of roads at Rhyl and
Rhuddlan within the County of Flint, that is
to say:—

Urban District of Rhyl.

The Parade, extending from a point
opposite the Packet Hotel to the eastern
boundary of the Urban District.

High Street, extending from the approach
to the Railway Bridge to the Parade;

The Railway Bridge and approaches
thereto from High Street and Vale Road;
and

Vale Road, extending from the approach
to the Railway Bridge to the south-eastern
boundary of the Urban District and its
junction with the main road to Rhuddlan.

Parish of Rhuddlan.

The road (including High Street, Rhudd-
lan) extending from the south-west end of
the bridge over the River Clwyd to the cross
roads at the north-east end of the town.

And whereas notice of the said applications
and of the time and manner in which objections
should be made to any such regulation
appeared in the London Gazette of the 14th
day of January, 1916, and in the Rhyl Record
and Advertiser of the 22nd day of January,
1916.

And whereas certain objections to the
making of any regulation in pursuance of the
said provisions have been received by the Local
Government Board, and it is expedient that
further inquiry should be made in the matter
of the said applications:

Notice is hereby given, that R. C. Maxwell,
Esquire, Barrister-at-Law, one of the Inspec-
tors of the Local Government Board, will
attend at the Town Hall, Rhyl, on Thursday,
the 15th day of June, 1916, at ten o'clock in
the forenoon, to hold a Local Inquiry into the
subject-matter of the said applications.

And notice is hereby further given, that any
person interested may attend at such Inquiry
and be heard with reference to the said appli-
cations.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 22ND MAY 1916.)

SURREY (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF
1916.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by
virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in
them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894
to 1914, and of every other power enabling
them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby
ordered, as follows:—

*Application of Swine-Fever (Regulation of
Movement) Order of 1908 with Modifications.*

1.—(1.) The provisions of the Swine-Fever
(Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908
(hereinafter referred to as "the principal
Order"), as modified by the Swine-Fever
Order of 1911, shall apply to the Scheduled
Area described in the First Schedule hereto,
but subject to the modifications hereinafter
contained: Provided that the provisions of the
principal Order relating to an Infected Area
shall not apply to any part of the Scheduled
Area, unless such part is for the time being
declared by Order of the Board to be, or form
part of, a Swine-Fever Infected Area.

(2.) The Swine-Fever (Regulation of
Movement) Order of 1914 (*Declaration sub-
stituted for Licence in case of Movement of
Swine Intended for Immediate Slaughter*)
shall, so long as the same remains in force,
apply to the provisions of this Order.

*Regulation of Movement of Swine to
Markets.*

2.—(1.) Swine shall not be moved into a
market, fairground or saleyard in the Sched-
uled Area described in the First Schedule
hereto from premises in the Scheduled Area
unless accompanied by a licence (Form A)
granted either by an Inspector of the Local
Authority of the District in which the
premises from which the swine are to be moved
are situate or by an Inspector of the Local
Authority of the District in which the market,
fairground or saleyard is situate, and the pro-
