HEREAS by an Order in Council dated the twenty-eighth day of November, nineteen hundred and fourteen, His Majesty was pleased to make regulations (called the "Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914") under the Defence of the Realm Consolidation Act, 1914, for securing the public safety and the defence of the realm:

And whereas the said Act has been amended by the Defence of the Realm (Amendment) Act, 1915, the Defence of the Realm (Amendment) (No. 2) Act, 1915, and the Munitions of War Act, 1915:

And whereas the said regulations have been amended by various subsequent Orders in Council:

And whereas it is expedient further to amend the said regulations in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the following amendments be made in the said regulations:

1. After regulation 8c, the following regulation shall be inserted:—

"8D. Any company, authority, or person supplying or authorised to supply water, light, heat, or power, shall, if so required by the Admiralty or Army Council or the Ministry of Munitions, supply water, light, heat or power to any factory, building, camp, or other premises belonging to or used for the purposes of the Admiralty or Army Council or the Minister of Munitions, and shall carry out such works and render such services as may be directed by the Admiralty or Army Council or the Minister of Munitions for the purpose of enabling such a supply to be given either by themselves or by some other such company, authority, or person:

"Provided that a company, authority or person shall not be required under this regulation to supply water, light, heat or power to premises within the area of supply of any other company, authority or person except with the concurrence of the appropriate Government Department, and if any question arises as to which Government Department is the appropriate Government Department the question shall be finally determined by the Traceury

shall be finally determined by the Treasury.

"If any company, authority or person fail to comply with a requisition under this regulation the company, authority or person shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations,

and any director or officer of the company or officer of the authority who is knowingly a party to the default shall also be guilty of an offence against these regulations."

2. For regulation 27 the following regulation.

shall be substituted:

"27. No person shall by word of mouth or in writing or in any newspaper, periodical, book, circular, or other printed publication,-

"(a) spread false reports or make false

statements; or

(b) spread reports or make statements intended or likely to cause disaffection to His Majesty or to interfere with the success of His Majesty's forces or of the forces of any of His Majesty's Allies by land or sea or to prejudice His Majesty's relations with foreign powers; or

"(c) spread reports or make statements intended or likely to prejudice the recruiting, training, discipline, or administration of any

of His Majesty's forces;

and no person shall produce any performance on any stage or exhibit any picture or cinematograph film or commit any act which is intended or likely to cause any such disaffection, interference or prejudice as aforesaid, and if any person contravenes any of the above provisions he shall be guilty of an offence against these

regulations.
"If any person without lawful authority or excuse has in his possession or on premises in his occupation or under his control any document containing a report or statement the publication of which would be a contravention of the foregoing provisions of this regulation, he shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations, unless he proves that he did not know and had no reason to suspect that the document contained any such report or statement, or that he had no intention of transmitting or circulating the document or distributing copies thereof to or amongst other persons.

3. The following regulation shall be inserted

after regulation 29A:

" 29B.—(1) The Admiralty or Army Council, with the concurrence of a Secretary of State, or in the case of Scotland of the Secretary for Scotland, may from time to time by order declare any area to be a Special Military Area for the purposes of this regulation, and the boundaries of any such area shall be indicated by means of notices on roads and other ways of access to the area and in such other manner as may appear to the commandant of the area to be required for informing the public, and the commandant shall be an officer who has been duly appointed to be a competent naval or mili-

tary authority.
"(2) As from such date as may be directed in an order declaring an area to be a Special Military Area, no person shall without lawful

authority or excuse enter the area without permission from the commandant, and such permission may authorise the person to whom it is granted to enter the area either generally or on any particular occasion, and may authorise him to remain in the area either indefinitely or for

a specified period, and where any such permission has expired or is withdrawn the person to whom it is granted shall, unless he was at the said date a resident in the said area, forth-

with leave the area:

Provided that-

(i) The commandant may at any time by public notice or otherwise suspend this regulation either wholly or in so far as it affects any person or persons of any class or description, without prejudice to the subsequent enforcement of the provisions of this regulation in full ;

 \mathbf{The} following persons shall be exempted from the provisions of this regulation:

(a) any person in receipt of pay as a member of any of His Majesty's naval or military forces and any member of any police force in the United Kingdom;

(b) any person who holds a public office under the Crown and any member of His Majesty's civil service and any officer or servant of the Minister of Munitions

(c) any officer or official of a State in alliance with His Majesty, who is the holder of a special Inland Pass issued by or under the authority of a Secretary of State, and any other alien who is the holder of such a pass;

(d) a foreign ambassador, public mini-ster, or other alien exempted by Article 33 of the Aliens Restriction (Consolidation) Order, 1916, from the provisions of that

(e) any person under the age of sixteen

years;

(f) any person passing through the area in the course of a continuous journey by railway or water from and to places outside the area;

but the burden of proving that he is exempted from the provisions of this regulation shall rest on the person claiming exemption.

(3) For the purposes of this regulation the possession of a valid official pass in a form approved by the Admiralty or Army Council, and containing a photograph and the signature of the bearer duly authenticated by or under the authority of a Government Department recognised for the purpose by the Admiralty or Army Council, shall be a sufficient proof of

the identity of the holder.

- (4) Applications for and grants of permission to enter a Special Military Area shall be made in such manner and upon such form and subject to such conditions as may from time to time be approved by the Admiralty or Army Council, with the concurrence of a Secretary of State, and provision shall be made for the transmission by telegraph of applications for and grants of permission. Forms of application may be obtained by applying at any police station
- (5) If any person contravenes or fails to comply with any of the provisions of this regulation he shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations, and may be removed from the Special Military Area, unless he was at the said date a resident therein, by the direction of the commandant.
- (6) The provisions of this regulation shall be in addition to and not in derogation of any provision contained in any order made under the Aliens Restriction Act, 1914, or any other provision of these regulations.

 After regulation 34 the following regulation shall be inserted:

``34a. It shall be lawful for the Admiralty or Army Council or the Minister of Munitions to require any person who carries on the business of storing, cooling, transporting or distributing goods to afford such services in relation to the storage, cooling, transport or distribution of goods for or for the purposes of the Admiralty or Army Council or the Minister of Munitions as they or he may direct, and if any such person fails to comply with such requirements he shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations, and, if such person is a company, any director or officer of the company who is knowingly a party to the default shall also be guilty of an offence against these regulations."

5. The following regulation shall be inserted

after regulation 58c.:-

"58D. Where His Majesty has by Proclamation suspended, either generally or as respects any specified area, the operation of section one of the Defence of the Realm (Amendment) Act, 1915, then any person who is alleged to have committed any offence (whether an offence against these regulations or otherwise) at any place within the United Kingdom or within the specified area, as the case may be, while the Proclamation was in force and while he was subject to military law shall, notwithstanding anything in any Act or law to the contrary, be liable to be tried for the offence by court-martial and not otherwise, and on any such trial the procedure of the court-martial and the punishment to be inflicted in case of conviction shall be as prescribed by the Army Act."

"And whereas under the regulations for the government of Your Majesty's Naval Service an allowance is payable to the Senior Lieutenant-Commander or Lieutenant of a ship in commission:

"And whereas we consider that the responsibilities devolving upon the Officer performing the duties of Senior Lieutenant at certain Air Establishments and Stations also deserve recognition:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to authorise us to grant Senior Allowance of 1s. 6d. a day at Air Establishments and Stations where the numbers borne are not less than 350, such allowance to take effect from the 8th April, 1916.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas under the Regulations for the Government of Your Majesty's Naval Service an allowance is payable to Officers employed swinging ships for the adjustment of their compasses:

"And whereas we consider that, in certain cases, an allowance should be granted to Officers who are required to swing aircraft for the adjustment of their compasses:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to approve of payment being made, as from the 15th March, 1916, to the Navigating Officers of Seagoing Ships and other Officers certified as duly qualified by the Superintendent of Compasses who may be required to adjust the compasses of aircraft, of an allowance of 2s. 6d. for each machine adjusted, provided (a) that the Officers are not in receipt of Flying Pay or other special emoluments in connection with the Flying Service, or specially appointed for the purpose, and (b) that no allowance shall be paid for the adjustment of any particular Machine at less intervals than 6 months.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by the Colonial Solicitors Act, 1900, it is enacted that where, as respects a Superior Court in a British Possession, His Majesty the King in Council is satisfied on the report of a Secretary of State:—

- (a) That the Regulations respecting the admission of persons to be Solicitors of that Superior Court are such as to secure that those Solicitors possess proper qualifications and competency; and
- (b) That by the law of the British Possession the Solicitors of the Supreme Court will be admitted to be Solicitors of the Superior Court in the Possession on terms as favourable as those on which it is proposed to admit Solicitors of that Superior Court in pursuance of the said Act to be Solicitors of the Supreme Court;

His Majesty in Council may order that the said Act shall apply and the same shall accordingly apply to the said Superior Court and British Possession, subject to any exceptions, conditions, and modifications specified in the Order:

And whereas by the said Act it is further provided that His Majesty in Council by the same or any subsequent Order may, as respects the Court and British Possession named in the Order, provide for all matters authorized by the said Act to be prescribed, and for all matters appearing to His Majesty to be necessary or proper for giving effect to the Order, and to the said Act, and that an Order in Council applying the Act to a Court in a British Possession may provide that Solicitors of that Court may be admitted by virtue of the said Act to be Solicitors in any part of the United Kingdom, namely, England, Scotland, or Ireland, or in two or one of those parts only:

And whereas by the Foreign Jurisdiction Acts, 1890 and 1913, it is, amongst other things, provided that it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council by Order to direct that the Colonial Solicitors Act, 1900, shall extend, with or without any exceptions, adaptations, or modifications, in the Order mentioned, to any Foreign Country in which for the time being His Majesty has jurisdiction, and that thereupon that Act shall, to the extent of that

jurisdiction, operate as if that Country were a British Possession, and as if His Majesty in Council were the Legislature of that Possession:

And whereas by Treaty, grant, usage, sufferance and other lawful means, His Majesty the King has power and jurisdiction in the Territories of South Africa known as Southern Rhodesia:

And whereas application has been made by the High Commissioner of South Africa that the said Act may be applied to Southern Rhodesia:

And whereas His Majesty in Council, on the report of the Secretary of State for the Colonies, is satisfied that the Regulations respecting the admission of persons to be Attorneys of the High Court of Southern Rhodesia are such as to secure that those Attorneys possess proper qualifications and competency, and that by the law of Southern Rhodesia the Solicitors of the Supreme Court in England and Ireland, and Law Agents in Scotland, will be admitted to be Attorneys of the High Court of Southern Rhodesia on terms as favourable as those on which it is proposed to admit Attorneys of that Court in pursuance of the said Act to be Solicitors of the Supreme Court in England and Ireland, and Law Agents in Scotland:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance of the said recited Acts, and in execution of the powers thereby in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Colonial Solicitors Act, 1900, shall apply to the High Court of Southern Rhodesia, and to the Protectorate of Southern Rhodesia, and that Attorneys of the High Court of Southern Rhodesia may be admitted by virtue of the said Act to be Solicitors in England, and in Ireland, and Law Agents in Scotland, subject to the conditions herein-after specified:—

- (1) An Attorney of the High Court of Southern Rhodesia (herein-after called the applicant), who, having been in practice before such Court for not less than 3 years, is desirous of being admitted to be a Solicitor of the Supreme Court in England or Ireland, or a Law Agent in Scotland, shall be a male British subject.
- (2) The applicant shall, 4 calendar months at least before the first day of the month in which he proposes to be admitted, leave with the Registrar of Solicitors, or in the case of Scotland with the Registrar of Law Agents, his original Certificate of Admission in the High Court of the said Protectorate together with
 - (a) A Certificate from the authority of the said Protectorate in whose custody the Roll of the Attorneys of the said Court is kept, stating that his name is still upon the Roll and has never been removed therefrom, and that no order has ever been made directing him to be suspended from practising his profession:
 - (b) One or more Certificates of fitness and character signed by two resident practising Attorneys of at least 5 years standing in the said Court, and by at least one of the Judges or Officers next in rank of such Court:
 - (c) A Statutory Declaration in terms of,

or to the effect of, that set out in the Schedule (A) hereunto annexed.

(3) The leaving of the before-mentioned documents shall be equivalent to notice of intention to apply for admission within the meaning of the Acts regulating the admission of Solicitors in England and Ireland respectively.

(4) The applicant shall further make formal Application for admission as herein-after pro-

vided.

- (5) The application for admission to be a Solicitor in England shall be made by petition to the Law Society as Registrar of Solicitors, and, if the Registrar is satisfied that the applicant has complied with the requirements of this Order, he shall be required to undergo the Final Examination in Law and the Examination in Trust Accounts and Book-keeping for applicants for admission in England prescribed by the Solicitors Act, 1877, and the Regulations in force thereunder, and on the Master of the Rolls being satisfied by a Certificate under the hand of the Registrar that the applicant has complied with the provisions of the Colonial Solicitors Act, 1900, and of this Order, and has duly passed the said Examinations, then and not otherwise the Master of the Rolls shall cause him to be admitted a Solicitor and his name to be enrolled on the Roll of Solicitors; which Admission shall be stamped with the stamps required by Clause (8) of this Order.
- (6) The application for admission to be a Solicitor in Ireland shall be made by petition to the Incorporated Law Society of Ireland as Registrar of Solicitors, and, if the Registrar is satisfied that the applicant has complied with the requirements of this Order, he shall be required to pass the Final Examination for applicants for admission in Ireland prescribed by The Solicitors (Ireland) Act, 1898, and the Rules and Regulations in force thereunder, and on the Lord Chancellor of Ireland being satisfied by a Certificate under the hand of the Registrar that the applicant has complied with the provisions of the Colonial Solicitors Act, 1900, and of this Order, and has duly passed the said Examination, then and not otherwise the Lord Chancellor of Ireland shall cause him to be admitted a Solicitor and his name to be enrolled on the Roll of Solicitors, which Admission shall be stamped with the stamps required by Clause (8) of this Order.
- (7) The application for admission to be a Law Agent in Scotland shall be made by Petition to the Court of Session, and, if the Court shall be satisfied that the applicant has complied with the requirements of this Order, they shall ordain him to undergo the Examination in Law prescribed for the time being for applicants for admission as Law Agents in Scotland under the Law Agents (Scotland) Act, 1873, and Acts amending the same, and on the Court being satisfied that the applicant has duly passed such Examination, then and not otherwise the Court shall cause him to be admitted a Law Agent and his name to be enrolled as such, which Admission shall be in writing and signed by a Judge of the Court, and shall be stamped with the stamps required by Clause (9) of this Order.

The Rules in force in Scotland for the time being as to the presentation of petitions for admission as Law Agent, and the proceedings under the same, shall be applicable to all

Applications under this Order for admission as a Law Agent in Scotland.

- (8) The Admission of the applicant as a Solicitor in England or Ireland shall be stamped with the stamps required to be impressed on the Admission of Solicitors in England and Ireland respectively, and shall be impressed with such further stamp as shall, together with the amount of stamps paid on articles of clerkship and admission in Southern Rhodesia (such amount being certified by a Judge of the High Court of the said Protectorate in the form set out in the Schedule (B) hereunto annexed), be equal in amount to the sum payable on articles of clerkship in England and Ireland respectively.
- (9) The Admission of the applicant as a Law Agent in Scotland shall be stamped with such stamp as shall, together with the amount of stamps paid on articles of clerkship and admission in Southern Rhodesia (such amount being certified by a Judge of the High Court of the said Protectorate in the form set out in Schedule (B) hereunto annexed), be equal to the stamps required to be impressed on the articles of clerkship and admission of Law Agents in Scotland.
- (10) The following fees shall be paid by the applicant in England to the Law Society.

We, whose names are hereunder written, having been sworn on the seventh day of March, one thousand nine hundred and sixteen, before the King's Remembrancer, at Goldsmiths' Hall, in the City of London, have made the assays and trials of His Majesty's gold and silver coins in the Pyx of the Royal Mint in London, which, according to accounts produced by the Officers of the Mint, were coined in the said Mint, from the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, to the thirty-first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, both days inclusive. We ascertained that the number of coins, both of gold and silver, in each packet produced to us, corresponded with the number which the Officers of the Mint represented it to contain, and we took one coin from each of

such packets of gold coins, amounting altogether to one hundred and three sovereigns or twenty-shilling pieces, and to eleven half-sovereigns or ten-shilling pieces, and we weighed each of the said coins separately and ascertained that they were within the remedy as to weight prescribed in the First Schedule to the Coinage Act, 1870, as amended by the Coinage Act, 1891. We found that the amount of variation from the standard of weight specified in the said First Schedule to the said Act as so amended was plus three thousandths of an ounce (+ '003 oz.) on the whole of such coins. We then melted the said gold coins so taken out and weighed into an ingot, and assayed such ingot, comparing it with the standard gold Trial Plate produced by the Board of Trade, so as to ascertain whether the metal was within the remedy as to fineness prescribed in the said First Schedule to the said Act amended as aforesaid, and we found that the amount of variation thereof from the standard of fineness specified in the said First Schedule to the said Act as so amended was plus two hundred thousandths (or + 00002), and that, therefore, the said metal was within the prescribed remedy as to fineness. weighed the residue of the said gold coins in bulk, and we ascertained that they were within the remedy as to weight. We then assayed the said eight sovereigns and two halfsovereigns separately, and we found the millesimal fineness of such sovereigns to be, the first 916.65, the second 916.74, the third 916.78, the fourth 916.74, the fifth 916.79, the sixth 916.69, the seventh 916.68, and the eighth 916.63 respectively, and the millesimal fineness of such half-sovereigns to be, the first 916.79 and the second 916.74 respectively. We also took a coin from each of such packets of silver coins, making altogether one hundred and thirty-one half-crowns, sixty florins, one hundred and ten shillings, forty-one sixpences, one fourpence, fifteen threepences, one twopence, and one penny, and weighed each of the said silver coins separately, and ascertained that they were within the remedy prescribed in the said First Schedule to the said Coinage Act, 1870, as amended by the said Coinage Act, 1891. We found that the amount of variation from the standard of weight specified in the said First Schedule to the said Act as so amended was plus three thousandths of an ounce (+ '003 oz.) on the whole of such coins. We then melted the said silver coins so taken out and weighed into an ingot, and assayed such ingot, comparing it with the standard silver Trial Plate produced by the Board of Trade, so as to ascertain whether the metal was within the remedy as to fineness prescribed in the said First Schedule to the said Act amended as aforesaid, and we found that the amount of variation from the standard of fineness specified in the said First Schedule to the said Act as so amended, was minus one ten thousandths (or - 0001), and that, therefore, the said metal

was within the prescribed remedy as to fineness. We weighed the residue of the said silver coins in bulk, and we ascertained that they were within the remedy as to weight. then took from such residue five half-crowns, two florins, three shillings, one sixpence, and one threepence, and weighed and assayed them separately, and we found that such half-crowns weighed respectively, the first 218 221 grains, the second 218 012 grains, the third 218 061 grains, the fourth 218 102 grains, and the fifth 218 202 grains, that such florins weighed respectively, the first 174 419 grains and the second 176 612 grains, that such shillings weighed respectively, the first 87:301 grains, the second 87 436 grains, and the third 87 425 grains, that such sixpence weighed 43 631 grains, and that such threepence weighed 21 870 grains. We then assayed the said five half-crowns, the said two florins, the said three shillings, the said sixpence, and the said threepence separately, and we found the millesimal fineness of such half-crowns to be, the first 925.4, the second 924.3, the third 925.2 the fourth 924.6, and the fifth 924.0, of such florins to be, the first 923.5 and the second 924.3, of such shillings to be, the first 923.7, the second 924.3, and the third 924.2, of such sixpence to be 924.4, and of such threepence to be 924.4.

We found that the amount of variation from the standard of weight specified in the said First Schedule to the said Act as so amended was plus seven-thousandths of an ounce (+ 007 oz.) on the We then melted the said whole of such coins. gold coins so taken out and weighed into an ingot, and assayed such ingot, comparing it with the standard gold Trial Plate produced by the Board of Trade, so as to ascertain whether the metal was within the remedy as to fineness prescribed in the said First Schedule to the said Act amended as aforesaid, and we found that the amount of variation thereof from the standard of fineness specified in the said First Schedule to the said Act as so amended was minus four hundred thousandths (or - '00004), and that, therefore, the said metal was within the prescribed remedy as to We weighed the residue of the said fineness. gold coins in bulk, and we ascertained that they were within the remedy as to weight. We then took from such residue six sovereigns and one half-sovereign, and weighed and assayed them separately, and we found that such sovereigns weighed respectively—the first 123 315 grains, the second 123 249 grains, the third 123 326 grains, the fourth 123 208 grains, the fifth 123 308 grains, and the sixth 123 297 grains, and that such half-sovereign weighed 61 685 We then assayed the said six sovereigns and one half-sovereign separately, and we found the millesimal fineness of such sovereigns to be-the first 916.55, the second 916.92, the third 916.69, the fourth 916.66, the fifth 916.56, and the sixth 916.65, respectively, and the millesimal fineness of such halfsovereign to be 916.70.

TRIAL OF THE PYX OF THE SYDNEY BRANCH MINT.

VERDICT.

We, whose names are hereunder written, having been sworn on the seventh day of March, one thousand nine hundred and sixteen, before the Kino's Remembancer, at Goldsmiths' Hall, in the City of London, have made the assays and trials of His Majesty's gold coins in the Pyx of the Branch Mint at Sydney, in the State of New South Wales, which, according to accounts produced by the Officers of the Mint. were coined in the said Branch Mint from the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, to the thirty-first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, both days inclusive. We ascertained that the number of coins in each

packet produced to us corresponded with the number which the Officers of the Mint represented it to contain, and we took two coins from each of such packets of gold coins, amounting altogether to seventy-two sovereigns or twentyshilling pieces, and to twenty-eight half-sovereigns or ten-shilling pieces, and we weighed each of the said coins separately, and ascertained that they were within the remedy as to weight prescribed in the First Schedule to the Coinage Act, 1870, as amended by the Coinage Act, 1891. We found that the amount of variation from the standard of weight specified in the said First Schedule to the said Act as so amended was minus onethousandeth of an ounce (-001 oz.) on the whole of such coins. We then melted the said gold coins so taken out and weighed into an ingot, and assayed such ingot, comparing it with the standard gold Trial Plate produced by the Board of Trade, so as to ascertain whether the metal was within the remedy as to fineness prescribed in the said First Schedule to the said Act amended as aforesaid, and we found that the amount of variation thereof from the standard of fineness specified in the said First Schedule to the said Act as so amended was plus six hundred thousandths (or + 00006), and that, therefore, the said metal was within the prescribed remedy as to fineness. We weighed the residue of the said gold coins in bulk, and we ascertained that they were within the remedy as to weight. We then took from: such residue five sovereigns and three halfsovereigns, and weighed and assayed them separately, and we found that such sovereigns weighed respectively, the first 123 249 grains, the second 123 335 grains, the third 123 215 grains, the fourth 123 331 grains, and the fifth 123 203 grains, and that such half-sovereigns weighed respectively, the first 61 671 grains, the second 61 618 grains, and the third 61 604 grains. We then assayed the said five sovereigns and three half-sovereigns separately, and we found the millesimal fineness of such sovereigns to be, the first 916 53, the second 916.80, the third 916.64, the fourth 916.69, and the fifth 916 63 respectively, and the millesimal fineness of such half-sovereigns to be, the first 916.74, the second 916.88, and the third 916.45 respectively.

TRIAL OF THE PYX OF THE MEL-BOURNE BRANCH MINT.

VERDICT.

We, whose names are hereunder written, having been sworn on the seventh day of March, one thousand nine hundred and sixteen,

before the King's Remembrancer, at Goldsmiths' Hall, in the City of London, have made the assays and trials of His Majesty's gold coins in the Pyx of the Branch Mint at Melbourne, in the State of Victoria, which, according to accounts produced by the Officers of the Mint, were coined in the said Branch Mint from the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, to the thirty-first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, both days inclusive. We escertained that the number of coins in each packet produced to us corresponded with the number which the Officers of the Mint represented it to contain, and we took one coin from each of packets of gold coins, amounting altogether to ninety-two sovereigns or twentyshilling pieces, and to three half-sovereigns or ten-shilling pieces, and we weighed each of the said coins separately, and ascertained that they were within the remedy as to weight prescribed in the First Schedule to the Coinage Act, 1870, as amended by the Coinage Act, 1891. We found that the amount of variation from the standard of weight specified in the said First Schedule to the said Act as so amended was plus two-thousandths of an ounce (+ '002 We then oz.) on the whole of such coins. melted the said gold coins so taken out and weighed into an ingot, and assayed such ingot, comparing it with the standard gold Trial Plate produced by the Board of Trade, so as to ascertain whether the metal was within the remedy as to fineness prescribed in the said First Schedule to the said Act amended as aforesaid, and we found that the amount of variation thereof from the standard of fineness specified in the said First Schedule to the said Act as so amended was minus one hundred-thousandth (or - 00001), and that, therefore, the said metal was within the prescribed remedy as to fineness. We weighed the residue of the said gold coins in bulk, and we ascertained that they were within the remedy as to weight. then took from such residue six sovereigns and one half-sovereign, and weighed and assayed them separately, and we found that such sovereigns weighed respectively—the first 123.278 grains, the second 123.246 grains, the third 123.341 grains, the fourth 123.289 grains, the fifth 123.265 grains, and the sixth 123.290 grains, and that such half-sovereign weighed 61 605 grains. We then assayed the said six sovereigns and one half-sovereign separately, and we found the millesimal fineness of such sovereigns to be—the first 916.61, the second 916.64, the third 916.81, the fourth 916.79, the fifth 916.75, and the sixth 916.84, respectively, and the millesimal fineness of such halfsovereign to be 916.82.

And I declare that for the purposes of exercising the powers delegated to them all persons authorized to act on my behalf shall have and exercise all such further or incidental powers as are by the said Act or any regulations prescribed thereunder conferred or vested in the Secretary of State.

foundland Volunteer Force deceased during the present war, and all payments out of monies so received, and all distributions, disposals and applications of such monies and effects had or made before the date hereof by the said Paymaster and Officer in Charge of Records, or Minister of Justice, or by any person or persons acting under the authority of either of them in pursuance or purported pursuance of the said Act or of any regulations prescribed thereunder, have been had and made under the authority of and with the sanction of the Secretary of State.

These Regulations are liable to alteration for future examinations.

1. The limits of age for these situations are 15 and 18. If an Examination begins in one of the first six months of any year, Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of April in that year. If an Examination begins in one of the last six months of any year, Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of October in that year.

In reckoning age for competition, persons who have served for two full consecutive years in any Civil situation to which they were admitted with the Certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding five years which they may have spent in such service.

Persons transferred to situations in the Post Office from a Telephone Company or Municipal Telephone Undertaking, on the absorption of such Company or Undertaking by the Post Office, may reckon, as if it were service in a situation to which they were admitted with the Certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners, their continuous service in the Post Office, as well as so much of their previous continuous service in the Telephone Company or Undertaking (or in any Telephone Company or Municipal Telephone Undertaking previously absorbed by it) as was rendered in situations for which a Civil Service Certificate is ordinarily required.

6. Candidates for the Post Office Service

must be at least 5 feet in height.

7. Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the Examination, before the commencement of the

competition.

Persons who have entered upon or completed a course of education or training for the occupation of teacher, on account of which grants are payable from the Exchequer, will not be qualified to receive appointments until the consent of the Board of Education in England, the Committee of Council on Education for Scotland, or the Commissioners of National Education, Ireland, as the case may be, given in conformity with rules sanctioned by the Lords of the Treasury, has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

I. WATERFORD TO LONG ISLAND SOUND.

Motor boats, yachts and pleasure craft of all descriptions will only be permitted at the following ports, &c., within the area specified:—

Port, &c.—Limit of Cruising Area.

Waterford, inside a line drawn between Hook point and Brownstown head.

Dungarvan bay, inside a line drawn between Helvick head and Bunmahon Coast Guard station.

Youghal bay, inside a line drawn between Capel island and Ram head.

Ballycottin bay, inside a line drawn between Ballycottin island and Capel island.

Queenstown, inside a line drawn between Cork head and Power head.

Kinsale, inside a line drawn between Old head and Sovereign rocks.

Courtmacsherry bay, inside a line drawn between Old head and Seven heads.

Clonakilty bay, inside a line drawn between Seven heads and Galley head.

Glandore bay, inside a line drawn between Galley head and Toe head.

Baltimore bay, inside a line drawn between Toe head and Cape Clear.

Long Island sound, inside a line drawn between Cape Clear and Brow head.

- 2. Before a Regatta can be held within the authorised limits of any of the ports or waters mentioned permission must be obtained from the Vice-Admiral Commanding, Queenstown.
- 3. Excursion steamer traffic will be permitted only under license from the Vice-Admiral Commanding, Queenstown.
- 4. Yachts and other craft must obey immediately any orders given them by the patrol vessels. They are liable to inspection and search by those vessels.
- 5. At Queenstown, no sailings will be permitted before daylight, and no craft must be under way during the hours of official night, but must remain at their moorings. All yachts and other pleasure craft are to return into harbour before sunset.

The channel west of Spike Island is prohibited.

II. BANTRY, KENMARE AND DUNMANUS BAYS.

- 1. Yachts and other pleasure craft are not allowed to cross the line in Bantry bay drawn from Sheep head to Dursey head, nor to cross the line in Kenmare bay from Cod head to Bolus head, nor to cross the line in Dunmanus bay from Sheep head to Three Castle head.
- 2. No Regatta shall be held without permission in writing from the Senior Naval Officer,

Castletownbere. This applies to the coast from Mizzen head to Sybil point.

- 3. No Excursion steamer shall run without permission in writing from the Senior Naval Officer, Castletownbere. This applies to the coast from Mizzen head to Sybil point.
- 4. The directions as to no craft being under way in the defended port of Berehaven during official night are to be strictly adhered to.

(2) Traffic Regulations.

PORT OF QUEENSTOWN.

I .- PROHIBITED AREAS.

1. An obstruction has been placed across Queenstown harbour inside the entrance.

Anchorage is strictly prohibited between the southern limit of Outer Man-of-War roads and a line drawn between the light-buoy exhibiting an occulting white light, to the eastward of Spike island and the light-buoy exhibiting a fixed white light, off Black rock, Corkbeg.

fixed white light, off Black rock, Corkbeg.

The passage between Spike island and Ringaskiddy point is closed, and no vessel shall approach the area bounded on the south by a line drawn between Golden rock and the southernmost point of Spike island.

No vessel shall use the channels between Haulbowline and Spike island, east of Rocky island, or west of the Military pier on Spike Island.

Passage through Obstruction.

2. Vessels entering the port, not being in charge of a pilot, shall not proceed beyond the Examination anchorage. Vessels wishing to leave the port, not being in charge of a pilot, shall not proceed beyond the southern limit of the Outer Man-of-War anchorage. This applies to all craft except boats drawing less than four feet which have obtained special permission from the King's Harbour Master.

It is compulsory for all vessels desiring to pass through the obstruction in either direction to have on board a licensed pilot, or Master holding a pilot's certificate for the port, whose name has been approved by the Vice-Admiral Commanding Coast of Ireland.

II.—Entrance to the Port.

Entry Forbidden during Fog.

3. All Mercantile traffic is forbidden to enter the port or to pass beyond the limits of the Examination Anchorage during fog.

Pilotage.

4. It is compulsory for all merchant vessels to have a licensed local pilot on board when entering the port, except:—

Vessels whose masters hold pilot's certificates for the port and whose names have been approved by the Vice-Admiral Commanding Coast of Ireland.

Also certain local vessels which have obtained exemption from the Vice-Admiral Commanding Coast of Ireland. It is to be understood that pilotage is compulsory for these vessels when passing through the obstruction.

III.-MOVEMENTS WITHIN THE PORT.

5. The movements of all merchant vessels, barges, or boats of any kind are subject to the direction of the King's Harbour Master, whose orders are to be immediately obeyed.

Night and during Fog.

6. During the hours of official night, no merchant vessels (including fishing craft, barges, boats, yachts, or private vessels of any kind) will be allowed to be under way in the waters, including the creeks of the Dockyard Port of Queenstown, except with special permission from the King's Harbour Master. All vessels, barges, and boats must display the regulation lights. During fog all mercantile traffic is absolutely prohibited.

IV .- VESSELS LEAVING THE PORT.

Prohibition.

7. No merchant vessels (including fishing craft, barges, boats, yachts, or private vessels of any kind) are permitted to leave the Dockyard Port of Queenstown during the hours of official night except with special permission from the Vice-Admiral Commanding Coast of Ireland, which can be obtained through the Shipping Intelligence Officer. No vessel may leave during fog.

Permission to Leave.

8. Merchant vessels (including those engaged in the coastal trade) must on no account leave the Dockyard Port of Queenstown without permission.

Vessels must obtain such permission from the Collector of Customs, Queenstown.

Note.

This Notice is a repetition of Notice No. 114 of 1916, with the addition of the information contained in Section (1), sub-section I.

Caution.
