PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council; a Scheme, bearing date the 18th day of May, in the year 1916, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual

right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (herein-after called ‘ the said Benefice ’) of Swindon, in the County and Diocese of Gloucester :

“ Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Swindon is vested for an estate in fee simple, in possession, free from incumbrances, in Elizabeth Mary Thorneloe, of The Cottage, Swindon, in the said County of Gloucester, Widow :

“ And whereas the said Elizabeth Mary Thorneloe is desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Swindon, now vested in her as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Right Reverend Edgar Charles Sumner, now Bishop of Gloucester, and his Successors in the same Bishopric :

“ And whereas the said Edgar Charles Sumner, Bishop of Gloucester, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness, and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which, by the Acts in the herein-before mentioned Act recited, or by some or one of them, is made necessary, he, the said Edgar Charles Sumner, Bishop of Gloucester, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned :

“ And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Swindon, which is herein-before mentioned, and herein-after

recommended and proposed, will, in our opinion, tend to make better provision for the Cure of Souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson, so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid, arises or exists, that is to say in the Parish of Swindon:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Elizabeth Mary Thorneloe, (in testimony whereof she has signed and sealed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Edgar Charles Sumner, Bishop of Gloucester, (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme, and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Swindon, now vested in her the said Elizabeth Mary Thorneloe as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said Edgar Charles Sumner, Bishop of Gloucester, and his Successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in, and shall and may from time to time be exercised by, the said Edgar Charles Sumner, Bishop of Gloucester, and his Successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Gloucester.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Leonard Hedley, Bishop of Sheffield, (testified by his having signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said New Parish of Saint Thomas, Kimberworth, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the Map or Plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a District Chapelry to the said Church of Saint Paul, Masbrough, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Paul, Masbrough.'

"And with the like consent of the said Leonard Hedley, Bishop of Sheffield, (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials, should be solemnized or performed at the said Church of Saint Paul, Masbrough, situate as aforesaid, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns, and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices, should be paid and belong to the Minister of the same Church for the time being: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us, the said Commissioners, to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism, or for the registration thereof.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint Paul, Masbrough, being:—

"All that part of the New Parish (sometime Chapelry District) of Saint Thomas, Kimberworth, in the County of York, and in the Diocese of Sheffield, which is bounded upon the north-east, and upon the east, by the New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Masbrough, upon the south by the Parish of Rotherham, both in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides

the said Parish of Rotherham from the said New Parish of Saint Thomas, Kimberworth, at a point in the middle of the River Don distant 26 chains precisely measured along the middle of such River from the centre of the bridge which carries across it the North Midland Line of the Midland Railway, and extending from the said point north-westward in a straight line (thereby crossing the Sheffield and Mexborough Branch Line of the Great Central Railway) for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts to the southern end of the fence which divides the Close known as The Horse Pasture from the premises belonging to the Parkgate Steel and Iron Works, and extending thence north-westward along such fence for a distance of 8 chains or thereabouts to the point where the said fence meets the southern side of Deadman's Hole Lane, and extending thence first north-westward to the middle of such lane, and then first north-eastward, then north-westward, and then northward, along the middle of the said lane (thereby crossing the canal known as the Sheffield and South Yorkshire Navigation (New Cut)) for a distance in all of 20 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Steel Street, and extending thence first eastward, and then north-eastward, along the middle of Steel Street for a distance of 8½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Holmes Lane, and extending thence first north-westward, and then northward, along the middle of Holmes Lane (thereby crossing the line of the Midland Railway) for a distance of 4½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Psalters Lane, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Psalters Lane for a distance of 20 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Wilton Lane, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Wilton Lane for a distance of 12½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Kimberworth Road and the road called Wilton Gardens, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Wilton Gardens for a distance of 14 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Wortley Road opposite to the fence forming the boundary between the premises of the North Greaves Brick Works and the houses and premises situate on the western side of Dovercourt Road, and extending thence north-eastward, first to and along such fence, and then along the fences forming the western boundaries of the Closes numbered 1, 2, and 3 upon the Map or Plan annexed to this Representation, for a distance in all of 24 chains or thereabouts to the point where the fence forming the western boundary of the said Close numbered 3 meets the south-western side of Henley Lane, and extending thence north-eastward in a straight line to a point in the middle of Henley Lane upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Thomas, Kimberworth, from the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Masbrough."

1. No passenger shall land or embark at any port in the Orkney Islands without the permission of the Competent Naval Authority at Kirkwall. Provided that the grant of any such permission by the aforesaid Competent Naval Authority shall not exempt an alien from any of the requirements of the Aliens Restriction (Consolidation) Order, 1916, with regard to the obtaining of permission to land or embark at any port in the United Kingdom or otherwise.

2. The Order made by the Secretary of State under the aforesaid Regulation 14A on the twenty-eighth of May, 1915, is hereby revoked.

DEFENCE OF THE REALM (LIQUOR CONTROL).

GENERAL ORDER (AMENDING) OF THE CENTRAL CONTROL BOARD (LIQUOR TRAFFIC).

We, the Central Control Board (Liquor Traffic), in pursuance of the powers conferred upon us by the Acts and Regulations relating to the Defence of the Realm, hereby make the following General Order:—

I. The Article entitled “Dilution of Spirits” in each of the Orders of the Board now in force in the respective areas to which the Defence of the Realm (Liquor Control) Regulations, 1915, and any Regulations amending the same, have been applied, shall be revoked, and in place thereof the following Article shall be inserted.

Dilution of Spirits.

A.—Compulsory.

(a) No person shall either by himself or by any servant or agent—

(1) Sell or supply to any person in any licensed premises or club for consumption on or off the premises or dispatch therefrom any whisky, brandy, rum or gin unless reduced to 25 degrees under proof:

(2) Introduce or cause to be introduced into the area any whisky, brandy, rum or gin, unless reduced to 25 degrees under proof.

Provided always that the foregoing provisions of this Article shall not affect the sale or supply of whisky, brandy, rum or gin which is proved to have been bottled before the 6th day of June, 1916.

B.—Permissive.

(b) The sale of whisky, brandy, rum and gin reduced to a number of degrees under proof which falls between 25 and 50 is hereby permitted.

(c) In determining whether an offence has been committed under the Sale of Food and Drugs Acts by selling to the prejudice of the purchaser whisky, brandy, rum or gin not adulterated otherwise than by the admixture of water, it shall be a good defence to prove that such admixture has not reduced the spirit more than 50 degrees under proof.

And each of the said Orders of the Board shall be read as if the said Article were inserted therein.

II. This Order shall come into force on the 1st day of July, 1916.

River Tyne Boom Defence—Entrance Signals and Traffic Regulations.

Former Notice.—No. 1023 of 1915; hereby cancelled.

Notice is hereby given that the undermentioned regulations have been made by the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, in regard to the Boom Defence of the River Tyne, under the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, and will remain in force until further Notice:—

The following signals will be displayed to indicate that the Boom is *Open to Traffic*:—

By Day ... 2 Black Balls, vertical.

By Night ... 2 White Lights, vertical.

The above signals will be hoisted on board H.M.S. *Satellite* and at the following Distant Signal Stations:—

(a) For Incoming Traffic.—At the Lighthouse on the end of the North Arm of the Breakwater.

(b) For Outgoing Traffic.—At Ballast Hill. Shipping at Dunstan and Tyne Docks should ascertain by telephone from H.M.S. *Satellite* whether they can proceed down river. A telephone for this purpose is kept at the Staith Master's Office, Dunstan, and at the Dock Master's Office, Tyne Docks.

The absence of these signals will denote that the Boom is *Closed to Traffic*.

Vessels entering or leaving the Tyne, after passing the Pier Heads when bound inwards, and after passing Hay Hole Point when bound outwards, are to so regulate their speed that until the line of the Boom is passed they shall not come within a distance of 200 yards from their stem to the stern of the next vessel ahead proceeding in the same direction. Whilst navigating between Hay Hole Point and the Pier Heads no vessel should attempt to overhaul and pass ahead of another vessel proceeding in the same direction.

When crossing the line of the Boom all vessels are to preserve a mid-channel course as far as is consistent with safe navigation. Vessels of 25 feet draught and above are to stop their engines when crossing the line of the Boom at or about the time of low water.

Incoming and outgoing vessels must not cross the line of the Boom at the same time. Vessels proceeding against the tidal stream must so regulate their speed that any vessels proceeding with the tide shall first pass the obstruction.

No vessel is to anchor in the area bounded as follows:—On the West by a line drawn from the south-west corner of Dockwray Square to the east end of Salmons Quay, and on the East by a line drawn from Prior's Stone to the Volunteer Life Brigade House, provided only that a vessel proceeding to the oil jetty at South Shields may let go her anchor, if necessary, within the line of moorings off the said jetty; such vessels, however, are not to anchor to the eastward of a line drawn from Lloyd's Hailing and Signal Station to the Lifeboat House and slip on Commissioner's wharves.

With the above exceptions, the Rules and Regulations for the Navigation of the Tyne are to be adhered to.

Note.—This Notice is a repetition of No. 1023 of 1915, with additional information.

Caution.

This Admiralty Notice to Mariners is issued under the provisions of the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, and failure to comply strictly with the directions contained in it will constitute an offence against those Regulations.

Any person found guilty of such an offence is liable to severe penalties both of imprisonment and fine.

Any person aiding or abetting the commission of such an offence is himself guilty of an offence against the Regulations.

Attention is also drawn to the fact that any infringement of the directions contained in this Admiralty Notice to Mariners is liable to result in the detention of the ship or vessel.
