## BY THE KING. A PROCLAMATION FOR A BANK HOLIDAY.

GEORGE R.I.

E, considering that it is desirable that Saturday, the First day of July next, should be observed as a Bank Holiday throughout the United Kingdom, and in pur-suance of the provisions of "The Bank Holi-days Act, 1871," do hereby, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Act aforesaid of the powers conferred by the Act aforesaid, appoint Saturday, the First day of July next, as a special day to be observed as a Bank Holiday throughout the United Kingdom, under and in accordance with the said Act,

and We do, by this Our Royal Proclamation, command the said day to be so observed, and all Our loving subjects to order themselves accordingly.

## BY THE KING. A PROCLAMATION

FOR PROHIBITING THE IMPORTATION OF CERTAIN ARTICLES INTO THE UNITED KINGDOM.

## GEORGE R.I.

HEREAS by Section forty-three of the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876, it is provided that the importation of arms, ammunition, gunpowder, or any other goods may be prohibited by Proclamation:

And whereas it is expedient that the importation into the United Kingdom of certain goods should be prohibited as hereinafter provided :

Now, therefore, We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, in pursuance of the said Act and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby proclaim, direct and ordain as follows:

As from and after the Sixth day of July, 1916, subject as hereinafter provided, the importation into the United Kingdom of the following goods is hereby prohibited, viz. :-

Such motor cars, chassis, parts and accessories (other than tyres) as were expressly exempted from the prohibition on the importation of motor cars, chassis, motor cycles and parts and accessories thereof which was imposed by the Prohibition of Import (No. 3) Proclamation, 1916.

Vacuum cleaners.

Yeast.

Provided always, and it is hereby declared, that this prohibition shall not apply to any such goods which are imported under licence given by or on behalf of the Board of Trade, and subject to the provisions and conditions of such licence.

This Proclamation may be cited as the Prohibition of Import (No. 7) Proclamation, 1916.

And whereas by Order in Council dated the 29th day of February, 1916, His Majesty was pleased to order that The Military Service Act, 1916, should extend to the Isle of Man, subject to the adaptations therein contained:

And whereas the said Military Service Act, 1916, has been amended and further enactments made by the Military Service Act, 1916, (Session 2):

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Mili-tary Service Act, 1916, (Session 2), shall extend to the Isle of Man subject to the following adaptations:-

1. For the words "Great Britain" there shall be read "The Isle of Man." For the expression "The Military Service Act, 1916" there shall be read "The Military Service (Isle of Man) Act, 1916."

2. For Paragraph 3 of Sub-section 1 of Section 1 the following provision shall be substituted :-

"The appointed date shall, as respects men who come within the operation of this Section on the date of the Order in Council extending this Act to the Isle of Man, be the thirtieth day after the date of such Order, and as respects men who come within the operation of this Section after the said date, be the thirtieth day after the date on which they so come within the operation of this Section."

In Sub-section (2) of Section 2 for the words "The Council of the County or Borough or Urban District" there shall be substituted the words "The Tynwald Court."

In Sub-section (2) (a) of Section 2 for the words "Council of the County or Borough or Urban District" there shall be substituted the words "Tynwald Court"; for the word "Council," where it next occurs, there shall be substituted the words "Tynwald Court"; and for the words "The Council," where they last occur, there shall be substituted the words "Such Court."

In Sub-section (3) of Section 2 for the word "Council," wherever the same occurs, there shall be substituted the words "Tynwald Court."

In Sub-section (4) of Section 2 the words "In the case of a County" shall be deleted; for the word "County" there shall be substituted the word "Island"; and the words "So, however, that every Borough and Urban District" down to and including the words "Majority of the Members of the District Committee" shall be deleted.

Sub-sections (8) and (11) of Section 2 shall be deleted.

Wherever the expressions "A Local Committee," "Any such Local Committee," "Any Local Committee," or "Local Committees" occur (except in Sub-section (1) of Section 2) there shall be read the expression "The Local Committee."

In Section 5 for the words "Under the Summary Jurisdiction Acts" there shall be substituted the words "Before a High Bailiff or two Justices of the Peace at the suit of any Chief or other Constable."

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Regulations amending the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, issued by Order of His Majesty in Council dated the 1st day of June, 1916, shall extend to the Isle of Man, subject to the following adaptations:—

At the end of Regulation 15s, the following words shall be inserted " (being an Act of the Imperial Parliament)."

In Regulation 45A, after the words "Military Service" the words "(Isle of Man)" shall be inserted.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the power by the aforesaid Act in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that Section 20 of "The Finance Act, 1894," shall apply to the Commonwealth of Australia.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

I. This Order may be cited as "The Southern Rhodesia Order in Council, 1916," and shall be construed and read as one with the Order of 1909.

II. Article 3 (2) of the Order of 1909 is hereby revoked, and the following provision is hereby substituted therefor:—

"(2) The High Commissioner may declare when, and for what period, any police or volunteer force or any part thereof shall be employed on active service, and such force or such part thereof while so employed, together with all persons who are in the service of or followers of or who accompany any such force or such part thereof while so employed, shall be subject to such terms and regulations as the High Commissioner shall determine."

III. This Order shall be deemed for all purposes to have commenced and come into operation on the 4th day of August, 1914, and shall be published in the Gazette, and the High Commissioner shall give directions for the publication of this Order at such places, and in such manner, and for such time or times, as he thinks proper for giving due publicity thereto.

IV. His Majesty may from time to time revoke, alter, add to, or amend this Order.

1. This Order may be cited as "The Northern Rhodesia (Amendment) Order in Council, 1916," and shall be construed and read as one with the Principal Order.

2. The second Paragraph of Section 20 of the Principal Order is hereby revoked, and the following provisions are hereby substituted therefor:—

"The High Commissioner may declare when, and for what period, any police or volunteer force or any part thereof shall be employed on active service, and such force or such part thereof while so employed, together with all persons who are in the service of or followers of or who accompany any such force or such part thereof while so employed, shall be subject to such terms and regulations as the High Commissioner shall determine. Any police force shall be liable for service in any place in South Africa either within or without the limits of this Order."

3. This Order shall be deemed for all purposes to have commenced and come into operation on the 4th day of August, 1914, and shall be published in the Gazette, and the High Commissioner shall give directions for the publication of this Order at such places, and in such manner, and for such time or times, as he thinks proper for giving due publicity thereto.

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction annuities awarded with the Naval Conspicuous Gallantry Medal being retained by Seamen and Royal Marines who are promoted to permanent or temporary Commissioned Rank (other than that of Quartermaster in the Royal Marines).

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals." His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

"And whereas by an Order in Council of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, bearing date the 20th April, 1880, the scale of salary of the Superintendent of the Royal Hospital School at Greenwich was fixed at  $\pounds400$  rising by  $\pounds25$ annually to  $\pounds500$  a year, with residence:

"And whereas we are of opinion that it is desirable that this scale of salary should now be revised:

be revised: "We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to authorize the existing maximum of the scale of salary of the Superintendent being increased from £500 to £600 rising by annual increments of £25."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

VHEREAS by the Burial Act, 1853, as amended by the Burial Act, 1900, it is provided that, in case it appear to His Majesty in Council, upon the Representation of the Local Government Board, that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new Burial Ground in any City or Town, or within any other limits, save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, should be prohibited, or that Burials in any City or Town, or within any other limits, or in any Burial Grounds or Places of Burial, should be wholly discontinued, or should be discontinued subject to any exception or qualification, it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order that no new Burial Ground shall be opened in such City or Town, or within such limits, without such previous approval, or (as the case may require) that after a time mentioned in the Order, Burials in such City or Town, or within such limits, or in such Burial Grounds or Places of Burial, shall be discontinued wholly, or subject to any exceptions or qualifications mentioned in such Order, and so from time to time as circumstances may require: Provided always that Notice of such Representation, and of the time when it shall please His Majesty to order the same to be taken into consideration by the Privy Council, shall be published in the London Gazette, and shall be affixed on the doors of the Churches or Chapels of, or on some other conspicuous places within, the Parishes affected by such Representation, one month before such Representation is so considered : Provided also that no such Representation shall be made in relation to the Burial Ground of any Parish until 10 days' previous Notice of the intention to make such Representation shall have been given to the Incumbent and the Vestry Clerk or Churchwardens of such Parish:

And whereas the Local Government Board, after giving to the Incumbent and the Churchwardens of the Parish of Ruthin St. Peter with Llanrhydd St. Meugan, in the County of Denbigh, 10 days' previous Notice of their intention in that behalf, have made a Representation to His Majesty in Council that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new Burial Ground in the Civil Parish of Llanrhydd Rural, in the County of Denbigh, save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, should be prohibited, and that Burials should be discontinued therein as hereinafter directed:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased, by His Order in Council of the 10th day of May, 1916, to give Notice of such Representation, and to order that the same should be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on the 21st day of June, 1916, and such Order has been published in the London Gazette, and copies thereof have been affixed, as required by the said Act:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that no new Burial Ground shall be opened in the said Civil Parish save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, and that Burials shall be discontinued therein as follows, viz.:--

His Majesty the KING has been graciously pleased to award the Edward Medal of the first class to James Burt and Arthur Frankland, also the Edward Medal of the second class to Duncan McPolland on account of their gallant conduct on the occasion of an explosion which occurred at the works of the Nobel Explosive Co., Ardeer, on the 30th July, 1915;

Also the Edward Medal of the second class to Arthur Woodhouse and Joseph Peat, miners at the Wood Lane Colliery, Hill Top, Horsley, near Derby, under the following circumstances :

On the 24th December, 1915, John Orrill, the Manager of the Wood Lane Colliery, ordered a man named David Aldread to fetch a shovel from a point some 200 yards distant. As Aldread did not return Orrill ordered another man, William Peat, to fetch an electric lamp from the surface and search for Aldread, and meanwhile Orrill himself went in search of the missing man. On his return with the lamp, William Peat followed Orrill and found both Orrill and Aldread lying unconscious on the ground, while he himself was nearly overcome by black-damp. He at once summoned help, and guided his son, Joseph Peat, and Arthur Woodhouse to a spot about 12 yards

distant from the bodies. By this time the air was so bad that a flame would not burn, and the only light by which the men could work was an electric hand lamp of one candle power. In spite of the difficulty and danger, Woodhouse and Peat by successive rushes forward over an obstacle created by a fall of roof, into an atmosphere fatal to life, succeeded in attaching their belts round the bodies, first of Orrill and then of Aldread, fastening a long strap from some adjacent machinery to the belts and pulling them out over the fall. Had either man stumbled or fallen when near the bodies the result would in all probability have been fatal. The rescue lasted from 60 to 90 minutes. Both Orrill and Aldread were dead when their bodies were recovered, but the unfortunate result does not detract from the bravery of the rescuers.

Also the Edward Medal of the second class to Frederick George Stephens, Under Manager of the Aberaman Colliery, under the following circumstances:

On the 10th September, 1915, a fireman of the Aberaman Colliery, on examining the pit at noon, found some timbers breaking, owing to roof weighting, and instructed a workman named Gamble to set props beneath the collars of the timbers. As Gamble was approaching the spot six pairs of timbers gave way causing a heavy fall (about 16 tons) of roof and sides, by which Gamble was caught. He was buried by about four feet of rubbish, his head and feet pinned tight; but his body protected by some fallen timber. Efforts were made to get him free, but were frustrated by the further falls, which were continually taking place. Stephens, the Under Manager, arrived about half an hour after the accident, by which time the roof and one side had become so dangerous that no one would venture near Gamble in spite of his cries for help. Stephens, however, immediately placed himself over Gamble, so as to protect him and called for volunteers. Four men responded and, under Stephens' instructions, began to pull down the overhanging stones, which Stephens, who is a strong man, diverted from falling on to Gamble, and by so doing was himself injured. After two hours' exertion Stephens succeeded in freeing Gamble, whose injuries, though not very serious, incapacitated him for two months from work. There can be little doubt that, had not Stephens been able to divert the falling stones, Gamble would have been in great danger of being crushed or suffocated, and it was Stephens' example which prompted the other men to renew their attempt at rescue, from which they had desisted owing to the danger of falling stones.

Also the Edward Medal of the second class to Harold Gregory, Under Manager, Charles Benjamin Franklin, Day Deputy, Charles William Hudson, Contractor, Edward Nurse, Stallman, and Thomas Smith, Stallman, employed at the Ireland Colliery, Stavely, Derbyshire, under the following circumstances:

On the 28th February, 1916, at 7 a.m., a fall of roof occurred at the Ireland Colliery, by which a filler named John William Fieldsend was imprisoned. Gregory, Franklin, Hudson, Nurse and Smith at once set to work to open a passage through the fallen roof in order to rescue their fellow workman. The roof was everywhere very uneasy and a further fall was liable to occur at any moment. Owing to the narrowness of the place, only one man could work at the head of the passage (the

four, one behind the other, passed out the material removed, the men taking by turns the post of danger. After about three hours' work, at 10 a.m. a further fall occurred, closing the passage which had been made for three yards. Fortunately the workers escaped without injury. Work was at once resumed, and Fieldsend was reached. As soon, however, as an attempt was made to remove him from under a piece of timber, by which he was pinned down, a third fall occurred, blocking up the passage for about four yards, and displacing much of the timber which had been used to prop up the roof and walls of the pas-sage as it was made. Finally, at 5 p.m., after ten hours' continuous work, Fieldsend was reached and taken out of the pit. He was not much injured. All five men ran continuous risk, during the whole ten hours, of serious injury or death from falls of roof.

## DEFENCE OF THE REALM (LIQUOR CONTROL).

GENERAL ORDER OF THE CENTRAL CONTROL BOARD (LIQUOR TRAFFIC) RELATING TO NEW EXCISE LICENCES.

Any person contravening any provision of this Order or of the Liquor Control Regulations is liable to imprisonment for six months with hard labour and a fine of £100.

We, the Central Control Board (Liquor Traffic), in pursuance of the powers conferred upon us by the Acts and Regulations relating to the Defence of the Realm, hereby make the following General Order:—

## Areas to which the Order Applies.

.(1) This Order shall apply to all areas to which the Defence of the Realm (Liquor Control) Regulations, 1915, have been applied.

### Restrictions on the Sale of Intoxicating Liquor Under New Excise Licences.

(2) No person shall, except with the written authority of the Central Control Board (Liquor Traffic) and in accordance with the terms and conditions subject to which such authority may be granted, either by himself or by any servant or agent, sell or supply in any premises any intoxicating liquor under an excise licence granted in respect of such premises on or after the first day of July, 1916, unless an excise licence authorising such sale was in force in respect of such premises on the 30th day of June, 1916.

Provided always that nothing in this Article shall be deemed to affect the sale of intoxicating liquor under—

(a) An excise licence granted on the authority of a Justices' licence, or of a certificate as defined in Part VII of the Licensing (Scotland) Act, 1903; or
(b) An excise licence granted to any

(b) An excise licence granted to any person holding a canteen under the authority of a Secretary of State or of the Admiralty; or

(c) A manufacturer's licence.

(3) In the application of this Order to any area or part of an area in Scotland the Order shall be read as if the expression "exciseable liquor" were substituted for the expression " intoxicating liquor."

DEFENCE OF THE REALM (CONSOLI-DATION) REGULATIONS, 1914.

## SHIPS' LIGHTS.

The Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty hereby make the following Order under the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914 :-

1. Anchor Lights .- No electrically-lit lanterns shall be employed as anchor lights. The normal brilliancy of all other anchor lanterns shall be reduced by 50 per cent.

All anchor lanterns are to be fitted with overhead screens, so arranged as to cut off the light at an angle of between 20 and 25 degrees above the horizontal.

Note.--Specimen screens can be viewed at: The Board of Trade Surveyor's Offices at Leith, North Shields, Hull, London, Plymouth, Cardiff, Liverpool, Glasgow, and Dublin.)

2. Bow and Masthead Steaming Lights .-Vessels in estuaries and harbours where navigation in the dark hours is permitted shall not employ electrically-lit lanterns as Bow or Steaming lights.

3. Other Lights .- No light, either aloft, on. deck or below, except those required by the Regulations for the Prevention of Collisions at Sea, and such as may be necessary for authorised signalling purposes, shall be permitted to be visible from outboard. This shall apply to

all vessels whether under way or at anchor. 4. The above Orders shall apply to vessels of every description, other than H.M. Ships, in the waters of the United Kingdom except within three miles of the Irish Coast, and shall come into force forthwith, with the exception of that part which relates to the screening of anchor lights, which shall come into force four weeks after the date hereof.

Fishing and other small vessels having a draught of over eight feet are to assemble at the Pilotage stations, and will be conducted into and out of port in groups.

## I. FIRTH OF FORTH.

## Section [A].

1. All incoming merchant vessels are only permitted to enter the Firth of Forth when they have sufficient daylight to enable them to reach Inchkeith before the close of "official day," which is notified in the Public Traffic Regulations for the Firth of Forth.

2. A light-and-whistle buoy has been established in lat. 56° 09' 00" N., long. 2° 51' 00" W. The buoy is painted green, and exhibits an occulting white light every twelve seconds, thus: ---

#### Light . eclinse

#### 10 secs. 2 secs.

3. All incoming and outward bound merchant vessels are to pass within half a mile of, and to the southward of, the light-and-whistlebuoy mentioned in paragraph 2.

4. Incoming vessels must pass between the Isle of May and Anstruther Wester, thence they must steer a course so as to pass within half a mile of, and to the southward of, the light-and-whistle-buoy mentioned in paragraph 2, and thence direct for Kinghorn ness.

5. Vessels are warned that, after having entered the Firth of Forth, they must on no account pass to the southward of a line joining the north point of the Isle of May and King-horn ness, until in the longitude of 3° West, when course may be shaped for the centre of North channel.

6. On approaching Inchkeith, the pilot vessel in the North channel is to be closed and a pilot embarked.

7. Merchant vessels approaching the Firth of Forth from the southward are permitted to keep close to the shore until Barns ness is reached, when course should be shaped for the Isle of May, so as to pass between the Isle of May and Anstruther Wester.

8. No merchant or fishing vessel is permitted to enter the Firth of Forth between the Isle of May and the south shore of the Forth

9. Merchant vessels approaching the Firth of Forth during the hours of darkness are to maintain a steady course and speed, and are to so arrange their speed that they shall not reach the Isle of May before daylight and thus will avoid having to reduce speed or stop in the vicinity of the Isle of May, where they may render themselves liable to be fired upon by shore batteries or patrol vessels.

10. No merchant vessel is permitted to be at an anchorage, during "official night," west of a line drawn from Barns ness to North Carr rock, and east of Inchkeith, unless such vessel has been granted permission by the King's Harbour Master, Rosyth, or unless such vessel is directed to anchor by the orders of a naval patrol vessel.

11. The above orders apply to vessels proceeding to any port in the Firth of Forth, whether to the eastward of Inchkeith or not.

12. Outward bound vessels must steer to pass the longitude of  $3^{\circ}$  W. in latitude  $56^{\circ}$  06' 30''N., thence shape course to pass within half a mile of, and to the southward of, the lightand-whistle-buoy mentioned in paragraph 2, and thence between Anstruther Wester and the Isle of May.

## Section [B].

1. Until further notice no merchant vessel is permitted to be under way in the Firth of Forth to the westward of Inchkeith during the hours of "official night."

2. No merchant vessel is permitted to enter or leave the docks at Leith or Granton during the hours of "official night."

3. No light on board any merchant vessel in the Firth of Forth is to be visible from out-board during the hours of "official night," other than regulation riding lights, which are provided for in paragraph 5 below.

All scuttles and skylights are to be effectively screened, or cabin lights kept extinguished.

4. No merchant vessel whilst lying at anchor to the westward of Inchkeith shall exhibit. riding lights except as provided for in para-graph 5 below. Every such vessel shall, however, keep trimmed and screened—ready for exhibiting-the regulation riding lights, and such lights shall be quickly accessible when required.

5. Riding lights are only to be shown by merchant vessels anchored west of Inchkeith

when the night signal for "Port Open" (three white lights vertical) is shown by the Examination vessel in Leith roads.

The Examination vessel will only show this signal on occasions when it is considered necessary by the Deputy Examining Officer.

6. Merchant vessels at anchor to the westward of Inchkeith are to keep a smart look out, and when the night signal for "Port Open" is shown by the Examination vessel in Leith roads, are to immediately display the regulation riding lights of a ship at anchor.

7. Merchant vessels berthed in Leith and Granton docks and harbours are prohibited from having any lights visible from outboard during the hours of "official night," unless such vessel is actually engaged in working cargo. All such lights are to be screened from overhead and from seaward when possible.

## II. MORAY FIRTH.

1. All vessels bound to Cromarty or Inverness must call for a pilot at Wick or Burghead.

Outgoing vessels are to discharge their pilots at one or the other of these places.

2. It is dangerous for any vessel to be under way to the south-westward of a line joining Findhorn and Tarbet ness without a pilot.

3. No vessels of any description other than H.M. Ships and Auxiliaries are to be under way between sunset and sunrise in the waters contained between a line drawn from Tarbet ness to Findhorn, and a line drawn from Fort George to Chanonry point.

#### III. SCAPA FLOW.

1. All entrances are dangerous and entry is absolutely prohibited by any of them except as provided in succeeding paragraphs.

2. Examination services have been established in the entrances to Hoxa and Hoy sounds; vessels directed to enter must communicate with the Examination vessel and follow the instructions received from her very carefully.

3. No vessel is permitted to approach the entrance to Hoxa sound within a radius of 5 miles under any circumstances whatever, except when actually ordered to Scapa Flow. Vessels ordered to Kirkwall should proceed direct to that port.

4. The only vessels permitted to enter Hoy sound from the westward are those ordered to Stromness.

5. Vessels are not permitted to enter Hoxa or Hoy sounds by night or in thick weather.

6. Passage through Cantick sound is entirely prohibited.

This Notice is a repetition of Notice No. 635 of 1916, with an amendment to Section [B], Part III., paragraph 5.
