The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council, dated the 20th day of August, 1914, His Majesty was pleased to declare that during the present hostilities the provisions of the Declaration of London should, subject to certain additions and modifications therein specified, be adopted and put in force by His Majesty's Government:

And whereas the said Declaration was adopted as aforementioned in common with His Majesty's Allies:

And whereas it has been necessary for His Majesty and for His Allies from time to time to issue further enactments modifying the application of the articles of the said Declaration:

And whereas Orders in Council for this purpose have been issued by His Majesty on the 29th day of October, 1914, the 20th day of October, 1915, and the 30th day of March, 1916:

And whereas the issue of these successive Orders in Council may have given rise to some doubt as to the intention of His Majesty, as also as to that of His Allies, to act in strict accordance with the law of nations, and it is therefore expedient to withdraw the said Orders so far as they are now in force: Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Declaration of London Order in Council No. 2, 1914, and all Orders subsequent thereto amending the said Order are hereby withdrawn;

And His Majesty is pleased further to declare, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and it is hereby declared, that it is and always has been His intention, as it is and has been that of His Allies, to exercise their belligerent rights at sea in strict accordance with the law of nations;

And whereas on account of the changed conditions of commerce and the diversity of practice doubts might arise in certain matters as to the rules which His Majesty and His Allies regard as being in conformity with the law of nations, and it is expedient to deal with such matters specifically;

It is hereby ordered that the following provisions shall be observed :---

(a) The hostile destination required for the condemnation of contraband articles shall be presumed to exist, until the contrary is shown, if the goods are consigned to or for an enemy authority, or an agent of the enemy State, or to or for a person in territory belonging to or occupied by the enemy, or to or for a person who, during the present hostilities, has forwarded contraband goods to an enemy authority, or an agent of the enemy State, or to or for a person in territory belonging to or occupied by the enemy, or if the goods are consigned "to order," or if the ship's papers do not show who is the real consignee of the goods.

(b) The principle of continuous voyage or ultimate destination shall be applicable both in cases of contraband and of blockade.

(c) A neutral vessel carrying contraband with papers indicating a neutral destination, which, notwithstanding the destination shown on the papers, proceeds to an enemy port, shall be liable to capture and condemnation if she is encountered before the end of her next voyage.

(d) A vessel carrying contraband shall be liable to capture and condemnation if the contraband, reckoned either by value, weight, volume, or freight forms more than half the cargo.

And it is hereby further ordered as follows:----

(i) Nothing herein shall be deemed to affect the Order in Council of the 11th March, 1915, for restricting further the commerce of the enemy, or any of His Majesty's Proclamations declaring articles to be contraband of war during the present hostilities.

(ii) Nothing herein shall affect the validity of anything done under the Orders in Council hereby withdrawn.

(iii) Any cause or proceeding commenced in any Prize Court before the making of this Order may, if the Court thinks just, be heard and decided under the provisions of the Orders hereby withdrawn so far as they were in force at the date when such cause or proceeding was commenced, or would have been applicable in such cause or proceeding if this Order had not been made.

This Order may be cited as "The Maritime Rights Order in Council, 1916."

And the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and each of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, the President of the Probate, Divorce, and Admiralty Division of the High Court of Justice, all other Judges of His Majesty's Prize Courts, and all Governors, Officers, and Authorities whom it may concern, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

W HEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 5th day of July, 1916, in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas the Army Council are empowered to grant a temporary allowance to invalided soldiers pending settlement of claim to pension, at the rate of 20s. a week for men in respect of whom separation allowance dependants allowance, or family allowance, was issuable up to the date of discharge, and 10s. a week for other men:

"And whereas the conditions and circumstances necessitating the institution of these allowances obtain equally in the case of invalided sailors and marines:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to authorize us to pay, as from 29th June, 1916, to Seamen, Marines, or Reservists, discharged as no longer medically fit for service, allowances pending settlement of claim for pension at the same rates, under the same conditions, and subject to the same restrictions, as apply in the case of men invalided from the Army.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

And whereas by the Isle of Man (War Legislation) Act, 1914, His Majesty has power to extend to the Isle of Man any Act which, in the opinion of His Majesty, was passed for the purpose of meeting any emergency created by the present War, subject to adaptations for the purpose of making the Act applicable to the Isle of Man:

And whereas the said Act has been extended to the Isle of Man by Order in Council of the 29th day of February, 1916, subject to the adaptations therein contained :

And whereas by Order in Council of the 30th day of March, 1916, His Majesty was pleased to order that the Regulations contained in the said Military Service (Regulations) Order, 1916, should be the Regulations made under the powers contained in Paragraph 5 of the Second Schedule to the Military Service (Isle of Man) Act, 1916, subject to the modifications therein contained :

And whereas the Military Service (Regulations) Order, 1916, has been rescinded by Order in Council of the 1st day of June, 1916, and further and other Regulations have been made as therein provided, called "The Mili-Service Regulations (Amendment) tary Order, 1916 ":

And whereas it is desirable to rescind the Regulations made by the Order in Council of the 30th day of March, 1916, and to make further and other Regulations as hereinafter provided:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice and consent of His Privy Council, to rescind the Regulations heretofore made under the Military Service (Isle of Man) Act, 1916, and to order that the Regulations contained in the said Military Service Regu-lations (Amendment) Order, 1916, shall be the Regulations made under the powers contained in Paragraph 5 of the Second Schedule to the Military Service (Isle of Man) Act,

ing definitions shall be substituted :----

"The Acts" means "the Military Service (Isle of Man) Acts, 1916.

"The Principal Act " means " the Mili-

tary Service (Isle of Man) Act, 1916." "The Amending Act" means "the Military Service (Isle of Man) Act, 1916, No. 2.'

2. For the words "Local Government Board," wherever the same occur, there shall be substituted the words "Lieutenantbe substituted the Governor."

3. For Paragraphs 1 and 2 of Section 1 of Part 1, the following provision shall be substituted :-

"1. The House of Keys may from time to time appoint such additional members of the Local Tribunal, as in the opinion of the House of Keys may be necessary, so, however, that there shall not at any time be more than twenty-five members.

"The House of Keys may also fill casual vacancies on the Tribunal, and in any case in which they are of opinion that it is desirable in order to secure the due administration of the Acts so to do, the House of Keys

may revoke the appointment of any member. "2. In the appointment of members of the Local Tribunal, the House of Keys shall provide for the adequate representation of labour.

4. After the words "Munitions of War Act, 1915 " wherever the same occur there shall be read the words " (being an Act of the Imperial Parliament).".

And whereas the said Act has been extended to the Isle of Man by Order in Council of the 27th day of June, 1916, subject to the adaptations therein contained :

And whereas by Section 7 of the Military Service (Isle of Man) Act, 1916, No. 2, His Majesty may, by Order in Council, make Regulations with respect to the establishment of Professional Committees to deal with claims for exemption made by duly qualified Medical Practitioners, and with respect to the reference to such Committees of applications by duly qualified Medical Practitioners for certificates of exemption :

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order that the Regulations contained in the said Military Service (Professional Committees Regulations) Order, 1916, shall be the Regu-lations made under the powers contained in Section 7 of the Military Service (Isle of Man) Act. 1916, No. 2, subject to the following modifications:

In the heading to the Schedule after the words "Military Service" there shall be read the words " (Isle of Man)."

For sub-paragraph (1) of Paragraph 1, the following provision shall be substituted :-

"1.-(1) Subject as hereina/ter provided, there shall be a Central Professional Committee for the Isle of Man: and the Central Professional Committee for England and Wales, constituted under the said Military Service (Professional Committees Regulations) Order, 1916, shall be the Central Professional Committee for the Isle of Man for the purposes of these Regulations, to which all applications for certificates of exemption made to a Tribunal in the Isle of Man by or in respect of Practitioners on any ground other than that of conscientious objection shall be referred by the Tribunal to which such applications are made."

In sub-paragraph (1) of Paragraph 5, for

the words "Administrative County of London" there shall be substituted the words "Isle of Man," and for the words "England or Wales" there shall be substituted the words "The Isle of Man."

In the Regulations of the 23rd day of May, 1916: In Regulation 1 for the expression "appropriate Government Department" there shall be substituted the words "the Lieutenant-Governor."

After the words "United Kingdom" throughout such Regulations shall be read "or the Isle of Man."

W HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, and of the Act of the 17th and 18th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 84, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 18th day of May, in the year 1916, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, and of the Act of the 17th and 18th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 84, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for apportioning the incomes of the Benefices of Saint Peter upon Cornhill, Saint Bartholomew, Bethnal Green, Saint Peter, Bethnal Green, and Saint Mark, Clerkenwell, all in the County of Middlesex, and in the Diocese of London, and the Benefice of Saint Mark, Victoria Docks, in the County of Essex, and in the Diocese of Chelmsford, between those Benefices and two other Benefices, namely, the Benefice of Saint Oswald, Fulham, in the said County of Middlesex, and in the said Diocese of London, and the Benefice of Saint Cyprian, Brockley, in the County of Kent, and in the Diocese of Southwark:

"Whereas the Mayor and Commonalty and Citizens of the City of London (herein-after referred to as 'the Corporation of London') are the Patrons of the said Benefices of Saint Peter upon Cornhill, Saint Bartholomew, Bethnal Green, Saint Peter, Bethnal Green, Saint Mark, Clerkenwell, and Saint Mark, Victoria Docks, and are also the Patrons of the said Benefices of Saint Oswald, Fulham, and Saint Cyprian, Brockley:

"And whereas the permanent annual income of the said Benefice of Saint Peter upon Cornhill was formerly derived partly from tithe-rent-charge and partly from the rents of certain messuages or tenements now known as Numbers 51, 52 and 53, Cornhill, in the City of London, and certain messuages or tenements now known as Numbers 1 and 2, St. Peter's Alley, in the City of London, which last-mentioned messuages or tenements are situate upon the site of the former Rectory House and garden belonging to the Benefice:

"And whereas the endowments of the said Benefice of Saint Peter upon Cornhill, under and by virtue of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council, made on the 9th day of August, in the year 1866, and published in the London Gazette on the 10th day of the same month, are charged with a clear yearly sum of £300, which charge was originally created in favour of the Rectory of Saint James, Duke's Place, within the City and Diocese of London, and is now payable to the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Saint Catherine Cree with Saint James, Duke's Place:

"And whereas by virtue of another Order of Her said late Majesty in Council, made on the 5th day of March, in the year 1885, and published in the London Gazette on the 10th day of the same month, it was provided that the surplus of the net annual rents derived from or in respect of the messuages or tenements then known as Number 52, Cornhill, but now known as Numbers 51, 52 and 53, Cornhill, which shall remain after deducting therefrom each year the annual sum of £300 to answer the annual sum of that amount charged by the herein-before recited Order in Council of the 9th day of August, in the year 1866, (which annual sum was, as between the several endowments of the said Benefice of Saint Peter upon Cornhill, but without prejudice to the rights of the Incumbent for the time being entitled to such annual sum, made payable primarily out of the annual rents of the last-mentioned messuages or tenements in exoneration of the other endowments of the said Benefice of Saint Peter upon Cornhill), and after also deducting therefrom any costs or expenses in respect of the recovery of rent or the management or letting of or otherwise in respect of the same messuages or tenements which the said Rector for the time being might as legal landlord thereof incur, should be divisible between the Rector or Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Saint Peter upon Cornhill and the Vicars or Incumbents respectively for the time being of the said Benefices of Saint Bartholomew, Bethnal Green, Saint Peter, Bethnal Green, Saint Mark, Clerkenwell, and Saint Mark, Victoria Docks, in equal fifth shares, and that the said

messuages or tenements should remain vested in, and the whole of the said rents in respect thereof should continue to be receivable and recoverable by, the Rector or Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Saint Peter upon Cornhill, and in the event of any question arising between the Rector of the said Benefice and the Incumbents or any of them of the other four Benefices whose Income was thereby augmented as to any such costs and expenses and otherwise as to the actual sum to be divided as aforesaid the same should be finally determined by the Recorder for the time being of the City of London, or, in the event of that Office being vacant, by the Com-mon Serjeant of the said City on the application of any one of the Incumbents:

"And whereas the rent which is receivable in respect of the said messuages or tenements now known as Numbers 51, 52 and 53, Corn-hill, has been increased, as from the 25th day of December, in the year 1914, by an annual sum of £920 as compared with the rent receivable in respect of the same premises at the time of the said Order in Council apportioning the said rent in favour of the said four Benefices of Saint Bartholomew, Bethnal Green, Saint Peter, Bethnal Green, Saint Mark, Clerkenwell, and Saint Mark, Victoria Docks, and in consequence of this circumstance the endowments now enjoyed by the Rector of the said Benefice of Saint Peter upon Cornhill, notwithstanding the aforesaid charges, and the endowments of the said four Benefices of Saint Bartholomew, Bethnal Green, Saint Peter, Bethnal Green, Saint Mark, Clerkenwell, and Saint Mark, Victoria Docks, are of such an amount that, in the opinion of us, and in the opinion of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, in the opinion of the Right Reverend John Edwin, Bishop of Chelmsford, in the opinion of the Right Reverend Hubert Murray, Bishop of Southwark, and in the opinion of the Corporation of London, the further apportionment of the same endowments which is herein-after recommended and proposed may properly be made:

"And whereas the said Benefices of Saint Oswald, Fulham, and Saint Cyprian, Brockley, are insufficiently endowed:

"And whereas the said Benefices of Saint Peter upon Cornhill, Saint Bartholomew, Bethnal Green, Saint Peter, Bethnal Green, Saint Mark, Clerkenwell, and Saint Mark, Victoria Docks, are now full, the present Vicar or Incumbent of the Benefice of Saint Mark, Clerkenwell, being the Reverend Frank Stenton Eardley:

"And whereas it has been proposed to us by the Corporation of London that a reapportionment of the surplus rent arising from the messuages or tenements known as Numbers 51, 52 and 53, Cornhill, and now forming part of the endowments of the said Benefices of Saint Peter upon Cornhill, Saint Bartholomew, Bethnal Green, Saint Peter, Bethnal Green, Saint Mark, Clerkenwell, and Saint Mark, Victoria Docks, should be made in the manner which is herein-after recommended and proposed:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, and of the said John Edwin, Bishop of Chelmsford, and of the said Hubert Murray, Bishop of Southwark, (in testimony whereof they have severally signed this Scheme, and sealed the same with their Episcopal Seals), and with the (consent of the Corporation of London (in testimony whereof the same Corporation has caused its Common or Corporate Seal to be affixed to this Scheme) and with the consent of the said Frank Stenton Eardley (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose

"(1) That as from the 25th day of March, in the year 1915, the one-fifth share of the surplus of the net annual rents to be as from that day derived from or in respect of the said messuages or tenements Numbers 51, 52 and 53, Cornhill, which under the provisions of the said Order in Council of the 5th day of March, in the year 1885, is receivable by the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Saint Mark, Clerkenwell, as aforesaid, shall be reduced to a sixth share of the surplus of the said net annual rents, and that as from the same date a sixtieth share of the same surplus of the net annual rents of the said Benefices of Saint Oswald, Fulham, and Saint Cyprian, Brockley, and

(2) That as from the date on which each of the said Benefices of Saint Peter upon Cornhill, Saint Bartholomew, Bethnal Green, Saint Peter, Bethnal Green, and Saint Mark, Victoria Docks, shall next be vacated the one-fifth share of the surplus of the net annual rents to be as from that day derived from or in respect of the said messuages or tenements which under the provisions of the said Order in Council is receivable by the Incumbent of such Benefice shall similarly be reduced to a sixth share of the surplus of the said net annual rents, and the share of the surplus of the same net annual rents receivable by each of the Incumbents of the said Benefices of Saint Oswald, Fulham, and Saint Cyprian, Brockley, shall be increased by a sixtieth part of the surplus of the same net annual rents.

"Provided always that the provisions made in the said Order in Council of the 5th day of March, in the year 1885, as to the vesting of the said messuages or tenements, and as to the final determination of the actual sum to be divided as aforesaid, and as to the payment and the apportionment of the said rents, shall remain unaffected by anything herein contained except in so far as to make those provisions applicable, and those provisions shall accordingly apply to the new apportionment of the said rents which is herein recommended and proposed.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"All which we humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the respective Registrars of the said Dioceses of London, Chelmsford, and Southwark.

Notice is hereby given, pursuant to the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that the Rule Committee of the Supreme Court propose to make the following Rules:—

1. The following sub-head shall be added to Order XI, Rule 1:---

(h) The action is by a mortgagee or mortgagor in relation to a mortgage of personal property situate within the jurisdiction and seeks relief of the nature or kind following, that is to say, sale, foreclosure, delivery of possession by the mortgagor, redemption, reconveyance, delivery of possession by the mortgagee; but does not seek (unless and except so far as permissible under Sub-head (e) of this Rule) any personal judgment or order for payment of any moneys due under \cdot the mortgage.

In this sub-head the expression personal property situate within the jurisdiction means personal property which, on the death of an owner thereof intestate, would form subject-matter for the grant of letters of administration to his estate out of the Principal Probate Registry; the expression mortgage means a mortgage charge or lien of any description; the expression mortgagee means a party for the time being entitled to or interested in a mortgage; and the expression mortgagor means a party for the time being entitled to or interested in property subject to a mortgage.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 10TH JULY 1916.)

SHEEP-DIPPING (DEVON) ORDER OF · 1916.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Prohibition of Movement of Undipped Sheep out of Dartmoor District from 25th July to 31st October.

1.—(1.) Sheep shall not, during the period in each year commencing on the twenty-fifth day of July and terminating on the thirty-first day of October, (a) be moved from any moor, common, or unenclosed land on which more than one person is entitled to turn out sheep, which lies within the Area described in the First Schedule hereto to any enclosed land within such Area, or (b) be moved out of the said Area, unless the sheep are accompanied by a licence authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the county of Devon.

(2.) Unless the Inspector is satisfied-

(a) by the production of a declaration signed by the owner of the sheep, or his agent authorised in writing for the purpose, that the sheep to be moved have not been on any moor, common, or unenclosed land referred to in the preceding paragraph during the said period; or

(b) that the sheep are to be moved direct to a slaughterhouse;

a licence for movement under this Article shall, subject as hereinafter provided, be granted only for sheep in respect of which the Inspector is satisfied that they have within twenty-eight days before the licence is granted been dipped twice, with an interval of not less than seven and not more than fourteen days between the dippings, by a thorough immersion in a sheep dip approved by the Board for sheep-scab or purporting to be so approved, and have since the second dipping been kept separate from other sheep not so dipped.

(3.) Sheep moved under a licence granted under this Article to a slaughter-house shall after their arrival thereat be there detained until they are slaughtered.

(4:) A copy of a licence under this Article authorising movement of sheep to a slaughter-house shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the Local Authority of the District in which the slaughter-house is situate.

Movement to Dipping Places.

2. In any case in which the dipping of sheep on any moor, common, or unenclosed land, required as a condition precedent to the granting of a licence under the preceding Article, is, in the opinion of an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District, impracticable, a licence authorising movement of the sheep may be granted without the sheep being previously dipped, but subject to the following conditions, which shall be specified in the licence :---

(a) During the movement to the premises specified in the licence and until they have been twice dipped in the manner prescribed by the preceding Article, the sheep shall be kept separate from all other sheep; and

(b) the sheep shall be detained on the said premises until they have been so dipped.

Prohibition of Movement of Undipped Sheep into Dartmoor District from 25th July to 30th November.

3. Sheep shall not, during the period in each year commencing on the twenty-fifth day of

July and terminating on the thirtieth day of November, be moved into the Area described in the First Schedule hereto from any place outside the Area, unless they are accompanied by a licence authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the county of Devon, either—

(a) upon production to the Inspector of a declaration signed by the owner of the sheep or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, that the sheep to be moved have been dipped twice within twenty-eight days before the licence is granted, with an interval of not less than seven and not more than fourteen days between the dippings, by a thorough immersion in a sheep dip approved by the Board for sheep-scab or purporting to be so approved, and have since the second dipping been kept separate from other sheep not so dipped; or

(b) where the place of destination is not a moor, common or unenclosed land on which more than one person is entitled to turn out sheep, then subject to the condition, which shall be specified in the licence, that the sheep shall, after arrival at the place of destination specified in the licence, be there detained and kept separate from all other sheep until they have been dipped twice, with an interval of not less than seven and not more than fourteen days between the dippings, in the manner prescribed in the preceding paragraph (a) of this Article, or until the sheep are moved from such place of destination to a slaughter-house under the authority of a licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the county of Devon, where they shall be detained until they are slaughtered.

Licences.

4. A licence under this Order shall be in force for eight days, inclusive of the day of issue, and shall be in the form set forth in the Second Schedule to this Order or to the like effect.

Provision for Movement through Area by Railway.

5. For the purposes of this Order, sheep shall not be deemed to be moved out of, or into, the Area described in the First Schedule hereto in any case where they are moved through such Area by railway from a place outside such Area to another place outside such Area without unnecessary delay and without the sheep being untrucked within such Area.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

6.—(1.) Any person in charge of a sheep being moved, where under this Order a Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, authorising the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

7. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

8.-(1.) If a sheep is moved in contravention of this Order, or of a Licence granted thereunder, the owner of the sheep, and the person in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the sheep, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the sheep is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894

(2.) If a person in charge of a sheep being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(3.) If a sheep is not isolated as required by this Order, the owner of the sheep, and the person in charge thereof, and the occupier of the place where the sheep is detained, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.
