DEFENCE OF THE REALM REGULATIONS.

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by Regulation 8z of the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, the Minister of Munitions hereby orders as follows:—

On and after the twentieth day of July, 1916, no person shall without license from the

Minister of Munitions commence or carry on any building or construction work, that is to say the construction alteration repair decoration or demolition of buildings or the construction reconstruction or alteration of railroads docks harbours canals embankments bridges tunnels piers or other works of construction or engineering. Provided that where the total cost of the whole completed work in contemplation does not exceed the sum of £500 and
