WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 13th day of July, in the year 1916, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now

humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called ‘ the said Benefice ’) of Avon Dassett, in the County of Warwick, and in the Diocese of Worcester :

“ Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Avon Dassett is vested for an estate in fee simple, in possession, free from incumbrances, in the Right Reverend Huyshe Wolcott, now Bishop of Worcester, in his private capacity :

“ And whereas the said Huyshe Wolcott, Bishop of Worcester, is desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Avon Dassett, now vested in him as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Worcester for the time being :

“ And whereas the said Huyshe Wolcott, Bishop of Worcester, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned in token of such his desire, and also in token of his willingness as such Bishop to accept such transfer, and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the Acts in the herein-before mentioned Act re-

cited, or by some or one of them, is made necessary:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Avon Dassett, which is herein-before mentioned, and hereinafter recommended and proposed, will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the Cure of Souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson, so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid, arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parish of Avon Dassett:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Huyshe Wolcott, Bishop of Worcester, (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Avon Dassett, now vested in him the said Huyshe Wolcott, Bishop of Worcester, in his private capacity as aforesaid, shall be transferred to himself the said Huyshe Wolcott, Bishop of Worcester, and his Successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in, and shall and may from time to time be exercised by, the said Huyshe Wolcott, Bishop of Worcester, and his Successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Worcester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of an Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 20th day of July, in the year 1916, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for

England, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for authorizing the sale and disposal of certain property in the Parish of Billingham, in the County of Durham, now vested in us:

"Whereas under and by virtue of the several Indentures, particulars whereof are set forth in the Schedule hereunder written, the lands, tenements, hereditaments, mines, and minerals, situate in the Parish of Billingham aforesaid, and particularly described in the same Indentures and Schedule, became with their appurtenances and are now vested in us:

"And whereas none of the said lands, tenements, hereditaments, mines, and minerals, are subject to any outstanding beneficial lease or grant, but are now in our possession, but some portions thereof on account of their character or situation are unsuitable or inconvenient to be held or applied for the purposes for which estates vested in us are applicable under the Acts by which our proceedings are governed:

"And whereas with a view to the advantageous appropriation of the same or of the proceeds thereof for the ultimate improvement of our common fund it is expedient that the said lands, tenements, hereditaments, mines, and minerals, or such part or parts thereof as we shall at any time and from time to time think fit, should be sold or disposed of, and accordingly that we should be empowered to sell or dispose of our interest in such lands, tenements, hereditaments, mines, and minerals, or in any part or parts thereof in such manner as shall appear to us advisable:

"Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose that we may be authorized and empowered by Instrument or Instruments in writing, duly executed according to law, from time to time to sell or dispose of and duly to convey, according to the provisions of the said Act, all or any of the said lands, tenements, hereditaments, mines, and minerals, so vested in us as aforesaid, under and by virtue of the said several Indentures, or any of them, with their appurtenances and all our estate, right, title, and interest therein, or in any part or parts thereof, unto and to the use of any person or persons desirous or willing to purchase the same, and his or their heirs, executors, administrators, or assigns, or otherwise as he or they shall direct or appoint, and for such consideration as shall upon due calculation and inquiry appear to us to be just and reasonable, it being our intention to invest the proceeds of such sale from time to time as occasion may arise, in the purchase of other lands, tithes, rent-charges, tenements, or hereditaments, or of some estate or interest therein, convenient to be held by us for the purposes of the Acts by which our proceedings are governed as aforesaid, and in the meantime to invest the said proceeds in some Government or Parliamentary Stock or other Public Securities in England.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 59th year of His late Majesty King George the Third, Chapter 134, of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 49, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Representation, bearing date the 13th day of July, in the year 1916, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 59th year of His late Majesty King George the Third, Chapter 134, of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 49, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a District Chapelry to the Consecrated Church called Christ Church, Dunkirk, situate in the Extra Parochial Place or Liberty known as the Ville of Dunkirk, in the County of Kent, and in the Diocese of Canterbury:

“Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a District Chapelry should be assigned to the said Church called Christ Church, Dunkirk, situate as aforesaid:

“Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Archbishop of Canterbury, (testified by his having signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said Extra Parochial Place or Liberty known as the Ville of Dunkirk, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the Map or Plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a District Chapelry to the said Church called Christ Church, Dunkirk, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named ‘The District Chapelry of Dunkirk.’

“And with the like consent of the said Randall Thomas, Archbishop of Canterbury,

(testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said Church called Christ Church, Dunkirk, situate as aforesaid, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns, and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices, should be paid and belong to the Minister of the same Church for the time being: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us, the said Commissioners, to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism, or for the registration thereof.

“We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal Consideration, and to make such Order with respect thereto as to Your Majesty, in Your Royal Wisdom, shall seem meet.

“The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

“The District Chapelry of Dunkirk, being:—

“All that main part of the Extra Parochial Place or Liberty called the Ville of Dunkirk, in the County of Kent, and in the Diocese of Canterbury, which is bounded upon all sides as follows, that is to say, upon the west by the Parish of Boughton under Blean, upon the north-west by the Parish of Hernhill, upon the north partly by the last-named Parish and partly by the Parish of Seasalter, upon the north-east partly by the Parish of Whitstable and partly by the Parish of Saint Cosmus and Saint Damian in the Blean, upon the south-east partly by the Parish of Saint Michael, Harbledown, and partly by the Parish of Chartham, and upon the south partly by the Parish of Chilham and partly by the Parish of Selling, all which Parishes are situate in the County and Diocese aforesaid.”

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Canterbury.
