By the Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

WHEREAS His Majesty was pleased, in exercise of the power in that behalf conferred on Him by Section one, sub-section one, of the Trading with the Enemy (Extension of Powers) Act, 1915, by a Proclamation dated the 29th day of February, 1916, to prohibit all persons or bodies of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, resident, carrying on business, or being in the United Kingdom from trading with any of the persons or bodies of persons mentioned in the List contained in the said Proclamation:

And whereas by Section one, sub-section two, of the said Act, it is provided that any List of persons and bodies of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, with whom such trading is prohibited by a Proclamation under the said Act may be varied or added to by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of a Secretary of State, such List as so varied or added to being in the said Proclamation referred to as the "Statutory List":

And whereas the List contained in the said Proclamation has been varied and added to by subsequent Orders of Council:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased by a

Proclamation, dated the 26th day of April, 1916, and entitled "The Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation, 1916, No. 2," to amend the said Proclamation dated the 29th day of February, 1916, in certain particulars:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased by a Proclamation dated the 23rd day of May, 1916, and entitled "The Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation, 1916, No. 3," to revoke the said Proclamation dated the 29th day of February, 1916, with the variations and additions made to the List therein contained by subsequent Orders of Council, and also the said Proclamation dated the 26th day of April, 1916, and to order that the Proclamation now in recital should be substituted therefor:

And whereas by subsequent Orders of Council the List contained in the aforesaid Proclamation, dated the 23rd day of May, 1916, was varied and added to:

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a recommendation from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs to the following effect:—

That the "Statutory List" of persons and bodies of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, with whom trading is prohibited, should be further amended by the variation and addition of the names set forth in the Schedule hereto.

Now, therefore, Their Lordships, having taken the said recommendation into considera-

tion, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the same be approved.

And it is further ordered that, where by this or any other Order of Council for the time being in force, whether made before or after the making of this Order, any variation in or addition to the Statutory List is made, copies of the Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation, 1916, No. 3, printed under the Authority of His Majesty's Stationery Office after such variation or addition is made may be printed with such variation in or addition to the Statutory List, and the Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation, 1916, No. 3, shall be construed as if it had, at the time at which such variation or addition was made, been issued with such variation or addition, and a reference in any Order in Council or other document to the Statutory List shall, unless the context otherwise requires, be construed to refer to that List as varied or added to by any Order of Council for the time being in force.

Whereof the Right Honourable Viscount Grey, K.G., one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, the Controller of the Foreign Trade Department, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

* NOTE (1).—Under the Trading with the Enemy Proclamations of 25 June, and 10 November, 1915, all Proclamations relating to Trading with the Enemy apply to all persons or bodies of persons of enemy nationality, resident or carrying on business in Persia, Morocco or Portuguese East Africa, and consequently it is an offence to trade with any person or body of persons of enemy nationality, resident or carrying on business in Persia, Morocco or Portuguese East Africa, even though such person or body of persons is not included by name in the above List, and the omission of

the name of any such person or body of persons from such List is not an authority or licence to trade with such person or body of persons.

NOTE (2).—Where a firm named in the List has more than one branch in the same country, all branches in that country are held to be included in the List even in cases where no address, or of several addresses one only is specifically mentioned.

NOTE (3).—The List for each country is sent by telegraph to His Majesty's Representative in that country, who will notify British Consular Officers, to whom persons abroad should apply for information as to names on the List; but firms in the United Kingdom with branches abroad are advised to furnish such branches with copies of the Statutory List. The Lists for all countries in Central and South America are also telegraphed to His Majesty's Ambassador at Washington.

The Foreign Trade Department is prepared on application to inquire of His Majesty's Representatives abroad for the names of substitutes for any firm on the Statutory List. When the applicant wishes this done by telegraph he must undertake to pay the cost of the telegraphic correspondence. A considerable amount of information is, however, already available at the Foreign Trade Department, and it is hoped that it may be possible in many cases to suggest the names of satisfactory substitutes in response to inquiries, without the necessity of referring the matter abroad. It would greatly facilitate the work of this Department if applicants in making inquiries would specify the particular trade, or trades, for which substitutes are required.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by Section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, after reciting that "Whereas in some instances Tithings, Hamlets, Chapelries, and other Places or Districts may be separated from the Parishes or Mother Churches to which they belong, with great advantage, and Places altogether extra-parochial may, in some instances, with advantage be annexed to Parishes or Districts to which they are contiguous, or be constituted Separate Parishes for ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted, "That when with respect to his own Diocese it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or when the Bishop of any Diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop, that any such Tithing, Hamlet, Chapelry, Place, or District within the Diocese of such Archbishop, or the Diocese of such Bishop, as the case may be, may be advantageously separated from any Parish or Mother Church, and either be constituted a Separate Benefice by itself or be united to any other Parish to which it may be more conveniently annexed, or to any other adjoining Tithing, Hamlet, Chapelry, Place, or District, parochial or extra-parochial, so as to form a Separate Parish or Benefice, or that any Extra-Parochial Place may with advantage be annexed to any Parish to which it is contiguous, or be constituted a Separate Parish for ecclesiastical purposes; and the said Archbishop, or Bishop, shall draw up a Scheme in

writing (the Scheme of such Bishop to be transmitted to the said Archbishop for his consideration) describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alteration may best be effected, and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction, Glebe Lands, Tithes, Rent-Charges, and other Ecclesiastical Dues, Rates and Payments, and in respect to Patronage and Rights to Pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested; and if the Patron or Patrons of the Benefice or Benefices to be affected by such alteration shall consent in writing under his or their hands to such Scheme, or to such modification thereof as the said Archbishop may approve, and the said Archbishop shall, on full consideration and inquiry, be satisfied with any such Scheme, or modification thereof, and shall certify the same and such consent as aforesaid, by his Report to His Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to make an Order for carrying such Scheme, or modification thereof, as the case may be, into effect":

And whereas the Right Reverend Edgar Charles Sumner, Lord Bishop of Gloucester, hath made a Representation in writing, dated the 17th day of January, 1916, to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, as follows:—

"I, Edgar Charles Sumner, by Divine Permission Bishop of Gloucester, do, in pursuance of the 26th Section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, hereby represent to Your Grace as follows:—

"1. There is in the City of Gloucester and within my Diocese of Gloucester the Rectory of St. Aldate, the Parish whereof contains according to the Census of 1911 a population of 451. The net annual value of this Benefice, arising from Glebe Rents, Income payable by the Ecclesiastical Commissioners or Queen Anne's Bounty, and fees and other sources, is £191 or thereabouts:

"2. There is also in the same City and within my said Diocese the Rectory of Saint John the Baptist, the Parish whereof contains according to the Census of 1911 a population of 1,893. The net annual value of this Benefice, arising from Income payable by the Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and fees and other sources, is £206 or thereabouts:

"3. There is also in the same City and within my said Diocese the Rectory of Saint Mary de Crypt with Saint Owen (herein-after called 'Saint Mary de Crypt' only), the Parish whereof contains according to the Census of 1911 a population of 824. The net annual value of this Benefice, arising from Glebe Rents, Income payable by the Ecclesiastical Commissioners or Queen Anne's Bounty, and fees and other sources, is £190 or thereabouts:

"4. There is also in the same City and in the County of Gloucester and within my said Diocese the Vicarage of Saint Mary de Lode with Holy Trinity (herein-after called 'Saint Mary de Lode' only), the Parish whereof contains according to the Census of 1911 a population of 3964. The net annual value of this Benefice, arising from Glebe Rents, Income payable by the Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and fees and other sources, is £218 or thereabouts:

"5. There is also in the same City and within my said Diocese the Rectory of Saint Michael with Saint Mary de Grace (herein-after called 'Saint Michael' only), the

Parish whereof contains according to the Census of 1911 a population of 1393. The net annual value of this Benefice, arising from Glebe Rents, Income payable by the Ecclesiastical Commissioners or Queen Anne's Bounty, and fees and other sources, is £285 or thereabouts:

"6. There is also in the same City and in the County of Gloucester and within my said Diocese the Vicarage of Saint Nicholas, the Parish whereof contains according to the Census of 1911 a population of 1973. The net annual value of this Benefice, arising from Income payable by the Ecclesiastical Commissioners or Queen Anne's Bounty, and fees and other sources, is £220 or thereabouts:

"7. A certain portion of the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode is detached from the main portion of the said Parish, is situate in the Station Road District, and adjoins the said Parish of Saint Michael, to the Church of which last-mentioned Parish it is nearer than it is to the Parish Church of Saint Mary de Lode:

"8. Another portion of the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode is detached from the main portion of the said Parish, is situate in the Bull Lane District, and adjoins the said Parish of Saint Mary de Crypt, to the Church of which it is nearer than it is to the Parish Church of Saint Mary de Lode:

"9. Another portion of the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode is detached from the main portion of the said Parish, is situate in the Berkeley Street District, and adjoins the said Parish of Saint Nicholas, to the Church of which it is nearer than it is to the Parish Church of Saint Mary de Lode:

"10. A certain portion of the said Parish of Saint Michael is detached from the main portion of the said Parish, is situate in the Cross Keys Lane District, adjoins the said Parish of Saint Mary de Crypt, and is situate a very short distance from the Church thereof:

"11. Another portion of the said Parish of Saint Michael is detached from the main portion of the said Parish, is situate in the Upper Westgate Street District, and adjoins the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode, from the Church of which it is distant about a quarter of a mile:

"12. Another portion of the said Parish of Saint Michael is detached from the main portion of the said Parish, is situate in the Saint John's Lane District, and adjoins the said Parish of Saint John the Baptist, from the Church of which it is distant about a furlong:

"13. A certain portion of the said Parish of Saint Mary de Crypt is separated by principal streets from the main portion of the said Parish, is situate in the Cross District, and adjoins the said Parish of Saint John the Baptist, from the Church of which it is distant about a furlong:

"14. A certain portion of the said Parish of Saint Michael is separated by a street from the main portion of the said Parish, is situate in the New Inn Lane District, and adjoins the said Parish of Saint Aldate, from the Church of which it is distant about a furlong:

"15. A certain portion of the said Parish of Saint John the Baptist is situate in the Saint Aldate Street District, and adjoins the said Parish of Saint Aldate, from the Church of which it is distant a few yards only:

"16. A certain portion of the said Parish of Saint Michael is situate in the Public

Library District, and adjoins the said Parish of Saint Mary de Crypt, from the Church of which it is distant about a furlong:

"17. A certain portion of the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode is situate in the Severn Meadow District, and adjoins the said Parish of Saint Nicholas, to the Church of which last-mentioned Parish it is slightly nearer than it is to the Parish Church of Saint Mary de Lode:

"18. A small portion of the said Parish of Saint Nicholas is situate in the Swan Lane District, adjoins the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode, and is about the same distance from the Parish Churches of both the said Parishes:

"19. A certain District situate in the said City of Gloucester and within my said Diocese, and known as the County Gaol District, is extra-parochial, and is contiguous to the said Parish of Saint Nicholas:

"20. It appears to me that under the provisions of the Pluralities Act, 1838, the following alterations in the contents of the above-mentioned Parishes may advantageously be made:—

(a) The separation of the Station Road District portion of the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode, referred to in the preceding paragraph numbered 7, from the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode and its annexation to the said Parish of Saint Michael.

(b) The separation of the Bull Lane District portion of the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode, referred to in the preceding paragraph numbered 8, from the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode and its annexation to the said Parish of Saint Mary de Crypt.

(c) The separation of the Berkeley Street District portion of the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode, referred to in the preceding paragraph numbered 9, from the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode and its annexation to the said Parish of Saint Nicholas.

(d) The separation of the Cross Keys Lane District portion of the said Parish of Saint Michael, referred to in the preceding paragraph numbered 10, from the said Parish of Saint Michael and its annexation to the said Parish of Saint Mary de Crypt.

(e) The separation of the Upper Westgate Street portion of the said Parish of Saint Michael, referred to in the preceding paragraph numbered 11, from the said Parish of Saint Michael and its annexation to the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode.

(f) The separation of the Saint John's Lane District portion of the said Parish of Saint Michael, referred to in the preceding paragraph numbered 12, from the said Parish of Saint Michael and its annexation to the said Parish of Saint John the Baptist.

(g) The separation of the Cross District portion of the said Parish of Saint Mary de Crypt, referred to in the preceding paragraph numbered 13, from the said Parish of Saint Mary de Crypt and its annexation to the said Parish of Saint John the Baptist.

(h) The separation of the New Inn Lane portion of the said Parish of Saint Michael, referred to in the preceding paragraph numbered 14, from the said Parish of Saint Michael and its annexation to the said Parish of Saint Aldate.

(i) The separation of the Saint Aldate

Street District portion of the said Parish of Saint John the Baptist, referred to in the preceding paragraph numbered 15, from the said Parish of Saint John the Baptist and its annexation to the said Parish of Saint Aldate.

(j) The separation of the Public Library District portion of the said Parish of Saint Michael, referred to in the preceding paragraph numbered 16, from the said Parish of Saint Michael and its annexation to the said Parish of Saint Mary de Crypt.

(k) The separation of the Severn Meadows District portion of the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode, referred to in the preceding paragraph numbered 17, from the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode and its annexation to the said Parish of Saint Nicholas.

(l) The separation of the Swan Lane District portion of the said Parish of Saint Nicholas, referred to in the preceding paragraph numbered 18, from the said Parish of Saint Nicholas and its annexation to the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode.

(m) The annexation of the extra-parochial County Gaol District, referred to in the preceding paragraph numbered 19, to the said Parish of Saint Nicholas to which it is contiguous.

" 21. The Benefice of Saint Aldate is in my patronage as Bishop of Gloucester.

The Benefice of Saint John the Baptist is in the patronage of His Majesty the King by His Lord Chancellor.

The Benefice of Saint Mary de Crypt is in the patronage of His Majesty the King by His Lord Chancellor.

The Benefice of Saint Mary de Lode is in the patronage of the Dean and Chapter of Gloucester.

The Benefice of Saint Michael is in the patronage of His Majesty the King by His Lord Chancellor.

The Benefice of Saint Nicholas is in my patronage as Bishop of Gloucester.

" 22. The Reverend Basil Edwards is the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Saint Aldate.

The Reverend Alfred Collet Eyre is the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Saint John the Baptist.

The Reverend Cecil Williams is the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Saint Mary de Crypt.

The Reverend William Christian Macklin is the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Saint Mary de Lode.

The Reverend Herbert Morris Braithwaite is the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Saint Michael.

The Rev. John James Luce is the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Saint Nicholas.

" 23. Pursuant to the directions contained in the 26th Section of the said Pluralities Act, 1838, I, the said Bishop, have drawn up a Scheme in writing annexed to this Representation describing the several Districts so as aforesaid proposed to be annexed to the said Parishes of Saint Michael, Saint Mary de Crypt, Saint Nicholas, Saint Mary de Lode, Saint John the Baptist, and Saint Aldate, and the mode in which it appears to me the alterations may best be effected and how the changes consequent thereon in respect of Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction, Glebe Lands, Tithes, Rent

Charges, and other Ecclesiastical Dues and Payments, and in respect to Patronage and Rights to Pews may be made with justice to all parties interested; And I do hereby submit the same to your Grace, together with the Consents in writing of the said Patrons and Incumbents, to the intent that if your Grace shall on full consideration and inquiry be satisfied with such Scheme you may certify the same and such consents by your Report to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

" SCHEME.

" That a District shall be separated from the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode and annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the contiguous Parish of Saint Michael. The said District is delineated and described in the Plan hereunto annexed, and therein coloured *red*, and lettered 'A,' and consists of the District known as the Station Road District.

" That a District shall be separated from the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode and annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the contiguous Parish of Saint Mary de Crypt. The said district is delineated and described in the Plan hereunto annexed, and therein coloured *red*, and lettered 'B,' and consists of the District known as the Bull Lane District.

" That a District shall be separated from the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode and annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the contiguous Parish of Saint Nicholas. The said District is delineated and described in the Plan hereunto annexed, and therein coloured *green*, and lettered 'C,' and consists of the District known as the Berkeley Street District.

" That certain portions shall be separated from the said Parish of Saint Michael and annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the contiguous Parish of Saint Mary de Crypt. The said portions (two in number) are delineated and described in the Plan hereunto annexed, and therein coloured *blue*, and lettered 'D,' and consist of the District known as the Cross Keys Lane District.

" That a District shall be separated from the said Parish of Saint Michael and annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the contiguous Parish of Saint Mary de Lode. The said District is delineated and described in the Plan hereunto annexed, and therein coloured *green*, and lettered 'E,' and consists of the District known as the Upper Westgate Street District.

" That a District shall be separated from the said Parish of Saint Michael and annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the contiguous Parish of Saint John the Baptist. The said District is delineated and described in the Plan hereunto annexed, and therein coloured *red*, and lettered 'F,' and consists of the District known as the Saint John's Lane District.

" That a District shall be separated from the said Parish of Saint Mary de Crypt and annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the contiguous Parish of Saint John the Baptist. The said District is delineated and described in the Plan hereunto annexed, and therein coloured *yellow*, and lettered 'G,' and consists of the District known as the Cross District.

" That a District shall be separated from the said Parish of Saint Michael and annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the contiguous Parish of Saint Aldate. The said District is

delineated and described in the Plan hereunto annexed, and therein coloured *green*, and lettered 'H,' and consists of the District known as the New Inn Lane District.

"That a District shall be separated from the said Parish of Saint John the Baptist and annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the contiguous Parish of Saint Aldate. The said District is delineated and described in the Plan hereunto annexed, and therein coloured *brown*, and lettered 'I,' and consists of the District known as the Saint Aldate Street District.

"That a District shall be separated from the said Parish of Saint Michael and annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the contiguous Parish of Saint Mary de Crypt. The said District is delineated and described in the Plan hereunto annexed, and therein coloured *green*, and lettered 'J,' and consists of the District known as the Public Library District.

"That a District shall be separated from the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode and annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the contiguous Parish of Saint Nicholas. The said District is delineated and described in the Plan hereunto annexed, and therein coloured *red*, and lettered 'K,' and consists of the District known as the Severn Meadows District.

"That a District shall be separated from the said Parish of Saint Nicholas and annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the contiguous Parish of Saint Mary de Lode. The said District is delineated and described in the Plan hereunto annexed, and therein coloured *blue*, and lettered 'L,' and consists of the District known as the Swan Lane District.

"That an extra-parochial District shall be annexed to the contiguous Parish of Saint Nicholas. The said District is delineated and described in the Plan hereunto annexed, and therein cross-hatched with *blue*, and lettered 'M,' and consists of the District known as the County Gaol District.

"That the respective Incumbents of the Parishes to which such several Districts shall be annexed shall have the sole and exclusive Cure of Souls within the said Districts.

"That the Parishioners of such several Districts shall be entitled to accommodation in the respective Churches of the Parishes to which the said Districts shall be annexed, and shall cease to be entitled to accommodation in the respective Churches of the Parishes from which the said Districts shall be separated, excepting nevertheless any person or persons possessing a legal right by faculty or otherwise to any pew or sitting in either of the said Parish Churches and who may not be willing to relinquish and give up the same.

"That marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials shall be solemnized and performed as follows:—

(a) For the Inhabitants of the Station Road District in the said Parish of Saint Michael.

(b) For the Inhabitants of the Bull Lane District in the said Parish of Saint Mary de Crypt.

(c) For the Inhabitants of the Berkeley Street District in the said Parish of Saint Nicholas.

(d) For the Inhabitants of the Cross Keys Lane District in the said Parish of Saint Mary de Crypt.

(e) For the Inhabitants of the Upper Westgate Street District in the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode.

(f) For the Inhabitants of the Saint John's Lane District in the said Parish of Saint John the Baptist.

(g) For the Inhabitants of the Cross District in the said Parish of Saint John the Baptist.

(h) For the Inhabitants of the New Inn Lane District in the said Parish of Saint Aldate.

(i) For the Inhabitants of the Saint Aldate Street District in the said Parish of Saint Aldate.

(j) For the Inhabitants of the Public Library District in the said Parish of Saint Mary de Crypt.

(k) For the Inhabitants of the Severn Meadows District in the said Parish of Saint Nicholas.

(l) For the Inhabitants of the Swan Lane District in the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode.

(m) For the Inhabitants of the County Gaol District in the said Parish of Saint Nicholas.

"That all fees, dues, ecclesiastical offerings and emoluments (excepting tithe rent-charge) arising from each of the Districts shall henceforth belong to the Incumbent of the Parish to which such District shall be annexed.

"That no alteration shall be made in the Patronage of the said Benefices, or either of them."

WHEREAS by Section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, after reciting that "Whereas in some instances Tithings, Hamlets, Chapelries, and other Places or Districts may be separated from the Parishes or Mother Churches to which they belong, with great advantage, and Places altogether extra-parochial may, in some instances, with advantage, be annexed to Parishes or Districts to which they are contiguous, or be constituted Separate Parishes for ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted, "That when with respect to his own Diocese it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or when the Bishop of any Diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop, that any such Tithing, Hamlet, Chapelry, Place, or District within the Diocese of such Archbishop, or the Diocese of such Bishop, as the case may be, may be advantageously separated from any Parish or Mother Church, and either be constituted a Separate Benefice by itself or be united to any other Parish to which it may be more conveniently annexed, or to any other adjoining Tithing, Hamlet, Chapelry, Place, or District, parochial or extra-parochial, so as to form a Separate Parish or Benefice, or that any Extra-Parochial Place may with advantage be annexed to any Parish to which it is contiguous, or be constituted a separate Parish for ecclesiastical purposes; and the said Archbishop, or Bishop, shall draw up a Scheme in writing (the Scheme of such Bishop to be transmitted to the said Archbishop for his consideration) describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alteration may best be effected, and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction, Glebe Lands, Tithes, Rent-Charges, and other Ecclesiastical Dues, Rates and Payments, and in respect to Patronage and Rights to Pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested; and if the Patron or Patrons of the Benefice or Benefices to be affected by such alteration shall consent in writing under his or their hands to such

Scheme, or to such modification thereof as the said Archbishop may approve, and the said Archbishop shall, on full consideration and inquiry, be satisfied with any such Scheme, or modification thereof, and shall certify the same and such consent as aforesaid, by his Report to His Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to make an Order for carrying such Scheme, or modification thereof, as the case may be, into effect."

And whereas the Right Reverend Edgar Charles Sumner, Lord Bishop of Gloucester, hath made a Representation in writing dated the 17th day of January, 1916, to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, as follows:—

"I, Edgar Charles Sumner, by Divine permission Bishop of Gloucester, do, in pursuance of the Twenty-sixth Section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, hereby represent to your Grace as follows:—

"1. There is in the City of Gloucester and County of Gloucester, and within my Diocese of Gloucester, the Vicarage of Saint Mary de Lode with Holy Trinity (herein-after called 'Saint Mary de Lode' only), the Parish whereof contains according to the Census of 1911 a population of 3964. The net annual value of this Benefice arising from Glebe Rents and Income payable by the Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and fees and other sources, is £218 or thereabouts:

"2. There is also in the same City and County, within my said Diocese, the Vicarage of Saint Catharine, the Parish whereof contains according to the Census of 1911 a population of 3704. The net annual value of this Benefice arising from Tithe-Rent-Charge, Glebe Rents, Income payable by the Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and fees and other sources, is £292 or thereabouts:

"3. There is also in the said City of Gloucester, and within my said Diocese, the Rectory of Saint John the Baptist, the Parish whereof contains according to the Census of 1911 a population of 1893. The net annual value of this Benefice arising from Income payable by the Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and fees and other sources, is £206 or thereabouts:

"4. There is also in the said City of Gloucester and County of Gloucester, and within my said Diocese, the Perpetual Curacy of Saint Mark, the Parish whereof contains according to the Census of 1911 a population of 3306. The net annual value of this Benefice arising from Income payable by the Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and fees and other sources, is £296 or thereabouts:

"5. There is also in the said City and County of Gloucester, within my said Diocese, the Vicarage of Barnwood, the Parish whereof contains according to the Census of 1911 a population of 1462. The net annual value of this Benefice arising from Tithe-Rent-Charge, Glebe Rent, Income payable by the Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and fees and other sources, is £300 or thereabouts:

"6. Certain portions of the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode are detached from the main portion of the said Parish and are situate in the Wotton District, and lie at distances of from one to two miles from the Parish Church of Saint Mary de Lode, but are immediately adjacent to the new Parish Church of Saint

Catharine situate in the Wotton District aforesaid:

"7. A portion of the said Parish of Saint Catharine is on the extreme edge of the said Parish, and is situate in the Cattle Market District and adjoins the said Parish of Saint John the Baptist, to the Church of which last-mentioned Parish it is nearer than to the Parish Church of Saint Catharine:

"8. Another portion of the said Parish of Saint Catharine is detached from the main portion of the said Parish and is situate in the Kingsholm District, on the west side of the Kingsholm Road, and lies at a distance of from one to one and a half miles from the said new Parish Church of Saint Catharine, and is nearer to the Parish Church of Saint Mary de Lode:

"9. Another portion of the said Parish of Saint Catharine is situate in the Honyatt Road District, and lies nearer to the Parish Church of Saint Mark than it does to the said new Parish Church of Saint Catharine:

"10. A certain District situate in the said City of Gloucester and within our Diocese, and known as the Henry Road District, is extra-parochial, and is contiguous to the said Parish of Saint Mark:

"11. A certain District situate near the London Road in the said City of Gloucester and within our said Diocese is extra-parochial, and is contiguous to the said Parish of Saint Catharine:

"12. A certain portion of the said Parish of Barnwood adjoins the River Severn and is contiguous to the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode, and lies nearer to the Parish Church of Saint Mary de Lode than it does to the Parish Church of Barnwood:

"13. It appears to me that under the provisions of the said Pluralities Act the following alterations in the contents of the above-mentioned Parishes may advantageously be made:—

(a) The separation of the Wotton District portions of the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode referred to in the preceding paragraph numbered 6 from the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode, and their annexation to the said Parish of Saint Catharine, to which they are contiguous.

(b) The separation of the Cattle Market District portion of the said Parish of Saint Catharine referred to in the preceding paragraph numbered 7 from the said Parish of Saint Catharine, and its annexation to the said Parish of Saint John the Baptist, to which it is contiguous.

(c) The separation of the Kingsholm District portion of the said Parish of Saint Catharine referred to in the preceding paragraph numbered 8 from the said Parish of Saint Catharine, and its annexation to the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode, to which it is contiguous.

(d) The separation of the Honyatt Road District portion of the said Parish of Saint Catharine referred to in the preceding paragraph numbered 9 from the said Parish of Saint Catharine, and its annexation to the said Parish of Saint Mark, to which it is contiguous.

(e) The annexation of the extra-parochial Henry Road District referred to in the preceding paragraph numbered 10 to the said

Parish of Saint Mark, to which it is contiguous.

(f) The annexation of the extra-parochial District situate near the London Road referred to in the preceding paragraph numbered 11 to the said Parish of Saint Catharine, to which it is contiguous.

(g) The separation of the portion of the said Parish of Barnwood adjoining the River Severn referred to in the preceding paragraph numbered 12 from the said Parish of Barnwood, and its annexation to the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode, to which it is contiguous.

"14. The Benefice of Saint Mary de Lode is in the Patronage of the Dean and Chapter of Gloucester.

The Benefice of Saint Catharine is in my Patronage as Bishop of Gloucester.

The Benefice of Saint John the Baptist is in the Patronage of His Majesty the King by His Lord Chancellor.

The Benefice of Saint Mark is in my Patronage as Bishop of Gloucester.

The Benefice of Barnwood is in the Patronage of the Dean and Chapter of Gloucester.

"15. The Reverend William Christian Macklin is the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Saint Mary de Lode.

The Reverend Samuel Richmond Robertson is the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Saint Catharine.

The Reverend Alfred Collet Eyre is the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Saint John the Baptist.

The Reverend Leonard Augustus Lyne is the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Saint Mark.

The Reverend Francis Harvie Fowler is the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Barnwood.

"16. Pursuant to the directions contained in the Twenty-sixth Section of the said Pluralities Act, I, the said Bishop, have drawn up a Scheme in writing, annexed to this Representation, describing the several Districts so as aforesaid proposed to be annexed to the said Parishes of Saint Catharine, Saint John the Baptist, Saint Mary de Lode, and Saint Mark, and the mode in which it appears to me the alteration may best be effected, and how the changes consequent thereon in respect of Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction, Glebe Lands, Tithes, Rent-Charges, and other Ecclesiastical dues and payments and in respect to Patronage and Rights to Pews may be made with justice to all parties interested, and I do hereby submit the same to your Grace, together with the Consents in writing of the said Patrons and Incumbents, to the intent that if your Grace shall on full consideration and inquiry be satisfied with such Scheme you may certify the same and such Consents by your Report to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

"SCHEME.

"That a District shall be separated from the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode and annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the con-

tiguous Parish of Saint Catharine. The said District is delineated and described in the Plan hereunto annexed, and therein coloured *blue*, and lettered 'A,' and consists of the District known as the Wotton District.

"That a District shall be separated from the said Parish of Saint Catharine and annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the contiguous Parish of Saint John the Baptist. The said District is delineated and described in the said Plan hereunto annexed, and therein coloured *pink*, and lettered 'B,' and consists of the District known as the Cattle Market District.

"That a District shall be separated from the said Parish of Saint Catharine and annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the contiguous Parish of Saint Mary de Lode. The said District is delineated and described in the said Plan hereunto annexed, and therein coloured *pink*, and lettered 'C,' and consists of the District known as the Kingsholm District.

"That a District shall be separated from the said Parish of Saint Catharine and annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the contiguous Parish of Saint Mark. The said District is delineated and described in the said Plan hereunto annexed, and therein coloured *pink*, and lettered 'D,' and consists of the District known as the Honyatt Road District.

"That an extra-parochial District shall be annexed to the contiguous Parish of Saint Mark. The said District is delineated and described in the said Plan hereunto annexed, and therein cross-hatched with *blue*, and lettered 'E,' and consists of the District known as the Henry Road District.

"That an extra-parochial District shall be annexed to the contiguous Parish of Saint Catharine. The said District is delineated and described in the said Plan hereunto annexed, and therein cross-hatched with *blue*, and lettered 'F.'

"That a District adjoining the River Severn shall be separated from the said Parish of Barnwood and annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the contiguous Parish of Saint Mary de Lode. The said District is delineated and described in the said Plan hereunto annexed, and therein coloured *yellow*, and lettered 'G.'

"That the respective Incumbents of the Parishes to which such several Districts shall be annexed shall have the sole and exclusive Cure of Souls within the said Districts.

"That the parishioners of such several Districts shall be entitled to accommodation in the respective Churches of the Parishes to which the said Districts shall be annexed, and shall cease to be entitled to accommodation in the respective Churches of the Parishes from which the said Districts shall be separated, excepting nevertheless any person or persons possessing a legal right by faculty or otherwise to any pew or sitting in either of the said Parish Churches and who may not be willing to relinquish and give up the same.

"That marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials shall be solemnized and performed as follows:—

(a) For the inhabitants of the Wotton District in the said Parish Church of Saint Catharine.

(b) For the inhabitants of the Cattle Market District in the said Parish Church of Saint John the Baptist.

(c) For the inhabitants of the Kingsholm District in the said Parish Church of Saint Mary de Lode.

(d) For the inhabitants of the Honyatt Road District in the said Parish Church of Saint Mark.

(e) For the inhabitants of the Henry Road District in the said Parish Church of Saint Mark.

(f) For the inhabitants of the District near the London Road in the said Parish Church of Saint Catharine.

(g) For the inhabitants of the District adjoining the River Severn in the said Parish Church of Saint Mary de Lode.

"That all fees, dues, ecclesiastical offerings, and emoluments (excepting Tithe-Rent-Charge) arising from each of the Districts shall henceforth belong to the Incumbent of the Parish to which such District shall be annexed.

"That no alteration shall be made in the Patronage of the said Benefices or either of them."

"The Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of the Holy and Indivisible Trinity in Gloucester, being the Patrons or persons entitled to present to the Benefice of Saint Mary de Lode, in the City and County of Gloucester and Diocese of Gloucester, in case the same were now vacant, The Reverend William Christian Macklin, being the Incumbent of the same Parish, The said Bishop of Gloucester, being the Patron or person entitled to present to the Benefice of Saint Catharine, in the City and County of Gloucester and Diocese of Gloucester, in case the same were now vacant, The Reverend Samuel Richmond Robertson, being the Incumbent of the same Parish, The Right Honourable Stanley Owen, Lord Buckmaster, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, being the Patron or person entitled to present to the Benefice of Saint John the Baptist, in the City and County of Gloucester and Diocese of Gloucester, in case the same were now vacant, The Reverend Alfred Collet Eyre, being the Incumbent of the same Parish, The said Bishop of Gloucester, being the Patron or person entitled to present to the Benefice of Saint Mark, in the City and County of Gloucester and Diocese of Gloucester, in case the same were now vacant, The Reverend Leonard Augustus Lyne, being the Incumbent of the same Parish, The said Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of the Holy and Indivisible Trinity in Gloucester, being the Patrons or persons entitled to present to the Benefice of Barnwood, in the City and County of Gloucester and Diocese of Gloucester, in case the same were now vacant, and The Reverend Francis Harvie Fowler, being the Incumbent of the same Parish, do hereby respectively signify to your Grace our several Consents to the Scheme above proposed and set forth, and to every matter and thing therein contained.

"That the population (according to the last Census) of the said Parish of Middleton with Cropton and Lockton was 1,419 persons, and that of the said Parish of Levisham was 103 persons, and that of the said Parish of Rosedale was 1,188 persons, and that of the said Parochial Chapelry of Lockton was 325 persons, and that of the said Township of Hartoft was 138 persons:

"That the net annual value of the said Vicarage of Middleton with Cropton and Lockton is £190, of the said Rectory of Levisham is £140, without a residence, and of the said New Vicarage of Rosedale is £189:

"That the Perpetual Right of Patronage of the said Vicarage of Middleton with Cropton and Lockton is vested in the said Archbishop of York in right of his Archbishopric, and the Reverend Max William Blakeley, Clerk, is the present Vicar thereof:

"That the Patronage of the said Rectory of Levisham is also vested in the said Archbishop of York in right of his Archbishopric, and The Reverend William John Ennis Armstrong, Clerk, M.A., is the present Rector thereof:

"That the Patronage of the said New Vicarage of Rosedale is vested in The Right Honourable Stanley Owen, Baron Buckmaster, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and The Reverend William Wainman, Clerk, is the present Vicar thereof:

"That the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have signified their intention upon the separation of the said Parochial Chapelry of Lockton from the said Parish of Middleton with Cropton and Lockton and the annexation of the same to Levisham to raise the income of the same by the further permanent annual Grant of £50:

"That the said Patrons and Incumbents are consenting parties to the separations and annexations hereinafter proposed:

"That there is a Consecrated Chapel in the said Chapelry of Lockton sufficient for the needs of the Inhabitants thereof:

"That there is no Church or Chapel in the said Township of Hartoft and that the said Township is situated at a distance of seven miles from the Parish Church of Middleton aforesaid and of three miles from the Parish Church of Rosedale aforesaid, and it would be more convenient for the Inhabitants thereof to attend Divine Service at the Parish Church of Rosedale than at the Parish Church of Middleton aforesaid and the Incumbent of Rosedale could more readily work the said Township than can the Vicar of Middleton with Cropton and Lockton aforesaid:

"That it appears to us The Archbishop aforesaid that the said Parochial Chapelry of Lockton and the said Township of Hartoft may, under the provisions of the Acts of Parliament passed in the 1st and 2nd years of the Reign of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 106, and the 2nd and 3rd years of the Reign of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 49, be advantageously separated from the Parish of Middleton with Cropton and Lockton to which they now belong and be annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the Parishes of Levisham and Rosedale respectively:

"That pursuant to the directions contained in the said first-mentioned Act of Parliament the said Archbishop has prepared a Scheme in writing appended to this Report describing the mode in which it appears to him the alterations above proposed may be made with justice to all parties concerned, and we do certify the same to Your Majesty in Council with the consents in writing to the said Scheme of the said Patrons and Incumbents of the three Parishes concerned therein as aforesaid and to be affected thereby, to the intent that Your Majesty in Council in case it should be thought expedient so to do may make an Order for carrying such Scheme into effect."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Archbishop is in the words following:—

"SCHEME.

"1. That the Chapelry of Lockton in the Parish of Middleton with Cropton and Lockton in the County and Diocese of York shall be separated from that Parish and be united to and form part of the Parish of Levisham in the said County and Diocese for ecclesiastical purposes:

"2. That the Vicar of the said Parish of Middleton with Cropton and Lockton shall cease to have Cure of Souls within the said Chapelry of Lockton and the Rector of the Parish of Levisham aforesaid shall have exclusive charge and Cure of Souls within the limits thereof:

"3. That the Township of Hartoft in the Parish of Middleton with Cropton and Lockton aforesaid shall be separated from that Parish and be united to and form part of the Parish of Rosedale in the said County and Diocese for ecclesiastical purposes:

"4. That the Vicar of Middleton with Cropton and Lockton aforesaid shall cease to have Cure of Souls within the said Township of Hartoft, and the Vicar of Rosedale shall have exclusive charge and Cure of Souls within the limits thereof:

"5. That the Inhabitants of the said Town-

ship of Hartoft shall be exonerated from all liability to repair the Parish Church of Middleton, but shall be liable with the other Inhabitants of the Parish of Rosedale, subject to the provisions of 'The Compulsory Church Rate Abolition Act, 1868,' for the repair of the Parish Church of Rosedale aforesaid:

"6. That the Inhabitants of the said Township of Hartoft shall have the same rights as to pews and the performance of all offices and services of the Church at the said Parish Church of Rosedale and otherwise in relation to the said Church as the other Inhabitants of the said Parish of Rosedale:

"7. That the fees for all offices and services of the Church performed for the Inhabitants of the Chapelry of Lockton aforesaid or arising within the limits of the same and usually payable to the Incumbent of a Benefice shall belong to and be received by the Rector of Levisham aforesaid and the like fees in respect of the Township of Hartoft aforesaid shall belong to and be received by the Incumbent of the Benefice of Rosedale aforesaid:

"8. That no alteration shall be made as to the Patronage or endowment of any of the said three Benefices to be affected by this Scheme."

And whereas the said Archbishop, as Patron of the said Benefice of Middleton with Cropton and Lockton and of the said Benefice of Levisham respectively, and the Reverend Max William Blakeley, as Incumbent of the said Benefice of Middleton with Cropton and Lockton, and the Reverend William John Ennis Armstrong, as Incumbent of the said Benefice of Levisham; and the Right Honourable Stanley Owen, Baron Buckmaster, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, as Patron of the said Benefice of Rosedale, and the Reverend William Wainman, as Incumbent of the said Benefice, have signed the Consents following:—
